# From the Archives...May

# 1995 - Twenty years ago...

The first Lakes Link News came out on the 4th May. The idea of a newsletter originated from the Lake Grace Development Association formed last year. A grant was sought from the Lotteries Commission for a laser printer and a desktop publishing programme which are located at the Telecentre.

## **Commemorating 100 Years of ANZAC**

Each of the soldiers listed on the Lake Grace Honour Roll will be featured in the Lakes Link News, as close as possible to 100 years from their enlistment. It is now 100 years, 8 months, 1 week and 3 days since William Henry Hamilton Hume (aka William John Court) signed up.

**HUME – WILLIAM HENRY HAMILTON:** *ALIAS – WILLIAM JOHN COURT:* It has been discovered that William Henry Hume went by an alias, as listed above, of William John Court. He is incorrectly named on the Lake Grace Roll as "HUMES. W" - There should be no "S" on the end of his name. For reasons best known to him, he chose to go by his mothers' maiden name!

His documents address him as Driver William Court. Born at Brougham House, Manchester, England in 1881, he was brought to Australia at the age of three, and did his schooling at Beerwah, Queensland. William Hume/Court had served in the 'English Imperial Army,' according to his mother, and enlisted in the Australian Imperial Force on the 25<sup>th</sup> of September 1914, at Helena Vale, Western Australia aged almost 34 years.

He seemed to have been quite intent on disguising his identity, as he firstly entered "Nil" as next of kin, though a later entry added as, friend, H. Hume, "Glenco", Beerwah, supposedly his father, who it appears later became deceased. A later entry gives his widowed mother as next of kin. He was a sleeper cutter/trimmer by occupation, until he took up land south of Lake Grace.

He was 5 feet 7½ inches tall (171.5cms), and weighed 142 lbs (64.5kgs), of dark complexion with green eyes and brown hair. His training was at Blackboy Hill and he was appointed to the 16<sup>th</sup> Battalion, B Company. He embarked the *Ceramic* at Melbourne on the 22nd of December 1914, destined for Gallipoli.

After further training in Egypt, on the 12<sup>th</sup> of April 1915 he proceeded to join the Military Expeditionary Force, for the Gallipoli Peninsula, making him one of the soldiers of a very early landing.

Almost a month later, on the 9<sup>th</sup> of May, while in the field of battle, he was reported missing, and a day later on the 10<sup>th</sup> of May he was reported as killed in action. So it appears this made him our first Lake Grace Anzac casualty. He was buried at the 4<sup>th</sup> Battalion Parade Ground Cemetery, Anzac.

In due course, Mrs Ellen Hume, the mother, received his medals, and a Mother Brooch. Driver William Hume/ Court gave his religion as Roman Catholic. A cablegram of Lieutenant John Gettingby was to confirm that Court was in fact Hume, it reads;

Dear Paddy,

I have had a reply from 3<sup>rd</sup> Echelon, and that Bill Hume, (The Yank) was killed in action at Anzac on 10<sup>th</sup> May 1915. He enlisted at Blackboy Hill under the name, W.J. Court (No 538) and marched out of camp with the 16<sup>th</sup> Battalion for the Eastern States to join up with the other half of this Unit which was raised in the East. I am quite prepared to make a sworn statement to the effect that Court and Hume are one and the same man, this is a fact which is within my personal knowledge.

Six years later, Mrs Hume wrote requesting the records be amended to the correct name for her son. The reply in part reads, "I have to advise that before records can be amended and provision made for engraving both names on the permanent headstone, it will be necessary for you to furnish this office with a Statutory Declaration to the effect that deceased enlisted under an assumed name, his correct one being – William John Hume"...... "inscription, 66 letters, the spaces between words counting as letters"....

Mrs Ellen Hume received her son's Gallipoli Memorial badge, 1914-15 Star medal, King's message certificate and Mother brooch.

The Mother Brooch referred to may have been a military presentation, as it was customary to give a badge to the mothers or widows of the fallen. The badge looks like a mini banner on black ribbon, with machine embroidered in gold with wattle sprigs, a

Rising Sun badge, (in gold), and the words "FOR AUSTRALIA".

The badges were suspended from a white metal bar which bore laurel leaves. Stars were added to the bottom bar, each indicating the death of one man.

Before enlisting for War Service, William Hume had been allocated a property south of Lake Grace in 1913, and called it "Kentucky Farm," and for some peculiar reason, while in the Service, he was referred to as "The Yank". He had commenced development and had cleared 100 acres with a small dam on it, and there was also a stable and a camp. In his absence, other selectors took their working horses to the property for grazing purposes during the non-working part of the year, as it grew good natural grasses for stock.

Because it was believed that the horses did not like walking in mud, a fence was put down one side of the location some distance into the muddy edge of the lake, Lake Grace, to prevent the horses wandering from the place. (The fence posts still remain standing in the lake). William Hume was a member of the local Progress Association, at a time when they were actively seeking the railway service to Lake Grace, but his service to country deprived him of ever seeing it.

Some years after the War, Mr Jack Coad, (Harold John Coad), himself a War veteran from Dumbleyung, took

up the location adjoining, and in a meeting with Mrs Ellen Hume, some kind of arrangement was made that enabled Mr Coad to take over her late son's property. Throughout their farming time there, the Coad's referred to the dam on the former Hume property as "First dam".

#### SEAT BELT ROUND AT THE LOCAL FOOTY

**DID YOU KNOW:** That unbelted rear seat passengers have been responsible for killing their drivers and front seat passengers because they weren't wearing their seat belts?

Studies show that drivers and front seat passengers are at a five times greater risk of dying in a car crash if the rear seat passengers are not wearing seat belts. This is particularly the case in head on crashes AND where do the majority of fatal head on crashes occur – on our country roads.

Round 5 of the Ongerup Football Association was BELT -UP ROUND.

Newdegate unfortunately were playing away from home but Lake Grace were at home and my thanks to Johno O'Neill for the invitation to say a few words before the League game.

Such an important reminder and no better forum than at a sporting round where there is always one town that has to travel on our country roads to attend. I emphasized that although I wanted to talk about statistics to make some points it was important that everyone understood that I was talking about real people; real older adults, real young adults and teenagers and real younger children and real babies.

Wearing properly adjusted seat belts and child restraints reduces the risk of fatal or serious injury by up to 50%. The failure to wear a seat belt is a contributing factor in road deaths and serious injury and is at its highest level in 10 years. Approximately 20% of drivers and passengers killed or seriously injured in crashes aren't wearing seat belts.

On rural roads males aged 17 to 39 make up the majority of the fatalities. Studies also show that the example set by older male influences and peers has a significant factor on the behavior of younger rural males. Fathers, older male relatives, bosses, work mates, peer group mates please set the right example and make a point of it if you're not already.

This good example and practice should also apply on farms whether the seat belt laws apply or not. There has just been another farm accident in our region where a mother and daughter have been injured and flown to Perth by the Flying Doctor Service after a rollover on a farm and neither were wearing their seat belt.

The impact of such unnecessary tragedies on the immediate family, loved ones and mates and a smaller

country community can be enormous. In the case of a very serious injury sometimes death isn't the worst outcome. Of course there is also the emotional impact or judicial impact if you were in some way responsible for the death or serious injury e.g. if one of your passengers wasn't wearing their seat belt or a child not properly restrained.

I looked around our sporting venue on that Saturday and thankfully didn't see anyone in a wheel chair etc. as a result of a crash where a seat belt or restraint wasn't used. No adult saying, "if only I'd taken 10 seconds to put my seat belt on" and no child asking, "what happened to me again".

I have seen in-camera vision of the way a person is thrown around the cabin of a motor vehicle, like a rag doll, simply because they weren't strapped to their seat. I've attended crashes since being here in Lake Grace where people have been thrown from their vehicles because they weren't strapped in. I attended one very disturbing crash in the Kulin area where a young female backpacker was thrown through the front windscreen of the vehicle, another crash over Lake King way where a male was thrown half way out of a rolling vehicle. In both case the victim lived but the injuries were horrific and permanent.

In every case the person didn't think it would ever happen to them, it did and in the blink of an eye.

Please wear your seat belts and make sure your passengers are restrained as required.

## CEO's Corner

The Shire is in the process of compiling its 2015/16 Budget and in doing so is reviewing those items previously identified in the Strategic Community Plan and a number of requests received from community groups in response to recent advertising by the Shire seeking submissions. These matters will be resolved over the coming weeks and it is planned to adopt the budget in the third week of July 2015.

Thank you to all those groups and community members who have provided suggestions and submitted requests.

In framing the coming year's budget it is interesting to note in regard to the Long Term Financial Plan prepared last year, the following considerations:

- Utility costs will increase on average by 7% not 5% as previously anticipated;
- Loan servicing costs have been impacted by a 0.6% fee applied by the State Government in this year's State budget, adding approximately \$14,000 to the Shire's loan servicing costs
- Commonwealth grants funding will not be adjusted for inflation over the next two years but may vary due to changes in the distribution formula.
- State road funding cutbacks will have an effect on future funding within the Shire's long term financial planning.

#### **Resounding Success of KidSport Continues in Wagin Electorate**

More local kids will get a chance to join a sporting club thanks to a two-year extension of funding for the State Government's KidSport initiative.

The extension comes as part of a \$10 million investment in the Sport 4 All program over the next two years, announced by Sport and Recreation Minister Mia Davies as part of the 2015-16 State Budget.

Since its inception in 2011, the hugely successful KidSport program has assisted more than 42,000 children aged between five and 18 receive up to \$200 to join a local club to play sport.

"So far 1463 children in the Wagin electorate have joined local sport and recreation clubs through KidSport," local MP Terry Waldron said. "Research shows that active kids do better at school, but we also know that active kids benefit from a range of other positive mental and physical health outcomes."

Comprising four initiatives – KidSport, Nature Play, ClubTalk and the Community Volunteer Project – the State Government's Sport 4 All package increases participation in community sport and recreation in WA.

"KidSport in particular has been hugely successful and we're thrilled that 61 per cent of kids joining local sport and recreation clubs have never been part of a club before," Mr Waldron said.

"This is great for clubs, because it's a chance to increase their membership and volunteer base but it also strengthens the local community." Statewide almost 42,000 kids have utilised the KidSport program since it began in 2011 across a wide range of seasonal sports.

"At the moment some of the local clubs with the most KidSport kids are the Katanning Junior Basketball Association, Narrogin Junior Basketball, Katanning Netball Association, Upper Great Southern Hockey Association, Tambellup Junior Football Club, Kulin Netball Club, the Boxwood Hill Combined Sports Club and Cranbrook Sporting Club. The top three most popular sports are footy, netball and basketball," Mr Waldron said.Mr Waldron added it was also great to see sporting clubs actively promote KidSport at a grassroots level, attracting a new wave of participants that might otherwise not have benefited from the junior sporting club experience.





# Men's Wellbeing WACFL Round

Wheatbelt Men's Health

The Regional Men's Health Initiative partnership with the West Australian Country Football League (WACFL) to sponsor a round of football enters its second year. One of the problems we have is we don't identify who our true mates are in the good times, this can then lead to isolation and loneliness in bad times.

#### Who are our Mates?

We say as blokes we have three broad categories of mates who we can talk to about our personal stuff. These usually come under the categories of a mentor, a partner or a peer. These mates are more often than not

different from the associates and mates that we play sport with and/or socialise with. How many blokes do you know that have no one to talk to?

#### What is the benefit of talking to a Mate?

It's about sharing our story and realising the value of just talking and in appreciating that there are other men out there experiencing similar things (we are not alone). I have never met a bloke yet that hasn't wanted to tell his story (no matter what the issue) and sometimes we just need the right environment.

Men are hardwired to be "problem solvers" and we like to work alone. We often have an attitude that *if we disclose we have a few problems* someone will exploit our problem or weakness.

It is well known that problems shared are often problems halved. Helping men to overcome isolation (by disclosing issues) helps build resilience and can therefore lower the chances of us becoming completely overwhelmed when difficulties and disappointments head our way.

As men we need to encourage help seeking behaviour and be prepared to be the one to "Talk to a Mate" when we know he is down or experiencing difficulties. It isn't rocket science and it does work.

"Talk to a Mate" Men's Wellbeing Round will be over the weekend 13<sup>th</sup> and 14<sup>th</sup> June 2015.

## HMMS Delivers \$153,000 to Rural Communities

The CBH Group will donate \$153,000 to charity through the Harvest Mass Management Scheme (HMMS) for the 2014-15 season.

The HMMS was developed by the CBH Group in conjunction with Main Roads Western Australia and allows trucks that are loaded above their legal tolerance limits the option to forfeit the overloaded tonnes.

This year the HMMS will support Ronald McDonald House, St John Ambulance, Wheatbelt Men's Health, Australian Men's Shed Association, SolarisCare, Princess Margaret Hospital Foundation Charity, Camp Kulin, Red Cross and Youth Focus.


The Senior Business Development Manager of Youth Focus, Susan Schofield, says the donation will go toward the delivery of free mental health programs.

"These children will learn important life skills including tools to improve resilience, perseverance, self-confidence, communication and respect, which they will then take back to their communities," she said.

SolarisCare Foundation CEO, David Edwards, said the support would help the Foundation with the provision of support services to cancer patients and their families.

"Annually we provide services and information for 5,000 people who call into our centres and more than 9,500 complementary therapies free of charge to cancer patients.

"We receive no government support and rely on organisations like CBH to assist us in continuing our work at our four centres, two of which are regionally based," he said.

## Why Is There an Elephant in the Wheatbelt?

Taken from the RAC Magazine April/May 2015

Although it has devastated so many in Western Australia's Wheatbelt community, it is a subject that has proved difficult to raise. It continues to confound experts and analysts who, despite having all the facts, are unable to The Wheatbelt's find the answers

Last year the road fatality rate in the Wheatbelt was more than five times the overall state rate and 10 times the metropolitan rate.

A review commissioned by RAC to investigate factors that may be contributing to the disproportionately high number of fatal road crashes in the Wheatbelt, found there was no single factor that differentiated this region from nearby regions or any other regional area in WA.

So what's going on in the Wheatbelt? The subject of the Wheatbelt's unacceptably high road fatality rate is like the elephant in the room.

While the number of fatalities and serious injuries speak volumes and the impact of road trauma on the community is devastating, real and deeply felt, the issue is rarely mentioned. In many cases, there is simply silence. In order to start a long overdue discussion, RAC has embarked on a campaign to break that silence.

Using the bodies of wrecked cars we've created a massive elephant, measuring three metres' high and four metres' long.

The elephant is a symbol of the unacceptable silence and inaction on road safety in the Wheatbelt. It was built to motivate community engagement and discussion about how we can all work together as a community to help save lives on the road. Part of this work will focus on breaking down myths and misconceptions about what is happening on regional roads and replacing these with facts.

Between 2007 and 2012 almost one in three deaths of drivers or passengers in the Wheatbelt occurred in crashes where vehicle occupants were not wearing a seatbelt.

There is a view that regional roads are more dangerous at night where in fact almost two in every three fatalities in the Wheatbelt occurred in daylight hours (6am-6pm), well above the metropolitan rate of around one in two.

There is also a misconception that visitors who

drive on regional roads are more likely to crash than locals as they are unfamiliar with those roads, but

> tragically two out of three road deaths in the Wheatbelt were drivers form the local area, and more than 70 per cent of fatalities recorded in the Wheatbelt involved only one vehicle.

RAC has embarked on this landmark campaign in order to start an important conversation about road safety in the Wheatbelt, to raise awareness about what is really happening on Wheatbelt roads and to begin the process of working directly with the community to heavy presence but no implement real strategies that will help save lives.

#### ACCELERATED DEPRECIATION FOR SMALL BUSINESS

The Government has announced that from Budget night until the end of June 2017 all small businesses will get an immediate tax deduction for every asset they buy costing less than \$20,000. Currently, the threshold sits at \$1,000. This \$20,000 limit applies to each individual item. Small businesses can apply this \$20,000 rule to as many individual items as they like. Any assets over \$20,000 (which cannot be immediately deducted) can be added together ("pooled") and depreciated at the same rate. These assets are depreciated at 15 per cent in the first financial year, and 30 per cent per year thereafter. If the value of the pool is below \$20,000 until the end of June 2017 it can be immediately deducted too.

#### What is this about?


Gaining the required experience, developing the necessary core skills for work or trying to decide what career path to take can be a daunting task for young people in their final years of schooling.


