Fantastic Fungi

It really has been a year for fungi, with some especially weird and wonderful varieties popping up. Have you ever seen one of these strange creations? This is the fruit body of lleodictyon cibarium, commonly known as white basket fungus.

The fungi begins life inside an egg-shaped volva, white to greyish in colour, then bursts out as 'basket'. It detaches from the volva and can roll with the wind like tumbleweed. While the immature volvae are edible, the mature fruit body is foul-smelling and covered with a slime layer that - on the inner surfaces - contains spores. This slime attracts flies that then spread the spores.

The basket fungi grows alone or clustered together - we came across these two under a sheaoak grove, east of Lake Grace. The species is found in Australia, New Zealand, and South Africa.


Editorial

Lions continued their recent busy period of activity on Sunday 4th July. On this occasion the annual office bearers Change Over took place.

The mid day event was held at Walkers Hill Vineyard where seating for 40 was arranged and fully taken up for the luncheon.

Norm was a fantastic contributor and member of the club who is fondly remembered.



All that is left of the Lake Grace Speedway is a track that is still in fair condition, some car bodies (that post date speedway) and the old water truck (as pictured) that was used to dampen the track between races.

Speedway probably started in the mid 60s and ended in the early 80s (if you have any information we would love to hear from you), ran either fortnightly or monthly and over the warmer months of the year.

There were different divisions; A Class, B Class, Super mod - these were categorised by power. The mechanics who worked on the cars between meets



also go the opportunity to get out there and test their driving skills against each other.

Heats were held throughout the day of the different divisions. Their were award for each meeting but also annual prizes for the different divisions.

Old cars were readily available to 'wreck' and parts were easy to come by. Following the meet drivers and mechanics worked feverishly on their cars to get them ready for the next meet.

Plastic Free July

We are already half way through the month but if you aren't onboard yet, it's not too late to start making small changes to reduce your plastic use and in turn what ends up in landfill.


Plastic Free July is an award winning worldwide movement established in Western Australia in 2011 by the now Plastic Free Foundation. In 2020 an estimated 326 million people in 177 countries took park in the challenge.

Choosing to reduce your plastic use will help in creating cleaner towns, oceans and bushland. WA is leading the charge in Australia with seven new bans on single use plastics coming into effect in 2022, including straws, drink stirrers, cutlery, polystyrene food and drink containers, plates and bowls, heavyweight plastic bags and plastic cups and lids followed by four more in 2023, being cotton bud sticks, fruit and veggie bags, microbeads and coffee cups containing plastic.

Resources are available on the plasticfreejuly.org website to help you reduce your single use plastic.

Getting started is easy, use reusable bags for your fruit and veggies at the shops, refuse plastic straws (banned in WA from 2022), BYO reusable water bottle instead of buying a plastic one, avoid pre-packaged foods and buy in bulk where possible, bring your own shopping bags (even the recyclable ones still have plastic in them), lose the balloons at your next celebration, in the bathroom you could swap out liquid soaps for bar, refuse single use razors, and use bamboo toothbrushes.

Here in Lake Grace we still are using landfill for our waste, how long do you think that can continue and what changes can we as a community make to reduce the amount of rubbish going into landfill? Do you really think its ok to produce 240 litres of landfill per household each week? (That's how big your bin is) With approximately 250 private residences in town, that's a staggering 60,000 litres of waste per week, that's over 3 million litres of waste per year. In our tiny little town! And that is not taking into consideration the many businesses who have one or more rubbish bins. Many local governments in WA have reduced the general waste bin to 120 litres, we could push our council to follow suit. It's a small step, but everything starts somewhere.

Half way through July and Lake Grace is closing in on its average annual rainfall already; 245.6mm has fallen thus far providing respite for water supply and the natural environment while giving the crops a good start.

Our sporting clubs can breathe a sigh of relief with their water supply dams maximising on the rainfall. Well done to the Lake Grace Shire for preparing all of our water harvesting infrastructure for the long awaited rains.

Number one Lake Grace oval dam (left) is full and flowing into number 2 dam (right), there is enough water in the holding dam to half fill the number 2 oval dam.

What is currently in the dams should last for about two years with further low rainfall, however if we have average seasons then it should replenish.

Currently there is also water harvesting from the CBH site and repairs to the sewerage pond have added to the water 'account' for the sporting precinct.

Let There Be Light

Between the 22nd and 30th July 2021 the Lake Grace airstrip lighting system underwent a \$292,000 complete upgrade. The project was 80% funded by the Shire and 20% funded by a Department of Transport Regional Airports Development Scheme grant that the Shire successfully received.

The upgrade consisted of

New trenches

New Conduit and cables

New pits and light fittings

Instillation of a lighting tower and flood light that will light up the parking apron

New windsock pole with LED lighting on top

New 7KVA generator for emergency power

New Pilot activation lighting system (this enables the lights to be activated buy Radio from inbound aircraft)

All works were carried out by Aerodrome Management services, Lake Grace Earthmoving and Shire staff.

Unless there is a power outage with the new system, pilots can remotely turn the lights on prior to approaching the airstrip.



<u>Crime</u>

This would have to be the quietest fortnight in the district history. It's like crime disappeared, even in other neighbouring sub districts. Must be too cold out at the moment.

Gel Blasters

Keep them coming! We have had several AR15's, shotguns and a sniper rifle handed in. They certainly look like the real thing. We did a quick trip down to Albany to drop them all off for destruction along with some drugs. The property guy at Albany Police Station had hundreds of them with literally half a tonne of ammunition. We were amazed at all the different types.

It is best to hand them in if anyone still has one, as the fine for getting caught with one is significant and comes with a criminal conviction.



Traffic

At last the Lake Grace traffic car is back! Just in time too, we have had several complaints with regards to speeding vehicles between Lake Grace and Lake King. It is most likely people travelling home to Perth after a shift change at Ravensthorpe. Please be aware we will be out patrolling that section of road this coming fortnight.

Sergeant Taylor has been banned from driving the traffic car, that's why we sent him to Narrogin...just saying.

Please be reminded with all the rain falling within the subdistrict, that the potential for road being flooded are high. Sergeant Taylor returned to Lake Grace from Perth last Saturday morning and had to wade through four sections of flooded road albeit all in the Kulin subdistrict. Some was about 50 cm deep. You don't want to hit those flooded areas at speed, apart from having to change your pants you increase your chances of crashing. Take it slow.



We recently captured some in-car video footage of heavy vehicles (mainly road trains) wandering all over the road, crossing double white lines entering oncoming lanes by significant amounts. Police stopped these vehicles to ensure that the drivers were not fatigued or drink/drug driving. In nearly every instance the drivers were alert and returned zero readings for drug and alcohol tests.

It was interesting the responses we received for the manner of driving. Many blamed the condition of the road as the issue making them unable to maintain the vehicle in their lane. Some simply could not believe it until the footage was played for them and some responses were not that encouraging "nothings coming so its ok."

All the vehicles stopped were inspected and found to be mostly in very good condition.

We will be having discussions with Main Roads and the road safety council seeking further information regarding this phenomenon as some of the footage we have captured is bordering on dangerous driving. We will provide the obtained feed back from the drivers stopped to these organisations and report back with the findings. We all have to share the roads with heavy vehicles especially at seeding and harvest time. We would like to make it safer on the roads for everyone.

We will also bring up the numerous amount of damaged windscreens people are suffering on the Lake Grace – Pingrup road. Even we have had to replace one

windscreen so far and we have another with chip damage that if it gets any worse that one will need to be replaced as well.



Covid update

Well we wouldn't want to be in NSW at the moment, its just a little bit out of control over there. The Government is currently considering closing the border with NSW (hard border). It has already been limited and any person arriving from that state has to mandatory quarantine for 14 days and provide a couple of negative tests as well.

The currently level for NSW is medium risk. If they keep recording a good number of positive tests each day they will be in lock down till Christmas at this rate.

Northern Territorians have just been down graded to low risk and they are all welcome to visit WA again since the Tanami mine debacle has now been sorted.

We here in WA are low risk again and the masks can disappear for the Perth and Peel people as of midnight Sunday (11/07/2021). Best to keep a few masks available if the covid roller coaster cranks up again and we are directed to wear them. If you don't have a mask come and see us here at the police station we have a few spares, or at least carry a football, apparently that is just as effective.

And whether he's believed or no, there's one thing to remark, That flowing beards are all the go way up in Ironbark.

And that's another sample of Australian poetry from this wonderful book 'An Anthology of Australian Poetry'.



The Alternative Archive

John Curtin Gallery has opened its doors again after Covid lockdown, giving audiences the opportunity to experience the work of three local artists in an important survey of regional art.

The first state-wide survey of its kind in 20 years, *The Alternative Archive* showcases work by 40 contemporary artists selected from a series of regionally -based exhibitions facilitated by local curators. In 2019, Lake Grace Regional Artspace featured works by 11



artists who drew on the history of the Lake Grace Australian Inland Mission Hospital for *The Only Hospital for Miles* exhibition. From this exhibition, the curators selected artworks by Michelle Slarke, Tania Spencer and Jeanne Melville.

Michelle Slarke's work *Artefacts After Burning* is a physical archive of Lake Grace Australian Inland Mission Hospital – old medical objects literally dug up from old tip sites and re-imagined. For *40 Babies a Year Born Here,* Tania Spencer crocheted 80 baby booties from industrial wire. Her artwork reflects on the essential maternity services provided by the AIM Hospital and later by the Royal Flying Doctor Services. For her engaging work *Where the Journey Leads,* Jeanne Melville made a kind of charm bracelet with small metal books that open to reveal historical photographs. Markers along the chain are stamped with the names of local towns the hospital served.

The Alternative Archive exhibition features a broad range of artworks that document how regional artists, as story-tellers and keepers of alternative histories and records, relate to their people, towns, communities and regions. *The Alternative Archive* is the culmination of a three-year project involving 13 regional art galleries, 35 curators and 200 artists and is co-curated by John







Know Your Diabetes Risk

This is the 2021 message for Western Australians during National Diabetes Week

For Diabetes Week 2021, Diabetes WA is urging Western Australians to **"know your diabetes risk"** by taking these three simple steps:

Diabetes is Australia's fastest growing chronic condition leading to kidney failure, loss of sight, lower limb amputations and other comorbidities if not managed. In Western Australia alone, around 140 000 people are living with diabetes with a staggering 23% increase in the last year.

Diabetes WA General Manager of Health Services Deborah Schofield says for every person diagnosed with diabetes, it is estimated another person remains undiagnosed facing even bigger risks.

"In Western Australia we are especially concerned for women and children...... women should know their risk and parents should know their children's risk because diabetes outcomes are devastating for both."

"Women can have undiagnosed pre-diabetes or undiagnosed type 2 diabetes before pregnancy but aren't even aware. This can be diagnosed as gestational diabetes (GDM) when screened at 24-28 weeks of pregnancy which is way too late," Deborah said.

Deborah shared how crucial it was for women to be equipped with diabetes risk information early when planning for a pregnancy just like understanding the importance of folate or quitting smoking, because of the dangers when not managed in time.

"GDM also puts both mothers and babies at risk of poor birth outcomes and future type 2 diabetes. When surveyed, a third of Australian women with GDM didn't even know their risk or the risk to their children developing type 2 diabetes in the future," Deborah said.

"This is worrying because in Western Australia, around 4000 women a year are diagnosed with GDM during pregnancy but in just one year, the numbers have increased by an alarming 27%."

Deborah said type 2 diabetes is severely progressive in children with a higher mortality compared to adults making it critical for parents to know their children's diabetes risk early.

"Children have higher rates of renal dialysis at an earlier age than adults with type 2 and at least 50% of type 2 children need insulin to manage their diabetes within 2 to 5 years of diagnosis," Deborah said. "The burden of type 2 diabetes among Aboriginal children is eight times greater, particularly young girls, further increasing the intergenerational impact of diabetes".
