## ABCDE

### Public Meeting *Moving from Talk to Action* At the Lakes Village Hall

As the ABCDE initiative moves along its natural course it has progressed from '*what are we doing?*' to '*I think we can make this work for our community*'. Discussion has centred around a greater collaboration between school and community with emphasis on *Shared Community Learning*.

Guest speaker Dr Richard Battistoni will be attending the Public Meeting on Tuesday to share his experiences with similar programmes he has been involved with in the United States.

Currently a professor of Political Science, Dr. Battistoni has an extensive background of public service work and scholarship. He currently directs Project 540, a nationwide project which gives over 100,000 high school students the opportunity to talk about issues that matter to them and to turn those conversations into real action for school and community change ([www.project540.org](http://www.project540.org)).

He has been involved with many of the leading national organizations in the public service field; as a former member of the Board of Directors of the Campus Outreach Opportunity League (COOL), a team leader and consultant to Campus Compact; a workshop facilitator for the National Society for Experiential Education (NSEE); and most recently as a member of the advisory board for City Year Rhode Island. He is a distinguished author in the field of political theory with a principal interest in the

role of education in a democratic society.

All community members are welcome to come to the meeting, your input is important to the future of this initiative.



## LETTER TO THE EDITOR

### **Wheat Farmers Pay Iraqi Debt**

I commend our Federal Government for forgiving the debt Iraq owes Australia. What has really happened is that our wheat farmers have had to pay this debt. Surely, this should be the responsibility of all Australians.

This money belongs to individual farmers and they have waited 14 years for their payment which it appears, they will never receive.

It is likely that many farmers have experienced hardship while they have waited in vain for payment of their produce.

Farmers who have since retired would have calculated the potential receipt of this money in their application for Aged Pension. This may have impacted on their quality of life on the pension.

## Baking With Pamela

Winter is my least favourite season, its only redeeming feature being, that it is a time suitable for curling up in front of the fire with a warm bowl of soup.

Another one of our family traditions is, on a Sunday night, to have soup with freshly baked scones, on our laps in front of the fire. The girls used to look forward to these family times and I loved it because soups are quickly prepared, easy to clean up afterwards from, cheap to make, freeze well and can be prepared ahead of time.

Pumpkin is my favourite base for soups and this week I have included two. Both these soups are close to the top of the list for my most frequently requested recipes. I have never made the Pumpkin Chowder without someone asking for a copy of the recipe. Try it, as I am sure you will enjoy the soup as much as I do.

### Thai Pumpkin Soup

1 medium onion  
 1 clove garlic  
 2 cm piece fresh ginger  
 60 g butter  
 1 kg pumpkin, peeled  
 pinch each of sugar and nutmeg  
 1 tablespoon curry powder (optional)  
 1 bay leaf  
 1 litre stock (I prefer chicken)  
 2 cups skim coconut milk  
 1/4 cup cream  
 freshly ground black pepper and fresh chives to garnish

In a large saucepan lightly sauté onion and garlic in the butter until soft, but not brown. Add roughly chopped pumpkin, ginger, sugar, nutmeg, curry powder and bay leaf. Stir in the stock, bring to boil then simmer until pumpkin is soft and mushy, about 30 minutes. When cooked, remove ginger and bay leaf. Puree remaining mixture. Stir in milk and heat for 2-3 minutes. Serve with a swirl of cream, pepper and chopped chives

### Pumpkin Chowder

4 bacon rashers, chopped  
 1 large onion, sliced  
 1kg pumpkin, peeled and chopped into large cubes  
 8 cups water  
 2 chicken stock cubes  
 1 cup pasta shells  
 1/2 cup cream  
 1/2 cup frozen peas  
 1/2 teaspoon nutmeg  
 salt and pepper

Fry bacon and onion until bacon is cooked. Add pumpkin, water and stock cubes. Bring to boil. Add pasta shells. Reduce heat and simmer for 25 minutes, stirring once or twice, or until pumpkin is tender. Stir in cream, peas and nutmeg until well blended.

### Poppy Seed Fingers

Remove crusts from thin slices of stale bread. Butter one side and sprinkle with poppy seed, salt and pepper. Cut into fingers and place on tray. Toast under the griller or bake in the oven till golden brown.

# Morton to Join Eagles Squad

Lake Grace will have a few more West Coast Eagles fans – and even some converts – with the signing to the club of local teenager Mitchell Morton. The Eagles have selected Mitchell as their choice in the third-round National AFL Draft. As the son of WAFL champion and Claremont's 1981 premiership captain, Noel Morton, Mitchell joins the club under the father-son ruling.

Currently playing for Claremont Colts, Mitchell gave an impressive performance at the recent national under-18s carnival, winning him all-Australian selection. This follows on from his earlier success in the International Rules Series against the Irish National Youth Team, where he was the winner of the Ron Barassi Medal for the best Australian player throughout the series. He has been under the attention of the Eagles since the under-16s level and through his involvement in the Australian Institute of Sport.

"He's a fairly versatile player," said Senior

Coach John Worsfold. "That gives us a lot of flexibility but I think he'll be aiming to eventually play through the midfield but could certainly be a talented half-back or half-forward as well."

For parents Noel and Valda Morton, Mitchell's selection continues a family tradition of sporting involvement and achievement. "We are very proud of him and happy he is staying in Western Australia," said Noel. "We believe the Eagles are a well coached and well run club which looks after the welfare of their players."

Mitchell's early selection means that he will not have to wait until November to know his football future. While his prospects as an AFL player selection are certainly exciting, the next months mean concentrating on his final year of school and studying for his Tertiary Entrance Examination.

## Chain Letter Scam

And yet another scam has made its way in to our lives! A chain letter telling you how Perth man, David Rhodes turned \$218 into \$78,000 within 60 days is currently being circulated.

A four-page letter is either faxed to you or arrives in the mail telling you 'not to bin this immediately' and to 'think about it for a few days'. David Rhodes, a fictitious identity, uses all the best scam-triggers by appealing to our desire to provide well for our family, have more money, be successful and get it all quickly with doing very little. Sounds too good to be true, doesn't it. Well, it is!

He tells you that it is a 'perfectly legal business opportunity' and here is all you have to do:

- Send \$10 to the person with a number #1 next to their name on a list of five that arrived with your letter
- Delete that person and move everyone else 'up' the list, putting your own name and address at number #5
- Copy 200 of 'new' letter and send out to 200 people you have found through the phone book or other source

- Do this within 60 days and your \$70,000 will start rolling in!

Mr. Rhodes also notes that if you decide not to participate, then you should pass the letter onto someone else and watch them succeed.

Some obvious concerns consumers should have are:

- Prosecution for participating
- Having your name and address widely distributed
- Alienating your family and friends if you involve them

Chain letters requesting money, even if disguised as a 'gift' like in this one, are illegal in much the same way as pyramid frauds are and participants can be prosecuted. You should not bin this letter if you get it. Simply contact Consumer Protection on 1300 30 40 54. They are all the subjects for the museum workers who attended a Museum of Western Australia course earlier this month. Locals Elsie Bishop, Mary Naisbitt and Michelle Slarke travelled to Perth for the four-day course for people who work in and for community and specialist museums.

With other participants from as far afield as Yarloop and Roebourne, they received an introduction to the roles of museums and museum practices. Museum professionals gave lectures on how to care for and protect a collection, pest management and how to decide if an object is historically significant. The group toured the public and storage areas

of the John Curtin Prime Ministerial Library, Art Gallery of WA, Museum of Western Australia and the Fremantle Prison Museum.

Mrs Bishop, Mrs Naisbitt and Ms Slarke left the course with valuable reference resources and will bring back these and many ideas for the Lake Grace Australian Inland Mission Hospital Museum. Their attendance at the course is one of a number of steps by the Lake Grace AIM committee and the Shire of Lake Grace to develop the tourism potential of the museum. The recently completed interpretive pathway, information panels and tourist brochure are also ways to open up the museum which is one of the three remaining AIM hospitals in the nation.

# Lake Grace Cadets Need You



After eighteen months, the Lake Grace Cadets are becoming a reality. After numerous meetings, phone conversations, emails and a great deal of perseverance, we have been accepted into the government's funding program. Specifically, we are to be classified under the Fire and Emergency Services Authority of WA (FESA).

The Cadets program is open to boys and girls between the ages of thirteen and seventeen. The aims of the program are to provide practical life skills, develop leadership, teamwork and initiative skills and foster qualities of community responsibility and service in young people.

It is anticipated the first Cadets meeting will take place Monday, August 2<sup>nd</sup> between 2:15pm and 3:15pm, with meetings to be held every Monday thereafter during term. Meetings will take place at Lake Grace District High School.

FESA Cadets are required to undertake a number of different types of training relating to the provision of subjects such as emergency services, bushcraft, pseudo-military activities and outdoor activities. Cadets are expected to learn skills

including mapping, navigation, radio communications, knots and lines, drill and ceremony, swimming and first aid.

Should anyone be willing and able to provide instruction in these or related fields and endeavours, please contact Rick Elliott at Lake Grace District High School on 9865 1207. Volunteers should be able to commit anywhere from two hours per week for the duration of 2004 to a single hour during one week. Note that it is not necessary to have a son or daughter participating in the program to volunteer. What is necessary is that interested parties share their expertise with the young people of the Lake Grace area.

As the cadets program develops and gains momentum, opportunities from attending 'adventure' camps from abseiling to sailing on the Leeuwin 'tall ship' should present. Electives are limited only by our imagination and funds. Who knows, we could end up becoming involved in activities as extreme as hiking the Kokoda Trail or bicycling across Australia...

# BOOK FAIR


The Lake Grace library will be hosting a Book Fair to celebrate 'Book Week'.





## Millionaire Mum Seminar OUTED

The consumer watchdog has swooped on another property investment seminar that it considered was using potentially misleading advertising.

Oneworld Seminars Pty Ltd in Queensland operates Express Home Improvements, whose ads had been running extensively in WA's daily and other newspapers. The ads suggested that participants would come out of seminars knowing whether property prices for any area would go up or down.

"We have made misleading advertising one of our priorities as offers of great wealth for doing very little in a short time may lure people into taking gambles they can ill afford", Consumer Protection Commissioner Patrick Walker said.

"In addition to being unethical, it is also illegal to make misleading public statements and we are out there looking for opportunists and will prosecute where appropriate.

"Bold claims such as 'from mum to millionaire' will always attract our interest", he said.

Following a letter of demand from the Department, Oneworld's Director Jack Weavers undertook to correct their actions by:

- \* publishing corrective advertising in the relevant publications;
- \* contacting participants who registered informing them of the correction;
- \* providing to Consumer Protection a list of all participants registered to date; and
- \* offering refunds to those participants who request one as a result of the correction

The operator has also been asked to substantiate the claims that significant financial wealth has been obtained, often in short periods of time, through property investment.

"We have seen some prompt attention and remedial action from the operator to date and will be monitoring the undertaking and the seminar to ensure compliance", the Commissioner said.

The ads were initially netted as suspected scams by Consumer Protection's daily media monitoring program.

# SCIENCE AND STUFF



Survival is never easy, especially if you are a member of a species on the verge of extinction. Just months after scientists reported that populations of the highly endangered mountain gorilla were recovering in the Verunga National Park, in the Democratic Republic of Congo, close to the borders of Rwanda and Uganda, it has emerged that illegal settlers have destroyed much of their prime habitat. Several thousand people moved into the park during May and June and cleared around 1,500 hectares of forest for firewood, timber or to plant crops. The settlers have now been removed but the impact on the gorillas is uncertain. In January it was reported that there were almost 700 gorillas at Virunga, up from a low of 400.



In Europe, hundreds of historic buildings and ancient temples are under threat from frequent dust storms and flood damage.

Make it strong and glassy: "Glassy" steel, more than twice as hard as the best quality conventional steel, has been created. It could one day be used in everything from reinforced concrete to submarine hulls. Metals ordinarily have a crystalline structure, with their atoms arranged in neat orderly rows, but glassy materials are irregular and disordered. Glassy metals are stronger because the chaotic packing of the atoms prevents them slipping past each other. Metallurgists have already made some glassy metals, including a zirconium alloy that is used in tennis racquets and mobile phone casings, but glassy steel can only be produced in granule form, but now a way has been found to make glassy steel in bulk by adding small quantities of yttrium atoms to an iron alloy. The yttrium atoms are larger than iron atoms, so researchers believe they disrupt the crystalline structure. They have made rods more than a centimetre in diameter and believe that the glassy steel could be used to create large structures using commercial melting and casting techniques.

(*Physical Review Letters*, vol.92, p 245503).

A Machine that directs internet traffic has been named the World's fastest by the Guinness World Records. The Cisco Systems crs-1 router pushes data at the rate of 92 trillion bits per second. The entire printed contents of the US library of

Congress could be downloaded in 4.6 seconds - a job that would take a dial-up modem nearly 82 years.

In America, leeches have been approved as a medical device. Leeches can suck out pooled blood from beneath skin grafts, helping them heal, or even restore blood circulation in blocked veins. It's hardly a surprise to most people as leeches have been used for thousands of years.



After a trip of 1.4 billion kilometers, the \$3 million spacecraft, Cassini orbiter and Huygens probe, arrived at the planet Saturn. The Website is [www.jpl.nasa.gov/cassini/](http://www.jpl.nasa.gov/cassini/) or <http://jpl.nasa.gov/>

Lake Vostok, the giant lake sealed under thousands of metres of Antarctic ice, has been found to have two distinct basins, raising the exciting possibility that the deep, frigid waters harbour two separate ecosystems. The largest known sub-glacial body of water, Lake Vostok, has been locked under ice for at least a million years. Unique life forms in water could provide clues to possible life in similar environments elsewhere in the solar system, such as inside Jupiter's icy moon, Europa. The Russian, French and American team has drilled to within 100 metres of the waters surface and could break through into the lake by 2005. (*Creophysical Research Letters*, Vol.31, p. 1124011).

The Arctic has its first world heritage sites. Lulissat ice fjord in Greenland and Wrangel Island, off north-eastern Siberia appear on the revised world Heritage List announced on June 30th.

Another specimen of Archaeopteryx was unveiled in Germany on July 9th. Archaeopteryx, the oldest known bird, is characterized by dinosaurian features, long front limbs and flight feathers. The new fossil, nicknamed "chicken wings", includes just two groups of wing bones and feather imprints.



Africa's rhinos have started a slow recovery in numbers according to the latest estimates. Numbers of black rhino have risen 15% to over 3,600. The white rhino population, down to just 50 individuals a century ago, now stands at around 11,000.




## Prepare your tax return electronically and lodge online

Last year over 800,000 people lodged their personal tax online using the Tax Office's free e-tax facility. That means one-third of all self-prepared tax returns are lodged online with e-tax.

e-tax will help you prepare your tax return and baby bonus claim easily, quickly and securely by asking you questions that are then used to complete and lodge your tax return.

e-tax can estimate your tax refund or tax debt, and help with items such as capital gains or losses. It also gives you access to Tax Office publications, rulings, help screens and examples.

e-tax 2004 will be available for use by vision-impaired people. All you need is access to a personal computer and the internet.




## e-tax has four steps ...

1. Go to the Tax Office web site [www.ato.gov.au](http://www.ato.gov.au) and download e-tax.
2. Save the e-tax software to your computer.
3. Complete your tax return by following the step-by-step prompts.
4. Then the tax return is complete, verify your identity using your Tax File Number and your notice of assessment; then lodge.

You don't need to send your payment summary or any other documentation to the Tax Office – but you should keep your tax records for at least five years unless the Tax Office advises on the notice of assessment that you only need to keep your records for two years.

Most refunds are received within 14 days.

Welcome to Night Watch for the fortnight from midnight Friday 30th July to Friday 13th August Remember Astronomy is looking up!

Our local star, the Sun, is in the constellation of Cancer until Tuesday 10th, when it will have moved into Leo and will be at magnitude -26.7.

The full Moon is, at 1.55am on Sunday August 1st, in Capricornus at Magnitude -12.0. The last quarter Moon is, at 5.51am on Sunday, August 8th, in Aries at magnitude -6.0. On Wednesday, August 11th, the moon will be at Apogee (furthest) at 405,292kms from Earth, in Gemini at 5.50pm. The Moon this fortnight is in Capricornus on July 31st and August 1st, Aquarius on the 2nd and 3rd, Pisces on the 4th and 5th, Aries on the 6th, 7th and 8th, Taurus on the 9th and 10th and Gemini on the 11th, 12th and 13th.

In the evening sky, Mercury, in Leo, sets at 7.37pm on Saturday 31st and at 7.02pm on Friday 13th, just in front of Jupiter.

Venus, in the morning sky at a very bright -4.5 magnitude, rises at 3.52am in Taurus. On the 5th, Venus will have moved into Orion, then into Gemini on the 12th where it will be 8° south of the moon.

Mars, also in Leo, sets around 6.40pm and will be at Aphelion at 8.00am on the 8th, at 249 million kms from the Sun, setting at 6.32pm.

The giant gas planet, Jupiter, now getting low down in the evening sky in Leo, sets around

8.30pm at Magnitude -1.8.

In the early morning twilight Saturn, the ringed planet, rises at 5.51am in Gemini at magnitude +1.0. Saturn, on Friday 13th will be 5° south of the Moon, rising at 5.06am.

Uranus, the blue/green coloured planet in Aquarius, rises around 7.30pm and will be 4° north of the Moon on the evening of Monday 2nd at magnitude +5.7. It can be seen by the naked eye.

Neptune, at magnitude +7.8 in Capricornus, rises around 5.50pm and will be 5° north of the Moon on Sunday 1st. Through binoculars and a telescope Neptune is a grey/green coloured round disc.

The tiny, dim planet, Pluto, at magnitude +13.8, is in the constellation of Serpens, setting around 3.30am, and can only be seen by telescope of 8 inches or more.

Meteors can be seen in Aquarius and near Pisces.

Comet /2003k4/ Linear, is moving through the constellation of Bootes, the herdsman, at magnitude +6.4 and is slowly brightening. Binoculars are needed as it is barely within naked eye range.

Visitors for information or viewing are welcome at any time, or if you wish for me to go to your house or farm, I will if possible.



Covering an area as vast as Western Europe, it operates from 20 bases across Australia, 24 hours a day, every day of the year. The Flying Doctor provides fast, reliable medical emergency and health care services to those people outside of the metropolitan area and in particular, to people living in the sparsely populated outback.

The Royal Flying Doctor Service was the first comprehensive aerial medical organisation in the world and to this day remains unique for the range of primary healthcare and emergency services it provides.

The Royal Flying Doctor Service was founded on May 15 1928 by the Rev John Flynn. His vision was to provide 'a mantle of safety' for people in outback Australia.

His understanding of the plight of those in the outback was learned first hand during his early years working for the Presbyterian Church's Australian Inland Mission. Flynn began his missionary work in 1912, at a time when only two doctors served an area of some 130,000 square miles in Western Australia, and 500,000 square miles in the Northern Territory.

The Aerial medical Service under the control of the

Mission was established at Cloncurry, Queensland on 15<sup>th</sup> May 1928. The first flight took place on 17<sup>th</sup> May 1928. A charter agreement was reached with Qantas to hire a de Havilland DH-50A, a timber and fabric aeroplane named 'Victory', at a cost of 2 shillings per mile. In the first year, 255 patients were attended to, and the small aeroplane travelled over 28,000 kilometres.

Today the Service provides aero-medical evacuations, clinic services, primary health care and communication services, and operates from 5 bases in Western Australia – Jandakot, Kalgoorlie, Meekatharra, Port Hedland and Derby.

Each year in Western Australia, approximately 43,000 patients are attended to by the Service, from as far away as Derby in the North West, and as close to the metropolitan area as Rottneest Island and Bunbury.

RFDS aircraft fly over 4.4 million kilometres in WA each year, utilising a fleet of 11 aircraft rotated among the five bases.

While some State and Commonwealth Government funding is received toward operational costs, without the help of the general public and the corporate sector the Service would not be able to take to the skies to provide this unique medical care each and every day.
