## Come on Ladies...Look After Yourselves

Regular medical check-ups are not a guarantee that you will live in a state of blissful health to a ripe old age; however they are something that we can all take advantage of in the fight against any disease, particularly cancer. Research shows that early detection increases the odds of a successful outcome.

Karen Hansen, Regional Education Officer Wheatbelt from the Cancer Council WA said, "We need to encourage all women to have a Pap smear every two years as four out of five women who develop cervical cancer have either never had a Pap smear or do not have them regularly."

In 2013-14 the Wheatbelt region had a cervical screening participation rate of 52.2%, which is lower than the State rate of 56.1%. This shows a large number of women in the Wheatbelt who do not screen regularly and are therefore at risk of developing cervical cancer. The biggest risk factor for cervical cancer is not having regular Pap smears.

All women aged between 18 and 70 years who have ever been sexually active need to have regular Pap smears as part of their ongoing health and wellbeing checks.

Fortunately the participation of women for breast screening is much higher. Breastscreen WA aims to have a rate of 70% of women aged between 50-69 attend for screening, the participation rate for Lake Grace is 78%.

In a bid to encourage women to take a more positive role in managing their health; Cancer Council WA and Breastscreen WA will be participating in an 'Upstairs Downstairs' event at the Lake Grace CRC on Wednesday 3rd August from 5:30pm. There will also be an gathering from 10am on Thursday 4th August for those who can't make it the night before.

Leanne Pilkington, Program Officer for Breastscreen WA will be on hand to answer any questions that you may have. The evening is timely as the 'Pink Van' will be arriving in Lake Grace with the free screening mammogram service available from 22nd August through to 29th August. Appointments at the van are necessary and can be made by calling 13 20 50 from three weeks prior to the visit.

Also at the evening will be Karen Hansen and Barbara Brennan. Barbara provides a range of support services to anyone who is affected by a cancer diagnosis (could be the patient or those who are supporting the patient). Barbara's support includes information about the cancer or the treatments available; emotional support or it could be financial practical and legal support.

Cancer Council can also provide accommodation for any regional West Australians who need to travel to Perth for cancer treatment. Barbara works part time (Tuesday – Thursday) and can be contacted in Northam on 9621 1810; she will be available for one on one chats during the morning of Thursday 4th August.

We would like as many ladies as possible at our Upstairs/Downstairs event, there will be fun and games. Please RSVP to 9865 1470 or lakegracecrc@westnet.com.au as this helps us with catering and also setting up the room.

## Editorial

What a huge shock it has been for our community to lose a committed and valued member such as Terry Gladish. On those late afternoons when I had finished the Lakes Link I would call through my opened mailbox 'Do you want them now or would you prefer them in the morning?' the answer was always 'Now!!'. Other times I would be quite early in the afternoon and it would be 'what happened?'. What other Post Office could you hold a conversation through the mail box, include cash with your mail and know it would get sorted or simply leave the cheque book and ask if the account could be sorted when he had a moment. Terry has been a big part of all of our lives and was the go to person when you wanted to know something. On a personal note I recall standing outside St Anne's church as a child watching Lenore walk to the church to become Terry's bride, he was one of the barman at my own wedding. He weighed each of my babies on a regular basis on his Post Office scales so that we could keep their baby books up to date and know that they were thriving. He signed our documents and was a regular sounding board if I had an ethical or book keeping conundrum for any of the organisations I was involved in. Without complaint he would accept the books at the end of the year for auditing. One funny (for me) but frustrating (for Terry) moment was following a phone conversation with Terry I hadn't hung the phone up properly. While working away on my computer I became aware of a bird singing in the garden at the front of the CRC. Quite excited I whipped open the blinds looking to see what kind of a bird it was. At that stage the garden was lawn with the robinia, although there was evidence of birds nesting in the robinia I'd never actually seen them.

## Countdown to Australia's Largest Online Event

Media Release

In just a couple of weeks, millions of people across Australia will pause to complete the 17th national Census of Population and Housing, in what could be the country's largest and most significant online event.

The 2016 Census will employ more than 39,000 temporary staff who will travel a distance equivalent to almost 200 trips around the circumference of the planet in order to count over 24million people in about 10-million households, who come from over 200 countries and speak over 300 different languages.

Head of the 2016 Census, Duncan Young, said the August 9 Census will be the easiest and most accessible ever, with people able to complete their Census from their own home on their smartphone, tablet or computer. We expect 16 million people to complete the survey online.

"Later this month and into early August, the ABS will deliver some 10 million letters to every household around the country in preparation for Census night," Mr Young said.

"These letters will be addressed 'To the Resident' and include a unique login and instructions on how to complete the Census online, as well as details on how to request a paper Census form."

While a majority of Australians won't hear from the ABS for a few weeks to come, Census Remote Area Mobile Team Leader, Steven Pearce, has driven 4,500km across northern Australia in the last two weeks, to ensure everyone in his remote area is counted as part of the Census.

"Within the 160,000 square kilometre area which I'm helping to count, I estimate there'd be less than 3,000 people living here, but that does not mean the data is less important," Mr Pearce said.

"My primary task now is to make contact with the communities and all the relevant stakeholders in those communities and lay a bit of groundwork which will enable us to carry out the Census in as efficient manner as possible."

Mr Young said the ABS' 105 Remote Area Mobile teams highlight the ABS' extensive efforts to ensure everyone in Australia completes a Census form wherever they are on Census night.

The national Census has been a part of Australia since just after Federation and provides the most comprehensive and accurate picture of our rapidly growing and changing population.

Despite 16 previous Censuses over 105 years, the 2016 Census will coincide with the Olympics for the first time ever this year. Mr Young hopes that while Australians are waiting for the swimming finals to start on August 9 they will do their bit for the country by completing their Census.

"The 2016 Census is Australia's moment to pause and make a difference, and help shape the future of Australia's investment in housing, roads, schools and hospitals." Mr Young said.

## An Innovative Approach to Men's Wellbeing and Health and in particular Mental Wellbeing

The Regional Men's Health Initiative is a state-wide program empowering men and communities to take responsibility for their wellbeing and health.

This program's primary role is community education on men's holistic wellbeing.

This is delivered in three ways:

Warrior Education Sessions;

Fast Track Pit Stop;

Advocacy.

The RMHI emphasis is on men's holistic wellbeing and health, which means the whole person and understanding problems/issues in the context of life. When we consider the individual we believe we are more than just physical and mental beings, the often neglected element is our "social/spiritual" wellbeing. We promote the requirement that it is important to know and understand the story behind our identity and what it is that makes us an individual.

Modern Western Medicine is too often about:

Diagnosing ills;
Prescribing pills; and
Sending bills

The "human factor" can get lost in the medical mix.

It has been said to me in the past that the definition of a good accountant is, "they get to know the people in the business"; this is no different to the functioning of a good doctor or specialist. In the work we do this is obvious, especially in the case of both the diagnosis and marketing of mental health issues.

We talk about "situational distress", which is the space between being well and being diagnosed with a mental illness. Quite often we fail to realize that most mental illnesses start from situations that are unresolved in our lives. Sometimes we have to allow people, in particular blokes, to be in this space which is about people having a "normal reaction to an abnormal event".

Often men know the issues but we don't want to show ourselves as the "only one" with a problem. Men in particular struggle because we think we are failing, rather than realizing we are battling issues beyond our making and/or control. A lot of the time it is about giving blokes permission and pointing blokes in the right direction to seek the best medical advice they can.

Blokes are warriors and that winning and macho attitude is very prevalent which often inhibits help seeking behaviour and can contribute to delays in men getting to

the doctors. In regional areas the distance factor and lack of services also plays a role.

Our slogan "...before it all gets too much...Talk to a Mate!!" is the basis of all our initiatives. Mateship, empathy and appropriate use of humour is the key to connectedness in our programs and presentations. We don't do health assessment but we do health awareness, which is quite often the missing link.

## **Artworks telling a Lighthouse Story**

Local artist and heritage consultant Michelle Slarke has been busy researching and designing public artworks for the Cape Naturaliste Lighthouse. The artworks – nine wooden sculptures and interpretive markers – were installed this month.

Five wooden sculptures now hold place near the former lightkeeper's cottage. They tell about the light keepers and their families who lived at Cape Naturaliste Lighthouse. Ms Slarke interviewed and researched former light keepers and their children who lived at the cottages.

For lighthouse children, the Cape was a place of adventure and isolation. The story painted on a boat sculpture "I live on wild little cape" is a quote from the son of a light keeper from 1936, about his home.

Inspired by home-made wooden toys of the 1930s-1950s, the brightly painted sculptures are interactive and playful. Children can sit in a small boat between a dog and seal. They can also move between a set of three waves or turn the top of the lighthouse to see, via a viewing scope, over the lighthouse grounds and beyond. Through the window of the lighthouse, a lighthouse keeper can be seen climbing the stairs.

Along the path up to the lighthouse are a set of jarrah panels and a custom-made jarrah bench. They feature Ms Slarke's drawings, and stories that have been sandblasted into the timber and then painted. They tell visitors about the unique Cape Naturaliste, showing plants such as the rare Cape Naturaliste Spider Orchid,

"La fright-six sea all around



as well as animals that have adapted to the place. Visitors can look through viewing holes in the panels to, for example, a wildlife track behind. The panels also tell of the importance of the place for the Wadandi people who know it as Kwirreejeenungup.

Visitors can take a breather half way up the hill to the lighthouse. For this, Ms Slarke designed an angled jarrah 'Geology Bench' where visitors can sit and look over the Cape's landscape to the coast. The shape of the bench refers to the unusual geology of Leeuwin-Naturaliste Ridge formed during the amalgamation of the Gondwana supercontinent. The text on the bench reads "Beneath us lies a ridge of ancient granite pushed from the deep earth around 520 million years ago".

The sculptures and markers are part of a wider interpretive project for the Margaret River Busselton Tourism Association. Ms Slarke also prepared the interpretive plan for the lighthouse precinct.

## Helena Joan McClare

## 24/01/1919 - 19/05/2016

Helena Joan (nee Elliot) McClare – delivered by her Grandson Steven.

Helena Joan Elliott born on 24 January 1919 in Wiltshire England to an Australian Army soldier David Leonard Elliott and his English bride Helena Louise. When she was 6 months old they came to Australia by boat to South Australia then to Cartmeticup in Western Australia, (between Wagin and Woodanilling). Her father built a home on the farm 'BEAUMONT' at Lake Grace

Joan was the eldest of five, two brothers Len and George and two sisters Audrey and Daphne. As the only one born in England the others called her "our pommy sister".

From an early age Joan showed responsibility and care for her younger brothers and sisters. Joan's father believed in a good education, a rare thing in the 1930's. Joan attended Lake Grace primary school. Then went on to Albany Senior High School for 3 years boarding at the "Priory". After leaving high school in 1936, she started work at the Lake Grace Hospital as a wardsmaid.

Joan, was concerned about the poorer patients, who often arrived without sleepwear or personal items. Her mother and a group of women around Lake Grace then started the Hospital Auxiliary, which is still raising funds today. All from Joan's initial concerns for other peoples' needs.

In 1937 Joan and three other young Ladies entered a 'Popular Girl' Competition to help raise money for some additions to the hospital. In four weeks the results were astounding. More than 316 pounds were raised even though it was a penny per vote......... 75,840 votes. When Joan turned 21 she started her three and a half years of nursing training at the Fremantle hospital, where we believe she met Frances Gerald McClare, who we all know as Frank.

While on leave Frank purchased a train ticket to Lake Grace. The attendant asked "Why the heck Lake Grace, that's the end of the world?" Frank replied "To see a girl." "Must be some girl was the reply!". When Frank arrived in Lake Grace he said the attendant was right! He said it IS the end of the world, but she is worth it.

Joan and Frank were married in April 1943 in Lake Grace. They then moved to eastern suburbs of Melbourne staying with Frank's brother Jack and family until 1948 both Frank and Jack worked for Wunderlich the tile makers.

Joan had three sons in those five years Graham, David and Michael. The family then moved to Gippsland in South Eastern Victoria to commence share farming growing potatoes. In the next five years they moved three times and had two more sons John and Andrew. In 1953 they moved to Hernes Oak where they lived until they were asked to move, because the Yallourn open cut coal mine was getting close. Ironically several years ago the coal mine has still not reached where their home once stood.

While in Hernes Oak Joan ran the Blood Bank at the Yallourn Hospital. The Blood Bank was one of the main

suppliers of blood and blood products for the main Hospitals in Melbourne – this being because of the Yallourn Power Station and the great numbers of workforce available to donate blood regularly. Joan was on call night and



day for emergency supplies of blood. She was known to contact a particular worker, with a certain blood group to come in as she needed that type of blood. She would fold herself into her small Morris Mini car which was an upgrade from her Vespa scooter and drive off to work. Frank worked at the Yallourn Power Station. He was a favourite victim!!

Joan was kept busy with her boys and their involvement in football, scouts, paper delivery rounds and other things boys must do.

Joan took her Mother back to England in 1979 so she could visit her brother George and his family.

In 1978 they retired to live in Capel, WA. Joan played bowls, and was always a sought after speaker at the Ladies Bowls, Red Cross etc. Joan's stories were real, interesting and entertaining, about early days living on a wheat and sheep farm out at Lake Grace and the many adventures in her nursing career.

She was President of the Red Cross, Patron of the Ladies Bowling Club and won the Capel Shire Citizen of the year in 1999. Being a wonderful volunteer, ex-nurse and organiser she also managed the Lions Club of Capel patient mobility assistance equipment.

Joan was a prolific reader, she loved reading about real people, not that fiction nonsense. She was said to have read every biography and autobiography book that came into the Capel Library.

Both Joan and Frank enjoyed gardening and reaping the rewards of their hard work. Joan was a great homemaker and fabulous cook, whether it be turning their produce into delicious pies, jams or slices etc. Knitting, crocheting or sewing a jumper for one of her children or grandchildren from bargain material she had bought at Cronshaws. Even if it WAS orange with purple collars and cuffs, it was warm and perfectly functional!

Nanna had many a story to share with us. She had a no nonsense personality but would do anything for anybody. If she asked us for tea at five o'clock and we turned up at ten past ...... too late tea was over..... well I told you five, we can't wait all night. That was it, the dishes were done!!!

Last night we were reminiscing and my sister and brother in law told a typical story .......She rang Andi and asked "does Graeme like figs?" Andi answered yes, Nanna said I'll make him some fig jam and promptly hung up. Days later she would drop the jam at their door and drive off not even letting them know she had been.

Smart, proud, kind hearted, do anything for anyone but no frills no fuss! We will all miss you Nanna!

## **Commemorating 100 Years of ANZAC**

Each of the soldiers listed on the Lake Grace Honour Roll will be featured in the Lakes Link News, as close as possible to 100 years from their enlistment. It is now 100 years and 2 weeks since Arthur Bishop signed up.

**BISHOP - ARTHUR JACK**; Born at Towcester, (pronounced Toaster), Northhamptonshire, England in 1898. Arthur, went by the name of Jack, and enlisted in the Australian Imperial Force at the young age of 18 years on 7/7/1916 - soon after his 18th birthday. He came with his family who migrated from England in 1911, and settled at Lake Grace on a farm they named Brockham, giving his occupation as labourer. At a height of 5 feet 6\(^3\)4 inches (169.5cms), and weighing 150 pounds (68kgs), and with a fresh complexion, blue eyes and brown hair, Jack was not a big person, though it is noticeable on his application forms, his neat and stylish handwriting! As he was under the age of 21 years, his parents, Arthur and Nellie Bishop had to sign a special application form granting him permission to enlist, the signature being witnessed by John (Jack) Carruthers. His training, was at Blackboy Hill, where he was appointed to the 5<sup>th</sup> Reinforcement /43<sup>rd</sup> Battalion.

On the 9<sup>th</sup> of November 1916, Private Bishop boarded the Argyllshire for England, and disembarked 10<sup>th</sup> of January, 1917 at Devonport, then marched in to the 11<sup>th</sup> Training Battalion, Durrington, where they engaged in further training. On the 25<sup>th</sup> of April, they proceeded to France, leaving from Folkestone, then marched to Etaples, thence, into the Field where the 43<sup>rd</sup> and 44<sup>th</sup> Battalion had participated in costly defensive operations in horrendous conditions. In August he transferred to the 44<sup>th</sup> Battalion, and when his Battalion was relieved later on the 21<sup>st</sup> of October, of the 992 men involved in the Ypes operations, only 158 emerged unwounded! For the next four months the Battalion rotated between the rear areas and the front line.

On the 16<sup>th</sup> of February 1918 Private Bishop returned to the United Kingdom, given leave for two weeks. He rejoined his Battalion, which was then rushed south to France in March, where the Battalion played a major role in blunting the enemy drive towards the vital railway junction of Amiens. Having defeated the Germans' in their latest effort, the Allies planned their own great offensive, and the 44<sup>th</sup> Battalion took part in the preparatory battle at Hamel beginning on July the 4<sup>th</sup> as part of the first wave. It was in that battle, where Private Bishop now aged 20 years, was wounded in action - in the field at Hamel, France. He sustained bullet wounds in the left arm, and about a month later, he was invalided to the United Kingdom. His injury was considered severe and his left arm had to be amputated on account of Gas Gangrene. By mid August his wound had healed sufficiently to transfer him to 2nd Auxiliary Hospital, however, it was considered that his working capacity was affected totally by his disability for six months, and thereafter three quarter, permanently. He remained hospitalised until December, (during which time he also had furlough), when it was decided he

should return to Australia, so on the 14<sup>th</sup> of December he embarked the Burma, arriving Perth, on 22<sup>nd</sup> of January, 1919.

Private Bishop arrived at Lake Grace by train six days later, and a good muster was at the siding to give him a welcome. George Lawson and Charles Lucas spoke words of welcome, and expressed their pleasure at seeing him back home. Jack was looking well, though he had lost an arm and was still requiring treatment, so his leave was only short.

At Katanning a month later, Private Bishop was also warmly greeted by his comrades in arms, many of whom had been with him in France. He said the first big stunt he was in was at Messines in June 1917, when, at the Battle of the Windmill, the  $43^{\text{rd}}$  and  $44^{\text{th}}$ were heavily engaged and suffered 50% casualties in 24 hours. Transferred to the 44<sup>th</sup>, Private Bishop participated in the fight on September 26th, when the Australians pierced the German line on a four mile front, in the Zonnebeke region. After fierce fighting for a week he was in the rush forward from north Lagenmarch which won the crest of the Paschendale Heights, at which the enemy lost heavily. After this, his Battalion was taken out of the lines and rested, only occasionally being called upon to take part in the actual fighting. From March, at the time when the Germans began their thrust in the north of Ypres, and in the south area towards Amiens, he was four months constantly under shell fire, up to the 4<sup>th</sup> of July – America's Independence Day – when he received the wound that caused the loss of his arm. This last engagement was at Hamel when the Aussies took a stretch of German trenches, the village of Hamel, and 1,500 prisoners with astonishingly light losses, and for the first time had



Americans fighting alongside of them.

At the time of being wounded, Private Bishop was in an advanced position, and on bringing a Lewis gun to bear on an enemy machine gun, received two bullets in his arm. He was a fortnight in France, then in an English Hospital, before being removed to the Australian Base Hospital at London. He describes the treatment he received, whilst in the Australian Hospitals as being like home and could not say enough of the care and attention given the men. He still had health problems, and was again admitted to Fremantle hospital. His eventual discharge from the Military Forces came on 11/8/1919.

Private Bishop received the British war Medal, the Victory medal, and the King's Message from Buckingham Palace: "The Queen and I wish you God speed, a safe return to the happiness & joy of home life with an early restoration to health. A grateful mother country thanks you for faithful services. George R I." He was of the Church of England faith, and service No: 2535 A.

On Jack's return home, a section of land joining onto Brockham was available for him to farm, however, with his disability he chose a more manageable career of accountancy, and became a top accountant in Perth. He married, but had no children. He was also very interested in theatre, and the claim has been heard from radio commentators, that if there had been no Jack Bishop, there would have been no Perth Playhouse! After his death at the age of 68 years on 7/03/1967, he was cremated - his ashes are at Karrakatta Cemetery. His war medals and memorabilia passed to his nephew Neil Bishop.

#### **Local Government Week - Convention**

Councillors Hunt, Clarke, Lloyd and Chappell together with incoming CEO Denise Gobbart, will be attending the 2016 Local Government Convention in Perth from Wednesday 3rd to Friday 5th August 2016. The Local Government Convention brings together local governments from all over WA and is an important event on the Local Government calendar.

Items for discussion and decision at the Annual General Meeting of the WA Local Government Association include:

- Non operational rail corridors: the potential for these to be used by local governments or other third parties for community benefit;
- Introduction of container deposit scheme: where
   a deposit is included in the retail price of an item and
   refunded when the container is returned to the
   collection point. Local government has been
   advocating for the introduction of such a scheme for
   a number of years on the grounds that it would
   significantly reduce materials at landfill sites and
   address problems with roadside litter and drainage
   debris; and
- Declared pest Plant C3 Review by DAFWA:
   requesting the Minister for Agriculture and Food WA
   to ensure that the BAM Act review results in the Act
   giving DAFWA responsibility to control, manage and
   facilitate the eradication of pest plants and weeds
   and that the Department be adequately funded to
   undertake eradication programs rather than reliance
   on locally funded and managed recognised
   biosecurity groups.

The annual 'Banners in the Terrace' display will once again be a feature with banners being flown on St Georges Terrace in the weeks leading up to the Local Government Convention. This year's Shire of Lake Grace entry has been painted by the Lake Grace Artists Group, if you happen to be travelling down St Georges Terrace anytime soon, keep a look out for it.

#### **Newdegate Town Hall**

With the completion of the "Well Aged" Units and the Lesser Hall upgrade, the Newdegate Rejuvenation Committee is seeking comment on the future development of the Newdegate Town Hall and old Doctor's Surgery.

- → Cemeteries Amendment Local Law 2016; and

Animals, Environment and Nuisance Local Law 2016

#### Purpose:

To provide for the regulation, control and management of animals and the prevention of environmental damage and nuisances within the District

#### Effect:

To establish the requirements with which any person keeping animals, or undertaking activities that have the potential to impact the environment or create nuisance must comply.

Cemeteries Amendment Local Law 2016

#### Purpose:

To amend the Shire of Lake Grace Local Laws Relating to the Lake Grace, Newdegate, Lake King and Varley Public Cemeteries to correct errors in the adoption of the Shire of Lake Grace Cemeteries Amendment Local Law 2015.

#### Effect:

To delete clause 1.2(3) and amend clause 6.1(1) of the Shire of Lake Grace Local Laws Relating to the Lake Grace, Newdegate, Lake King and Varley Public Cemeteries to ensure an appropriate interpretation of the local law.

Health Local Law 2016

#### Purpose:

To provide a statutory means to effectively control issues that have the ability to adversely impact on the health and well being of the community.


