New Ambulance Building Powering Up

It has been four weeks since our last article and things have been a little slow on site.

We were aiming for lockup (minus the garage doors) by the 24th June, but we only got there on the 29th July. However this does mean the building is water tight (bar the garage doors), and all of the door handles and door finishes have been completed. Our thanks to AK Homes Contractors, Brett Henshall of Brett's Carpentry and Renovation and Crowie Hunt of Crow's Carpentry for returning to Lake Grace to get the job done. Crowie was right about being back on Wednesday, he just forgot to tell us which Wednesday. (Oh......... and Brett is convinced that Nat Fyfe is going to play for the Eagles next year......)

Even with some additional delays this last month, at the time of publishing we are at day 94 of the build, and are

still looking for the building to be completed in Septemberjust late September not early September.

So what have we been up to? AK Homes Contractors, Tigerspark Electrical have completed the building wiring, and there is now an assortment of cables snaking through the building. The cables now culminate in a spaghetti diagram where the meter box will be installed, inside the Mass Casualty Kit room. Tigerspark electricians, Alistair and Steve roped in their roustabout Andrew Hunt to get the job completed. As the training floor ceiling has been changed from a 2700mm ceiling, to a ceiling on the rake, the wiring got a little more challenging with no ceiling cavity. The other main challenge was getting cabling from the main building to the garage through structural steel beams. However

Graham Returns To His 'Love' at Lake Grace

It's been 30 years since Graham Witt lived in Lake Grace, but the new CSBP Area Manager has returned with gusto.

The region has always been quite special to Graham, mainly because it's where he met his wife, Elaine, all those years ago.

After growing up on a wheat and sheep farm near Grass Patch, Graham worked for the CBH Group and was based in Lake Grace during harvest, which is when he and Elaine first crossed paths.

He worked as a green grocer in Esperance for a few years before moving to Elaine's home state of South Australia, where they raised their two boys.

Not long after the move, Graham studied a business course and began working in the smallgoods industry.

He then spent 18 years working in the hire industry, which mainly involved earth moving equipment, and last year completed a Diploma of Management.

"I'm particularly interested in the technical side of the business and am looking forward to helping people make the most of tools such as FERTview, NUlogic, myCSBP and GreenPrecision.

"I can see myself spending a lot of time sitting down with clients to help them understand and decipher

He also loves old machinery and has an appreciation of good wine.

Terrence 'Terry' Gladish

30/03/1947 - 12/07/2016

Spoken by Eoin Gladish.

Terry, Brother, Husband, Brother in law, Dad, Granddad, Post Master and TG.

For the last 37 plus years the majority of people here today celebrating Dads life will have known him as Terry at the Post Office. Need to find someone? Ask Terry. Need directions? Ask Terry. Looking for a particular date? Ask Terry. Need a postcode? Ask Terry. How much rain did we have? Ask Terry. Want to know a sport score? Ask Terry. Who's the new person in town? Ask Terry. It was often quicker for the police to ask Dad who someone was than for them to look it up. Dad even helped catch a few shady characters back in the day that had been through and cleaned out a few businesses in town including his own. If it wasn't for Dad creeping around at 3 in the morning (that point to be explained later) and decide to head straight to the police house after realising something was not right, a particular couple would have been long gone. Instead they didn't make it too far past Dumbleyung. Dad never did get his cash back although he did end up with a new safe, which on Tuesday morning last week became a slight problem. We thought there was a possibility we were going to have to crack that safe open again with the use of one of Steve Mac's oxy just like the couple had all those years ago. The loss of Dad has taken us all by shock, we weren't prepared and he wasn't ready to go. He has taken so much with him including the combination to the safe but he has also left us with so much love, knowledge, wisdom, friendships, stamps and weather statistics that Ihope will always remembered.

Dad was born on the 30th March 1947 to Bernard and Bonnie Gladish in Albany, the eldest of three siblings with younger brother Kevin and little sister Ann. Dad spent his early years on the small farm at Marbellup and later at the family farm "Bon Bern" opposite the airport on Albany Highway, now the location of a tree plantation. Dad lost his own father at the age of 12 and being the eldest he took on the role of helping Nanna Bon around the farm including the task of milking the dairy cows morning and night. Dad's commitment and work ethic started young.

He was always an Albany boy, every week he would pick up his Advertiser from Murray George so he could keep track of what was happening in the town and the sporting teams. Every time there was someone drafted in the AFL from the area he would tell you about it and continue to remind you! It's fair to say Dad didn't talk a lot about his childhood, he did it tough. Losing his father at a young age continued to hurt Dad throughout his life. Dad never told us many stories from this part of his life however when he did it was often about his days in the air force cadets and his ability in the cross country, an athletic trait that he failed to pass on to his three children. However, it's no surprise that Dad enjoyed running, I'm sure its where he felt the most comfortable with time to be with his

own thoughts.

Later in life once Dad had left Albany he would return with his family to visit Nanna and Kevin. We would make the trip down every 6 weeks with all of us getting in to the wagon early on a Saturday



morning to the sound of the ABC news followed by Dad's choice of music, generally a mix of sixties classics and Paul Simon. As kids we always preferred Dad's choice of music over Mums with one of us accidentally ensuring Mum's choice of Foster and Allen Irish ballads were left out of the car. Dad was a committed driver never stopping for a car sick child, instead placing Meredith in the middle so she could pass the sick bucket between Louise and Eoin. We would also squeeze in a haircut followed by fish and chips or Hungry Jacks which was more of a treat for Dad than the rest of us. Dad and I (Eoin) would get our hair cut by Eli as soon as we got in to town, I think Dad enjoyed keeping in touch with all the Albany news which to be honest tended to be mostly about golf.

Many of you know Dad from just his time at the Post office however I'm sure there are a few here today that remember Dad prior to this. Following school in Albany Dad began a job as a Telegram boy which would begin his long association with Australia Post. In 1966, Dad headed to Perth to begin his Postal clerk training and learn his craft in the Post Office which would eventually total over 52 years. He spent time training in the city before becoming a relief postal clerk that would see him tour the Wheatbelt and Great Southern. It was during this time that Dad became known to a certain girl working at the ESSO petrol station in the town of Lake Grace. At the time Dad was relieving in the office and would spend Monday to Friday in town before shooting back to Wickepin for a weekend of footy. This however changed as when his time in Lake Grace finished and he moved to another town his weekends all of a sudden were spent back in Lake Grace. His courtship of Mum was under full swing with the two of them spending weekends at dances across the district from Pingrup to Pingaring with the other Junior Farmer members. At the same time Mum's sister Wendy was also being wooed by who we know today as Uncle Peter. With Dad and Peter turning up to Nanna and Pop's house to pick up the girls. Dad's favourite memory is one such trip from Pingrup back to Lake Grace. Dad had never known a trip to take so long, Uncle Peter had decided to mix a few drinks and

was feeling under the weather. Mum and Aunty Wendy were clever and drove back together with the two boys in a separate car. Dad reckons he had to stop every 2 miles so Uncle Peter could open the car door and dispose of the fluid he had consumed.

Dad was a romantic at heart and his proposal must have been remarkable if only Mum could remember when, where or how! Almost more romantic was Mum and Dad's honeymoon, after their wedding here in the church on the 28th April 1973 the two spent their first night as a married couple in a town that oozes romance, Narrogin. It was after this first night that Dad said to Mum, 'Well the honeymoon's over if you tell anyone we are on our honeymoon they will charge us double for the room." Dad's fondest memory of the trip which would eventually end in the popular seaside resort town of Carnarvon was watching the FA Cup final in bed while they were in Geraldton. Dad wasn't sure but he thinks West Ham won it.

Mum and Dad spent the next few years living the life of gypsys, starting in Dumbleyung where they became proud parents for the first time in 1975 with the birth of Meredith although both Mum and Dad were expecting her to be a Beverly baby she decided she liked Dumbleyung better.

Followed by stints in Beverley, Kulin, Mt Barker, Denmark, Cranbrook and finally back to Wickepin with life spent in and out of caravans. Most people often picture Dad with a cup of tea in his hand rather than a beer. However there was a time when Dad loved a drink and smoke. It was his Wickepin days that Dad held so fondly especially his time at the footy club as treasurer and his constant work ensuring the club survived with every fundraising venture possible. Once again Dad always kept track of the community and pretty much knew every family in the town. It was in Wickepin which we like to think Dad decided to give up the drink, it was 1977 when Mum was in labour with their second child (which happened to be Louise). The word went around town "Where is Terry" Dadso happened to still be celebrating Wickepin's grand final triumph from the previous day and was being pushed around the town in a wheelbarrow. It makes a good story that Dad gave up drinking following the birth of his little girl Louise but really it was just because he had ulcers!

One of Dad's fondest memories was driving around Australia with his great Wickepin mate Uncle Ross. If only we all knew a few more tales from theiretrip I'm sure it would make a great read. Only a couple of months ago on Dads 69th birthday he was incredibly chuffed to get a call from his great mate Rocky, easily his favourite gift of the day.

In 1978 Dad had a choice to make on a permanent position with offers for both Corrigin and Lake Grace, surprisingly Mum wanted Corrigin but Dad ultimately chose Lake Grace a decision that would last almost 38 years. Dad's ultimate success story came late in 1980 with the birth of a son. Mum really wanted a fourth child but Dad was happy to finish with perfection and settle while he was ahead.

It's in the office that Dad hit his groove, with not only the mail side of the business but also his new found love of weather which required reading and transmittal every 3 hours. Dad would take alternative readings throughout the day and night with Geoff, who at the time had hair. It was this 3am reading of the weather that allowed Dad to notice something was not quite right and alert the police. Dad loved his weather and could read the clouds well. His moment of fame earned in 2006 when he got the opportunity to talk with Kochie on Sunrise about the great flood of Lake Grace. The ever professional Terry was unflappable he could have been talking to anyone let alone live breakfast TV. It upset Dad when the weather was changed to an electronic station although Dad did have the last laugh however because a computer couldn't replace the water for the wet and dry bulb.

In 1993 Dad had the opportunity to purchase the office and become the second licensed post office in the state, with Corrigin ironically the first. The office eventually became Dad's fourth baby; not quite what Mum was expecting. Dad loved working in the office, we all know he got grumpy but to be honest it was his face that everyone saw every day of every week and it was hard to hide behind a door when every second person forgot their key! Dad had his regulars that he would love to have a chat with each with a different and varied topic he would always get an update on all rainfall or lack of from around the district which he could then pass on to the next.

It would be countless the number of local children that have been taken through the post office on kindy or school excursions. Dad has seen so many children grow up in the town and eventually have their own children come for a tour of what happens in the life of a letter. He always felt one of his most important jobs was to ensure that all of Santa's letters from the local children not only arrived at the North Pole on time but also that Santa's response made it back to them. Most recently Dads biggest buzz has been the young local who grew up in front of him as one of those little kids that came to post a letter and how Nathan would always find time to come and see him when he was back in town. Dad's next hot tip for a local star is Fletcher Taylor, another little local who Dad loved to have chats with and thinks will only be a matter of time before he is starring on the hockey field.

Dad always had his faith and he spent a lot of time here in the church. His faith started back when he was a small boy when he would attend Sunday school which eventually turned into time as a choir boy and server at St Johns in Albany while living in Patrick Taylor's cottage with his grandfather. Dad spent many a Sunday morning here at church with Mum and we three kids right down the back and closest to the door. Jack of all trades Dad even got to baptise a couple of local children.

Dad hit the jackpot when he met Mum, he not only gained a fantastic wife he also married into a family

Creativity is still alive and well in the Seminar Room at the CRC on Friday mornings with crocheters and patchworkers industriously working towards their goal of donating even more lap rugs in 2016 to 'Wheelchairs For Kids'.

Last year about a dozen women learnt the art of English Paper Piecing and created about 150 blocks, each made up of 3 diamonds hand sewn together. These blocks have since been sewn together to form 4 lapsized quilt tops and the next step was to sandwich them together with wadding for warmth and a fleecy backing for softness and comfort.

Learning how to maintain sufficient tension on the backing and then pin safely through two thick layers and a precious handsewn top layer was a little tricky at first. However, after experimenting with a few different techniques the task wasn't too daunting at all. With five sets of hands working together there were two quilt tops successfully sandwiched and perfectly pinned in no time at all.

These are now ready for quilting, one by hand and one by machine, and after that they will be bound and labelled. If you would like to join in with this project, please drop in to the CRC on a Friday morning and stay for a cuppa. Beginners to experts are all welcome.

With so much love and effort poured into these quilts they are sure to become very precious and treasured by the special children who receive them.



This year's cropping program was on target and on time and the Clegg's were planning their maintenance program for the next few months. Barry had always impressed on the boys that maintenance kept things working when they needed to work and helped avoid surprises along the way.

With everyone home for the uni holiday break, this was a good time to get some of the large machinery out of the sheds and make sure that no vermin or birds had made engine bays their homes and chewed through wiring.

Of course the best laid plans can oft go astray, and while moving the header, Clayton managed to scrape the side of the shed causing some damage to the header, but seriously undermining the structure of the shed. As the wind picked up it looked like the shed was in danger of collapse. A decision was made to move all machinery out of the shed and park it up in the most sheltered positions they could find.

A quick call to Justin had an assessor at the farm within a day, and he confirmed that the shed would need urgent repairs. The shed was insured for a fair and reasonable amount under farm property section of the Clegg's farm insurance policy. A local building firm was

called in to quote on the job. They were able to get a quote to the assessor within a week and the assessor approved the quote and the builder and the Cleggs began to work out a timeframe to have the work completed.

The header was still in working condition, though some damaged panels would let a lot of dust get into the motor and so would need replacing. The local dealer was able to quote on the replacement parts, the quote and images obtained and assessed by Elders motor claims people. The repairs were authorised and our local dealer was able to order in the parts needed.

And now, with crop insurance upon them, it is time to work out potential yields for this year's crop and get those estimates back to Justin.

Free Mammograms for Lake Grace Women

Media Release

If you are a woman aged 40 or over you can access the FREE screening mammography service in Lake Grace. BreastScreen WA's mobile service will be located at Lake Grace Shire Hall, Bennett Street from 22/08/2016 to 29/08/2016.

Breast cancer is the most common life threatening cancer for women and one in eight women in Australia will develop breast cancer in their lifetime.

Having a screening mammogram (breast x-ray) every two years significantly increases the chance of a woman surviving breast cancer and reduces the amount of treatment required. More than 75% of breast cancers occur in women over the age of 50. Research shows that screening is most effective for this age group.

BreastScreen WA's Medical Director Dr Elizabeth Wylie, said screening mammography was the most effective method for early detection of breast cancer.

"Screening every two years is vitally important to increase the chance of a breast cancer being detected when it is too small to feel or be noticed. Finding a cancer at this early stage often means that the breast cancer is small and more treatable".

"A free screening mammogram is one of the best things that women can do to look after their health. Breast screening saves lives and only takes 20 minutes," said Dr Wylie.

Screening mammograms may detect up to 90% of breast cancers.

Any woman with a persistent change in a breast should see her doctor immediately.

The mobile service will then be moving to Dumbleyung and Wagin.



Commemorating 100 Years of ANZAC

Each of the soldiers listed on the Lake Grace Honour Roll will be featured in the Lakes Link News, as close as possible to 100 years from their enlistment. It is now 100 years, 10 months and 4 days since Joseph Willis signed up.

WILLIS – Joseph Daniel, was born at Bendigo, Victoria in 1882, and at the age of 33 years and 7 months enlisted in the Australian Imperial Force on 30/09/1915. He was an unmarried man, and gave his address as Wagin, though he was employed at Lake Grace as a farm labourer. Private Willis had also done a five year apprenticeship as a boot maker. At 5 feet 8 inches tall, (173cms) and weighing 138 lbs, (63kgs) he was of fair complexion with sandy coloured hair. He gave his father Joseph Robert Willis of Bendigo as next of kin, and his training was at Blackboy Hill. In the beginning of his training he was in the 31st Depot, but had several moves before he was taken into the 12th Reinforcements / 16th Battalion a month later.

On 22/12/1915, Private Joseph Willis embarked the Ajana for active service abroad, where it would seem that he disembarked in Egypt, to undergo further training. On the 3rd of March 1916, he was transferred to the 48th Battalion at Zeitoun. He was taken on strength at Tel-el-Kebir and proceeded to join the British Expeditionary Force on 2/06/1916, where he embarked at Alexandria and disembarked at Marseilles a week later. Two months later he was wounded in action, in France, when he took a gunshot wound in the back, and four days later he was admitted to the 6th General Hospital, Rouen. Another four days later he was invalided to England, embarking the St George, and admitted to the 1st Southern General Hospital, Birmingham, where it was found a bullet had lodged an inch (2.5cms), from his sixth vertebrae, (in the neck area), which fortunately caused no serious damage. Nearly 3 weeks later he was transferred to the 1st Auxiliary Hospital, Harfield, and a bit over a month later he marched in from the hospital to No1 Command Depot, having recovered from his wound. He was then granted furlough. A month later he reported at Perham Downs, having over-stayed his furlough, and had committed the offence of being absent without leave, from 21/10/16, 9 pm to 3/11/16, 9 pm. For this offence he was given 168 hours detention, and had to forfeit 21 days pay.

Having served his time, he marched in to the 12th Training Brigade, Codford, from where they were to proceed overseas to France from Folkestone per the SS *Victoria*, and on the 4th of February 1917, they marched into the 4th Australian Divisional Base Depot, Etaples. Private Willis was again taken on strength with his 48th Battalion, and they proceeded back into the battle field. After two months Private Joseph Willis was wounded for the second time on 11/4/1917, in action in the 'Field' in France, and admitted to the 13th Field Ambulance, with a gunshot wound to the right knee. After being transferred to the 6th General Hospital, Rouen, he was again invalided to England, embarking

the *Panama* at Le Havre, and admitted to the Bath War Hospital. His gunshot wound was severe.

On the occasions when Private Willis was injured and confined to hospital, his next of kin, was kept informed. Three weeks later he was discharged from hospital to Headquarters where his injury was to be assessed, as to his ability to continue to be of service. His medical report indicated that he would be permanently unfit for service and temporarily unfit for home service, and his capacity to earn a livelihood in general labour was lessened to ½ ability, so it was decided to send him back to Australia.

From Headquarters he marched in to No2 Command Depot, Weymouth, on 22/7/ 1917. He embarked the *Nestor* and left England for his return to Australia, and disembarked at Fremantle on 13/9/1917. On 3/10/1917, he was discharged from the Australian Imperial Force at Perth, having been declared medically unfit, with the disability of a gunshot wound to the right knee, and also affected by osteo-arthritis. Private Joseph Daniel Willis received the 1914/15 STAR, the British War Medal, and the Victory Medal. Private Willis gave his religion as Methodist, and his service number was 4048.

After his discharge, Joseph Willis returned to Lake Grace. Little is known of his life in the community or who his connections were, (where he was employed), however it is recorded that when the end of the war was declared, the whole populace celebrated the victory when a bullock was roasted and a sports programme was arranged. After a toast was proposed to "the Allies" in the proceedings, Joseph Willis was one of the returned soldiers present who responded on their behalf. More good news was to come his way soon after, when Joseph Willis appeared before the Wagin Land Board on November 26th, under the chairmanship of Marshall Fox, (the man who named Lake Grace), and was allocated a block of land, being Williams location 11079. Unfortunately for him, it would seem that his ambition to become a farmer and clear his own land was a challenge too great, as it was not long before he relinquished his lease. This property was later taken up by Mr Harold (Jack) Coad, about 1920, also a returned soldier from Dumbleyung way. One can imagine that Mr Coad, out of respect for his fellow veteran, honoured and remembered him, by naming one of his paddocks "Willis paddock", and therein was the strip that in later years, Andrew Coad would take off and land his aeroplane.

When Joseph Willis's father died in 1918, he applied for a War Pension allowance for his widowed mother Elizabeth, however it was rejected as dependence was not proved. On 6/10/1923, it was necessary for Base Records to furnish particulars of service in the AIF of Ex-No 4048, Private Joseph Daniel Willis - 48th Battalion, to the Department of Repatriation, Esplanade East, Perth. It is recorded in his file on 21/11/23: "Died after discharge".

Tania Spencer, Greg, Jayne and I attended the opening of Sculpture by the Sea, Winter Exhibition at Rio-Tinto's Central Park tower in St Georges Terrace on Wednesday evening. What a fabulous space for sculpture. Tania and I both have a piece of work in the exhibition, it is on until 6 August. Congratulations to Tania who has sold her piece, awesome.

that would end up giving him so much more. Later in his life as an adult he was lucky enough to gain a father figure in the form of Pop, the two of them would talk for hours from sport to politics and back to sport. It also gave Dad an opportunity to be involved in the one profession that would have been his first choice if possible and that was farming. Although he wasn't a fan of using round-up like the majority of farmers, in the garden he would instead turn every grain of soil to remove weeds, by the time he finished he had to start again and it would drive Mum crazy. Dad loved nothing more than getting out on the weekends and going to the farm with Pop to do whatever was required, be it sheep work or just collecting wood. Every summer while we were in Busselton with Nanna and Pop, Dad had his own holiday of sorts and would get to the farm to ensure everything was in order and feed the pigs. Pop was such a big part in Dad's life, along with Nanna and his Sunday afternoon tea rituals. You could tell it broke his heart last year when Pop finally passed, it was a hole in Dad's life that he missed terribly.

Dad loved all his sports and especially footy and as most of you would know Freo was his team, that love though stems from his WAFL team Claremont with a newly formed Freo consisting of many players from Claremont including the coach. Sitting next to Dad at the footy was an experience. He was far more suited

to listening to the games on the radio while in the garden as he could tune in and out or if the game was close, work a little faster. At a live game things were a little different. Dad had what you would call a left leg with a mind of its own. It wasn't hard and he gave Dad a ring to see if we were heading to the Grand Final and to see how excited the town was. Dad had to tell him someone had to stay behind to look after the office, when infact I think Dad would have shaken his entire leg off it had gone to the game.

Dad never did get a handle on the computer age he was one for the customer and the person. He liked to do things the way he always had and would prefer to pick up a phone than type an email. He must have known something with his passing as the next election is more than likely heading towards an electronic format although Mum would have been happier.

Dad always preferred the background over the limelight, all you need to do is look at all the family photos and see him tucked in down the back. He was always the last at the table and always the last to finish eating although his plate would be spotless. If Dad wasn't involved in a community group, he held an interest and it would be easier to list those that he wasn't involved with than those that he was. He always felt that it was easier to just do it than sit back and wait. In terms of the office everyone including his kids would tell Dad to have a holiday, take a break and retire. But Dad always felt it was his duty for the office to be open. It was just his way. We have not only lost our Dad and Husband but the town has lost a true local. Mum will never get to poke Dad to stop him snoring again, Meredith will never get her phone call passed to Mum after Dad has answered, Lou won't get to take Dad to another music concert, I will no longer get to dissect a Freo game with

Dad, James and Luke won't get to talk footy tips and teach Grandad how to use a fishing rod,

Sarah won't get to play him her viola and Cooper won't get to list out his favourite Kangaroo players. His nephew Grant has lost his phone a friend option on 'Who wants to be a millionaire', we always had a concern with this option because if Dad did ever get the call he wouldn't realise he had a time limit and just keep procrastinating on the answer. But the one thing we will always have is the clouds, and every time we look at them we will remember Dad the weatherman and postie who would always be there come rain, hail or shine.



the team got on with the job and were ready a week before the plasterers made it to site.

Also on site this last month was Lake Grace Communications principal Stephen Hunt. Steve and Helen have donated the fitting of the communication to the building. To achieve our requirement, Steve has diligently run the two telephone cables through the building, and prepared the building for the installation line from the Telstra junction box to the building. Our thanks to Trevenen Plumbing for running the conduit for the Telecommunications cable when the water was brought onto the site. This meant we only had minimal digging to get both ends ready for the incoming cable to be run.

The Information Technology (IT) wiring has been proving a cause for concern for the Project Manager. To the rescue came Steve Hunt, who supervised Ross Chappell and Amanda Milton to run the IT cabling, VAST (TV) cabling and the audio cabling for the building. The installation being guided by Leading Edge Hi Fi Albany who supplied the IT cabling drawings. As the building will have a hard wired speaker system using 5 speaker attenuation zones, we have been able to plan the large screen monitor audio to come through the speakers. This will allow us to even out the sound over the large floor area. We also have installed hardwired internet cable to the monitors to increase their ability to be used as large computer screens.

With the wiring completed it was the turn of Lake Grace Transport to deliver to site 20 tonne of plasterboard, firecheck, insulation and associated materials. Let us just say that Rex Walker, and company owner Darren Spencer, had a challenging time getting the very heavy packs onto site, as the forklifts kept getting stuck in the soft sand. After half a dozen times needing to be pulled free of the sand, the duo eventually got all the packs off the truck and somewhere near the building. Although, one pack is firmly planted in some sand which is closer to the water tanks than the building...but we won't say how it got there....will we Darren!

This week is a week for major visual change inside the building. On Monday the 1st August the plasterboard team arrived on site and quickly got on with insulating the building. By the end of Monday, all of the wall and ceiling insulation was in place.

Next up, the team got on with getting the plasterboard up on the ceilings in both the garage and building area. No mean feat, as some of the sheets have to be lifted over 4 metres in the air.

The plasterboard crew of four will be in town for about 12 days, after which time the internal and external painting by Greg Argent can begin.

Other jobs for this coming month include the screeding of the wet area floors, the installation of the kitchen by Lake Grace Cabinet Makers, the tiling by Lewis Building and Maintenance and the installation of the garage doors.

In a surprise visit on the 1st August local member of parliament Tuck Waldron, National Party Candidate for Roe, Peter Rundle and National Party Candidate for the Agricultural Region Leigh Ballard, dropped in at the new building for a look around. The trio were impressed with the floorplan design, and complimented the project for designing for the future. The political trio even squeezed in an impromptu photo shoot.

In a week of visits, a scheduled visit from St John Ambulance WA Ltd property services occurred on the 3rd August with Property Services Manager Michael Longman and St John Project Supervisor Clayton McCarthy visiting site.

We would like to thank those members of the community who have ventured onto site to have a look around. You are in your last weeks of having a peak before the garage doors go up, so drop in and have a look. The project team welcomes your visits.

All visitors please make yourself known to the site foreman/supervisor, if you are on site during active work stages. Just sing out "hello" and ask is it OK to have a look, don't be shy, we are proud of the project and want to show it off. At all other times please come and have a look but always be safety conscious.
