Remembering Past Glories

No doubt there'll be talk of screamers taken, legendary shirtfronts and questionable umpiring decisions as this weekend's home game of football hosts a celebration marking 50 years since the Lake Grace Football team won the 1967 Grand Final.

Although the Lake Grace Reserves team had been putting on a good show during the 1960's (played three full seasons [1963, 1964, 1965] without losing a match, it had been a veritable drought for the League side.

1967 heralded the formation of the Dumbleyung Lake Grace Football Association; this replaced the EGSNFL.

Forming the league were Dumbleyung, Lake Grace, Kukerin, Moulyinning and Newdegate. Prior to 1967 Moulyinning had been a force to be reckoned with but had lost a number of players as they moved on to other opportunities. One of these players was Ray Bairstow who took up farming land south of Lake Grace.

In 1967 Ray 'Musso' Bairstow was appointed captaincoach of the league team. Bairstow had learned his football under the renowned Moulyinning mentor Joe Pearce. Perhaps the biggest difference between 'Musso' and the previous coaches was the belief in the team and

HUGGINS – Cecil Murray

Allan Zweck

Born 13/1/1888 at Tweed River, near Murwillumbah, New South Wales, at the age of 29 ½ years he enlisted in the Australian Imperial Force on 19 June, 1917. His address was Lake Grace, East Wagin, and next of kin his father Charles. A farmer, at 5 feet 5 inches, (165cms) tall, and weighing 125 lbs (57kgs), and of fair complexion, he had blue eyes and fair hair. He trained at Blackboy Hill where he was placed in several different regiments before being transferred to the 51st Battalion. He embarked the SS Ormonde at Fremantle on 13 March 1918, and disembarked at Suez, three weeks later. Transferred to Port Tewfik, he embarked the *Ellenga*, on 30/04/1918, before dis-embarking at Southampton two weeks later, and joined the 51st Battalion at Codford for further training. On 8 August, they proceeded overseas to France via Folkestone, and marched into Le Havre a few days later, as reinforcements for the 51st Battalion, where he was taken on strength before advancing into the Field.

With the War drawing to its conclusion, little is recorded of his movements until after the Armistice, when Private Huggins was detached from duty in his unit to serve in various other units and actions in the Field. On the 22nd of March, 1919, he re-joined his unit, and in May was evacuated for the return to Australia. However, after disembarking at Southampton, Private Huggins was transferred to Administration Headquarters at Sutton Veny. On 23rd July, he was granted leave to 23rd

October to work on "Belgrave" farm for Wm. Parker of Leicester. On a certificate of 'Record of Non-Military Employment', his employer reported; "Private Huggins gave every satisfaction while employed on his farm for experience. He was engaged on general farm work, and, the care of stock, in which he took a keen interest. His conduct was all that could be desired". During this employment he was paid six shillings (6/-) per diem.

Private Huggins was returned to the 51st Battalion on 12/9/1919, preparatory to his return to Australia on the *Mahana*, two weeks later, disembarking at Fremantle on the 3rd of November. He received the British War Medal, and the Victory medal. He was of the Church of England faith - service No.7303. Discharged 26/11/1919, Private Huggins returned to his farm at Lake Grace.

Charles Huggins, the father of Cecil, was a son of Sir Thomas Huggins of Nepis, West Indies, and came to New South Wales where, following his occupation of sugar boiling, became involved in the sugar industry and was employed in sugar mills on the Richmond River. He married Helen Lyle and took up land at Uki, but during the Coolgardie rush, he came to Western Australia, where he was fairly successful. Helen and sons Donald and Cecil came later, as Charles followed the rushes, mainly round Kanowna where he acquired property. Cecil was able to attend Perth Boys School, then Perth High School, where it appears he was in the Cricket eleven from 1901 to the end of 1905, the team having won five successive Darlot Cups. Surprisingly, he became School Captain in 1903, an honour usually gained in their last year. In 1904, after winning the Darlot Cup, it was reported, "Huggins, the school captain, who has been a successful player for some years, put together 86 [runs] in capital style". The next year, they won the cup again, having remained unbeaten. "A great deal of the year's success has been due to the fine generalship of CM Huggins, the captain".

In June 1905 the school paper, *The Cygnet*, wrote; "It is with general regret we parted with our captain, CM Huggins last term. He was presented with a gold medal by the first and second cricket eleven as a token of their regard and esteem. He helped us greatly in cricket and football, being captain of both". In another tribute they wrote: "We were fortunate having such a capable and

careful captain. Winning all matches speaks volumes of his generalship, but he never allowed his success to lessen his interest in the individual members of the team, or his determination to do better. He is a fine right hand batsman with plenty of patience and excellent defence. He cuts both 'square' and 'late' splendidly, and his leg glance is equal to the best. His fielding is always sure, and no one works harder. In leaving, the boys have lost a thorough "sport". It is believed that in 1904, he was one mark short of selection as a Rhodes Scholar.

In June of 1911, Cecil Huggins was allocated land, locations 10163 and (10173 homestead), north of Lake Grace, along with partners, Gibbney and Henderson, who also had a 'homesteader' on 10173. Simultaneously, he was allocated another 2 locations with 3,000 acres of pastoral lease with Gibbney, easterly from Marchagee which they had to abandon. Gibbney soon quit Lake Grace, but little is known of Henderson. Huggins arrived at Lake Grace at a time when others were getting established, and in season 1915 he had sown 250 acres of wheat. Like the other settlers, he added his voice of support to the progressive community in their endeavours, and was an early secretary of the local Farmers and Settlers Association, and involved in the Progress Association. After his absence at the war, it seems as though rabbits became his enemy. Years later, on an RSL visitation to Lake Grace by "NonCom", (a roving reporter), he said of Huggins, "One of the early settlers, very quiet, but still at war, (this time with rabbits"!) In fact, the Road Board had prevailed upon him to put in a bigger effort to control them on his property, as was the case with a number of settlers.

Cecil was an enthusiastic supporter, player and adviser to the North Lake Grace Cricket Club. Many lovely evenings were spent in their home to raise funds for the Club. In the 1930s, aging into his 40s, he took part in the country week competition, though he only occasionally rose to the heights or his school days performance, as was the case for his local team.

In 1937, Cecil was in a deputation to the Members of Parliament urging them to have a school of Agriculture set up in the district similar to Narrogin. Lake Grace was the centre of a large wheat growing area and it was argued that farmers' sons would get better training, as conditions were different to Narrogin, and in any event very few boys from these areas were admitted to that school. This was a surprise to the MPs, and to rectify that, was about all they achieved.

About 1941, Cecil leased his farm, and he and wife Marion went to live in Perth. In a letter to the press the same year, he gave an interesting explanation of annual climate change, claiming, "the earth's tilt in relation to its position towards the sun, and, the constancy of the earth's axis which terminates at the poles", being two reasons, which he explained in good detail for the climate to change. He also wrote in 1944, that our national anthem should be "Lift Up the Fivestarred Flag," written by WA's own songster and poet. He thought "Australia Fair" unmusical and "Waltzing"

Matilda" just a popular ditty. In those years, he authoured a number of musicals, drama's, and literary works, "The Girl from the Argentine".... a dramatic work, the first to be submitted for copyright in August 1936, after which there were no less than 18 works produced by him. Some titles were; The Proposal Waltz.... a musical, April 1945, The Popping the Question Waltz.... a musical, January 1946, Westward Ho.... a literary work, October 1949, and The Song of W.A....a musical, December 1965.

In 1946 the former Private Huggins applied for a new discharge certificate from the AIF, from his St. Georges Terrace address. He wrote; "For 3 years after the war I lived in a hut on my farm before marriage and with the carelessness inherent in the male the certificate must have been mislaid. I did not report the loss because I was unaware it was so, never having had occasion to produce it until recently when I applied for a war service home". When Cecil Huggins wanted to sell his farm, he approached Dick Dewson, who insisted there was no way he could buy it. "Dewson! I have a plan"- Huggins proceeded to offer his plan, on terms which Dewson could afford, and so his property became the Dewson farm. It has since been sold to another party. In his later days, Cecil lived at Tuart Hill, where he died at the age of 80 years, on 16/06/1967. He was buried in the Presbyterian section of the Karrakatta Cemetery with his wife Marion, who had predeceased him by 3 years.


According to Mr Murphy and Miss Bishop the key to the

speaker, telling attendees of her experiences in agriculture and the challenges of modern farming.

"Many rural-based youth face additional challenges accessing educational opportunities, and training needed for the jobs of the future will still have the tyranny of distance and financial hurdles to overcome," said Ms Gartmann.

"The growing scale of agriculture and the challenges young people face getting into agriculture, such as accessing finance with no equity or long track records in business, was clearly a topic of discussion for a lot of the attendees."

Other speakers from the day included Wheatbelt Business Networks executive officer Caroline Robinson who also talked about supporting local and the impact this has on rural communities.

Sean Starling from Meat and Livestock Australia whose opening video presentation included snippets from the latest Tom Cruise movie and left many wondering where it was going. However, Mr Starling assured us that the <u>technology</u> featured in his presentation is real and currently being applied to various aspects of the red meat industry.

After morning tea Susan McCalman from Rural Bank gave a quick economic update before we moved along

to the key session of the day – Drones in Agriculture. Agricultural researchers Ben White and Josh Giumelli from Kondinin Group gave a fantastic insight on where drone technology was heading and different applications that drones could possibly be adapted for in the future.

Two popular talks from the day were from Sheep Alliance of WA board member Bindi Murray who focused on the positives around rebuilding the flock and getting back into sheep, while Dale Woodruff from Byfields gave an honest and detailed process for succession planning that had everyone talking.

Jody Morton from the National Centre for Farmer Health shared some alarming statistics to remind everyone of the dangers in farming, then the conference divided into breakout sessions to learn more about Wealth Creation, Educational Opportunities at Muresk and Grain Marketing from Christopher Tyson of Bunge.

The conference rounded out with a great talk from Peter Newman from Australian Herbicide Resistance Initiative on why Australia is leading the way with herbicide resistance techniques. Finally the WA Nationals Leader Mia Davies closed the conference with some important take home messages about staying resilient in regional WA before conference delegates enjoyed a sundowner, compliments of the Kulin **Community Bank**[®].

This re dedication was attend by 30 people who had to make a quick dash across the road to the art space for afternoon tea with more food than people before the sky opened up.





Flooding Event - February 2017

WML Consulting Pty Ltd has now been appointed as the successful Project Manager, and in conjunction with the Western Australia Local Government Association (WALGA) they have prepared the necessary documentation of tenders for supervision services, plant and labour. Two tenders were advertised on Saturday 12 August in "The West Australian". The tenders close Tuesday 29 August 2017 at 3.00pm WST. The tenders are being conducted within an electronic environment utilising WALGA's E-Tendering Portal Tenderlink.

Road Funding - Direct Grants Cut by 42%

Since receiving the good news that Local Government was successful in having our vehicle licensing concessions reinstated, we have now been informed that the Government has reduced our road funding.

The Government has now made the decision to reduce the Direct Grants pool of the State Road Funds to Local Government Program by the values of \$10.3 million in 2017/2018 and \$9.8 million in subsequent years. This will result in a near 42% reduction to each Local Government's previous 2017/2018 Direct Grant indicative allocation.

This has a direct impact of reducing our road funding from \$296,514 to \$170,765 a direct loss of \$125,749. This equates to 4.45% in rate revenue as opposed to the average \$73,000 or 2.5% loss in relation to the vehicle licensing concessions.

Local Government Week – 2017 Convention

Councillors De Landgrafft, Hunt together with myself attended the 2017 Local Government Convention in Perth on 2 - 4 August 2017. The Local Government Convention brings together local governments from all over WA and is an important event on the Local Government calendar.

During the Convention the Local Government Honours Recipients 2017 were announced and awarded.

Notable mentions from our neighbouring Shires were;

 Cr Gordon Davidson, Shire of Dumbleyung – Eminent Service Award

This recognises personal commitment, eminent service and contribution to the Association as a President, Executive Member or Serving Officer, of the Association or Member Council.

 Cr James Sullivan, Shire of Kulin – Long and Loyal Service Award

This recognises long and loyal service of a high degree to Local Government or the WA Local Government Association.

 Mr Greg Hadlow, Shire of Kulin – Local Government Distinguished Officer Award

This recognises outstanding contributions made by serving officers of member Local Governments to the Association, the sector or other agencies and local communities.

4WDL Meeting

The Deputy Shire President and myself attended the 4WDL meeting held on Tuesday 8 August in Woodanilling.

The 4WDL is a group of Councils who have joined together to form a Voluntary Regional Organisation of Councils (i.e. VROC) and consists of the Shires of Wagin, Williams, West Arthur, Woodanilling, Dumbleyung and Lake Grace. Shire Presidents and CEOs attend the meetings every two months.

This fortnight, Wayne Trawinski, the Shire's Building & Maintenance Supervisor reports that works continue on Independent Living units:

LOCAL GOVERNMENT ORDINARY ELECTION CLOSE OF ENROLMENTS

Shire of Lake Grace

ROLL CLOSE: 5:00 PM Friday, 1 September 2017



You may be eligible to be enrolled to vote in the local government elections on 21 October 2017 if you live in or are an owner or occupier of rateable property in the Shire of Lake Grace.

Residents

You are automatically enrolled to vote if you are on the State Electoral Roll as at 5:00 PM Friday, 1 September 2017. If you are not already on the State Electoral Roll and meet the eligibility criteria, or if you have changed address recently, you must complete an enrolment form.

Enrolment Forms

Electoral enrolment forms are available from the Shire of Lake Grace, all Post Offices, all Australian Electoral Commission offices or the Western Australian Electoral Commission and must be completed and reach a Divisional Returning Officer in Western Australia by 5:00 PM Friday, 1 September 2017.

Non-Resident Owners and Occupiers

If you are a non-resident owner or occupier of rateable property in the Shire of Lake Grace and are on the State or Commonwealth Electoral Roll, you are eligible to enrol to vote. If you are **not** on the State or Commonwealth Electoral Roll and own or occupy rateable property in the Shire of Lake Grace you may be eligible to enrol to vote. This applies if you were on the last electoral roll for the Shire of Lake Grace prior to May 1996 and have owned or occupied rateable property in the district continuously since this time. Please contact your local government for details.

Owners of land who were on the last Local Government roll continue to retain that status until they cease to own the rateable property to which the enrolment relates. Occupiers do not have continuous enrolment and should contact the Shire of Lake Grace to confirm their enrolment status. To be eligible to enrol as an occupier, you will need to have a right of continuous occupation under a lease, tenancy agreement or other legal instrument for at least the next three months following the date of the application to enrol.

Joint Owners and Occupiers

If a rateable property is owned or occupied by more than two people, a majority of the owners/occupiers may nominate two persons from amongst themselves who are on either the State or Commonwealth Electoral Roll, to enrol as owner/occupier electors.

Corporations

A body corporate that owns or occupies rateable property may nominate two people who are on either the State or Commonwealth Electoral Roll to enrol as owner/occupier electors.

Enrolment Forms - Non-Resident Owners and Occupiers Only

Enrolment forms can be obtained from local governments and must be lodged with the Chief Executive Officer by 5:00 PM Friday, 1 September 2017. Further information can be obtained from the Shire of Lake Grace.

Defunct or Disbanded Associations and Clubs

Media Release

Are you a member of a club or group? If it is a registered Association, do you know if it has lodged its annual information statement?

We are compiling a list of associations that may be defunct as they have not been submitting an annual information statement and appear to have been dormant for 12 months or more.

The reason associations and clubs are required to submit an information statement to Consumer Protection every year is to confirm the association is still active, eligible to be incorporated and has held its Annual General Meeting.

If an incorporated association has not submitted its information statement, we will have to presume it is inactive, which carries the risk of the incorporation of the association being cancelled. If the incorporation of the association is cancelled it is no longer a legal entity, which may cause problems for the association ... and we don't want that.

If you're a committee member or office bearer of an incorporated association that hasn't lodged its information statement, we urge you to do the honours as we look forward to hearing from you.

Submitting the annual information statement is not a big undertaking and doesn't cost money – it can be done in the time you might take to have a cuppa and there are no lodgment fees.

Lodgement of the information statement can be completed online through our web portal **AssociationsOnline**. We even have a helpful video to explain how at www.commerce.wa.gov.au/cp/ infostatement

You should make sure you have the following information ready when you complete your association's statement:

- the association's current address for service (this can be a street address or a PO Box);
- the date of the most recent annual general meeting; and
- the total revenue for the last financial year.

You will also be asked to confirm:

- whether the association has at least six voting members:
- the association's main purpose, such as educational, sporting, recreation or religious; and
- whether the association is registered with the Australian Charities and Not-for-profit Commission.

It is not necessary for an association to submit copies of meeting minutes, financial reports or registers of members or committees with the information statement.

The report is more or less just a checklist for both the association and us to assess whether you are still operating as per the requirements of the *Associations Incorporation Act 2015*. It is also a great way to formally confirm the contact information for the association.

If you are a member of a club, society or association that is active, please encourage your committee to submit its information statement if it hasn't already done so.

If you were a member of a club or group that you know no longer exists or operates, we encourage you to contact Consumer Protection and let us know that the group is no longer operating. You can do this by completing our very simple online form which can be found at www.commerce.wa.gov.au/endassoc or send us an email at assoc-cleanup@dmirs.wa.gov.au to ensure it's included on our 'defunct associations list' which will be made public in the near future.
