Backyard Bush Blitz

Why lay in bed on a Sunday morning when you can bounce up and do some cleaning up in your own backyard? As part of the LCDC Bushcare project fifteen volunteers spent two hours cleaning up the rubbish that has accumulated in the remnant bushland east of town.

Volunteers took away six ute loads and left two large piles that the Shire staff kindly removed. A lot of the rubbish is decades old and migrated from the old tip site, however there was new rubbish and dumped garden waste also.

There is a rather large infestation of bridal creeper, a rather attractive and delicate looking creeper that is anything but. Some of this was removed on the day but there'll be plenty of more work to be done to get rid of it entirely - this is why it is so important to not dump garden waste in bushland.

There will be plenty more work to be done over the half a dozen sites that the bushcare project includes. Next year we will get into the phase of regenerating the sites by planting suitable trees and shrubs.

Of course the volunteers were suitably rewarded with scones, jam and cream - big thanks to Annie for slaving away over a hot stove.

Science Fair

As part of science week the community were treated to a science fair at LGDHS.

Students were able to choose a subject, research and do the necessary experiment. They then made posters to inform the parents and community members on their materials used, Methods, variants to the experiment and then the conclusion.

There were experiments ranging from "What substance stops apples from browning through to How much pressure does it take to crush rock, steel and salmon gum.? How far does lava travel and what are the effects on house's and towns from a volcano erupting?, How to make Magnetic Slime, What type of bread creates mould quicker? These are just a few of the experiments the students performed. Some of the conclusions were not what students expected.

Did you know that you can subtract the DNA from a strawberry? It was fascinating to see the process taken to get to the final conclusion. That food colour affects the taste of apple juice? Apparently blue food colouring can make apple juice taste weird with red changing the taste completely and green making it a lot sweeter. Who knew! Do you know what substance out of Sugar, Salt and Sand will melt ice quicker? It's salt, as it dissolves into the water surface and lowers the freezing point below the ices temperature. Amazing!

It was great to see so many students explaining their experiments and how they came to their conclusions. Who knows some of them might go on to be scientist and cure cancer!




Finding the Scorpius Constellation

Learning to point out constellations is lots of fun, and one of the easiest to find is Scorpius the Scorpion. It's a lovely, large constellation that really does form the shape of a scorpion! It is currently visible throughout the evening, lying directly overhead at around 8pm.

When and where to look: A great night to find Scorpio will be on the 10th September. Look for a brilliant conjunction of Venus and the crescent Moon in the north-west at sunset. Higher in the sky look for a reddish star, Antares that lies in the centre of the constellation. See if you can find the curve of Scorpio's body and the sting in its tail stretching up to the centre of the sky!

Antares is a super-giant red star several hundred times the diameter of our Sun and is about 550 light-years from Earth. It is often referred to as the 'Heart of the Scorpion', due to its location in the constellation and its reddish glow. The name Antares

means 'rival of Mars' due to its similarity in colour. It is classified as a Red Supergiant and is massive, at approximately 700 times our sun's diameter!

The Significance of History

The theme for the 2021 National History Challenge was Significance: History Matters. The National History Challenge is supported by the Australian Government Department of Education through the Civics and Citizenship Education program.

All entries must focus on the theme, students can, with guidance, apply the theme to a variety of contexts within their particular state or territory's curriculum. This theme offers students the opportunity to explore various topics in history.

Filling in some time over the school holidays three Lake Grace students, under the guidance of Anna Ayers Dillon elected to look at 'Time for Indigenous Reform' and put together an entry.

They researched the tribes within Australia and mapped out the boundaries. With fresh eyes they looked at the colonial tradition of acquiring 'new lands' and the way of life and laws that were inflicted upon the indigenous population. What was seen as fair play in times of empire building is now recognised as critically unfair.

When you have been listening to music as long as I have which includes many varieties such as music from the 40s 50s and 60s just music and of course, country music both American and Australian.

Some of those artists stick in your mind and you always enjoy listening to such as Elvis, Roy Orbison, Patsy Clyne, Johnny O'Keefe the list goes on and on.

On the country side such stars as Waylon Jennings, Merle Haggard, Johnny Cash, Slim Dusty, Tammy Wynette, Willie Nelson all wrote and sang their songs which became classics to remember them by.

Then there was another C and W artist who took my attention and became a big hit seller from the sixties to his parting from this earth, leaving behind many hit songs such as Big Bad John, PTO 9, Me and Bobby Mcgee, Cajun Queen, Dear Ivan, Little Black Book just to name a few.

His name is Jimmy Dean and with his rendition of Dear Ivan these two monologues result in Jimmy being awarded for his effort 1962 Grammy award. Below is a copy of his self penned and performed monologue Dear Daughter.

Dear daughter I tiptoed to your room tonight
 And I looked down at you smiling in your sleep
 You were so lovely my heart nearly broke
 And I thought how very much like sleeping beauty a little girl is
 When I tuck you in at night I never know how old you'll be when you wake
 One evening you crawl on your dad's lap and throw your arms around his neck
 The next morning you might be much too grownup for that sort of thing
 You're so quickly approachin' my awkward age
 Too young to drive a car and yet too old to be carried
 Into the house half asleep on daddy's shoulder
 I have a secret that I've never told you Sleeping Beauty
 You're going on a very exciting trip
 You'll travel from yesterday all the way to tomorrow
 It's a rapid journey and you'll travel light
 Leavin' behind your measles mumps freckles bumps bubblegum and me
 I promise not to feel too hurt when you discover
 That the world is more important than your daddy's lap
 Yesterday you were blue-jeaned and pig-tailed the neighborhood's best tree-climber
 Tomorrow you'll be blue-organdie and pony-tailed
 And you'll view the world from a loftier perch a pair of high-heel shoes
 Yesterday you could mend a doll's broken leg with a hug
 Tomorrow you'll be able to break a young man's heart with a kiss
 Ha ha yesterday you could get lost one aisle away from me in a supermarket

Seniors Safety and Security Rebate

Western Australian Seniors Card members can now claim up to \$400 per household towards the purchase of eligible home security equipment - as part of the 2021-22 State Budget

Premier Mark McGowan announced the return of the Safety and Security Rebate which can be claimed for the cost of purchase of equipment or installation costs by a licensed tradesperson.

The \$12 million program will provide WA Seniors Card members with a rebate of up to \$400 for the purchase and installation of devices such as:

- home alarm and CCTV systems;
- security door screens;
- door and window deadlocks;
- security window screens or shutters;
- security sensor lights;
- WiFi video doorbells;
- residual current devices;
- mains powered smoke alarms; and
- fire extinguishers and fire blankets.

This commitment is part of the McGowan Government's record investment in community safety, including an additional 1,100 police officers, to help keep older Western Australians safe.

To meet the requirements of the Safety and Security Rebate, items purchased must meet the relevant Australian Standards, and any installation work required must be carried out by a licensed tradesperson.

The rebate is administered by the WA Seniors Card Centre, with more information available by calling 1800 671 233 or visiting <http://www.seniorscard.wa.gov.au>

Hard copy application forms can be requested from the WA Seniors Card Centre or downloaded from the WA Seniors Card website.

The State Budget includes an additional \$4 million to deliver on the McGowan Government's election commitment to establish Elder Rights WA, a State-wide elder abuse advocacy service, to comprehensively prevent and address elder abuse in the community.

The funding will be provided to Legal Aid WA to establish the service supporting seniors by helping them connect with information and legal advice to help combat elder abuse.

The additional funding will enable Legal Aid WA to provide legal assistance to older people experiencing all forms of elder abuse, and to safeguard and advocate for the rights of older people.

Elder Rights WA will provide a complete 'wrap-around' service for those experiencing elder abuse in Western Australia, providing security to those needing to access legal services.

and can provide information on the various types of licenses, probity issues and costs of licenses.

Lake Grace Police will be attending the event, along with other officers who are keen to assist. We are hoping to have the Police Incident Control Vehicle from Albany for the two days as this will serve as our mobile Police Station, Please come and say hello if you get the chance, if not then I'm sure we will see you when we are out and about walking around the event, personally I will be trying to stay away from eating too many fresh doughnuts.





Wheatbelt Athlete Support Program (WASP)

2020/21 Summary Report

The Wheatbelt Athlete Support Program (WASP) is funded by the Department of Local Government Sport and Cultural Industries (DLGSC) and Royalties for Regions through the Regional Athlete Support Program (RASP). WASP supports the development of regionally based talented athletes, coaches, and officials through the provision of a high-quality training environment at a local level. The aim of the program is to encourage the continued development and progression of talented individuals along their sporting pathways from the sub-elite to elite performance level whilst living in regional Western Australia (WA).

The program is developed in conjunction with State Sporting Associations (SSAs) and Regional Sporting Associations (RSAs) to ensure that identified talented athletes, coaches and officials are supported in their endeavors to compete at a higher level.

WASP offers **three** types of financial support:

1. Athlete Support Funding
2. Coach / Officials Support Funding
3. Sport Support Funding

WASP Athlete Support Funding (ASF) is available to support identified high performance athletes residing in the Wheatbelt region in gaining access to quality specialist coaching, sports services and facilities [with-in the Wheatbelt region](#).

To be eligible for WASP Athlete Support Funding:

Athletes should:

- **Contact the WASP Co-ordinator prior to submitting an application.**
- **Reside permanently** in the Wheatbelt Region.
- Be aged between the ages of 13 – 21.
- At minimum be working towards selection in a regional talent program or regional squad, a WA State team or squad or a national team.
- Be a current financial member of an affiliated Club or Association within the Wheatbelt region.
- Have the support of the relevant affiliated Club or Association (as the applicant) to administer the grant. **No individual athlete will receive funds directly.**
- Ensure a representative of the nominated affiliated State Sporting Association endorses the application and training plan.
- Consider attending at least one RASP education session during the financial year of the allocated grant.

Club/Association:

- Must hold a minimum value of \$20 million public liability insurance and submit Certificate of Currency.

Eligible items include:

- Access to facilities and personal trainers (eg: gym memberships and tailored exercise programs).
- Access to local specialised sports services (eg: physiotherapy, remedial massage).
- Access to specialist coaching (eg: sprint training, technique support, core strength training, on-line coaching support).

NB: In order to be eligible support must be accessed *within the Wheatbelt region*.

Ineligible items include:

- Athlete travel costs.
- Equipment or uniform costs.
- Programs not based within the Wheatbelt region.

AFS applications for between \$500 and \$2,000 can be submitted.

Applications must be submitted to this office no less than 30 days before program dates commence.

From the CEO

The Hon Dave Kelly MLA, Minister for Water and his entourage accompanied by the Department of Water's Tracy Calvert, Sandy Turton-Parkinson and Liz Tanner came to town on the 12th August to view some of the projects that DWER is doing around the Shire. Tagging along were the Shire President Len Armstrong, Deputy President Ross Chappell, Manager Infrastructure Services Craig Elefsen and myself.

We visited North Lake Grace AA dam where Cr Allan Marshall gave a brief history on how and why it was built. It was then on to Burngup Railway Dam which has been cleaned out by DWER where Cr Chappell provided a rundown on the history.

The Minister took the opportunity to announce that the State and Federal Governments have combined to provide \$7.3million to upgrade 70 agricultural area dams throughout the

southern half of the state. The Shire will see works carried out at North Lake Grace Dam – tank, pump and standpipe. Lake Magenta North Dam – catchment works. Burngup Railway bore- a new bore to be sunk and pipeline to the new tank recently installed. Varley North Community Dam- catchment works. Purnta Rock – negotiations are underway with the Water Corporation for new tanks.

Negotiations are underway with CBH at another site for the installation of tanks but if this falls through, we are looking at a backup plan. The Minister also announced an increase in funding through the Community Water Supply Program and we are already working on some options for this.

There was some minor disruption on the streets of Lake Grace last week when Shire engaged tree loppers arrived to remove some dead trees and trim some others in the main street.

There was a fair bit of misinformation getting around and possibly some miscommunication between all parties. One tree was removed prior to the work being brought to a halt and instructions were clarified. As a result, the contractors packed up and left without completing the works they were engaged to do.

I won't go on about the costs involved to all parties and ancillary businesses. I do however have an issue with the use of social media, in this case Facebook, to spread misinformation whether it be unintentional or intentional. Everyone has a right to form an opinion based on facts however, this is very difficult when misinformation is spread through social media.

It has been communicated many times that if you have a problem ring us and we will be happy to discuss it. The Shire has a duty of care to all residents and ratepayers and does not generally go out of its way to carry out jobs without a valid reason to do so.

- at any time during the above period by arrangement; or
- between 2:00pm and 4:00 PM Thursday, 9 September 2021 (close of nominations) at the Shire of Lake Grace, 1 Bishop Street, LAKE GRACE.

Nominations Requirements

Candidates are required to lodge with the Returning Officer;

- a completed nomination in the prescribed form, signed and witnessed. This form is available from the Returning Officer or the Western Australian Electoral Commission (www.elections.wa.gov.au);
- a single A4 page profile of not more than 800 characters (including spaces) containing information about the candidate;
- a nomination deposit of \$80 (cash, bank cheque or postal order);
- (optional) a recent passport-sized photograph of the candidate's head, or head and shoulders; and
- every candidate must have completed the online course titled *Induction for prospective candidates*, available at www.dlgsc.wa.gov.au, prior to nominating.

The Commission has developed an online system called Nomination Builder to assist candidates to complete their nomination form which includes the candidate profile. This is the preferred method of completing the nomination form and profile for elections conducted by the Commission. Candidates complete their nomination details and profile, print the completed form which has a reference number allocated and lodge it with the Returning Officer. The nomination builder can be accessed via www.elections.wa.gov.au.

Where an agent lodges a nomination on a candidate's behalf, it must be in the prescribed form with a written authorisation signed by the candidate.

The documents may be hand delivered or posted to the Returning Officer and must be received by the close of nominations.

Climate Wake Up Call from Top Scientists

Farmers are calling on the Federal government to commit to net zero emissions by 2050 at the latest, as the latest UN report issues a dire warning to global leaders.

The report from the most authoritative international body on climate science, the IPCC, found that Australia had already experienced 1.4 degrees of warming, and that deep and immediate emissions cuts were the only path to avoid catastrophic climate change.

Farmers for Climate Action chair Charlie Prell, who farms at Crookwell, said: "While distressing, this report shows there is still a narrow path to curbing climate change and this rests on global action to reduce emissions. In Australia, this means the Federal Government must commit to net zero emissions no later than 2050.

"Embracing carbon sequestration opportunities forms part of this picture and we applaud recent government initiatives to support this, including the Federal Government's carbon and biodiversity pilot.

"But sequestration alone is not enough: our governmental leaders must accelerate the renewable energy roll out, embrace the opportunities this presents

to regional communities and rapidly plan for communities who depend on coal and gas industries to be supported to diversify."

Angus Emmott, Longreach grazier and Farmers for Climate Action board member, said: "Extreme weather events, including heatwaves and droughts, have become increasingly par for the course at my place in recent years. The report makes clear this is just a taste of what's to come.

"Real, impactful climate action – including a plan to rapidly decarbonise this decade and achieve net zero emissions before 2050 – is a win for all Australians. Our trading partners are moving and we are being left behind.

"This is also a story of opportunity. With the right policy settings and investment, agriculture is one of the few industries that can become not just carbon neutral, but carbon positive – locking up more carbon than we emit."

25 West Aussies a Week Diagnosed with Bowel Cancer

Cancer Council WA is encouraging adults in the Wheatbelt region to familiarise themselves with the common symptoms of bowel cancer, with data revealing more than 25 people a week are diagnosed with bowel cancer in WA. Wheatbelt Regional Educational Officer, Melissa Pickering said bowel cancer, also known as colorectal cancer, is the second most common cancer in Western Australia, affecting both women and men.

"Our latest data reveals that in 2017, more than 1,300 Western Australians were diagnosed with bowel cancer and close to 400 people lost their lives from the disease," Ms Pickering said. "In the Wheatbelt in 2017, 51 people were diagnosed with bowel cancer and 15 people died from it.

"We know people living in regional Australia have lower rates of five year survival for all cancers combined, compared with people living in major cities, so we urge anyone in the wheatbelt experiencing a symptom to visit their doctor, clinic nurse or Aboriginal health worker."

Common symptoms of bowel cancer include: blood in your poo (even just one time) or, for more than four weeks; a new pain, lump or swelling in your tummy; feeling tired; looking pale; losing weight without trying; problems breathing; not feeling hungry; and a change in normal bowel habits such as runny poo, pooing more

often or finding it hard to poo.

Ms Pickering said people from regional WA were particularly likely to delay going to a medical clinic when they were experiencing symptoms, with many thinking the symptom could be due to something else.

"If you're unsure about a possible symptom you should make an appointment to discuss the change with your doctor, clinic nurse or Aboriginal health worker as soon as possible," she said.


"Being bowel cancer aware and knowing the symptoms could help find bowel cancer early, which increases the chance of successful treatment."

Bowel cancer champion Mary French from Geraldton knows all too well how important it is to react quickly to unusual body changes and recommends regional men and women listen to their bodies. "*Please do not hesitate seeking medical help when you have bowel irregularities*" she said.

Don't get infected by FluBot

If you've been bombarded with suspicious, garbled text messages lately that mention a missed call or voicemail, you're not alone.

There's a good chance the messages riddled with typos have been generated by malware called FluBot. The malware tries to steal Android device users' banking details and other personal information.

We understand the scammers behind the malware are deliberately using bad grammar and spelling errors in the text messages to circumvent strict filters put in place by telco companies that would ordinarily block this type of message from getting through.

The FluBot malware has already infected devices in Europe, after Android users clicked on the links in the messages and installed the FluBot app, which is only available outside of the official Google PlayStore.

Even though iPhones can still receive the messages, the FluBot malware doesn't pose a threat to iOS users because they can only download and install files directly from the Apple store.

Once installed on an Android device, the FluBot can take over to spy and steal data. Of particular concern is its ability to overlay on top of a legitimate banking app, leading the victim to a scammer's site instead of their


own bank. FluBot can also access your contact list, meaning your friends and family may also start receiving the bogus messages.

While phishing scams aren't new, they are on the rise. As of August 2021, figures from WA ScamNet reveal 81 victims have lost more than \$904,000 to phishing scams. This is compared to 65 victims with almost \$305,000 in losses for the whole of 2020.

- Never click on links in messages you are not expecting.
- Don't download apps outside of official app stores and
- Installing anti-virus software on your phone.

If you have installed the FluBot app, it is recommended to do a factory reset on your device to remove the malware. Avoid doing a 'restore' on your phone to retrieve lost apps and files, as this may reinstate the malware.

New Farm Working Visa

The federal government will introduce a dedicated agriculture visa to help fill a COVID-induced labour shortage across the farming, fisheries and forestry sectors.

The Australian Agriculture visa, aimed at enticing Pacific and Southeast Asian workers, is not capped and will include pathways towards permanent residency and regional resettlement.

It is unclear at this stage which countries will sign up for the visa.

It will operate from September 21, ahead of the next harvest, and comes in addition to the existing Seasonal Worker Programme and Pacific Labour Scheme, considered highly successful by the government.

"This is the biggest structural reform to Australian agricultural labour in our nation's history," Agriculture Minister David Littleproud told the ABC

"There are some features to this that are particularly going towards the heart of structural change that the agricultural industry in regional Australia have been asking for so long," he said.

He warned current coronavirus border closures, which have seen the number of working holiday visa holders decline, had left the agriculture sector which now faces a 30,000 worker shortage.

"Most of our meat processing sectors are running around 60 to 70 per cent capacity at the moment, because they simply don't have the people to do the jobs," Mr Littleproud explained.

"Australians get first crack at these jobs but it's important to understand that farmers have been patient but they can wait no longer when they need to get their crop off."

The government forecasts the number of Pacific and Timorese workers in Australia will double to over 24,000 under the scheme.

Due to the ongoing pandemic, all workers will need to be quarantined, adding additional constraints on bringing in Pacific workers.

Mr Littleproud said the federal government was working with states and territories to ensure workforce needs can be met while abiding with strict caps on international arrivals.

"The premiers and chief ministers all remained adamant they wanted to own the quarantine of agricultural workers, in addition to their caps," he said.

"Some states aren't living up to those caps at the moment. So, there is capacity within some of these states to take some of these workers, even within their hotel arrangements at the moment."

State governments have been encouraged by the federal government and industry to look at safe ways of bringing in workers, including on-farm or in-country quarantine programs.

"We're just hoping that the states will act with a level of maturity and opportunity," Mr Littleproud said.

"If it wasn't for resources and agriculture, our economy would be bugged during COVID-19. They kept on making a quid for this nation and we need to repay that now with courage and conviction."

The Australian announcement follows moves from New Zealand to expand its travel bubble to Tonga, Samoa and Vanuatu, allowing season workers to travel without two weeks quarantine to help address agriculture labour shortages.

In January, the state of Victoria struck a deal with Tasmania to allow seasonal workers to quarantine there before travelling to the mainland, to help fill gaps in the workforce.

Orange School Bus Service Review

The Isolated Children's Parents' Association of WA (ICPA WA) welcomes the news that the Minister for Transport has referred the School Bus Services policy to a parliamentary committee for review.

State President, Sally Brindal said "it is welcome news for families throughout WA. ICPA WA have been requesting a review into the School Bus Policy for quite sometime."

"Rural and regional families rely heavily on the Orange School Buses transport assistance program for educational access.

In recent times ICPA WA have received numerous concerns from member families regarding the current policy. Many issues received have related to the complimentary and eligible status of children utilising the bus services, as well as school bus routes and safety concerns.

Families are discovering that within the one family business the eligibility for transport assistance to the same school can differ for each family unit depending upon where their residence is located. This is causing a great deal of anxiety to families as their children are separated from their traditional communities.

Access to education is a crucial factor when attracting

new families to our already diminishing communities and it is imperative that the School Bus Services policy meets the needs of Western Australian families and reflects the way rural schools and rural communities have changed since the last policy review in 1999".

"We thank the Minister for Transport, Hon. Rita Saffioti, MLA for her commitment to conduct a full review into the current regulations and guidelines for School Bus Services (SBS).

ICPA WA are grateful the inquiry will consult widely with regional Western Australia and encourage all interested parties to make a submission to the inquiry when it opens," Ms Brindal said. ICPA will continue to advocate for regional parents and students in accessing education. Education is a core role of the WA State Government, as such we appreciate their ongoing commitment.
