CWA President Mrs Annie Slarke welcomed everyone and International Officer Mrs Elsie Bishop gave a brief talk on Tibet; unfortunately the Lake Grace branch was unable to source anyone local who had travelled to Tibet. However invited guest on the day, Debbie Clarke, had been fortunate enough to attend the Dalai Lama's recent speaking engagement in Perth. Debbie being organised had taken notes and was able to regale those present with some of the wisdom imparted by the Dalai Lama.

Highly educated, the Dalai Lama is exiled from his own country and travels the world raising awareness of Tibet and the trouble it faces while helping people understand the need for compassion, tolerance and forgiveness. Tibetans are a gentle people with a strong connection to their religion and the natural environment.

Lunch in Tibet...(cont)

Bordering Nepal, Tibet shares Mt Everest; it is also the source of several major rivers including the Yangtze, Mekong and Ganges. It is a desolate country subject to high temperatures in summer and intense cold in the winter. The bleak desolation is unrelieved by any vegetation bigger than a low bush and where wind sweeps unchecked across vast expanses of arid plain; aside from the mountains and rivers it sounds a bit like some of the wheatbelt landscape!


The Tibetan Empire emerged in the 7th Century, however a desolate landscape wasn't enough to keep marauders at bay and the Tibetan people have been under siege throughout the centuries. In 1951 Tibet became an unwilling part of the Peoples Republic of China and in 1959 their government was abolished following a failed uprising.

The Tibetan economy is dominated by subsistence agriculture. Due to limited arable land, the primary occupation of the Tibetan Plateau is raising livestock, such as sheep, cattle, goats, camels, yaks, dzo, and horses. The main crops grown are barley, wheat, buckwheat, rye, potatoes, and assorted fruits and vegetables.

Religion is extremely important to the Tibetans and has a strong influence over all aspects of their lives. Bön is the ancient religion of Tibet, but has been almost eclipsed by Tibetan Buddhism, a distinctive form of Mahayana and Vajrayana, which was introduced into Tibet from the Sanskrit Buddhist tradition of northern India. Prior to the 1950's 10%-20% of Tibetan men were monks.

But now it's back to the menu; a starter for lunch was red lentil soup. The main course was momos with sepen. What's that I hear you ask....dumplings with a spicy sauce, chillies being the primary ingredient of the sauce. Remembering that those present were more used to a western diet the CWA ladies went easy on the chillies and filled the water carafes on the tables. The dumplings featured a selection of fillings; vegetable, beef and chicken. Dessert was Dresil with golden raisins; dresil being sweet rice.

The lunch was a wonderful opportunity to get out of our own environment and with Croatia being CWA's International country of choice for 2016 I'm sure the ladies will be very busy studying over the next few months.

By now, I am sure you have all heard the news that Henriette and I will be leaving Lake Grace at the end of October.

Reflecting on 4 years of work in Lake Grace has left us with a very positive impression of the Lake Grace, Newdegate, Lake King and Varley communities. I also had the opportunity to render a service to Hyden, Kulin and Kondinin and the towns to the South of Lake Grace. This includes Pingrup and Nyabing to the south and Kukerin to the west.

We are fortunate to have met so many wonderful people who extended their hospitality to us and have invited us into their homes. We went camping with some of you and enjoyed a Kimberley safari in 2013. You taught me the rules of "footy." I, coming from rugby playing countries like New Zealand and South Africa, even started to like the game.

I shared in the joy of Lake Grace winning the finals in 2012, and the excitement when Newdegate reached the finals last year. I know you were the better team, but in the finals, things can go wrong. We have been witnesses to a demonstration of wonderful family life and family structures seldom found in modern societies. We talked about the good relationships between parents and their children and the excellent interpersonal skills of the young people in the Shire of Lake Grace. We were witnesses to a group of young people who are not afraid to make eye contact, who can conduct a conversation with adults and radiate confidence in their everyday lives.

We were part of the "mini population explosion "in the region. Much to our delight (as grandparents), you allowed us to cuddle your babies and share in your joy, and sometimes in your sadness. We are proud of the excellent parenting skills of our young parents.

As a GP, I can honestly say that the last 4 years, although full on, were some of my best years as a GP. There were some stressful times in the Lake Grace Hospital, when we had to deal with very sick patients, but it all contributed to a very fulfilling experience. I had the opportunity to do some procedures that I had not done for many years, and that gave me an opportunity to re-live my younger days as a GP in South Africa. It certainly added to my bunch of grey hair. Luckily it did not lead to hair loss!

To the staff at the Lake Grace Hospital, who tried to make my life as easy as possible, I shall forever be thankful. Even though I was practically on call for 24 hours per day, 7 days a week, it was a great pleasure. I can honestly say that they have given 110% of their effort to make things run smoothly. I always felt I had your full support and backup. I appreciated your common sense and practical knowledge, which sadly, have been smothered by

bureaucracy. A special thanks to the domestic staff who saved me from starvation whenever Henriette went away. Also for the morning tea refreshments.

To St John Ambulance, our Lake Grace crew and the Newdegate team of Gary and his men and women, my sincere thanks. I wonder if there is ever enough appreciation for the work you do? Your dedication and friendliness, even in the middle of the night, or sometimes early morning, always encouraged me, and I can only speak highly of you. All this commitment for the love of it.

To my staff at the medical centre, I always felt that "I just worked there". Amongst Henriette, Debbie, Vicki and Caroline, they had everything under control. During our time of having the dispensary they were a most efficient team. I was frequently reminded by patients that my wife is actually better at getting blood and they did not bruise when she bled them. Quite humbling!

I will miss the Pingrup races and all the fun going with it. I managed to predict some of the winners, but never put money on them.

To the Shire of Lake Grace, thank you for the house, car and rooms that we used free of charge. An attempt to secure a doctor for Lake Grace has unfortunately not been successful so far, but I am sure the right person will soon show up.

To the farmers of the region, the best of luck. I can honestly say that I have brought good fortunes to the region. Arriving in 2011, after 2 years of drought, it started to rain and by the looks of it, it may just be 3 good years in a row! May there be many, many more. No, I do not have divine powers!

We shall remember the South West as an amazing area with some of the best beaches and scenery found anywhere.

So goodbye to you all, but I am sure there is a good chance that you will see us again.

Botanica—Exhibition

John E. Maloney's exhibition *Botanica* is a collection of fine art photography bringing to life the beautiful flowers which were first collected in the late 18th and early 19th Centuries around the Australian coast.

Maloney is drawn to photograph Banksias because they are a way of "preserving rare natural history, and capturing the intricate beauty, in fine detail, of the world around us." – John E. Maloney

This artist's macro photographs depict the rich diversity of Australian flora. The exhibition transports the viewer back to the early 1770's when botanists Joseph Banks (in NSW) and later Robert Brown (in WA) landed on Australian soil and collected samples of previously unknown species of plants. The audience may wonder, as Banks and Brown did, over the variety and splendour of the genus that was named after the botanical explorer and supporter of Australia's early settlement. Maloney has captured the unique characteristics of 16 species of Banksia in *Botanica* along with a series of abstracted images focusing on finer details of Banksia blooms and flowering cacti.

Wills and Scams

It may seem a long way down the track, perhaps at this stage of your life it seems like something that only happens to 'old' people however the reality is that we all die. Vanessa Hillerman from Albany Legal Service was in Lake Grace last week to remind us of this enduring fact and that we all need to prepare for it.

Of course as the old adage goes, once you're dead your problems are over but in too many cases this is when the problems start for the family left behind. A will is a very important document and is your voice beyond the grave. Vanessa stated that too few people understand the painful reality of an outof-date will, no will (intestate), poorly written will or an old one which they have scribbled over thinking that will be okay. Will kits are alright if your estate is very simple, ie no properties, shares or dependants. However Vanessa said too many of these have been made null and void because they haven't been

signed, witnessed correctly or dated - this results in a slow trip through the court system.

Vanessa emphasised the importance of individuals discussing their wishes with their families and that communication can alleviate the potential problems in the future. Albany Legal Service do outreach work and travel to Katanning fortnightly and are always eager to form relationships in outlying communities.

Following Vanessa's presentation Iris Thomas from the Department of Commerce talked about warranties, contracts of purchase and scams. Few people understand warranties and that when an item is purchased, your contract of purchase is with the retailer you purchased the item from, not the manufacturer.

Iris has seen where some people have got themselves in some very unfortunate positions purely because they did not understand contracts or their rights as a customer. Iris cited a young girl signing purchase contracts on three different cars in three different car yards in one morning, thinking she was able to ring up and say she was no longer interested in the first two. Iris also said it was very important when including a caveat on a contract that it was concise and detailed in what you meant and that it couldn't be misconstrued.

As part of her position with the Department of Commerce, Iris spends time travelling through the Great Southern region inspecting pricing and signage. Her pricing inspections include selecting items from shelves and ensuring they match the prices at the checkout.

Aggressive salesman and those taking advantage of the vulnerable are of particular concern for Iris and she implores that if unsure, don't sign anything.

Scams are an ongoing issue and the creativity and brazenness of the scammers never ceases to amaze. A scammer will keep a record of who they have scammed, call them back later pretending to be the Department of Commerce and saying that they have noticed that there has been unusual financial activity and that they are concerned that you have been scammed. The victim quite relieved that someone is sympathetic to their plight then unwittingly gives out more personal details and gets cleaned out a second time.

Iris said that if anyone rings and you suspect it is a scam simply hang up on them, don't bother engaging with them at all. If they say they're from the ATO and you're wanting to 'check up on them', don't call them back on the number they have given, locate the number for the ATO through the phone book and ask if anyone from the ATO has contacted you recently. Scamming has turned into quite a slick profession and what may look like an Australian phone number actually isn't; it's simply the scammer using VOIP (Voice Over Internet Protocol).

New Orchid Species Add to WA Plant Diversity

Seventeen new types of spider orchids have been discovered in Western Australia's south-west region, Australia's only internationally-recognised global biodiversity hotspot.

Department of Parks and Wildlife herbarium curator Kevin Thiele said the new orchids were found in areas throughout the south-west from north of Geraldton to east of Esperance.

He said the orchids had recently been formally named in a journal published by the WA Herbarium, highlighting the enormous variety of plant species known to exist in the region.

"This is a significant achievement – it's not every day 17 new types of spider orchids are named," Dr Thiele said.

The newly named spider orchids are all from the genus *Caladenia* and include 11 separate species and six subspecies.

"There are now 158 identified spider orchids in WA, the vast majority of them found only in the south-west, reinforcing the State's reputation for its amazing diversity of flora," Dr Thiele said.

"This discovery also adds greatly to the understanding of spider orchids by botanists and the wider community, who may have them growing on their properties."

"By knowing the distinguishing features of these species we may be able to show that orchids we thought to be rare may actually be more widely found and distributed."

Western Australia has one of the highest rates of new plant species discoveries in the world, with an average of more than 50 a year.

Parks and Wildlife staff member Andrew Brown and WA Herbarium research associate Garry Brockman identified and named the new species.

Information about the new orchids has been published in the current edition of WA's botanical journal *Nuytsia*.



Advance Health Directive

Advance Health Directive

An Advance Health Directive (AHD) is a legal document, which contains your decisions about future treatment (treatment decision) and can only be completed while you have the ability to make and communicate decisions (i.e. you have 'capacity'). As soon as you no longer have capacity, you are no longer able to complete an Advance Health Directive. It is also important to know that no one else can complete an Advance Health Directive for you once you have lost capacity.

Why should I consider making an Advance Health Directive?

You have the right to make decisions about your own health care and treatment. But what will happen if you're not able to make your choices known?

If you have chosen not to make an Advance Health Directive, a treatment decision will be made on your behalf in the event that you are unable to make the treatment decision for yourself. The treatment decision will be made by (in the following order of priority) your Enduring Guardian (if you have appointed one), your Guardian (if one has been appointed for you), or by a person responsible for you (such as your spouse, parent, child, sibling or unpaid carer)

An Advance Health Directive is a legal document in which you can set out in writing your decisions about future treatment. It will only come into effect if you are unable to make and communicate your own judgments about treatment later on.

'Treatment 'includes medical, surgical, palliative, dental and other health care.

When should I prepare an Advance Health Directive?

You can prepare one at any time, even when you are fit and well. You must be at least 18 years of age and have capacity i.e. you are capable of understanding the nature and effect of your Advance Health Directive. You may lack capacity if your decision making is impaired, for example, by reason of illness, disease or injury, or the effects of medication, drugs or alcohol. If you have any doubts about your capacity to make an effective Advance Health Directive, you should ask your doctor for an assessment.

How do I go about preparing an Advance Health Directive?

You can make an Advance Health Directive by completing a form available from the Western Australia Department of Health, You can also obtain a booklet

called, Preparing an Advance Health Directive, to assist you through this process by telephoning 9222 2300.

You may consider asking your doctor to witness your AHD. In this way, any future doctor(s) looking after you will know that you have been assisted by your doctor to make an informed decision about your future care and that you were aware of the effects of your decisions. Alternatively, you can write on your AHD the details of the doctor you have spoken to. For further information phone: 9222 2300.

Hierarchy of Decision Makers


Many people believe that their next-of-kin has authority to give or refuse consent for their treatment. This is incorrect. The hierarchy of decision makers is designed so that those who are most likely to know your beliefs and wishes are given the most authority to make decisions on your behalf.

If a person identified as being a decision maker is not contactable/readily available or declines to make a decision, the health professional needs to contact the next person in the hierarchy of decision makers.

If your treating health professional does not acknowledge (or accept) your partner, as your decision maker, your partner should contact the State Administrative Tribunal (SAT). You can contact SAT by visiting their website http://www.sat.justice.wa.gov.au/ or telephone: 1300 306 017 (cost of a local call).

Please note that de facto includes same sex partners.

You can prevent those people you do not want involved in your care from having a say by appointing an Enduring Guardian.

The St John Ambulance WA Ltd - Lake Grace Sub Centre, wish to advise the community that the Lotterywest - Work Places Grant Application, was unsuccessful in gaining Lotterywest Board Support at their late July meeting. The grant application was for \$242,000.

On the 4th August 2015, senior management from St John Ambulance met with senior management of Lotterywest to discuss the future of this project. It was decided by both organisations, that the project should be placed in the hands of Mark Tap (Grants Officer, St John Ambulance WA Ltd) and Faye Baxter (Lotterywest) for the project to be re-written, with a stronger emphasis on volunteer wellbeing. It is planned that the application will go back to the Lotterywest Board, for re-consideration at the end of September 2015.

The original grant was written with the focus on community benefit as required, and submitted in February 2015.

The project funding by Royalties for Regions - Regional Grant Scheme of \$110,340 is contingent upon Lotterywest also contributing to the project. Without Lotterywest support the R4R monies do not flow either. The R4R application was submitted in December2014.

The estimated project cost stands at \$850K. We, the community, are directly contributing \$350K cash to the project. There is also a further \$52K of donated services or pledges of materials/services committed. The balance of the project was requested 50/50 from R4R and Lotterywest.

Warriors Wellbeing - Put Yourself Over the Pits. What is the Fast Track Pit Stop?

A lot of blokes would appreciate the hard work and effort that goes into maintaining something we love; whether it's a new car, a valued piece of machinery, or our weekend toys (boat, motorbike). If we don't service and look after our machines regularly it will eventually affect their performance and easy fix problems may be compounded, and will end up costing us time and money.

So why is this any different to our wellbeing and health? To put it simply if we neglect our wellbeing and health (whether it be physical, mental or social/spiritual) it will eventually catch up with us and could cost us more than just time and money. Do we think about the way this flows on to affect other facets of our lives, whether it be our relationships (family, work or business), loss of function or participation in the things we enjoy?

It is important to recognise that the ageing process throws up all sorts of changes and complications. Sometimes illness and diseases can't be avoided, however, something as simple as a "routine service visit" or discussion with your GP or treating health professional may assist in the early detection and prevention of certain health and wellbeing issues.


At RMHI we have a simple but effective program that aims to empower men and communities to take responsibility for their wellbeing and health. The Fast Track Pit Stop is related to the servicing of a vehicle and is a non-clinical, non-invasive way of helping men become more aware and take charge of their own health and wellbeing. It involves a 3 Point Health Awareness Check:

Waist Measurement/Chassis: A waistline of more than 102cm (men) and 88cm (women) gives us an increased risk of developing Type 2 Diabetes, some cancers, stroke, heart disease and high blood pressure. Long term storage of internal fat surrounding the heart, liver, pancreas and kidneys is just one indicator.

Blood Pressure/Oil Pressure: According to the Heart Foundation, high blood pressure is one of the main risk factors for heart disease, stroke and blood vessel disease. So it's important to firstly know your blood pressure, but also take steps to manage it if it's getting high.

Coping Skills/Shockies: We are all affected by life's ups and downs, participants are given 10 questions to help identify stress levels. Encouraging communication and help seeking is part of the problem solving process.

We think it's about being there, allowing blokes to have a conversation, and listening. Life is hectic, people are busy, but it's about taking a minute to sit down, have a break and think about OUR health and wellbeing.

All in a Days Work at Lake Grace Hospital

They say, 'if you can't take the heat get out of the kitchen', but the cooks at Lake Grace Health Service have shown they have the tenacity to operate in their temporary transportable kitchen as they wait for their modern new kitchen to be built.

WA Country Health Service Wheatbelt's Redevelopment Project Officer, Sheldon Paice, said the building upgrades at Lake Grace Health Service are well underway and due to be finished by the end of the year.

"As part of the refurbishments, Lake Grace Health Service will be upgraded with a modernised kitchen that meets the highest standards of safe food practices," Mr Paice said.

"The old kitchen has been completely gutted, leaving nothing but the original brickwork. The kitchen will be rebuilt and include brand new equipment including a combination thermal induction oven, gas hot plates, stainless steel work benches, commercial refrigerator and a new dishwasher.

Health Services Manager, Colleen Hopkins, said the transition to the temporary kitchen in June had gone without a hitch.

"The cooks haven't missed a beat, the transition from the old kitchen to the temporary kitchen which is about a quarter of the size, has been very smooth," Ms Hopkins said. "The kitchen continues to produce meals for both our patients and our customers who receive Home and Community Care services such as Meals on Wheels."

In addition to a new kitchen, the Lake Grace Health Service will also benefit from a refurbished emergency department, as well as a new reception, administration, general office, waiting area and toilets.

The Lake Grace Health Service redevelopment is funded by the State Government's Royalties for Regions as part of the half a billion dollar Southern Inland Health Initiative being delivered by the WA Country Health Service.

The Southern Inland Health Initiative capital works program is more extensive and complex than any project previously undertaken by the WA Country Health Service, with new builds and upgrades to 37 hospitals and health services in the Wheatbelt, South West, Great Southern and Midwest.

In the Wheatbelt, Merredin, Northam and Narrogin hospitals are being redeveloped as well as upgrades to 23 small hospitals and health centres across the region, including the Lake Grace Health Service.

Bits & Pieces

Cast your mind back to the 16th July Edition of the Lakes Link News and you may recall in that edition we touched on the topic of 'The Origins of Todays Saying'. It appears from the feedback that many people enjoyed not only a chance to become more educated but also where these sayings originated from. So to keep you the reader happy, let's take another history lesson and see if you know the origins of the following

'To freeze the b**ls off a brass monkey'

The story goes that cannonballs used to be stored aboard ship in piles, on a brass frame or tray called a 'monkey'. In very cold weather the brass would contract, spilling the cannonballs: hence very cold weather is 'cold enough to freeze the balls off a brass monkey'. There are several problems with this story, as follows:

- •the term 'monkey' is not otherwise recorded as the name for such an object
- •the rate of contraction of brass in cold temperatures is unlikely to be fast enough to cause the reputed effect
- •the phrase is actually first recorded as 'freeze the tail off a brass monkey', which removes any essential connection with balls.

It therefore seems most likely that the phrase is simply a humorous reference to the fact that metal figures will become very cold to the touch in cold weather.

The term 'Love' meaning 'Nil' in tennis

It seems to have been adapted from the phrase 'to play for love (of the game)' (i.e. to play for nothing). Although the theory is often heard that it represents the French word *l'oeuf*, meaning 'an egg' (from the resemblance between an egg and a nought) this seems unlikely.

The phrase 'hair of the dog'

The expression the hair of the dog, for an alcoholic drink taken to cure a hangover, is a shortening of 'a hair of the dog that bit you'. It comes from an old belief that someone bitten by a rabid dog could be cured of rabies by taking a potion containing some of the dog's hair. The correlation suggests that, although alcohol may be to blame for the hangover (as the dog is for the attack), a smaller portion of the same will, paradoxically, act as a cure. There is, it should be added, no scientific evidence that the cure for either a hangover or rabies actually works.

The origin of 'pros and cons'

The phrase 'pros and cons' is an abbreviation of the Latin phrase pro et contra, 'for and against', and has been in use in the abbreviated form since the 16th century, according to the Oxford English Dictionary.

'Pros and cons' is a well-established standard usage; Oxford's larger dictionaries do not mark it as 'informal' or in any way restricted in use. The much longer alternative is the phrase 'arguments for and against'.

The origin of the term 'Flea market'

Flea market comes from the French marché aux puces, a name originally given to a market in Paris which specialized in shabby second-hand goods of the kind that might contain fleas. The earliest English use that the 20-volume Oxford English Dictionary has found dates from 1922.

Where did the word 'loo' originate?

There are several theories about the origin of this informal British term for a toilet. The first, and most popular, is that it derived from the cry of 'gardyloo' (from the French *regardez l'eau* 'watch out for the water'), which was shouted by medieval servants as they emptied chamber pots out of upstairs windows into the street. This is historically problematic, since by the time the term 'loo' is recorded, the expression 'gardyloo' was long obsolete.

A second theory is that the word derives from a polite use of the French term *le lieu* ('the place') as a euphemism. Unfortunately, documentary evidence to support this idea is lacking.

A third theory refers to the trade name 'Waterloo', which appeared prominently displayed on the iron cisterns in many British outhouses during the early 20th century. This is more credible in terms of dates, but evidence is still hard to find. Various other colourful theories also circulate, involving references to doors numbered '00' or people called 'Looe'.

And finally.... One terminology which irks and rubs me the wrong way is the constant use of 'ok'. It appears no matter what language you are speaking, what form of communication is being used, (be it television, computers or written dialogue) the term 'ok' is becoming more and more prominently used. So where did it originate from? The following explanation may enlighten you.

There have been numerous attempts to explain the emergence of this expression, which seems to have swept into popular use in the US during the mid-19th century. Most of them are pure speculation. It does not seem at all likely, from the linguistic and historical evidence, that it comes from the Scots expression *och aye*, the Greek *ola kala* ('it is good'), the Choctaw Indian *oke* or *okeh* ('it is so'), the French *aux Cayes*

('from Cayes', a port in Haiti with a reputation for good rum) or *au quai* ('to the quay', as supposedly used by French-speaking dockers), or the initials of a railway freight agent called Obediah Kelly who is said to have written them on documents he had checked.

A more likely explanation is that the term originated as an abbreviation of *orl korrekt*, a jokey misspelling of 'all correct' which was current in the US in the 1830s. The oldest written references result from its use as a slogan by the Democratic party during the American Presidential election of 1840. Their candidate, President Martin Van Buren, was nicknamed 'Old Kinderhook' (after his birthplace in New York State), and his supporters formed the 'OK Club'. This undoubtedly helped to popularize the term (though it did not get President Van Buren re-elected).

The only other theory with at least a degree of plausibility is that the term originated among Black slaves of West African origin, and represents a word meaning 'all right, yes indeed' in various West African languages. Unfortunately, historical evidence enabling the origin of this expression to be finally and firmly established may be hard to unearth.

The R4R grant was short by \$132K from what was requested. However in a significant gesture, the St John Ambulance - Newdegate Sub Centre have offered to "short fund" the \$132K. What this means is that the Newdegate Sub Centre will loan to the Lake Grace Sub Centre \$132K, should the \$242K from Lotterywest be forthcoming. Essentially the Newdegate Sub Centre sees this project as so important that they don't want a funding shortfall to see the project fail (the offer is subject the St John Ambulance CEO - Tony Ahern approving the offer). In the meantime the Lake Grace Sub Centre has been attempting to crowd fund from within the St John Ambulance Sub Centre network (100 sub centres) to gain their financial support.

We are proud to announce that the Wundowie Sub Centre have pledged \$15K to the Lake Grace Project and the Boddington Sub Centre have pledged \$20K to the project. These pledges now mean that the offer from the Newdegate Sub Centre can be reduced by \$35K to \$97K. We are continuing with this internal crowd funding project.

It is fair to say that the delay in gaining Lotterywest financial support at this time is a significant setback for the project. And we are now asking for your help

We are actively seeking financial pledges and pledges for the donation of materials and/or services for this project.

Your volunteers can no longer safely, or effectively deliver an ambulance service from the building they currently occupy.

Young Men – Do you want to be branded with an 'Indecent Assault' offence?

Please be very clear - if you inappropriately touch a female you may be charged with 'Indecent Assault' or worse. Do you really want to be branded with that type of offence against your name for the rest of your life just because you had too much to drink and didn't have enough respect for a young lady to keep your hands to yourself?

Ask your Mum, ask your family if that's what they'd want for you?

I absolutely acknowledge that I'm talking about a small minority regarding this behaviour but I wouldn't be doing my job if I didn't bring it to public attention. The high majority of the young men in our communities are fine young men who have been raised with good morals and values, which is more reason for me to speak up about these albeit isolated incidents.

Enough of setting the scene. Here is one of the real life examples that I'm talking about that happened right here in Lake Grace recently and involved some of our football players.

A lovely young lady visiting Australia from overseas obtained some casual work here. She was kindly invited to a post football game function at a liquor outlet and excitedly accepted in good faith looking forward to enjoying a night out with people her own age. Later in the night she's standing at the bar with her back turned waiting to be served when someone touches her bottom – strokes her bum. She turns around to see a group of about six football players standing behind her with stupid smiles on their faces likes it's a big joke. Despite her obvious upset and quiet protest to them it happened again straight after. She complained to some local girls about what had happened to her and they dismiss the behaviour as a bit of a joke.

Let me be very clear to you all, this young lady was genuinely upset and aggrieved by the behaviour and had every right to be. She was indecently assaulted that night, twice. She was and is to this day, a victim and was so upset and felt so disrespected.

She didn't initially approach police to report the matter but we heard about it and later took her report and complaint. She wasn't so much interested in reprisals as she was about trying to ensure that it didn't happen to other young ladies, who like her, wouldn't think it was okay to be treated in that manner. Unlike in other parts of the world, Western Australia doesn't have a statute of limitations on such serious offences and the person or persons responsible could be charged at any time in the future.

I investigated at the time but didn't have the evidence to pursue the matter. Had there been a witness prepared to stand up for this young lady, or some CCTV footage, I wouldn't hesitate to initiate charges.

Since that report there have been two other similar incidents that have come to my notice. One involved a shearer in Lake Grace who groped a female worker and touched her inappropriately and another football player who inappropriately and unlawfully touched a young lady, again at a licensed premises.

There is also no statute of limitations on the offence of common assault.

While the specific behaviours involve a minority I raise it now so that all young men in our community are aware and understand that this behaviour isn't okay and that they are playing with fire. It's not okay in general, it's not okay just because you're with your mates, it's not okay just because you've consumed alcohol, and it's not okay just because the odd young lady thinks it's a bit of harmless fun and/or a compliment.

It won't wash as an excuse to us or in Court to say – "well I'd been drinking, and/or, I've done it to other girls and they haven't complained".

I repeat - the lovely, shy young lady from overseas that was the subject of an indecent assault in our community felt very hurt, felt violated, and felt disrespected. All because she dared to venture out to a licensed premises to socialize with some people her own age.

I've made inquiries and know that this type of behaviour happens in other rural towns and of course in Perth. Be

that as it may, my immediate concern is for the young ladies coming into our communities, Lake Grace and Newdegate, and also for the young men who for whatever reason think that this behaviour is just some harmless fun. Be advised that it could blow up in your face and have serious repercussions for all parties for life.

To the slightly more mature young men in our community, please make sure you are setting a good example for the younger men to follow in this regard and certainly not the opposite. Speak out against allowing young ladies to be subjected to such treatment simply because they are in a licensed premises where some young men have had too much to drink.

Attracting committed members is an issue many sporting clubs are facing, however, the tennis club is particularly hard hit. With the 2015/16 tennis season approaching, the current committee is concerned that it won't have enough players to field the pennants team. The pennant season runs from the end of October through to March, with a total of six matches played in this time. The season breaks from mid December through to the end of January to account for harvest and holidays, so it is not a huge commitment. Both the ladies and men's teams require six players each.

Continuing on from this issue, is the possibility of the annual Junior Tennis Tournament being forced into recess, due to the lack of support from the community. Last year, the tournament was cancelled due to low numbers, and it was particularly disappointing that there were only two nominations from Lake Grace junior players. Whilst a lot of children access the coaching provided by Keith O'Brien, which is subsidised by both the Lake Grace and Tarin Rock Tennis clubs, that is where it ends for many potential players.

The concept of playing in a tournament may seem daunting to many children. It is however, through the experience of a tournament that an individual will develop their skills. It is not the outcome, but the process which is important, and being involved in a tournament not only provides an opportunity to apply skills learnt, but it teaches tennis etiquette, correct scoring and knowledge of the rules. It is also an opportunity for a child to play an individual sport, which may be a new experience for them. The tournament has been running successfully for many years, and it would be disappointing to see it recessed.

Finally, the Lake Grace Tennis Club would like to extend our heartfelt thanks to outgoing President Ross Bowron. Ross has dedicated a huge amount of his time to the LGTC and has been committed ambassador to the development of tennis in Lake Grace. We would like to congratulate Ross on receiving his Life Membership of the Lake Grace Tennis Club, and it is our intention to formally celebrate Ross' achievement with him in the near future.

An excerpt from Ross' President's report highlights these concerns:



The tennis season of 2014/15 was very similar to the previous season, our numbers participating are just enough to field a Pennant side, run the Club and do some basic fundraising.

Despite Kristy Stanton's best efforts the Lake Grace Junior Tournament didn't attract enough entries to go ahead for the second year in a row. Although the 2013 Tournament was cancelled due to extreme expected heat conditions, we are in danger of losing this long running tournament if we don't all push it back into everyone's field of vision .

I ran ladies midweek night coaching, aimed at beginners, and although we only got five nights in due to windy or rainy conditions, the girls all showed improvement and we have potentially gained three new members to the club. I hope someone will continue to develop this area,

Social tennis was very quiet, almost non existent, we had some reasonable turnouts on Thursday nights for doubles, but otherwise struggled to fill more than two courts. We need to involve Juniors more, especially those 12 yrs and older. We have to look outside the arena of who we think would be a good tennis player and embrace anyone who wants to have a go.

Our Pennant season was fairly forgettable, I think we only won one round. We were reasonably competitive but lacked practice and a full strength line up. Thank you to Alex and Lauren Duckworth for doing the Mens & Ladies captains jobs again this year. I appreciate that quite a few of the players have young families so just being able to field a side and not forfeit is important. If everyone is enjoying themselves that is the main thing.

In conclusion I would like to say that I have enjoyed my years of involvement with the Lake Grace Tennis Club as a player, office bearer and ambassador. I feel I am handing a club over that is not in a good position, and feel like a captain leaving a sinking ship. Having said that I know that it is time for younger people with drive and fresh ideas to take control. I wish you all the best of luck, I remain a friend of the Tennis Club for life and if I am able to help out in anyway it would be my pleasure.





A record 272 teams participated in the 2015 Smarter than Smoking Association Netball Championships held in Perth from Saturday 30 May to Monday 1 June.






