Jack and Lizzie Lay Family Reunion

Of the 187 descendents of Jack and Lizzie Lay spanning 4 generations, 90 attended an enjoyable get together at the Shire Hall on Sunday 25th September. This was followed on the Monday by a lunch gathering on the original family farm, Hazinelle, now managed by Ron and Bambi Lay.

There was also an opportunity to revisit the little Red School site which the original family attended. Rene Hooper who attended as a student was also the last teacher there and shared some history about the School during her times there.

People travelled from as far as Perth, Busselton, Albany, Esperance, Wongan Hills, Northampton, Geraldton, Katanning and Lake Grace.

The reunion marks 25 years since the death of both Jack and Lizzie, who died within 3 months of each other in 1980. Many early day photos surfaced and were on display in the Hall for all to see, as well as each Family Tree displayed and researched by Vynka Lay. A power point presentation of some more old photos also got people guessing who was who. It was amazing how everyone had grown (aged).

The Lay family was one of the early pioneering families in the area and in another six years it will be 100 years since Jack Lay first came to the area. Based on the success of this reunion, Ron Lay announced that it is planned to have another Reunion around this time which all thought was a great idea. Then the photos from this Reunion can be viewed to see how much more we've all grown.

Reports have already filtered back about how this was a very worthwhile thing to do. Many cousins had lost contact with each other and it was a great opportunity for some of the younger ones to meet each other for the first time.

To any other Lake Grace families thinking along similar lines we would highly recommend the experience. It was well worth it.



Graham Jacobs MLA Member for Roe

Transport operators ignored by Government

Operators face 167 per cent registration fee increase on top of high fuel prices

Member for Roe Dr Graham Jacobs has called for the Gallop Government to take responsibility for heavy haulage transport costs in the State.

Dr Jacobs called for Treasurer Mr Eric Ripper to give up some unbudgeted windfall, particularly from GST on fuel, and give some relief to transport operators.

“The transport operators in my region are hit with a ‘double whammy’ as they are looking down the barrel of 167 per cent increase in truck registration fees on top of the escalating fuel prices,” Dr Jacobs said.

“The government is refusing to do anything about the high fuel prices, but the situation with registration fees is deplorable.

“The thrust of the National Transport Commission’s (NTC) third determination that states truck registration fees need to be high to drive bulk commodities off road onto rail is not practical in WA where we have a rail system that can’t deliver.

“When called on to help transport operators in Parliament this week, the Treasurer’s responses were as lame as the Premier’s – both offered absolutely no help or hope for transport operators.

“Our Transport Minister should stand up for WA on this issue. No federal objection will be lodged if WA stands up for our road transport operators, as this NTC is not a federal organisation, but a conglomerate of transport ministers from other states.”





SCIENCE AND STUFF

MAMMOTH OZONE HOLE:

This year's seasonal hole in the ozone layer over Antarctica is the size of Europe, the largest breach since 2000 and the third-largest ever recorded. The 10-million-square kilometre hole was reported by the European Space Agency's Envisat satellite on 6th September.

HOW TO BREED SUPERBUGS:

Overuse of antibiotics really does drive the evolution of superbugs.. The Antibiotic Resistance, Prevention and Control project looked at 300 European hospitals and found that those using most antibiotics had the highest levels of methicillin-resistant *staphylococcus aureus*. Hospitals with tightest infection control, such as isolating patients with MRSA, had the lowest levels.

BLACK-AND-WHITE DINNER:

Ancient humans dined on giant pandas. Evidence from seven fossil sites suggests that pandas formed part of the human diet approximately 600,000 years ago. Today only about 1590 pandas live in the wild, most in mountainous areas in Sichuan, Shaanxi and Gansu provinces.



SIBERIAN BLAST LED TO MASS EXTINCTION:

The culprit in a global murder mystery may have finally been found. Huge volcanic eruptions that covered much of Siberia with lava were probably responsible for the worst mass extinction in the last half-billion years. Atmospheric carbon dioxide rose to 10 times today's levels, warming the surface of polar oceans and stalling global ocean circulation, which in turn starved marine life of oxygen. The mass extinctions 251 million years ago, at the end of the Permian period, wiped out 90 to 95 per cent of marine life and some 70 per cent of terrestrial life, but they have been hard to explain. One clue comes from marine rocks which show that at the time of the extinction, the ocean contained too little oxygen to support marine animals. With no evidence of a massive asteroid impact or other catastrophe, the prime suspect has been Siberian eruptions. Carbon dioxide concentrations at the end of the Permian era was 10 times that of modern times with land and sea temperatures about 8 degrees C warmer (Geology, vol 33, p 757).

SMELLY:

A new line in chewing gums and candy could leave you smelling of roses for 6 hours afterwards at least. Japanese firm Kanebo has developed confectionary containing rose or vanilla-scented chemicals that the body starts secreting 30 minutes after the treats are eaten. They found the most effective ingredients to be geraniol, extracted from roses, and vanillic aldehyde from vanilla.



PLAN TO SAVE THE DEAD SEA:

After three years of negotiation, the governments of Israel and Jordan, and the Palestinian Authority agreed

the first steps of a plan to refill the Dead Sea with the water from the Red Sea by carving out a 200-kilometre canal through the south of Jordan. The potential benefits of this highly ambitious plan is to use the 400-metre height difference between the two seas to generate hydropower, and build the World's largest desalination plant to supply communities around the Dead Sea with drinking water. The scheme would also help restore the area's biological diversity, which is being slowly choked as water levels drop. The Dead Sea, the lowest point on the Earth's surface, is surrounded by Israel, Jordan and the west bank. It has been receding by roughly 1 metre a year for the past three decades. Some estimate that it has half the quantity of water it did a century ago. It will cost at least \$4 billion to build. If the project fails to take off, and nothing is agreed to replace it, it will be an opportunity missed. If the Dead Sea is left as it is, a point may come when its name becomes obsolete. Some scientists reckon that as the waters continue to recede, the concentration of salts will become so high that evaporation will stop. If that happens, you won't have to be Jesus to walk across the Dead Sea.

TOXIC TRANSFER:

A report from the Netherlands says that before we are even born, our bodies may be riddled with pollution. More chemicals from everyday household products cross the placenta from mother to baby than we ever imagined. From 42 maternal blood samples and 27 samples of blood taken from the umbilical cord were analysed. For the first time, they found chemicals such as antibacterial agents, flame retardants and detergents in umbilical-cord blood. Traces of pesticides, artificial musk's and plasticisers also appeared. Concentrations of the antibacterial agent triclosan were higher in chord blood than in maternal blood, while maternal and chord blood had roughly equal concentrations of phthalates, which are used as plasticisers and are also found in ink, paint and cosmetics. All other chemicals were also present in lower concentrations in cord blood than in maternal blood found the study.



GOING APES:

After years of warnings that our closest cousins, the great apes, are on the brink of extinction, there is finally a collective will to halt their decline. For the first time, representatives from the governments of 23 countries in Africa and south-east Asia that the six species of the great ape call home, have met to discuss the creatures' fate. The call to action may have come too late, however. Last week, conservationists launched a major report in which they warn that great apes could disappear within a single generation.



Well, I've never met anyone from Hawaii, so I leaned out the window and gave him the good luck sign back.


My grandson burst out laughing, why even he was enjoying this religious experience.

190 Rings Up Big Bills

190 premium numbers are becoming the new scourge of regional residents.

Any phone, fax or SMS service that has 190 as the first three numbers is a premium phone service and can involve high charges, often up to \$5.50 per minute. These services are not illegal, but must show their name and the cost per minute or other applicable charges on their material. However 190 operators bank on consumers not reading the fine print.

Fax-backs are one of the most common forms of 190 scams where consumers are enticed into responding by fax machine to competitions, diets and employment opportunities. The goods or services on offer often have little value for the huge bills they generate, and the information can be obtained free through the Internet or local paper.

Some fax-back services use slow operating fax machines when there is a charge per minute for the call. One consumer reported a \$100 call charge when they responded to a fax-back offer to obtain a 'special diet'.

Some 190 competitions auto dial consumers' phones at random with a recorded message telling them to call a 190 number to win a car or other prize. These competitions are big traps and use a number of tricks to keep the consumer on the line and the money counter

ticking over. They ask complex questions and consumers have spent more than \$30 trying to win a car.

Small businesses and community groups have unknowingly become victims of 190 scams when staff and members use their phones to respond to these offers. Small businesses might consider contacting their telephone company to get a 190 'block' put on the phone.

SMS ring tones and 'chat' services have become very popular recently, especially with younger people. Many are not reading the terms and conditions of these offers, which often 'subscribe' them to an ongoing arrangement when they think they are buying just one ring tone for between \$2 to \$4.

One teenager reported being billed with more than \$1000 worth of mobile phone ring tones in 10 days, receiving up to 20 SMS messages a day, after ordering what he thought were two ring tones from an internet site. Consumer Protection has received more than sixty calls in two months from country consumers complaining about 190 premium phone numbers.

NIGHT WATCH



Welcome to Night Watch for the fortnight from midnight Friday 7th October, to midnight Friday 21st October. Remember, astronomy is looking up, and never look at the Sun without proper equipment.

This fortnight its goodbye to the planet Jupiter in the evening sky. There is a partial Eclipse of the Moon at moonrise in the evening of Monday 17th (new moon).

Our local star, the Sun, resides in the Constellation of Virgo shining at magnitude -26.7 all fortnight.

On Saturday evening the Moon at 21%, will be 0.2° north of the red star Antares (rival of mars). The Moon, on Tuesday 11th, will be at 1st quarter phase 53%, shining at magnitude -6.0. On Friday 14th at 10pm the Moon will be at Perigee (closest), at 365,449 kms from Earth at 84%. The full Moon at 100% visibility, will be at 8:04pm on Monday 17th at magnitude -12.0. The Moon is in Scorpius on Saturday, Ophiuchus on 9th, Sagittarius on 10th and 11th, Capricornus on 12th and 13th, Aquarius on 14th and 15th, Pisces on 16th, 17th and 18th, Aries on 19th and 20th, Taurus on Friday 21st.

Mercury, at magnitude -0.6 in Virgo, sets at 7:20pm on Saturday. On Friday 14th Mercury will be at Aphelion (furthest from the sun), at 69.7 million kilometres. Mercury on Saturday 15th will have moved into Libra. On Friday 21st Mercury at magnitude -0.4 sets at 8:02pm.

Shining at magnitude -4.3 in Libra, Venus sets at 9:52pm on Saturday and two minutes later on Sunday in Scorpius. Venus on Sunday 16th will have moved into Ophiuchus and on the 17th will be 1.6° (thumb at arms length), of the red star Antares. Venus sets at 10:12pm on Friday 21st.

The red planet Mars, in Taurus, rises at 9:02pm on Saturday and 8:58pm in Aries on Sunday. At 9pm on Wednesday 19th, Mars will be 5° south of the Moon. On Friday 21st, Mars rises at 8pm and reflects the Sun's rays at magnitude -1.8.

The giant gas planet Jupiter, in Virgo sets on Saturday at 7:02pm at magnitude -1.7 and sets four minutes earlier each evening, slowly disappearing into the

twilight sunset until next fortnight when it will rise in the morning twilight.

The ringed planet Saturn, in Cancer at magnitude +0.7, rises on Saturday at 2:30am and at 1:45am on Friday 21st.

The blue/green coloured planet Uranus, in Aquarius, sets at 4:05am on Saturday morning at magnitude +5.7. Uranus will be 3° north of the Moon on Friday 14th, and sets at 3:13am on Friday 21st.

The grey/green coloured planet Neptune, in Capricornus, sets at 2:52am on Saturday at magnitude +7.9. On Wednesday 12th Neptune will be 5° north of the Moon and sets at 2:04am on Friday 21st.

Pluto in the Constellation of Serpens Caput, at magnitude +13.9, sets at 11:08pm on Saturday and at 10:18pm on Friday 21st.

With the Moon in the night sky until Wednesday 19th when it rises just after Mars, it is a good time to check out the craters on the Moon and Venus.

Astronomers have found some Asteroids with a small moon, now they have found one with two moons.

Asteroid 87 Sylvia is one of the largest known from the asteroid belt, which is located between the orbits of Mars and Jupiter. Sylvia is shaped like a lumpy potato, and is about 280 kilometres in diameter.

The European Space Agency's Venus Express spacecraft is at the Baikonur launch site in Kazakhstan, preparing for a launch this or next month to our sister planet Venus. The mission will provide the most comprehensive study ever of the Venusian atmosphere. It will dig into mysteries such as the unexplained fast atmospheric rotation in four days around the planet and the polar balance. It will also study the global thermal balance and the role of the strongest 'greenhouse effect' found in the Solar System.

FIREBREAK NOTICE

Bushfires Act 1954

Notice to all Owners and Occupiers of Land in the Shire of Lake Grace.

Pursuant to the powers contained in section 33 of the above Act, you are hereby required on or before the first day of November up to and including the 31st day of March the following year, to have a firebreak clear of all inflammable material in accordance with the following:

(i) RURAL LAND

1. a) Immediately inside all external boundaries of the property or as is practicable, firebreaks of not less than 3 metres wide and
b) Where buildings, haystacks, fuel ramps, fuel tanks and stored fuel drums are situated on land, firebreaks of not less than 2.5 metres wide within 33.5 metres of the perimeter of such buildings, haystacks, fuel ramps, fuel tanks and stored fuel drums in such manner as to completely encircle the buildings, haystacks, fuel ramps, fuel tanks and stored fuel drums and;
2. Where land is in crop and adjoins the railway line reserve a firebreak of not less than 3 metres wide encircling the crop and;
3. a) Immediately surrounding an aerial landing ground situated on the land a firebreak of not less than 6 metres wide and;
b) Any aerial landing ground used as the motor start up, refuelling and maintenance area to be completely cleared of all flammable materials for a radius of 18 metres and;
4. Maintain clear of all flammable materials all townsite blocks and;
5. Where bush or land has been bulldozed, chained or prepared in any similar manner for clearing by burning (whether intended to burn the bush or not), provide a fire break of NOT LESS THAN 13 METRES WIDE inside the external boundaries of the land so prepared. If you become owner or occupier of land after the first day of November, 2005, the requirements of this notice are varied so as to require you to comply with the terms of this notice within fourteen days of the date of your becoming owner or occupier of such land, instead of on or before the first day of November, 2005. The firebreaks required by this notice are to be maintained clear of flammable materials up to and including the 31st day of March, 2006.
6. A readily mobile operational fire fighting unit containing a minimum of 400 litres of water on standby and available for inspection is required during the period 1 November 2005 to 31 March 2006.

(ii) TOWN LAND

1. Where the area of the land is 0.202 hectares (half an acre) or less all inflammable material on the land shall be removed from the whole of the land; and
2. Where the land exceeds 0.202 hectares (half an acre) in area, firebreaks at least 2 metres wide shall be cleared of all inflammable material immediately inside all external boundaries of the land and also immediately surrounding all buildings situated on the land.

GENERAL

If it is considered to be impracticable for any reason to clear firebreaks or to remove inflammable material from land or any other provisions required by this notice you may apply to the Council or its' duly authorised officer not later than 30 October, for permission to provide firebreaks in alternative positions or to take alternative action to abate fire hazards on the land. If permission is granted by Council or its' duly authorised officer, you shall comply with the requirements of this notice.

"Inflammable Material" is defined for the purpose of this Order to include bush (as defined in the Bush Fires Act), timber, boxes, cartons, paper and like inflammable materials, rubbish and also any combustible matter, but does not include green standing trees or growing bushes and plants in gardens, or lawns.

The penalty for failing to comply with this notice is a fine of not more than \$1,000 or a penalty of \$100 may be incurred by issue of an infringement notice, and a person in default is also liable, whether prosecuted or not, to pay the cost of performing the work directed in this notice if it is not carried out by the owner or occupier before the date required by this notice.

If the requirements of this notice are carried out by burning, such burning must be in accordance with the relevant provision of the Bush Fires Act. A permit to burn is required during the restricted burning period from an authorised officer. Permits are not valid on Sundays or public holidays.

HARVEST BANS AND MACHINERY MOVEMENT BANS

The following is a set of definitions and guidelines developed to permit the delivery and removal of farm produce when harvest and vehicle movement bans are imposed by the Shire of Lake Grace.

1. DEFINITIONS

The following definitions shall apply to the guidelines on the ban of vehicle and machinery movement and the operation of internal combustion engines under Regulation 38A and 38B of the Bush Fires Act.

Laneway/Roadway (non gazetted)

A laneway/roadway is defined as having a trafficable surface, free of all inflammable material, a minimum of four metres wide. Overhanging vegetation has to be pruned back so as to not come into contact with parts of a vehicle.

Registered On and Off Loading Area

A registered On and Off Loading area is defined as an area free of inflammable material, save live standing trees to a radius of 50 metres from the centre of the area - application forms are available from the Shire Office.

Mobile Fire Fighting Unit

A mobile fire fighting unit is defined as having a minimum water carrying capacity of four hundred (400) litres, fitted with a minimum of twenty (20) metres of nineteen (19) millimetre diameter fire fighting hose and pump capacity of delivering water through an adjustable nozzle in the spray and jet configurations.

Harvest Ban

A ban on the operation of all grain harvesting machines within the Shire or part of the Shire and during a time, as specified in a notice or broadcast (Reg 38A).

A Ban on the Movement of all Vehicles and Machinery and the Operation of Internal Combustion Engines.

A ban on the movement of all vehicles and machinery and the operation of internal combustion engines within the Shire or part of the Shire and during a time

as specified in a notice or broadcast (Reg 38A & 38B) with the exception of the movement of vehicles and machinery on constructed and gazetted roads and laneways.

2. PERMITTED ACTIVITIES

The following activities are permitted provided these comply with specified conditions.

1. Loading and off-loading of grain, fertilizer and feed is only permitted on sites which are approved and registered by Council on an annual basis and which are clear of all inflammable material save live standing trees to a radius of at least 50 metres. A mobile fire-fighting unit shall be in attendance at all times the site is in use during the ban period.
2. Water carting for stock and domestic purposes provided it is accompanied by a mobile fire-fighting unit or, alternatively, the water carting vehicle acts as the mobile fire-fighting unit and meets minimum specifications, (this also requires the retention of 400 litres of water at all times).
3. All necessary travel to and from and within piggeries, sheep or cattle feed lots, provided this is undertaken with a mobile fire-fighting unit in attendance.
4. All necessary carting of livestock, provided that such a vehicle is accompanied by a mobile fire-fighting unit.
5. Activities which received specific exemptions from Council or a Chief Bush Fire Control Officer.

3. CHRISTMAS DAY

A Harvest Ban and a ban on the movement of all vehicles and machines and the operation of internal and combustion engines is imposed on Christmas Day each year.

All other activities or operations may only be undertaken during Total Vehicle and Machinery Movement Bans and Bans on the Operation of Internal Combustion Engines after approval has been granted by Council. Approval has to be sought on an individual basis. Approval may be subject to specified conditions. It should be noted that approval may not be granted.



Australia Post Does Not Support Chain Letters



Australia Post does not support chain letters, does not provide free or reduced postage for chain letters and strongly urges recipients to throw the letters in the bin rather than continuing the chain.

There are a number of chain letters which incorrectly state that Australia Post monitors the chain letter, provides free postage or has said that the recipient should use 50-cent stamps to post C5 envelopes which should have \$1 postage.

Two of the most common letters are the "Rhodes" letter which promises financial rewards and a Guinness Book of Records letter which states that it is attempting nasty "South American" version

which threatens anyone breaking the chain with particularly bad luck or a violent death.

The Department of Consumer Affairs is particularly concerned about the "Rhodes" letter and has a warning bulletin on its website.

If people recognize the names of people on the list of recent recipients of a chain letter, then they should inform those people that if they were responsible for forwarding the letter then they should desist from forwarding any similar letters to the recipient.
