One of four siblings, the youngest of course. Or am I the oldest? Not really sure.


I bring new life and herald the warmth, but hay fever, too, is in my source.

Did you know as a country patient you can attend some of your specialist medical appointments using videoconferencing?

Thanks to telehealth, country outpatients often now have access to specialists via telehealth – using videoconferencing to allow you to have face to face appointments with your doctors without having to visit Perth.

This saves you the time, money and the inconvenience of having to travel long distances for relatively short specialist visits.

The free telehealth service is available for a wide range of clinics including burns, wounds, pain management, speech pathology, gastroenterology, neurology, urology, paediatrics, mental health and many more.

After you've made an appointment, you simply visit your closest telehealth-enabled health service and the staff will connect you via videoconference to your specialist at their Perth hospital.

What Do We Do at the CRC?

Centrelink: The CRC is an access point for Centrelink, which means we can photocopy and verify your original documents; fax 'stuff' for you or help you access forms whether it be from the supply we have on hand or through the internet. We also have a phone that customers can use to call the Call Centre and will be getting a computer solely for Centrelink use.

ATO: We are also an access point for the Australian Taxation Office. We have a supply of their forms on hand (or can download them), can help you apply for an ABN over the internet or can give you free access to a computer so that you can complete your tax return online.

Government Computer: As part of its contract the CRC has a computer available, free of charge, for anyone needing to access state (WA) government websites.

Computer Training: We have in house training for Beginners, Excel, Word (Beginners & Intermediate), Publisher, Outlook, Internet, Social Media and Digital Photos. If the interest is there we can also source trainers to provide other IT training. We also provide one on one training at the CRC.

Other Training: The CRC also sources training workshops for Skippers Tickets, Chemcert, Forklift, Chainsaw & MC Assessment. These courses are reliant on the needs and wishes of the local community.

Photo Printing: Glossy photos of 4" x 6" (standard) and 6" x 8" are able to be printed on the photo booth. The photo booth also prints calendars, images with borders and collages. Other items such as photobooks and giftware are also available but is delivered at a later date.

Scanning: The CRC has an excellent scanner that can scan negatives, slides, photographs and documents. These can then be burned to a CD or DVD and/or printed. We can scan a multipage document into a single pdf document.

Photocopying: We can photocopy anything up to A3 (twice the size of this page) in both black and white and colour. Items can be increased in size or decreased (very handy for the crafty people).

Printing: The CRC has a wide format printer than can print up to A0 (841mm x 1189mm) as well as banners on a variety of mediums. Can also print on canvas.

Passport & ID Photos: The CRC is able to take and process your passport or ID photos.

Dubbing & Converting: We can convert your videos to DVD.

Digital Photos: If you need some photos taken (within Lake Grace boundary) we can take them and either burn to CD/DVD, print or email. If you are a keen photographer but don't have your own computer we can download the images for you and put them onto a DVD for you. We also have mounts for using when framing your photographs (have a good selection of colours).

Card / Paper etc: We have a selection of coloured paper and card (of varying thicknesses) in both A4 and A3 available, plus a variety of labels (we can also print your labels for you).

Desktop Publishing: CRC staff can create pretty much anything you want in the way of posters, leaflets, booklets and banners. Whether it's a birthday invite or a birth announcement to a thank you card, calendar or event booklet we are able to create it for you.

Secretarial Services: Want a letter or some minutes typed up? The CRC can do that, they will even attend meetings and take minutes if needed.

Equipment Hire: We have a digital projector, screen, PA System and whiteboard available for hire.

Venue Hire: The fully ac/heated seminar room, with interactive whiteboard, widescreen TV, DVD & video players and wireless internet is available for hire.

Computer Use: The CRC has five computers available for public use; one with Windows 7 and Office 2010 and the remaining four run Windows 10 and Office 2016. Computers can be hired individually or the computer area can be hired in it's entirety for an hour or a day by any organisation.

Faxing: Are able to fax any documents, locally and internationally.

Email: Need an email sent but don't have a computer or email account, we can do that for you.

Memberships: Are a very economical way to have unlimited access to the internet. Members also receive reduced rates for photocopying, printing, desktop publishing, hire of equipment plus more. Memberships are available to individuals, businesses, families and organisations.

Community Newspaper: Most importantly the CRC edits, prints and collates the Lakes Link News; a vital source of information for the community of Lake Grace.

Licensing: The CRC conducts the theory testing for drivers licenses.

Videoconferencing: The CRC has videoconferencing available.

TAFE: A variety of TAFE brochures are available at the CRC for a wide variety of studies that are available; from nursing and office studies through to horticulture and agriculture.

Lake Grace Calendars: Toward the end of each year the CRC creates calendars using local photographs. Ideal as Christmas gifts. We also put together personalised calendars.

Roadwise and LCDC (Land Conservation District Committee): The CRC has partnerships with both of these organisations.

First New Doppler Weather Radar Soon to go Online

Media Release

The construction and installation of the first of three new Doppler radars planned for regional WA has been completed, at Newdegate.

Local Member Terry Waldron said this investment in radar technology would assist WA's agricultural sector with critical decision-making and would help ensure the sector remained internationally competitive into the future.

Mr Waldron said the State Government had invested \$23 million through the Royalties for Regions program in Doppler radar technology to help positively transform the State's farms and regions.

Doppler radars provide data on rainfall and significant wind changes across an area up to 200 kilometres from the radar location. "Doppler radars will allow our local farm businesses to observe real-time rainfall and wind events across their properties," he said.

"Access to timely information is really important for farmers, to assist them to make informed decisions all year round."

Nationals WA candidate for Roe Peter Rundle said research supporting the Doppler radar project had estimated that, based on more timely spray applications

The Newdegate Doppler radar is expected to be operational by the end of October.

Radar information will be delivered to farmers through the Bureau of Meteorology's website, though the bureau and the Department of Agriculture and Food are currently working on applications to deliver information directly to farm businesses.

Mr Waldron said the Royalties for Regions investment into Doppler technology was important in terms of providing more precise weather information for farm businesses and rural communities.

"This information will benefit farmers, the wider community and emergency services," he said.

The other two Doppler radars, which form part of this project, will be installed at South Doodlakine and Watheroo, with all three expected to be operational by mid-2017.

CRCs To Continue Thanks to Royalties for Regions

Media Release

Delivery of essential services, information and activities to regional and remote communities will continue thanks to a \$56 million State Government Royalties for Regions investment in the Western Australian Community Resource Network (WACRN).

Consisting of 106 Community Resource Centres (CRCs), the WACRN provides a physical community hub for the delivery of government services and information as well as community development activities to approximately 50,000 people in regional and remote areas of the State, each month.

Member for Wagin Terry Waldron MLA said communities in the Wagin electorate that relied on the availability of services through CRCs, would benefit significantly from the continued funding, which was announced on Thursday.

"This considerable State Government investment will see the ongoing stability and security of these important community services," Mr Waldron said.

"This funding will assist the 20 local CRCs in the electorate."

The CRCs in the Wagin electorate are located at -Boddington, Bremer Bay, Dumbleyung, Frankland River, Gnowangerup, Jerramungup, Katanning, Kulin, Lake Grace, Mt Barker, Newdegate, Ongerup, Pingelly,

Pingrup, Tambellup, Wagin, Wandering, West Arthur (Darkan), Wickepin and Williams.

Nationals WA candidate for Roe Peter Rundle said CRCs had been operating since 1991, originally as Telecentres, and today act as shop fronts for many government services such as driver and licensing services for the Department of Transport, the Australian Taxation Office, Centrelink and Medicare.

"The State's CRCs employ up to 450 people, and more than 1700 people are engaged in voluntary roles assisting in the management and day-to-day operations," Mr Rundle said.

Mr Waldron said: "Through this significant Royalties for Regions investment, operation and expansion of these community hubs will continue and locals will still be able to access essential government services close to home."

'It's been a fantastic growing season this year so the scenery is just magic, come out and enjoy true rural hospitality for the weekend.'



Commemorating 100 Years of ANZAC

Each of the soldiers listed on the Lake Grace Honour Roll will be featured in the Lakes Link News, as close as possible to 100 years from their enlistment. It is now 100 years and 3 days since John Carruthers signed up.

CARRUTHERS – JOHN: Born at Dumfrieshire, Scotland, in 1895, he went by the name of Jack. He enlisted in the Australian Imperial Force, at the age of 21 years and 4 months, as a single man on September 12th 1916. At 5 feet 11 ½ inches tall, (182cms), and weighing 170 lbs (77 kgs), he had a fresh complexion, with blue eyes and brown hair. Private Jack Carruthers came from his father's farm, "Lowtherfield", stating his calling as a farmer, and had some previous form of military training.

He trained at Blackboy Hill, and was appointed to the 25th Reinforcement /11th Battalion. Like other local trainees in his group, his training was interspersed with the need to help with harvest duties on the farm, however, by the 29th of June 1917, he was ready to embark on the His Majesty's Australian Transport *Borda* at Fremantle. They arrived at Plymouth two months later, from where they disembarked and marched into the 3rd Training Battalion, Durrington.

Three weeks later Private Carruthers left from Southampton for France arriving at Le Havre, for further conditioning, and thence into the battlefield, being taken on strength with his 11th Battalion.

On the 3rd of November he was wounded in action with a gunshot wound to the right hand, when a bullet passed through near his index finger, causing very limited movement of that finger, the wound becoming septic. Three days later he was returned to England on the *Ville de Liege* from France, and admitted to the Edmonton Military Hospital and though his wound was described "Mild", it was troublesome and restricted his abilities. It was the 28th of November before he was sent for repatriation.

During his convalescence it was considered that he was unfit for service for six months, and unfit for home service for three months, so on the 1st of February 1918, he embarked the *Balmoral Castle* for the return journey to Australia.

On arrival at Fremantle he was admitted to the No.8 Australian General Hospital Fremantle for several days, and after the medical procedures concerning his war wound were addressed, his eventual discharge from Military Service came on the 7th of April, 1918. He received the usual War medals – the 1914/15 STAR, British War Medal and Victory Medal. He gave his religion as Plymouth Brethren, and his service No. was 7451.

On his return to Lake Grace a welcome home social saw a muster of 70 people at the Carruthers farm. Speeches expressed the great pleasure of the Lake Grace settlers, at Jack's return, and the great relief of anxiety to his worthy parents, and that he now intended settling down to work on the good lands of Lake Grace. The manly character of the returned hero was voiced, and all were pleased to see him back. A much enjoyed musical programme organized by Miss A E Lucas reflected great credit on the performers.

Jack came to Australia with his parents and their family. At the age of 16, and eligible to become a land holder under the guardianship of his father, Jack successfully obtained his own property. When he came to Lake Grace with his father and a brother his father became very despondent when he saw the "Medi-evil Forest" on their lands, and pined for the homeland, regretting their move to Australia, but it was Jack who said, "We are here now, and let's see if we can make a go of it". And so they did, and after very tough beginnings and with Western Australia's worst drought ever soon upon them, their resilience and determination eventually made them very successful with their farming venture.

Jack would have been both witness and partaker in the development and progress in the district. The making of the corduroy into the construction of the causeway across the lake, which Jack had worked on, would have been an event of enormous value, saving so many miles of travel by residents needing to cross the lake.

Jack also gave back land to the Lands Department when it was decided to site our town where it is today, beginning with land for the town dam and the first school. Almost 84 acres was resumed from his original farm, this being the land south of Absolon Street.

The Carruthers farming operations became very successful, with Jack the eldest male in the family, performing a leading role in their success. Pictures of Jack sinking a dam with a team of horses, and the finished dam on the internet, attest to his contributing abilities. Jack married Margaret Mary Agnes Watson, who went by the name Agnes, and they lived close to the town. Jack lived a long life and died at the age of 83 years on 11/09/1978, and was buried next to Agnes, who predeceased him in 1960, in the large Carruthers family plot at the Lake Grace Cemetery.

Regional Subsidiaries One Step Closer

Media Release

Local Governments in regional Western Australia will shortly be able to deliver services jointly following the passage of a Bill through the Legislative Council to allow the formation of regional subsidiaries.

The regional subsidiary model, which has been operating in South Australia since 1999 and was first proposed for WA by former National Party MLC Max Trenorden, will allow two or more local governments to share a service delivery or to engage in an activity collectively.

Nationals Member for the Agricultural Region Martin Aldridge MLC said the reforms meant local governments are now able to form legally recognised entities to deliver a range of functions to the benefit of their communities.

"Small local governments in the Agricultural region can often have difficulty providing certain services efficiently," Mr Aldridge said.

"The beauty of the regional subsidiary model is that the subsidiary is its own legal entity, meaning local governments can share the legal and financial responsibility in the delivery of services such as waste and environmental management, tourism and marketing opportunities, infrastructure delivery, resource sharing and in seeking grants for regionally significant projects."

Mr Aldridge praised former Nationals leader Hon Max Trenorden, whose 2010 Private Members Bill first proposed the idea of regional subsidiaries in Western Australia.

"Max undertook an enormous amount of work to bring the best collaborative model for regional local governments to the Parliament, resulting in his Private Members' Bill in 2010," he said.

"He recognised that the 'big is better' mantra does not ring true in regional WA and a different model was needed to improve the sustainability of the sector.

"While it has taken six years and four iterations of this



Bill in Parliament, the model Max brought to the table will allow local government more flexibility in service delivery."

Mr Aldridge highlighted the position of The Nationals which opposed forced amalgamation of Local Governments in preference for voluntary reforms such as regional subsidiaries.

"Regional subsidiaries do not prevent local governments from continuing down the voluntary amalgamation path, but provide an alternative for those who prefer to remain as is," he said.

"The Nationals WA have long supported regional subsidiaries and opposed forced amalgamation, and the passage of this Bill is evidence of that."

Wheatbelt Snapshot Series - Horticulture

Media Release

The Wheatbelt Snapshot Series: Horticulture provides an overview of horticultural activity in the Wheatbelt to inform stakeholders including local government and business and to guide public and private investment into the region.

Horticulture value of agricultural production in the Wheatbelt increased from \$87.86 million in 2007-08 to \$93.23 million in 2011-12, representing 11.73% of Western Australia's horticultural worth.

Within the Wheatbelt, there are prominent suppliers of fruit and vegetables for domestic and international markets. The Central Midlands and Central Coast Subregions are increasingly involved in intensive horticultural activities as urban expansion and a lack of available water resources pushes the industry out of the north metropolitan area. The proximity of the Wheatbelt to Perth, significant groundwater resources and potentially unhindered land close to key infrastructure and transport routes will facilitate future expansion in the Region.

In recent times, the Wheatbelt vegetable production value grew by 70% from 2007-08, to \$56.4 million (15% of the State's total) by 2011-12 being led by the major cultivation of carrots and lettuce.



Fruit production in the Wheatbelt has had strong growth, 2011-12 statistics indicate the Wheatbelt's fruit production value grew to \$19.1 million. The growth is led by the rapid growth in citrus fruit including oranges and mandarins.

The opportunities to expand horticulture in the Wheatbelt should have a focus on value-add to regional produce, increasing the entrepreneurial base of producers while advocating industry needs and developing regional, state, national and international markets.


Road Works

Our road construction team are currently working on South Burngup Road from Gellard Road towards Biddy Camm Road. The construction team will then move on to Holt Rock South Road. This work is to include reconstructing pavement, extending existing culverts, clearing road side drains of vegetation, applying a 14mm bitumen primer seal and 10mm bitumen final seal, installation of guide posts and warning signs. The work is to be undertaken between slk 21.8 - 25.4.

The Holt Rock South Road project is estimated to cost \$356,236 of which we are allocated Regional Road Group funding of \$237,491. The Shire is required to fund the balance from our own revenue sources.

The Lake Grace road maintenance grader is currently working in the north eastern sector.

Bushfire Bulletin

The 2016/17 fire season is not too far away, now is the time to prepare. Bushfires happen every summer, they can start suddenly and without warning. People have been killed or seriously injured, homes destroyed during bushfires and the chances of a bushfire occurring increases as the season progresses.

Things to consider when preparing your property: **Starve the Fire -** Clear around your home so that embers are less likely to start a fire when they hit the ground. This will also help reduce the damage caused by fire.

Make a Safety Zone - Create and maintain a Building Protection Zone and a minimum two metre gap between your house and tree branches.

Building Protection Zone (BPZ) is an area extending for 20 metres around a building where there is reduced flammable material. This means there is less material that can ignite, improving the chances that your home may survive a bushfire.

Fill the Gaps - Houses usually catch fire when embers get into the roof space, a wall cavity, onto ledges or under the house. Prevent sparks from entering your house by blocking all the gaps.

Fix the Traps - Do not pile wood against or near a house. Remove any timber, rubbish and old junk lying around.

Opportunities from a Declared Pest Rate (DPR) in Eastern Wheatbelt Shires

IMPORTANT MESSAGE! If you live within the Shires of Kondinin, Kulin, Lake Grace, Merredin, Mt Marshall, Mukinbudin, Narembeen, Westonia, Trayning, Yilgarn and Nungarin and own landholdings of 20ha and above then you will shortly receive a Declared Pest Rate (DPR) notice in the mail. The rate will vary depending on the size of your landholding. The DPR is based on ad valorem minimum charge of \$30 per VEN. Larger landholders will pay more.

Many people don't realise it is a legal requirement for individual landholders to control declared pests on their land. By forming a Recognised Biosecurity Group, the Eastern Wheatbelt Biosecurity Group (EWBG) can manage funds raised on behalf of the community and the State Government will match the rates raised through this process. Individuals still need to manage their pests however this provides additional funding and a coordinated approach using current best practice management.

The EWBG has been in operation for over 10 years with the purpose of helping control declared pests considered widespread that are unlikely to be eradicated. EWBG members believe local group decision-making and management at a landscape level is more effective and needs the community to be involved. Those communities rated are provided with opportunities to help decide which pests are managed. The main focus for the next few years is on wild dog control. This has been an ongoing issue for those near the State Barrier Fence for many years and reduces the risk of access and damage to more populated areas.

For 2016/2017 an Operational plan and budget for the funds has been determined. The EWBG will carry out the following activities:

- 2 Control current predation of livestock by wild dogs.
- Develop and implement management strategies to minimise future wild dog impacts on livestock.
- Implement best practice wild dog management on private and public land in the region.
- 2 Increase landholder participation, both private and public.
- Monitor, evaluate and report on the progress towards minimising wild dog impact on livestock in member shires.
- Provide proactive and positive extension activity driven by the group that will facilitate broader community awareness of wild dog issues.




