
Adding Birthdays and Anniversaries

Get Your Hexie on...!

Following the success of our crochet workshops last term, we have decided that our next skill to learn is 'foundation piecing' (or English Paper Piecing, known as EPP), which is a technique used to create a quilt block by using fabric wrapped around paper patterns which are cut to an exact size. Our first project will be a simple mug rug.

Mug rugs are extra large drink coasters or smaller versions of placemats that hold a cup of tea or coffee with room for a pastry or treat. They can be as big or as small as you like, usually falling somewhere in between the usual size of a coaster and a placemat. Small, fun and easy to create, mug rugs are designed to look pretty on your desk whilst soaking up your drink of choice's drips and condensation, as well as giving you full-on permission to eat a bikkie or two, since, well, that extra space off to the side of your drink is just THERE for you to use.

In patchwork, EPP was originally a method used to stabilize pieces of fabric that were stitched together. It first became popular in the 18th and 19th centuries in England, although a 15th century Italian piece, the Impruneta cushion owned by Antonio Degli Agli, appears to have used EPP. Originally, pieces of scrap fabric or muslin were used as the foundation.

Recently, the use of paper has become very popular for use as a pattern in creating quilt blocks that are all the same size, each with precise points and perfectly matched intersections.

Because of the accuracy, ease of use and portability of the centuries old EPP method, it remains a popular quilt making technique today. A perfect way to quilt-on-thego, you'll love the ease of hand-stitching with paper templates and you'll be amazed at how easily accuracy in piecing can be achieved.

So, come along to the CRC and learn this take-itanywhere, time-honoured technique that is completely done by hand! Classes start on Friday 16th October,

running from 10am until 12noon. For just \$10 we will provide you with a kit containing everything you need to make yourself a great little mug rug, although you might like to bring along your favourite pair of fabric scissors. Enjoy the relaxing, informal atmosphere and indulge in a little creative metime!

Henk Doelman

11/04/1925 - 5/9/2015

Henk Doelman was born the tenth of eleven children at Vlaardingen near Rotterdam in South Holland on 11th of April 1925.

His Dad's family were fishermen, his Grandfather having two fishing boats fishing mainly for herring in the North Sea. His father travelled all over Holland by rail and his job was to sell the fish which were transported to restaurants and markets in large vats, which held between 800 and 1000 herring.

Going to school through the depression meant nothing different to Henk, they still had three meals a day although there wasn't much meat on their plates. One of the fun things he remembered as a child was iceskating on the frozen rivers and ponds. He also worked in a bakery before and after school as baking was always his passion at a young age.

He left school at the age of fourteen years old to work as an apprentice pastry cook, earning two guilders, which is equal to \$3 for a 48-hour week. One of the first things he bought was a second hand bike.

It was around this time that World War 2 began. The Germans bombed Rotterdam very heavily and before long they occupied Holland - which was planned to be their launch pad into England.

During this time the Dutch were forced to work for the Germans. Henk and a friend both ended up getting dysentery at one time and were treated for this in a German hospital. Large numbers of wounded soldiers needed to be treated for injuries and whilst there Henk and his friend spoke with an English airman who was sitting in a German staff car. The guy had no legs and he explained that he was a POW and had been shot down and that his artificial legs had been destroyed when his plane crashed. He was waiting for the Red Cross to send a new set of 'Tin' legs. Henk only found out several years ago that the Englishman was Douglas Bader who was later featured in a book and film called 'Reach For The Sky'.

Once the dysentery was cured, they caught a steam train from the hospital to Rotterdam but before they arrived there, two English planes flew over shooting at the train and unfortunately the driver was killed. All of the passengers had to disembark and take cover in a ditch until a replacement train driver arrived, to take them to their destination. After arriving in Rotterdam he stayed the night with his sister and it was the following day that he joined the Resistance Army at the age of 19 in 1944. Although he didn't see any direct action, they were kept busy transferring messages to assist with the delivery of intelligence and evacuation and welfare of allied military personnel trapped behind enemy lines.

Henk was not aware until after the war, that both his Dad and one of his brothers were also in the



Resistance Army. Such was the necessary secrecy required in case they were captured. Towards the end of the war the Germans left Holland and he was one of many to be called up as de facto police officers to assist with the restoration of normality to the devastated country.

Jacoba (Connie), Henks' teenage sweetheart whom he later married were both members of a bike riding club during the war years. After he was released from his secondment he joined the Dutch navy as there were no prospects of employment at home (due to the devastation of most businesses during the occupation) and went to a naval training camp in Wales.

Connie and Henk wrote to each other nearly every day during the five months he was away. He proposed in a letter and she wrote back accepting his proposal of marriage.

They were married on the 28 May 1946 in Holland.

His first position with the navy was baking bread, being one of six cooks, on a destroyer ship the 'Banckert' that housed 260 naval personnel. The Dutch navy deployed them to Batavia and It took them about four weeks to sail from Holland to Batavia (now Jakarta) in the Dutch East Indies (now Indonesia). Their role was to assist the transition to self government to the Indonesian people who had been under Dutch rule prior to WW2. They lived on the ship and he recalled it being very hot, compared to the temperatures in Holland that he was accustomed to.

The ship was sent to the port of Fremantle in Western Australia for R&R and re-stocking of supplies. While the

ship was being restocked, the crew were allowed to go ashore for two weeks. He had the first week in Perth and the second week in Katanning with some friends and while he was there he met Cooky (Hector Cook, who was a baker formerly of Lake Grace). He told Henk that if he came back to Australia he would give him a job.

However with Cooky's offer still on his mind, he decided to leave the navy. So he returned to Holland on a troop carrier the 'Grooterbeer' along with 3000 other men. Being baker he was kept busy by baking bread during the journey back to Holland. He was discharged from the navy in December 1948.

In December 1948, Connie and Henk were on the first migrant ship which left Holland, destination - Fremantle. It cost 2,700 guilders for two fares and with only one square cubic metre of cargo space per person on the ship, they could only take the bare essentials. They disembarked in Fremantle during January 1949 and their friends from Katanning were there to meet them and take them back to Katanning.

Once they had settled in, he went to see "Cooky", but he had sold out and left. It wasn't long though before he got a job as a pastry cook with Arthur Hobbs (Hobbsy) . He agreed to pay Henk five pounds per week.

They lived for some time with Hobbsy, then rented a cottage, half a mile from the shop for 27 shillings and six pence a week. In July 1949, their first child Cobi (Stanton) was born.

Henk worked in Katanning for two years and they saved every penny they could! During this time Hobbsy sold out and he stayed on, working as both baker and pastry cook. By 1952, Henk and Connie had saved the 800 pounds needed to buy the leasehold on a bakery business in Pemberton. They worked this bakery for another two years and it was during this time that Anna (Strevett) was born. They sold the leasehold on this place and Henk acquired a job as a mill hand at the local mill. Although only for a short time because after a chance conversation with the foreman, he went to work at the bakery which the mill owned at Deanmill. They bought a boarding house there, which Connie ran with another lady. They also bought their first car for 800 pounds, this being a brand new 'Vanguard'. They lived in Deanmill until 1958 and it was during this era that Rita (Marshall) was born.

Connie's parents came out from Holland to see if they could live in Australia. On arrival, they decided to shift to the city and soon found a leasehold bakery in Osborne Park. Connie's parents helped them greatly -Mum worked in the house and Dad helped Henk in the bakery, even though he had to teach him everything, he learnt quickly! After two years of living in Australia, Connie's parents decided to go back to Holland and the family felt the need to leave the city. They wanted to go back and live in a small country town, so they purchased one of the two bakeries in Boyup Brook where the last daughter Fiona (Porritt) was born. After a few years they decided to give up the baking trade and try farming. They purchased a small dairy farm, with a small orchard on the outskirts of the town and milked cows, until a skin allergy forced Henk back into the dough!

From the dairy farm at Boyup Brook they moved to a bakery at Mt Magnet. Henk purchased this without Connie seeing it - that was the last time she let him do that but they made some wonderful friends at Magnet and it was there that Cobi and Murray met.

The two eldest girls Cobi and Anna went to secondary high school in Geraldton, which meant boarding away from home. So after three years of experiencing a gold mining town, they decided to head back to the city to educate the younger girls. Henk worked for Noonan's bakery in Belmont until they purchased a delicatessen shop and operated that for three years.

In 1969 they purchased the Lake Grace bakery from Colin and Betty Taylor. After some years, Connie and Henk formed a partnership together with partners Alex and Edna Dickson and Ted and Ivy Thornton. They set about making this bakery into quite a large business and had approximately ten staff including the partners. Bread was delivered to Ravensthorpe, Dumbleyung, Pingaring, Kukerin and Pingrup - all the deliveries were made in the rear of cars. It was great having partners, at last they could go on holidays knowing someone as capable as themselves were left in charge. In 1982 they sold the business to Mike and Ann Williams and Henk continued working for three months to show Mike the ropes! Then he delivered mail around town on a push bike! (back to his youth).

In 1983 the love of his life, Connie was diagnosed with cancer and in 1988, she sadly passed away. He would say in later years how lucky he was to have his daughters, son-in-laws, most of his nine wonderful grandchildren and seventeen great grandchildren living so near.

He travelled back to Holland to visit his remaining family several times but only one sister and brother had travelled to Australia to visit them over the years. During 2009 Henk had the opportunity to travel to Calgary, Canada with Rita to visit his granddaughter Emma and her family. Whilst there he was able to visit some Dutch relatives, descendants of his deceased older sister, some of whom he had never met before. That was something he cherished.

Sometime after Connie died, Henk and Shirley Duckworth became friends and enjoyed many years of companionship together but sadly Shirley passed away in 2012.

After retiring, Henk was able to enjoy helping Murray

and Cobi at the Lake Grace Plaza supermarket for some years, baking the bread and pastries but was happy later to leave that work to the younger ones as he put it. He also enjoyed gardening, having quite an extensive rose garden, visiting his daughters on the farm, jigsaw puzzles were always a feature on the table, reading and cooking. He also was an active and playing member of the Lake Grace Bowling club which he had been involved with since 1969. The Lake Grace Lions club had also played a big part of his retirement years enjoying the dinner meetings with his mates.

During 2008, A Dutch friend, Herman Krygsman saw a notice in the newspaper for ex patriot Dutch people who had served in the resistant movement during the war to apply for a medal which had been available to those still living in The Netherlands. Herman applied for Henk to receive the medal and on Henks' 84th birthday in 2009 the Netherlands Defence Attaché travelled from Canberra to Lake Grace to present Henk with his 'Mobilisation War Cross' which was a great honour for him.

He also enjoyed the weekly meetings at the new Men's Shed and the many outings which were provided by the (HACC) Home and Community Care group.

He also volunteered his time at the Visitor's Centre, Australian Inland Mission Hospital, delivered Meals on Wheels to the elderly, the annual grape harvesting at the local vine yards, Driver Reviver caravan, 'how to vote cards' for all parties concerned and had been an active member of St John's Ambulance doing transfers etc.

He still enjoyed baking the countless 'Christmas Puddings', sponge cakes and shortbread biscuits for his family and many friends. He could be described as a 'social butterfly'.

Henk's neighbours and friends, Neil and Elsie Bishop would always check on him every day and the family is grateful for their care.

He enjoyed visits to Bremer Bay where he liked to play Scrabble, (had to turn a blind eye when giving a score),

occasional beach fishing and eating fish and to Albany to visit his daughter, Fiona and family.

The family also honours the friendship and support of the other 'Dutchys' who had kept in touch with the Doelman family over the years. Tom & Leny, the Goedharts, Daemes, Krygsmans, Tini Chatfield, Verboons and any others I may have missed. Ray and Val Herdman were also close friends over the years.

Henk celebrated his 90th Birthday in April this year with family and friends and since then his health had started to decline. Sadly he passed away in Sir Charles Gardiner Hospital in Perth on 5th September 2015. He will be greatly missed by his family and all that knew him but he had a wonderful life.

The family would like to thank Dr Francois Jacobs and his wife Henriette, the wonderful nursing staff at the Lake Grace Hospital, St. John's Ambulance officers-Lake Grace branch and the Royal Flying Doctor Service for their care and support.

Goodbye Henky, you have lived a life well lived. Journey well and rest in peace.

ONLINE BANKING SCAMS

Last week my internet account and credit card were hacked, the password and mobile number were changed and hackers from the US were successful in stealing nearly \$7,000.00. After a complaint to the bank, I was requested to identify myself with the bank in Narrogin to sort out the matter.

While I was assuming this sort of isolated electronic pick-pocketing can happen sometimes, this week my Pharmacy Assistant was busy with her bank since \$200.00 was stolen from her credit card. Upon quick research I found out cyber related online fraud costs nearly 1 billion dollars per year in Australia. Around 1 in 5 Australians is a victim of online fraud .

The following tips, which are readily available to the public from various sources, are worth remembering.

1. Don't neglect to update antivirus software on your computer/laptop.

2. Install a firewall program, it can prevent spying on your computer.

3. Be careful while browsing internet sites; particularly the dodgy ones (dating websites, porn, get-rich-quick sitea etc.)

4. Don't reply to Phishing emails.

5. Secure your bank account with strong passwords and change it frequently. Weak passwords like abc123, 1234 etc is practically the same as not using a password at all.

6. Where possible don't perform bank transactions on public computers.

The event is being held at the Lake Grace Regional Artspace, with proceeds from the catering going toward the refurbishment of the Lake Grace Pioneering Women's mural. Men and women are welcome to attend and children over the age of 13 (they will need to pay full price).

In an entertaining, motivational, informative, humorous and inspirational speech, Estelle Blackburn details the events in Perth in 1963, when a serial killer changed forever the psyche of the previous safe, secure, 'big country town'. Estelle takes the audience through the eight murders and 14 attempted murders of the last person executed in Western Australia, Eric Edgar Cooke, and his insistence that two innocent men were in prison for murders he committed.

John Button had been jailed for 10 years with hard labour for the hit-run murder of his girlfriend and Darryl Beamish had been condemned to death (later commuted to life imprisonment) for the axe-murder of wealthy former Melbourne heiress and socialite Jillian Brewer. Despite Cooke's many and detailed confessions, including one on the gallows minutes before his execution, the wrongly convicted youths (Button and Beamish) lost a total of seven appeals in the 1960's and exhausted all legal avenues of proving their innocence. They lived their lives with the stigma of being murderers and the pain of injustice, and would go down in history as murderers.

Estelle chanced upon the story of these injustices after the men had served their time and were out of prison. She gave up full time work and spent six years researching and writing the book Broken Lives, published in 1998. The book reopened the cases and with the support of a newspaper editor and two top lawyers taking on the appeals pro bono, the end result was the longest standing convictions in Australia to be overturned.

Described as Australia's Erin Brokovich, Estelle has received many awards and accolades throughout her illustrious career. Estelle will have her books available for purchase at the Sundowner.





I believe the Shire of Lake Grace ought to reconstitute as the Territory of Lake Grace (TLG) and seek separation from Western Australia and inclusion in the Commonwealth under section 122 of the Constitution. Being small, the TLG could provide direct, efficient governance and introduce broad reforms. For instance, a Department of Agriculture could be reopened. Departments of Education, Health, Housing and so on could be rebuilt from the ground up. The democratic process itself could be recast to suit the technology of our time. Such reforms would revitalise the district by attracting investment and human capital, and inspire other districts. The TLG could be a truly revolutionary democratic experiment. Let's give it a go!

Returning Officer Terry Gladish will be at the Council office on Saturday 17th October from 8am to 6pm; ready to take your vote if you haven't already posted it in. After the close of the ballot at 6pm counting will begin. Members of the public are welcome to attend.

Jane Bushby and Rhiannon Wallace won first prize in the Tin Horse Highway competition at the Kulin Bush Races.




Dumping has been a significant issue in the past and unfortunately, if it continues, the *drumMUSTER* service may be withdrawn completely.

"Strong community support and involvement can significantly lift farmer participation in *drumMUSTER*," he said.



- Initiate an amendment to the Shire's Local Planning Scheme No. 4 to reclassify the reserve upon which DAFWA's former Regional Office was located. The reserve purpose is being changed from 'public purpose-Agriculture WA' to 'commercial' zone.

The Shire received two applications for a permit to keep a rooster at each of two properties in the Lake Grace townsite. As part of Council's deliberations residents were asked for comment





WE ARE HERE TO HELP



Noisy Parties etc.

As the warmer season of the year approaches it's timely that everyone be reminded to be considerate of neighbours and the community in general by keeping any noise or celebrations to a reasonable level in line with the time of the day or night. Neighbours should also be considerate of the time of the year and of the odd party taking place.

Please be aware however that the Environmental Protection Act is a powerful piece of legislation both with regard to police powers and with the penalties that may apply. Noise includes voices. The Act allows notices and directions to be issued that may last for up to seven days, for police to enter premises using force if necessary to seize equipment such as stereos, for fines of \$2000 to be issued, and for offences of hindering officers in the execution of these duties.

If you are being disturbed by an unreasonable volume of noise you should firstly make a polite approach to the person or persons responsible and request it cease or be lowered to a reasonable level. If we are called out and find an unreasonable volume of noise we will take the appropriate action.

Is Your Will Up To Date?

I know it's not really a police matter and isn't something any of us like to think about for ourselves or our loved ones. The fact is however that police investigate sudden deaths on behalf of the Coroner and deal with the families left behind. These dealings at times have highlighted to me the importance of having an up-todate Will. I've witnessed firsthand the extra burden it places on those left behind over a prolonged period of time when there isn't an up-to-date Will. I believe it is imperative that we all make arrangements for our loved ones just in case the worst happens because not to do so can cause considerable angst for those left behind, can delay payments and can result in a percentage of an Estate being used to cover avoidable fees and charges.

Even for young adults it is important even though as parents we never like to think that our children might go before us. Some friends of mine recently, tragically lost their young adult son. He owned real estate, household items, work tools and a car, had bank accounts and a life insurance policy etc etc. but didn't have a Will. So apart from trying to cope with the devastation of the loss, his parents are suffering the additional angst of trying to sort out all these matters on his behalf. As a result I am arranging for both my adult children to have a very simple Will in place that reflects their wishes.

Goodbye and Thanks From Me



It was hard to wipe the smiles off the faces of members of the Lake Grace St John Ambulance Sub Centre when they heard that their new building

will be going ahead.

General Manager of St John Country Ambulance Service Julian Smith and St John Manager of Property and Development, Michael Longman were in Lake Grace on Tuesday 6th October to deliver the good news.

Lotterywest has come to the table with a grant of \$197,417; this coupled with Royalties for Regions funding (\$110,340) and gifts from Wundowie Sub Centre (\$15,000) and Boddington (\$20,000) and the community funding of \$350,000 have put the \$850,000 project back on track. The generosity of these Wundowie and Boddington sub centres has given the Lake Grace branch a much needed morale boost.

On top of the good news of the Lotterywest funding St John Ambulance have agreed to an interest free loan to make up the shortfall of funds needed to complete the building project.

From now the necessary contracts will need to be signed and a tender document drawn up. It is expected that a builder will be awarded the contract prior to

stock capital, fuel, train drivers, scheduling and maintenance and road to rail transfers."

The current interim agreement with Brookfield Rail is set to expire on 31 December 2015.

"The current uncertainty exposes growers to further price increases, despite CBH's continuous requests to Brookfield Rail to negotiate the next interim agreement.

"Freight rates are therefore subject to change before being finalised early next year.

"We will continue to fight for a fair go for WA grain growers.

"We believe that it is not reasonable that Brookfield Rail's access charges are more than four times those of comparable rail line sections on the east coast and we will continue to do all we can to achieve a reasonable access rate for WA growers."

The estimated freight rates are provided to growers as a guide only and will be finalised in February 2016.

Mister Manners

A modern take on etiquette

This week we take a look at dress codes.

Dress codes can be confusing when stated on invitations so let's run through them to clarify what exactly is expected in modern western society. Starting at the most formal that you might come across and working down.

Formal – typically for evening weddings and state dinners. History dictates that the most formal is White Tie which is not often seen in Australia as Black Tie is more often worn and considered appropriate.

White Tie is considered correct after 6:00pm and consists of a black or midnight blue tailed suit, white shirt, white bow tie and white waistcoat for the gentlemen and a ball gown for the ladies. Ball gowns may have décolletage (low cut) but no leg must show, they must be floor length and colour may be dictated by the event. Gloves are to be opera length (upper arm), white and not removed for the duration. Hair should be worn up or dressed.

Morning Dress is the daytime formal dress code which consists of a morning coat, striped trousers and waistcoat (usually grey) for gentlemen and an appropriate dress for women, not too short or revealing and worn with a jacket. Hats are usual for weddings and essential for the races. This is not a common dress code in Australia.

Semi-Formal – typically worn to weddings in Australia, charity balls and theatre opening nights often also referred to as cocktail which can cause some confusion.

The elements of black tie for gentlemen are dinner suit (tuxedo), white dress shirt, black bow tie and waistcoat or cummerbund. When listed as cocktail dress, gentlemen may wear a suit, dress shirt and tie. Traditionally ladies would wear an evening gown of dinner (ankle) or tea (mid -calf) length with gloves and a wrap or stole. Today it is acceptable for ladies to wear anything from a ball gown to a cocktail dress.

Informal – also known as business attire and typically for religious services and funerals, business meetings and for morning weddings in Australia.

For men you would expect a suit with business shirt and tie. Ladies could get away with a business suit (skirt and jacket) and blouse or a knee or tea length dress.

Smart Casual – defined as neat yet informal attire. This one is tricky as it really depends on the occasion and is often misinterpreted.

For men, dress pants with a sports coat and open shirt (not open like Hawaii 5-0) ties are not required. Shorts and jeans are generally not acceptable. Dresses, casual dresses or pant suits are suitable for women. Women would be discouraged from wearing tights, (as outerwear), tight tops, singlet tops, jeans or miniskirts. **Casual** – common everyday wear. For both men and women, jeans and a neat t-shirt without slogans are commonly accepted as casual wear. Suitable for a picnic or bbq with friends, sporting events or daytime social outings. Many bars and clubs will have neat casual attire as their dress code which is more about what you can't wear than what you can. Shoes are required and singlets are not allowed. Although there seems to be a fair amount of gender inequality in this as ladies can walk off the beach in shorts and strappy top yet the men need to be wearing a t-shirt. From what I gather this is a throwback from the old days where men's work singlets (you know the old blue ones) were not considered appropriate.
