## Lake Grace Daycare Reopens Its Doors

After being closed for over five months Lake Grace Daycare, now known as the Lake Grace Early Learning Centre, reopened its doors on Monday 6<sup>th</sup> October, a relief for parents to have a dependable service again. The centre offered some free trials for the first week, allowing parents to get used to leaving their child. Staff welcomed eight children on their first day, relaxing them with some indoor play before settling into the daily routine.

The centre is able to cater for a maximum of 19 children, but needs a minimum of nine enrolled consistently to keep the centre viable. CSSU's Manager, Sarah Short encourages parents to make

regular bookings as this enables the centre to plan their staffing. A bonus for the centre is that it is now open 8am to 4pm throughout the year, the previous arrangement was a great although the school holidays could be a nightmare for those who had to make alternative arrangements.

Part time Assistant Educator, Tahlia Blackmore has found herself in a win-win situation, gaining work at the centre while able to take her daughter, Ryleigh Willock with her. Catering for children aged from 0-6 years of age, the staff will be kept on their toes as they ensure they meet the needs of their charges.

For some children this is their first time away from parents and an opportunity to gain some social skills. For parents the centre offers an opportunity to work or attend appointments knowing their children are in safe hands and they can address the tasks facing them without distraction.

CSSU (Children's Services Support Unit) is a not for profit organisation; although they get some sustainability funding the remainder of their costs need to be met through fees.

Enrolments have been slower than staff expected however this could be attributed to school holidays and the community getting used to the centre being open again. Centre staff look forward to receiving more enrolments as word gets out.

# Gopher Workshop

No matter what our age, independence is important to all of us. So if circumstances arise that an individual loses confidence in driving a motor car, or perhaps has never held a driver's licence then a gopher is an ideal means of getting from point A to point B. However, adapting to a gopher can be a challenge in itself if you have never used one.

Lake Grace Community Resource Centre has paired with Lake Grace Roadwise to bring a 'gopher workshop' to Lake Grace on Friday 17<sup>th</sup> October. The aim of this workshop is to educate current gopher users but also assist anyone who may be considering purchasing a gopher in the future for either themselves or a family member.

The day will start at 9:30am with Sophie Wittwer from the Independent Living Centre being present to talk about gophers; she will bring three different gophers with her so everyone will have the opportunity to look at different styles and hear what factors need to be taken into consideration when purchasing and what optional extras and accessories are available.

For those who already have their gopher, there will be a presentation on safety and road rules. Peter Borgese from Calibre Care in Albany will also be present to give a talk on how gophers work, how to look after them, what can go wrong and how to prolong the gophers life. Lake Grace Roadwise with sponsorship from the Shire of Lake Grace will also be covering the cost of a 15 minute maintenance check on all of the gophers present on the day.

Users of motorised gophers are classed as pedestrians under current traffic laws, provided the maximum speed of the equipment is 10 km/h. These low powered chairs are allowed to travel on footpaths, shared paths and the sides of roads if there is no footpath. The gophers are also able to manoeuvre within shopping centres.

Following the workshop, participants will enjoy a two course meal sponsored by the Lake Grace CRC. The Independent Living Centre will also be bringing their trailer, so if anyone needs any aids or would like to see what is available then drop into the Lake Grace Village. This workshop isn't restricted to those who have gopher, everyone is welcome. Please call the Lake Grace CRC on 9865 1470 to register.



After arriving on Friday night, the group of 13 University students ate at the Lake Grace Roadhouse then took up their accommodation at Ollie and Lucy Farrelly's Saltbush Inn. The bus driver, David Lord, found space away from the group by the kindness of Lion Henk Doelman's hospitality.

Saturday, the busy day firstly had them enjoying breakfast at the Lakes Village, where all meals were catered for. Driver Dave then took the enthusiastic, orange shirt clad visitors to Williamson's farm to see Spencer's team shearing the lambs. Most of the students were witnessing shearing for the first time.

Back in town, the first task was to tidy up the Lions Park. This consisted of stick picking, mowing the grass,

The digging up of the soil for the tree planting was greatly assisted by the use of a mechanical borer, compliments of Mark and Karen Seaman of CCL Hardware. ## Update from CSSU regional manager Sarah Short

Hello to the Lake Grace Community,

This week marked the official opening of the Lake Grace Early Learning Centre. As such, I would like to share some additional information about the Centre for those who may have missed our Parent Information Evening recently.

The following points are in response to questions from the community over the past few weeks.

**Staffing**- We have completed the recruitment process for centre staff and are pleased to welcome the following ladies to the centre.

**Director**- Joanne Wells

**Assistant Educators**- Tahlia Blackmore, Holly Korosec and Chloe De-Frenne

**Opening Hours**- 8am-4pm.

**Half Days**- A half day session is available- from 8am- 12.00pm, or 12.00pm-4pm

**After School Care**- At this stage, we will not be offering a dedicated after school program. Once we have a consistent number of bookings for full and half days, we will be able to assess the availability of an additional staff member to leave the service and collect children from the school. If your child is able to be dropped at the centre after school, we will be able to cater for them as of next week.

**Fees**- Full Day- \$105, Half Day \$65, After School - \$35

**Public Holidays/Absent Days**- If your child misses a day due to sickness or their regular day falling on a public holiday, you will be offered a 'make up' day within the same week at no extra charge.

**Child Care Rebate/Benefit**- All families who are permanent residents and are working/studying will be eligible for the 50% Child Care Rebate on your fees. This is not means tested. If you are not eligible for the Rebate because you are not working, you may still be eligible for Child Care Benefit, an additional discount on your fees. To find out your eligibility, you will need to contact the Family Assistance Office on 13 61 50. An approximation of costs is attached on the next page.

**Permanent/Casual Bookings**- Having a permanent booking does not mean that you are unable to change your days. A permanent booking can be every day, every Monday or every third Tuesday! We can offer fortnightly bookings ie 2 days one week, 1 the next. These are all classed as permanent bookings, which just means that we can plan for your child attending, and have enough staff so that people don't miss out on the days they need.

**Viability of the Service**- I have been told that some families are still uncertain about the long term viability of the centre. The only way to keep the centre up and running in the long term is to use it. If you are unsure about the staff, the centre or any other aspect of using child care, we encourage you to come down, meet everyone, and book a trial session for your child. You are welcome to stay for your child's orientation visits, or stay in the staff room and have a cuppa while your child settles in.



The recent rains should finish the crops off nicely so its time to start thinking about getting the equipment ready for harvest.

A lot of people have upgraded the size of their trucks and trailers for carting grain which increases the potential to overfill the bins. If you have ever thought about getting camera systems fitted into the trailers so you can monitor the filling in the cab, now is the time to do it.

The monitor screens inside the truck are available in 7 or 9 inch colour and are quad screens, so can take up to four cameras. They also have an AV input so you can catch up on the latest series of Houso's on DVD while you wait in line at the bin.

The cameras are colour and infra red and also have microphones inbuilt for sound if so required. We have been fitting these systems to trucks, headers and chaser bins for 3-4 years now and they have been very reliable.



The standard camera kit is a 7 inch screen with 2 x 10m cables and two cameras for \$650 incl GST for the month of October.

# Lake Grace Uniting Church

Further to the article which was printed in the last issue of 'Lakes Link', about the Uniting (Methodist) Church in Lake Grace, more interesting information has been provided by Phillip Franks.

John and William (Bill) Franks were among the first parishioners when the Church was established in 1921 and worked hard to see it built. John was on the Building Committee and was a Foundation Trustee. At that time, the minister used to catch the train on Friday from Dumbleyung to Lake Grace and return on Monday. In the book, "Across the Lake", John is credited with buying the Rev. Thomas Hughes a new horse so that he could continue to visit farms when in Lake Grace—the old horse being worn out. Philip remembers that John also donated 25 pounds to see the Church completed.

For at least a decade in the 40's and 50's the church was blessed to have three fine musicians who played for every service in the church. Bill Franks was the cellist and his wife, Gladys Franks, played the organ. Bill Pickstone, the violinist was also the town butcher.

On one special occasion, when they played in the Town Hall to a large gathering, the Minister paid tribute to their beautiful music. In later years, Gladys was unable to work the organ pedals and it fell to her twin sons, Phillip and Henry, to pump the hand pedals for her.

In the absence of a minister, Bill Franks would take an occasional service. In the 1950's, he completed much voluntary work while the Manse was being built. Philip recalls that he (Phillip), accompanied the Rev. Lucas to Perth to get timber for the manse in a borrowed, very old truck. They were stopped by the police for having no tail lights. After listening to the Minister's detailed explanation about their mission, they were let off with a warning!

The new manse was opened on October 16th 1954 when Roads Board Chairman, Dave Elliott handed the key to Bill Franks, the oldest member of the church.

# Paypal Security Scam

## Department of Commerce Scamnet

You receive an email purportedly from PayPal claiming your account has been suspended until you verify your account details.

The email reads: "In accordance with PayPal's User Agreement and to ensure that your account has not been compromised, access to your account was limited.

"Your account access will remain limited until this issue has been resolved. To secure your account and quickly restore full access, we may require some additional information from you."

The email states that you need to confirm your PayPal information by going directly to a website listed or to click on the link attached. This is a typical phishing email sent by fraudsters in an attempt to collect sensitive personal or financial information from you.

There are numerous variations of this scam including one asking to confirm whether you have added a certain address to your account.

According to PayPal's website, PayPal and its representatives never ask their customers to reveal the following information:

- Credit and debit card numbers
- Bank account numbers
- Driver's Licence numbers
- Email addresses
- Passwords
- Your full name

If anyone claiming to work for PayPal asks for your password under any circumstances, by email or by phone, refuse and immediately contact PayPal via their secure webform online. If you have fallen for this email and provided personal information, PayPal advises you to immediately log into your PayPal account and change your password, security questions and answers. If you notice any unauthorized activity on your PayPal account, contact PayPal. You should also contact your bank and credit card company immediately.

# Carry on Camping

With maps but no route chosen Craig and I dawdled our way across the Nullabor and South Australia before arriving in Mildura where the 'real holiday' was to begin. Our aim was to see as much of New South Wales and Victoria as we could in the eight weeks we had absconded from work. Having never had this length of time off before we were unsure if we would be able to stay on the road for that long.

We covered 13,500km taking in many of the main attractions such as the Snowy Mountains, the Murray River region, snowfields of Mt Hotham (had no idea we were going to be in the midst of THAT), Great Ocean Road, Riverina, Gippsland etc. etc.

Towing our camper trailer we stayed in 24 different campsites/towns/cities in the 51 days we were away. Camping isn't what it once was with many of the parks offering some very top of the range facilities.

Wagga Wagga was looking good for the 'Best Camp Kitchen' award; with its gas heater, TV, double hotplate with rangehood and plenty of seating. However as good as Wagga Wagga was we were left speechless by Tamworth with its leather lounges, gas pebble fire, 50" flat screen, double kitchen and ample tables and seating area...and that was just the kitchen. They also had an extensive outdoor BBQ area.

Bathrooms are always a bit tricky, I firmly believe that all proprietors of caravan parks should use their own facilities. Then they would discover that one hook isn't enough, that a shower curtain does keep your clothes etc dry and that the bench where you sit your toiletries is best if its more than six inches deep. My pet hate is the 'knock 'em up in a day' partitioning that most caravan parks use. The walls don't reach the floor, so when you drop your soap it shoots across to the next cubicle (or further) and you hope you can get it back! However some parks had some real luxuries with heated floors, internal heating and piped music. Peterborough in South Australia didn't have any of these things but I'd have to say they got my vote for cleanliness, good benches and partitions that went to the floor.

There were many highlights and it was interesting to see the differences between the states. To those whose main focus in life is roads, WA has really good ones. Although NSW's main highways are great (except for all the other traffic) the lesser roads are bumpy and potholed!

Hay was a lovely town to visit, surrounded by flat plains of farmland it boasts some beautiful old buildings that are very much still in use. This was where we came across a curious habit within many NSW communities, reverse angle parking. Provides much better vision when taking off but I noticed one café patron at sidewalk seating get quite nervous as a ute's tray kept coming toward her. Hay made good use of the Murrumbidgee River with plenty of BBQ's and seating along the river bank as well as free camping. The local Visitor Centre offered free internet and free bike hire. Hay is home to the Shearer's Hall of Fame and a museum featuring the POW camp. This was the first time we had seen cotton growing.

Although there's a plethora of free camping all of the caravan parks were well used. Luckily for us caravan parks seemed to be well used to patrons booking in before lunch and with towns/cities so close together this happened on a couple of occasions.

If you think you're having a bad day spare a thought for the truckie whose rig died halfway up the Blue Mountains. Hands on his hips he just watched as the truck spewed water from its radiator, not much fun when you're boxed in by terrain and traffic.

Not having seen snow before we were treated to it while driving through the Snowy Mountains, before taking a day trip to Thredbo to have a good look around. Neither of us was interested in the idea of skiing and after seeing the queues for the ski lifts I'd have to say that was a good thing. There were people everywhere!

Having seen many photographs of the Twelve Apostles it was nice to visit in person....with about a thousand others. The site was buzzing with the carpark at capacity with a dozen tour buses and plenty of private vehicles and two helicopters flying back and forth offering a bird's eye view to their passengers.

Mt Panorama in Bathurst was a great experience with anyone being able to drive on the track. Driveways lead off it and there's a vineyard, housing and horses in the middle of the circuit. I'm presuming they must love motor racing or come March they go on holiday.

While camping at Wodonga we took a drive around Ned Kelly country, Benalla being one city that we took (also where Weary Dunlop grew up) in. They have the most beautiful cemetery, possibly because they have an employed curator. After visiting graves that had ties to

### Public Question Time

In accordance with the *Local Government (Administration) Regulations 1996*, a minimum of 15 minutes for public question time will be set aside at Council Meetings for members of the public to ask questions relating to Shire activities. Anyone may ask a question.

Questions may be submitted in two ways:

1. Questions submitted in writing and be 'put on notice' before the Council Meeting.
2. Questions may be raised from the public gallery 'without notice' during public question time.

The Shire encourages members of the public to submit a question in writing prior to a Council Meeting. This enables Council to provide a more "well-researched" and complete response. These questions and answers will be listed on the agenda for the next scheduled meeting.



- Records can only be assessed by the person who appears on them. Your partner, mother or sister cannot access your record.
- Payment of invoices and renewals can be paid by any person if they present a renewal notice or invoice.

Enquiries should be directed to the Department of Transport, 13 11 56. The reason for this is so there is a record of the conversation and a way of tracking it. The Shire can be contacted to book PDA tests and to answer simple enquiries. We cannot access any records over the phone.



We are now a couple of weeks into the Restricted Burning Time with the Prohibited Burning Time starting on 1 November.

Now is the time to be preparing yourselves and your property for the fire season;

- **Preparing Your Property**—Create and maintain a Building Protection Zone, 20m radius, around your home. Remove as much flammable material as possible. Make sure your gas cylinders are secure and that the vent at the top of the cylinder is pointing away from the house. - **Pack your Emergency Kit**—Items to consider; torch & spare batteries, AM/FM radio & spare batteries, mobile phone charger, first aid kit, woollen blankets, food & water (for your pets too), cooking gear and eating utensils. 
