Editorial

♦ A huge thankyou to Chloe and Rosie for holding the fort while I was in Perth attending the Linkwest conference that is held every two years. Linkwest are the overarching body for regional CRC's and our metro cousins, Neighbourhood Centres and provide a great service in terms of governance, advice and information. It was a great get together with some inspiring guest speakers and fantastic workshops for us to attend. With CRC's and Neighbourhood Centres facing uncertainty with future budget cuts it is important that we value what we have. There has been conversation in Parliament about the number of CRC's in the Wheatbelt; that in our area there is a CRC for every 1800 people compared to one for every 22,000 people in the Pilbara, one for every 3,500 in the Kimberley and one for every 13,000 in the southwest. Now this might make you sit up and think if you didn't understand the disparity of population within our state, if you forgot that cities such as Bunbury and Albany are included in the southwest. The Wheatbelt is in the position of having towns spaced far enough apart that it is difficult to 'just pop over to the next town and do that photocopy'. There's also a misconception that CRC's are all about computer and internet access; that's what the major focus was 20 years ago but we have moved into other areas. Having said that computer and internet access is still a drawcard as many don't have a functioning printer, have unreliable internet or don't have the software that

Rural Woman of the Year

A remarkable West Australian who is helping rural kids and women to transform their lives is the Rural Woman of the Year for 2017.

Tanya Dupagne founded Camp Kulin in the WA Wheatbelt in 2013, after moving from Perth despite the warnings of her friends that she might regret moving to a town with a population of just 300.

Since then, Camp Kulin has gained national and international recognition for its pioneering work, particularly in helping children and teenagers who have survived trauma.

Ms Dupagne said she was surprised to be named Rural Woman of the Year, at a gala celebration at Parliament House in Canberra on Wednesday 20th September.

She will use the \$10,000 bursary she has been awarded to extend the Camp Kulin program to rural women across regional Western Australia, and eventually the rest of Australia.

"The biggest request we have had is from mums and ladies saying 'We want to come to camp too. When is that going to happen?'" she said.

"That's what this will enable us to provide."

Ms Dupagne said her goal was to make leadership affordable and accessible to everyone, and to provide rural women with the skills they needed to help change their communities.

"There's a lot of issues facing Australia as a whole, things like mental health, domestic violence, all those kinds of things are hard enough already," she said.

"But when you live in a regional community where there is little to no support available, it's even harder.

"So it's really important that we can support women and provide them with the skills they need, so that when those things do come up they're equipped to deal with them."

Lake Grace Gym Club Season Wrap Up

On the weekend of 16th and 17th of September, Lake Grace Gymnastics Club finished off the 2017 season by competing in the "Go For 2 & 5" Southern Regional Gymnastics Association (SRGA) Regional Championships. An annual event, the Championships are held over two days in Katanning, with teams competing from Esperance, Narrogin, Dumbleyung (Kukerin), Katanning, Denmark and this year, Armadale.

Our team of fourteen gymnasts (two boys and twelve girls) were accompanied by their coaches, Lauren O'Neill, Lisa Pearce, and Renae Jury. Some of our gymnasts had never competed in a gymnastics competition, so it was quite daunting to compete in large groups, in a formal gymnastics setting.

First to compete on Saturday morning were our two boys, Clancy Lay (Level 3) and Jack Willis (Level 1), who competed in a field of 36 male gymnasts in Levels 1-5. Male gymnasts (MAG) compete and are scored on six apparatus (floor, pommel, rings, vault, parallel bars and high bars) and seeing the boys' strength is always impressive. Their scores on each apparatus are tallied to give each gymnast an overall score and ranking. All gymnasts then receive either a gold, silver or bronze medallion based on their ranking. Clancy Lay received a Silver medal, and was awarded the "SRGA MAG Level 3 Regional Champion". Jack Willis, in his first gym competition, did extremely well to earn a Silver medal.

Next to compete were our five Foundation Level 1 girls. Girls compete on four apparatus - vault, bars, beam and floor. In a field of 30 gymnasts, the girls did a great job, receiving the following medals: Gold - Torah Robertson, Silver - Alexis Jury, Aleisha Smith and Chloe Smith, Bronze - Ella Ward.

By mid afternoon it was time for the Foundation Level 2 girls competition. We had just one gymnast, Grace Penney, competing in a field of 39 gymnasts. Grace did a great job of representing the Lake Grace team in this level and received a Silver medal.

It was an early start again on Sunday morning, with our six Level 3 girls needing to be in Katanning at 8am. This level is always competitive, and this year was no exception with an amazing 56 gymnasts competing. Again, our gymnasts did very well, receiving the following medals: Silver - Maisey Lay, Amber Pearce and

A huge thank you to our Treasurer, Tahlia Willock who has been doing a fantastic job keeping our finances organised.



Education Minister Announces a Reduction to the Boarding Away from Home Allowance

Media Release

The Isolated Children's Parents' Association of Western Australia (ICPA WA) have been informed by the Education Minister, Hon. Sue Ellery MLC that the Boarding Away From Home Allowance (BAHA) will decrease after 2017.

As of 2018, the BAHA will reduce over four years due to the Royalties for Regions (R4R) funding ceasing after 2017.

The BAHA was last increased in 2010 from \$1320.00 to \$2105.00, with \$785.00 coming from R4R funding. ICPA WA have been informed that the following rates will apply:

2018 - \$1948.00 2019 - \$1791.00 2020- \$1643.00 2021 - \$1477.00

Many families throughout WA rely heavily on this funding. ICPA WA have continually lobbied the previous and current State Governments for an increase to this vital allowance.

Members throughout the State are disappointed with this decision saying that once again the Government have forgotten about rural and remote families.

One Kimberley member was quoted as saying "The State Government talk about developing the north, yet give families no incentive to live in remote areas"

Past ICPA Federal President and WA State President, Roxanne Morrissey has said "Any savings the Government may make will be minimal compared to the anguish that this announcement will cause our members who rely heavily on this much-needed allowance".

Government and Independent boarding facilities throughout the State raise boarding fees from between 3-8% per annum, with the gap widening progressively between the true cost of sending a child away for school and the allowances received by the Government.

For many students their closest high school is several hundred kilometres away and their only option is to travel to Perth to attend high school. For students residing in the Pilbara their only option is to attend school in Perth as they have no direct access to the Government Country Residential Colleges.

Voice for Regional Education Working Together to ensure access to appropriate education for all regional Australians.

Established in 1971, the Isolated Children's Parents' Association (ICPA) is a national organisation representing rural students and their families at all stages of education and has a large network of

branches throughout Australia. ICPA WA works within the community to provide support and assistance to rural and regional families across Western Australia. We advocate and lobby to assist families to access appropriate education for their children.

Pilbara Branch member Robin Pensini has said "My husband and I were shocked to learn the State Government have implemented a decrease in the BAHA beginning in 2018. Our youngest child of four will begin boarding in Year 8 next year in Perth. Our family has relied heavily on federal and state allowances in order to make ends meet over the past 8 years since our eldest began boarding in 2010. Based on experience, educating children in the northwest in an isolated area has been the most challenging aspect of raising our children. Why doesn't the state government support families like ours who are committed to developing sustainable long term living in regional and remote areas".

Regional Aged Care Top of McGowan's Hit List

Media Release

Nationals WA seniors and ageing spokesman Peter Rundle says aged care has been abandoned by the McGowan Government after almost \$50 million for regional ageappropriate housing was wiped from the State Budget.

Mr Rundle said omission of \$46.2 million of Royalties for Regions funding committed by the previous State Government for seniors housing across 27 local government areas would force hundreds of seniors to seek accommodation options elsewhere.

"The Labor Government has shown no compassion making this decision, which means overall more than 170 specially designed age-appropriate and worker houses will not be built in the south of our state," he said.

"Such disregard for the elderly is shameful and goes against the findings of a landmark report that has guided previous Government investment in regional seniors housing."

The majority of towns and projects hit by funding cuts are in the Wheatbelt and Great Southern, however, the Budget reveals funding for a 12-unit project in Brunswick Junction has also been abandoned.

Mr Rundle said investment had been guided by the Ageing in the Bush study that identified housing and care models enabling ageing regional residents to age in their communities.

"Cutting funding has jeopardised federal funding leveraged for the some projects and many millions of dollars raised and committed by Shires and community groups," he said.

"It is one of the most unpardonable acts of this Government to date. The Nationals WA will continue advocating for investment in regional aged care and housing."

Member for the Agricultural Region Colin de Grussa MLC said the McGowan Government had chosen to fund Perth election promises and use Royalties for Regions to pay for regular government services in the bush rather than keep seniors connected with their regional communities.

"WA Labor has raided Royalties for Regions to pay for teachers, subsidies for the delivery of water services and general road spending and are slugging households higher fees and charges," he said.

"The McGowan Government has failed to deliver on its promises and regional Western Australia will suffer the most."

Capacity, A Wellbeing Driver

Warrior Wellbeing Article

A word that I feel is over used and out of context in the modern world today is the word 'resilience' and I would like to question the use of that word. There is even a whole industry built around 'resilience' in the form of providing training and education services in this space.

Resilience is the correct word if used in the context of a person's ability to 'bounce back' ie. recovering from shock or trauma. However, when it is used about:-

- our ability to cope with everyday life;
- going through a shared adversity such as a natural disaster;
- an adverse personal event (ie. death or illness);

it is often used out of context because these experiences encompass much more than just 'bouncing back'.

Both on an individual basis and as a community it is not until we experience a traumatic event or been pricked by a circumstance that we will find out how resilient we are. The public is telling us that all the time.

Consequently, when we use the word 'resilience' we are pigeon holing an individual and/or community into a category that 'so called' experts want us to fit into. For example, after a traumatic event the experts are quick to say that the community and/or individual is 'resilient' rather than acknowledging that we all have a random 'capacity' when operating outside our comfort zone. I suggest that a better baseline word to use to encapsulate all the times in our lives (the good as well as the challenging) is the word 'capacity'.

Capacity is the capability to contain and accommodate stuff in our lives. This conveys a positive vibe to us as we endeavour to maintain the right balance.

We are all born with a random capacity to deal with life's issues. It is a bit like a rubber band and we all know and recognise an individual's capacity to operate fully, half, or to not appear stretched at all. No matter what we are challenged by, we all have ups and

G'day all,

Summer is nearly here and as the days get longer and warmer so does the workload for the Lake Grace Police Station. That's not to say we are in the midst of a crime wave, however the increase in tourist traffic sees us on the road a lot more and also the warmer months bring the music events, country shows and our very own Newdegate Field Day.

I would just like to take the opportunity to publicly congratulate the Newdegate Field Days Committee for the fantastic show they put on this year. From a Police point of view there was nothing left to chance and the Committee did a thorough job of making the event a safe and trouble free one.

Newdegate recently suffered some vandalism on the oval, as many will know, and we are pleased to announce that we have apprehended and charged a male for a number of traffic offences in relation to this incident. It was community information that led us to this individual and I am pleased you have all responded so positively to my requests from previous newsletters.

Other positive results in recent weeks were that a Pingrup male has been arrested and charged for a number of burglary and stealing offences in Pingrup. He left some fingerprints at some crime scenes leading to his eventual arrest. He was questioned regarding the Lake Grace Sportman's Club break in (the same weekend) and we are satisfied that this male is the culprit. He faces Katanning Magistrates Court soon and we will keep you posted with any further updates. Just a reminder to all Sports Club Presidents and Committees to review their security arrangements before stocking up with food and alcoholic drinks for the spring and summer sporting seasons. We are more than happy to come and visit and provide crime prevention advice if you want to call and make an appointment.

A recent traffic collision highlighted a bit of a knowledge gap within the community, and thought I'd raise a couple of points for information of everyone. If you have a collision with another vehicle the details you exchange with the other driver are name of the driver and their driving licence number. You are not required to provide phone numbers or home addresses, but some do this when things are amicable. I would advise anyone to also write down rego plates before leaving the scene. If one or both parties is getting heated — call for Police to attend using the station number. If it seems violence is imminent or serious injury is involved dial 000. By leaving the scene of a collision without exchanging details you could be committing an offence.

Traffic crashes can be fairly fraught situations and it is to be expected that tempers might fray, but as a driver you need to be responsible enough to make reasonable decisions regardless.

On a personal note the Lake Grace LDAG (Local drug Action Group) is up and running and are building on some initial successes. Keep an eye out for upcoming LDAG sponsored events such as "Ice Breakers" visiting Lake Grace soon. If anyone is keen to jump on the committee please make contact with either myself or Suzanne at the CRC.

Anaphylaxis is an Emergency!

Anaphylaxis (A SEVERE AND SERIOUS ALLERGIC REACTION) is rapid in onset and may cause death if not treated quickly!

Causes can include bee sting, food allergy (eg peanuts/ seafood). People with known allergies should avoid contact with the allergen and carry an EpiPen at all times.

Symptoms occur suddenly and can progress quickly to become life threatening so treatment needs to start as soon as possible

The initial symptoms may be coughing, itching, hives, fainting, trouble breathing, swollen tongue. These can guickly progress leading to loss of consciousness and may need CPR.

- If the person has known allergies and carries an EpiPen then administer it
- You must call for an ambulance on 000 and/or start to head for hospital—more treatment and monitoring will definitely be necessary
- Monitor the patient and be prepared to administer a second EpiPen (if available and symptoms do not improve) and be prepared to perform CPR if breathing and pulse stop

If recognised and treated promptly people suffering anaphylaxis will generally make a full recovery. So even if you doubt the need for treatment, it is better to be safe than sorry.



"At CBH, our vision is for everyone to return home safely at the end of each working day.



Growing Up in Lake Grace Pt VIII

John Dyke


A former resident of Lake Grace, John Dyke was born in King Edward Memorial Hospital in Subiaco, on 24 April 1935, to Noel Frederick Dyke and May Dyke. Dad had gone ahead to Lake Grace as Secretary to the Road Board. They had come to West Australia from Wales, UK, in 1926, paid their own way, and were sent to the South West, south of Bridgetown, to one of the Group Settlements, No's 126 and 127. The whole thing was a complete con between the British and Australian Governments, promising the new settlers a house, good land to cultivate, and the promise that within a few short years, working hard, they would be wealthy enough to return to the UK and have a good holiday. John and his wife Cheryl currently live in Albany. The following is the eighth part in a series detailing some of John's earlier adventures.

Early In 1959 I was patrolling up through Kings Park at about 9.30pm when I noticed the car in front of me was being driven erratically so I pulled the driver over in a parking area to have a chat with him. He got out of the car and said have I done something wrong officer? I could see he had been drinking and said yes your driving is a little erratic, have you been drinking? He said yes officer we had a few drinks at the office myself and the other directors after the staff had gone home. I realise I have done the wrong thing and must apologize,

my wife will probably kill me for this but you have a job to do and I am prepared to accept the consequences.

He was extremely polite and well dressed, we chatted on for a few minutes and I then said do you have anything in your car of any value to which he replied only my brief case officer. I said go and get your brief case and lock the car and then give me the keys, to which he replied, yes of course officer. He came back to me and handed me the keys. I asked him where he lived, and he replied Nedlands officer. I said get on the back of my bike and hold on tight as I don't want to lose you and have to explain that to your wife. So he did and I took him home. Took him to the front door and knocked, the door was opened by a lady in her late thirties or so, I said I'm sorry to bother you madam but your husband has had a few drinks so his car is in Kings Park and I have brought him home.

She took one look at him and said, I have told you before Charles the next time you come home at this hour of the night half drunk I'm going to divorce you now go into the lounge sit down and be quiet. Charles did and I said do you mind if I come in and we can have a chat. She said of course not officer, you should have locked him up and that may have knocked a bit of sense into him. We sat together at the dining room

table. I said do you have any children and she replied yes officer two boys aged 14 and 16, they are upstairs in bed asleep after having finished their homework. Where do they go to school I asked. They both go to Scotch College officer. Are you involved with any clubs here in Nedlands. Yes officer we both belong to the Golf club. Charles, I said, what do you think would happen if I arrested you for drunk driving and in the worst case you got 3 months in Fremantle Prison. Would the golf club want you still as a member, would your wife be looked down upon by the other ladies, and what about your 2 sons do you think Scotch College would want the sons of a convicted criminal doing a jail sentence mixing with the other students. Charles you have a beautiful wife and 2 sons who need you as a husband and father, do you want to destroy your marriage and lose your boys? No I don't officer and as of this moment on I promise my darling wife who I love with all my heart that I will never have another drink. I gave the lady the car keys told her to ring for a taxi and I would wait and when it arrived I would escort the taxi back to their car, and she could then drive it home. As I was walking out the door she threw her arms around me and gave me a big kiss on the cheek, and said thank you officer you are the nicest Policeman I have ever met and I will always remember you.

Some three months later I was on patrol sitting off the highway next to a shopping centre in Nedlands when she came up to me, we exchanged greetings and she said, I can never thank you enough for what you did for our family, Charles and I are very happy and he has not had another drink since that night. I said some people deserve another chance in life and I am glad I was able to give you that chance and we parted company.

A year and a half later I was sitting in the same spot and she came up to me again, I have to tell you officer both of our boys are doing very well at school the eldest is being put forward as School Captain and the younger is doing extremely well academically, Charles is now the Chairman of the board and we are so very happy, Charles wants to meet with you so that he can thank you personally. I said I would love to, your husband is a true gentleman, but I can't as such a meeting could be misconstrued as corruption, just give Charles my best wishes and God bless you and your family. And that was the last time that we met.

In about 1959 I joined the 10th Light Horse Regiment and within the next 12 months there were 6 Police officers in the regiment, all Sergeants in C squadron. Only one with previous military experience and that was "Baldy" Peter Sims who had served in Korea. Baldy used to tell us the Korean's had the edge on the allies as all they needed in food supplies was a bag of rice in their backpack, whereas the allies needed a convoy of trucks to supply enough food to feed them. In January-February of 1961 we were to carry out exercises against the British Commandos who had just come down from Singapore on the Aircraft Carrier HMS Bullwark. I had six Ferrit Scout Cars in my troop with a driver and Crew Commander in each vehicle.

Attached to the troop were approx. 20 SAS Commandos and Sergeant Ray Simpson who was with me on my Ferrit. Our job was to transport the SAS troops overland just after sundown for something like an hour and a half, then when Sergeant Simpson said we were in the right location we stopped, his boys got off and they disappeared into the night. An hour or two later we would hear a number of explosions and another hour later they would return jump on the Scout cars and we would travel back to base.

I must say that I have never met a guy who came across as tough as Ray Simpson at about 5 feet ten inches with a huge barrel chest, and muscles everywhere. Just to look at Ray you would think I wouldn't like to tangle with this bloke. Each night before moving out Ray would give his boys a rundown on where we were going and what they would be doing and who was doing what, Ray used to swear a lot and watching and listening as I did each night I always got the impression that if Ray said ok you guys follow me we are just going to jump off this cliff it's only 100 foot down but the landing will be soft, each one of them would have followed.

One night he said to me, John how do you put up with the Officers you have, not one of them would last a day in the real man's army. I said Ray they give the orders, mostly they drink a lot of booze and we take very little notice of them, we do the job, but we do it our way. Ray said well keep doing it your way John. I have a photo I took one morning just after we had finished breakfast, not a good photo but it shows Ray in the foreground kicking out the fire and behind Ray is my driver Lance corporal Adrian Roberts.

Adrian was a big chap about 6 feet 2 inches, good looking guy and heavily built, he absolutely loved the army, and in civvies was an art teacher. Adrian was accepted into our military college Duntroon, graduated as a 2nd Lt and the next I hear of him, he is mentioned in dispatches fighting in Vietnam in charge of an APC group.

Adrian has appeared on T.V. several times being interviewed about that battle. The last time I met Adrian was on Rottnest Island in the 70's and he was telling me that he was thinking of leaving the Army as promotion was very slow, he was then a Captain. The next time I saw Adrian was after the death of Sir Robert Menzies our longest serving Prime Minister. The funeral would have been the largest in Australia's history, was broadcast live on Television and as I sat down to watch, the commentator was saying. "And now swinging into the Boulevard is the 2nd 44th Battalion (may have been another Battalion) and leading the Parade is Lt Colonel Adrian Roberts, and there he was looking like a million dollars leading a Parade of thousands. And I thought then good luck to you Adrian you deserve to be leading that Parade. I have since learned that Adrian is now a full Colonel.

GSFL Grand Final

Unfortunately, Blair received a couple of solid knocks during the game which saw him taken to hospital as a precaution. You'll be pleased to know he's fine and was back to support the other teams later in the day. Poch also received 3rd Fairest & Best at the Royals Presentation night on Saturday.
