How's Your Prostate?

It's the most commonly diagnosed cancer in men with over 3,000 dying each year and kills more men than breast cancer kills women. It's not a competition but sadly the prostate possibly hasn't been receiving the same amount of publicity as women's breasts and its only gained traction in recent years with a focus on men's health and the importance of conversation.

Of those diagnosed around 92% will be alive five years after diagnosis. Although the disease only affects men physically it has a devastating effect on families and the communities they live in. There has been significant advances in the treatment of prostate cancer but this is heavily reliant on research and the funds needed to keep it happening

The Long Ride is a national charity motorcycle ride for the Prostate Cancer Foundation Australia (PCFA). The Long Ride has been undertaken every 18 months or so since about 2007. In addition to fund raising for the PCFA, the ride aims, through community involvement, to promote awareness of the PCFA and the issues associated with this disease. The event attracts motorcyclists from all walks of life, but also is strongly

supported by Australian Defence Force personnel.

The 2016 Long Ride destination was Margaret River, and previous Long Rides have included Uluru, Darwin and Far North Queensland among other places. This year's ride destination is Tasmania, which has meant a number of local riders are unable to do the full Long Ride of almost three weeks away. Instead we (Long Ride *Team WA*) have opted to conduct a "Short Ride" over six days, taking in much of the Wheatbelt, Great Southern, and Goldfields regions. The Long Riders will accompany the Short Riders as far as Norseman and continue east, while the rest of *Team WA* will return to Perth through the Wheatbelt.

In previous years, our practice has been to establish points of contact at each town en-route to support us with coordinating the visit, local publicity and assisting with any donations collected. Normally we have worked through regional Mens' Sheds and RSL branches, as they provide direct access to the demographic most affected by prostate cancer. We have also worked with sporting

Local School Awarded for Alcohol, Drug and Road Safety Education

A local school was among the first in the state to be recognised for improving the health and wellbeing of the community, at an awards ceremony on Thursday 21 September.

Lake Grace District High School received a gold award for completing Changing Health Acting Together

(CHAT), an initiative developed and funded by School Drug Education and Road Aware (SDERA).

CHAT builds resilience in students, parents, staff and the community by integrating road safety and alcohol and other drugs education into classroom learning and school practices.

The event was attended by various special guests including the Hon. Roger Cook MLA, Deputy Premier, Minister for Health; Mental Health, the Hon. Samantha Rowe MLC, Parliamentary Secretary to the Minister for Education and Training and Colin Pettit, the Commissioner for Children and Young People.

The Hon. Roger Cook MLA, Deputy Premier, Minister for Health; Mental Health spoke about the value of drug and alcohol education for children and young people, and commended schools for their hard work. To assist in the roll out of the initiative, each school received funding from SDERA, free classroom resources and free professional development for school staff.

"The benefits of CHAT extend far beyond the classroom," he said.

Earlier this year Lake Grace Roadwise funded a dozen \$25 vouchers to the Lake Grace Roadhouse for our local police to hand out to drivers they noticed were exhibiting safe driving practises. All of the vouchers are now gone but it could be something that Roadwise will do on a regular basis.

The image of flashing lights in the rear view mirror has many motorists scrambling to remember how many demerit points they have left while frantically checking their seatbelt and speed. Therefore, it was a happy moment for those motorists who were pulled over to be surprised with a reward.

Local police have located themselves in the middle of town for a few hours most weeks over the past 6 months, checking the speed of vehicles as they pass through town whilst conducting breath tests and they have not been able to give out more than a couple of verbal cautions. Local Government Elections are rapidly approaching and with the Shire of Lake Grace receiving seven nominations for five vacancies the interest of the community has been aroused.

After sixteen years on council, four years as Deputy President and six years as President, Andrew Walker has retired from his position as Councillor for the Lake Grace Shire. Andrew has enjoyed his time on council and said that it opened his eyes to the complexities of local government. "You are constantly learning and it is rewarding being involved in the budget process and decisions being made", said Andrew.

Renominating are our current Shire President Jeanette de Landgrafft, Ross Chappell, Len Armstrong and Murray Stanton who have all served 10, 4, 7½ and 4 years respectively.

It's fantastic that people continue to give their time and expertise to help with the running of our local government; the fact that those renominating continue to do so is a credit to them. Equally important to local government is the reinvigoration that fresh blood can give; so it's a positive to see Mikaela Spurr, Mark Walker, and Peter Stoffberg putting forward their nominations.

Councillors are elected for terms of four years with elections held every two years for half of the council. Steve Hunt, Debrah Clarke, Allan Marshall and Roz Lloyd are half way through their four year terms and therefore didn't have to go up for election.

Election day is Saturday 21st October and the Returning Officer, Carly Smith, must receive your voting package by 6pm of this day. The convenience of a postal vote means that you can slip your vote back in the mail as soon as you have filled it out, or you can hand deliver on the day to the Shire Chambers.

While voting in a local government election is not compulsory in Western Australia, this is your opportunity to have a say in who you would like representing you in local affairs.


Jeanette de Landgrafft

Spammers Continuing to Hit Emails

Media Release

Scams and spammers continue trying to deceive innocent victims through their emails. Fake infringement notices and fake announcements of winning competitions are just a couple of these annoying and tiring emails doing the rounds at the moment. These can often look very real and may alarm the recipient. If you are unsure if it is real or not, don't hesitate to ask for advice. If you have received an email that you think may be suspicious, print it out and bring it in to the CRC and we will do our best to find out if it is indeed a scam.

This Stay Smart Online Week, the ACCC is warning the community to watch out for common online scams they might encounter.

The online sphere – email, the internet, social media and mobile apps – has overtaken telephones as scammers' preferred tool of the trade to contact potential victims. In 2017, the ACCC's Scamwatch site has received more than 51,000 reports of scammers trying to con people online. Online scam losses total nearly \$37 million so far in 2017.

"It's difficult to spot a scammer online these days as they go to great lengths to trick the public and steal personal information and money," ACCC Deputy Chair Delia Rickard said.

Two scams that people may encounter online are:

 Phishing – often delivered via email, scammers will pretend to be from well-known businesses and government departments to con unsuspecting victims out of their personal information and money. For example they might say they're from Apple and you need to reset your password for security reasons, or they may offer you a gift voucher to a major supermarket for completing a 'survey'.

company and send you a fake bill. These scams
can be very hard to pick as the fake bills scammers
send look authentic.

"If you're ever contacted out of the blue, particularly via email, by someone asking you to pay a bill, complete a survey or update your passwords, it pays to be skeptical. If it seems too good to be true, it probably is. If you're unsure about the legitimacy of something online like a store, classified listing or email you receive, do you own research as others who have been stung by scammers will often post warnings for others. There are also plenty of very useful tips and advice at www.scamwatch.gov.au to avoid being stung by online scams," Ms Rickard said.

Don't Let the Deadline be a Dread-Line

ATO Media Release

The Australian Taxation Office (ATO) is reminding taxpayers that there is just one month left to lodge their own tax returns. Assistant Commissioner Kath Anderson said that over 2.5 million people have already lodged their own returns via myTax, with another 5.2 million people lodging via an agent, and she expects millions more in October.

"The upcoming deadline shouldn't be cause for concern though, because our suite of online services makes it easier than ever before to get your return in on time," she said.

"We use sophisticated data-matching technology to prefill most information into returns, including things like wages, bank interest and dividends. With the majority of pre-fill information now available most of the hard work is already done, and it's even easier if you have been recording your deductions using myDeductions on the ATO app. In most cases you or your registered agent only need to double-check the pre-filled information, include any work-related expenses and click submit.

"If you plan to lodge your own tax return using the ATO's online service myTax, you need to lodge by 31 October 2017. If something happens and you miss the deadline, you should lodge as soon as you can to minimise penalties."

Ms Anderson reminded taxpayers planning to use a registered tax agent to talk to them before the deadline.

"Agents are able to lodge your return after 31 October, but only if you are on your agent's books before then. This is especially important to remember if you're using an agent for the first time or using a different agent this year."

Most returns are processed in less than two weeks, and over 98.8% of people who have already lodged a tax return this year received their refunds within 12 days. However, Ms Anderson warns that mistakes in your return may create delays.

"If you realise you have made a mistake and have already lodged, don't stress. You can quickly and easily make an amendment online using myTax or by contacting your registered tax agent," Ms Anderson said.

"If you don't fix it, we may have to contact you, which can create unnecessary processing delays."

Ms Anderson urged taxpayers not to put off doing a tax return if they expect to have a debt.

"We know some people put off lodging because they think they'll owe money, and they don't realise that the payment will be due on 21 November regardless of when they lodge," Ms Anderson said.

"We have ways to help you if you think you may have difficulties paying your tax debt, but you still need to lodge on time.

"If you need assistance, it's important that you contact us early and we'll work with you to tailor a payment plan

to your circumstances. Depending on your situation, you might even be able to set up a payment plan online."

ATO officers have heard it all when it comes to excuses for lodging late. Here are some of the boldest examples we've heard recently.

- "My paperwork flew out the car window when I was on my way to see the accountant."
- "I have a condition that only allows me to work 30 minutes each week, so I couldn't lodge."
- "My accountant has gone to prison. He is working on it, but it's taking longer than normal because he can't access a computer."
- "My ex-wife burnt everything belonging to me, including all of my tax records."
- A taxpayer was asked why he hadn't lodged returns for years between 2008 to 2015, and he said it was because he suffered a back injury in 2016.
- A taxpayer said he hadn't lodged his return on time because his father had died recently. The ATO officer was sympathetic until case notes revealed that he had used the same excuse more than a year before.



and social groups, regional Army Reserve units, as well as Shire Community Development Officers where a suitable community group was not available. Support offered by these groups ranged from publicity, prepositioning donation tins or hosting a community sausage sizzle and information session through to providing overnight camping facilities.

Through that community support, in 2016, Long Ride *Team WA*, comprising 16 riders and a couple of support vehicles, rode some 3500 kilometres over seven very rainy days, and raised over \$18,000 towards the PCFA, thereby contributing to the national Long Ride total of around \$400,000.

Once the members had finished drooling over the motorbikes they waved the Short Riders off as they headed toward Hyden on the next leg of their tour.

Anaphylaxis is an Emergency!

Anaphylaxis (A SEVERE AND SERIOUS ALLERGIC REACTION) is rapid in onset and may cause death if not treated quickly!

Causes can include bee sting, food allergy (eg peanuts/ seafood). People with known allergies should avoid contact with the allergen and carry an EpiPen at all times.

Symptoms occur suddenly and can progress quickly to become life threatening so treatment needs to start as soon as possible

The initial symptoms may be coughing, itching, hives, fainting, trouble breathing, swollen tongue. These can guickly progress leading to loss of consciousness and may need CPR.

- If the person has known allergies and carries an EpiPen then administer it
- You must call for an ambulance on 000 and/or start to head for hospital—more treatment and monitoring will definitely be necessary
- Monitor the patient and be prepared to administer a second EpiPen (if available and symptoms do not improve) and be prepared to perform CPR if breathing and pulse stop

If recognised and treated promptly people suffering anaphylaxis will generally make a full recovery. So even if you doubt the need for treatment, it is better to be safe than sorry.

Don't Dodge When you Lodge

Media Release

The Australian Taxation Office (ATO) is reminding taxpayers there are serious consequences if they choose not to meet their tax obligations this tax time.

Assistant Commissioner Kath Anderson said most Australians want to do the right thing, but some refuse to pay their share, or pay at all.

"In the first instance we always try to help and educate taxpayers about how to get their tax right. Unfortunately in some cases people don't respond or deliberately make false statements to avoid paying the right amount of tax – and we have to pursue this," she said.

Ms Anderson said the ATO has sophisticated systems and analytics that ensure wrongdoing can't fly under the radar. If a claim raises a red flag in the system, auditors will investigate further.

"In 2015–16 for individual taxpayers we conducted around 450,000 reviews and audits, resulting in adjustments of nearly \$1 billion in income tax, and prosecuted over 1,300 taxpayers," Ms Anderson said.

"Criminal investigations and prosecution are a last resort and not something we take lightly. However, Australians expect us to make sure nobody gets a free ride and we are prepared to use all the avenues available to us to protect the integrity of the tax system.

"Our message to all taxpayers is that the ATO takes firm action against those who actively choose to ignore their obligations or try to game the system."

Ms Anderson said the ATO uses a range of strategies to manage taxpayer transgressions, ranging from help and education, to audits and even prosecution through the court system for more serious cases.

"When choosing a course of action, we consider a number of factors including a taxpayer's history of compliance, and the number of chances we've already given them to get back on track with their obligations," Ms Anderson said.

"The decision to prosecute is only made if we have exhausted other options to get the taxpayer to change their behaviour and correct their affairs."

The ATO is aware some people are willing to take risks and falsely claim work-related expenses. Ms Anderson said taxpayers considering risky claims should be on notice that the ATO is serious about dealing with non-compliance, and the consequences can be costly for those found to be doing the wrong thing.

"In the worst cases a penalty can be up to 95% of the tax shortfall amount. For example, we took a taxpayer to court over his false car work-related expense claims in two consecutive years, and he was ordered to pay more than \$4,000 in fines and court costs," Ms Anderson said.

"In another instance, a taxpayer had neglected to lodge his tax returns over a 12-year period despite being given a number of opportunities to comply. After being fined more than \$100,000 and still failing to get his tax affairs in order, he was handed down an eight month suspended sentence.

"The vast majority of Australians do the right thing, which is why we will pursue those who try to dodge their obligations. Our message to anyone thinking about making a false deduction, omitting income or not lodging at all is that it just isn't worth running the risk of audits, fines or prosecutions."

Restricted Burning Period

(Permits Required)

19 September - 31 October

Burning permits are required across the Shire, this includes burning within townsites.

Firebreaks must be in place from the 1 November to the 30 April.

Harvest Bans Zones

All fire zones in the Shire of Lake Grace will be on Channel 11 in an event of a fire.

- When a fire occurs on a property in a zone a Harvest and Vehicle Movement Ban will be imposed for the whole zone until the fire is deemed safe, and the Harvest and Vehicle Movement Ban is lifted.
- When a fire occurs on a property neighbouring a zone boundary both zones will have a Harvest and Vehicle Movement Ban imposed until the fire is deemed safe, and the Harvest and Vehicle Movement Ban is lifted.

Bushfire Warning System

During a bushfire, emergency services will provide you as much information as possible through a number of different methods. There are four levels of warning. These change to reflect the increasing risk to your life or property, and the decreasing amount of time you have until the fire arrives.



ADVICE

A fire has started but there is no immediate threat to lives or homes. Be aware and keep up to date.



WATCH AND ACT

There is a possible threat to lives or homes. You need to leave or get ready to defend - do not wait and see.



EMERGENCY

You are in danger and need to take immediate action to survive. There is a threat to lives or homes.



ALL CLEAR

Take care to avoid any dangers and keep up to date.

Same Sex Marriage Update

Media Release

The Australian Bureau of Statistics (ABS) has just published its second weekly update on the estimated number of survey forms they received in the same-sex marriage postal survey, saying the figure has hit 10 million.

That figure, from last Friday, October 6, is an increase of 800,000 forms on last week, taking the total to 62.5% of forms in the voluntary vote returned.

The ABS estimate is based on the number of bulk containers of returned forms it has, rather than counting individual or processed forms.

Around 16 million surveys sent out late last month and there's just under four weeks left for the form to be returned.

The survey closes on November 7 and the ABS is advising anyone who wishes to have their vote counted to post it by October 27. If you've lost your survey form, you can apply for a replacement up until Friday, October 20. Call 1800 572 113 or apply online.


The survey results will be released on November 15.

If you haven't got your survey materials you can request a replacement form easily and quickly via the ABS website's online enquiry form.

You'll be asked to supply personal information such as a driver's licence or Australian passport so we can verify your identity, send a new survey form and invalidate your previous form so only one response is counted.

Another option is to visit a capital city or regional pickup location. At each location you can collect a survey form, after verifying your identity. Locations can also accept returned survey forms or provide directions to a nearby Post Office or Red Post Box.

The ABS is providing a paperless option so that eligible Australians travelling overseas, people in aged care facilities or those with an illness, injury or disability can respond online or by phone.





The Most Common Mental Health Issue in Australia?

New research by beyondblue shows most people are unable to identify the most common mental health issue in Australia.

A survey reveals two in three Australians believe depression is the most common mental health condition in the country.

"Imagine spending years of your life expecting the worst to happen every single day. Imagine the experiences you might have had, if you'd been receiving treatment and support and were managing your condition rather than dismissing it. Imagine the things you could achieve if you were in control of your anxiety, rather than anxiety being in control of you," Ms Harman said.

"The point is you don't have to wait or wonder. Support is available and research tells us that it works."

Other findings from the survey of 1400 Australians include:

- 93 per cent of those who had professional support found the support useful

- 41 per cent of people think others believe anxiety is not a real medical condition



The importance of mental health and supporting one another is being recognised today as part of World Mental Health Day, with WAFarmers encouraging people to take care of each other now more than ever.

Everyone's a Winner in Malaysia Scratchie Scam

Media Release

Glossy travel brochures with fake scratchies are arriving in the mailboxes of WA residents with at least one of the two cards enclosed declaring a \$US190,000 win.

Consumer Protection warns residents that the Get It On Holiday travel brochure and scratchie cards are a scam designed to gain personal information from the supposed 'winners' who will then be asked to pay fees upfront before receiving their 'prize'.

Commissioner for Consumer Protection David Hillyard said this is the latest of many similar mail scams from a bogus Malaysian travel company that have been detected over many years.

"Every two years or so these professional looking travel brochures turn up in the mailboxes of WA residents with different names and different images but with one common purpose, to fleece the recipients of their money and possibly their identity," Mr Hillyard said.

"There is no prize and anyone who responds will be asked to verify their identity by providing personal and financial information which leaves them open to identity theft at some time in the future.


"So don't respond, don't provide personal information and, most importantly, don't send any money to these scammers. Throw out these brochures and the fake scratchies in the bin!

"We work with Australia Post to try to intercept scam mail but many still get through so WA householders need to be aware if they receive these enticing brochures offering fake prizes."

Codeine Scheduling Changes

Media Release

Experts from a number of key health groups are urging state and territory governments to support Australia's medicine regulator, the Therapeutic Goods Administration (TGA), in its decision to make codeine-based medications available only with a prescription from February 2018.

President of the Royal Australian College of General Practitioners (RACGP) Dr Bastian Seidel urged the states and territories to listen to the advice of health professionals and consumer groups and put the health and safety of patients in front of commercial interests.

"With more than one million Australians taking codeine based medications every year, codeine addiction has become a serious problem for our community," Dr Seidel said.

"The consumption of these medications is currently running out of control with over 16 million items being sold over the counter in pharmacies every year.

"Australian GPs are seeing the harmful effect these medications can have on our community, which is why the RACGP strongly endorsed the TGA's decision to reschedule over the counter codeine based medications."

Addiction specialist and the Royal Australasian College of Physicians' President of the Chapter of Addiction Medicine, Professor Adrian Reynolds, said patients with chronic pain should talk to their doctor.

"We strongly support a nationally integrated and coordinated real-time monitoring and reporting system, especially if it includes codeine and other prescribed medications of concern.

"However, we don't support the assumption that a reporting and monitoring system on its own, is going to identify and help people who are misusing these products. The health community needs to know what to do with this information.

"If we accept these products are at risk of abuse and should be monitored, then we should want patients to be assessed by their doctor before they are sold these products.

"We encourage political parties and the health community to work together and support the TGA's scheduling changes for codeine."

Painaustralia CEO Carol Bennett said, "Chronic pain is a major health issue in Australia - we need to do much better than offering medications that are often both ineffective and potentially harmful in responding to chronic pain. Providing appropriate pain management should be a much higher priority, particularly in rural locations where reliance on opioids is a significant issue.

"Painaustralia supports a co-ordinated, whole of sector strategy to address the issue of access to optimal pain management, including public and clinical education programs, linkages between rural health care clinicians via Telehealth with specialist city based services."

The TGA's decision is consistent with what has happened in most of Europe, the United Arab Emirates and Japan where these medicines can only be sold with a prescription. Canada is also heading in a direction of requiring a prescription for products containing codeine.


