# James Dam Added to Heritage List

A square dam with a concrete inlet chute and a "wave-like" roaded catchment based in Lake Grace in the eastern Wheatbelt has been added to the Register of Heritage Places.

AA Dam No190 James, Lake Grace was originally constructed in 1914 and, following improvements in 1949, became the first experimental roaded catchment dam in the State.

This dam was originally part of a State Government program to provide an adequate water supply to regions of the Wheatbelt during the early twentieth-century that were not part of the Goldfields Water Supply Scheme.

In 1949 the dam was expanded and improved using new technologies and materials to develop a more efficient method of water collection and storage for agricultural areas.

One of the innovations was a "roaded catchment" which is a sloped area with a corrugated surface that collects rainwater and channels it into a dam.

This technology was considered one of the greatest single advances in water conservation for the State.

Other works on the dam in 1949 increased its capacity from 1.4 million litres to 9.1 million litres.

As the population in the Lake Grace district continued to grow over the years, so did the need for more water and by 1975 the town became connected to the Comprehensive Water Supply Scheme providing a more reliable water supply for all residents.

James Dam has important social history for Lake Grace, being the site for both cricket and tennis. Tennis courts were constructed from termite nests post war and North Lake Grace participated in the district pennant competition from this site in 1950 and 1951. *"With cricket and tennis, the ladyfolk were able to participate in the years of sociability of these wonderful days. Tea from James Dam water, boiled into four gallon kerosene tins, the scones and cream cakes provided in abundance by the ladies, North Lake Grace's James Dam became a priority venue."*

But of course it wasn't all play with no work. A sheep dip was also built at the site that was shared by farmers local to the area.

## Book Review: *Ash Mountain* by Helen Fitzgerald

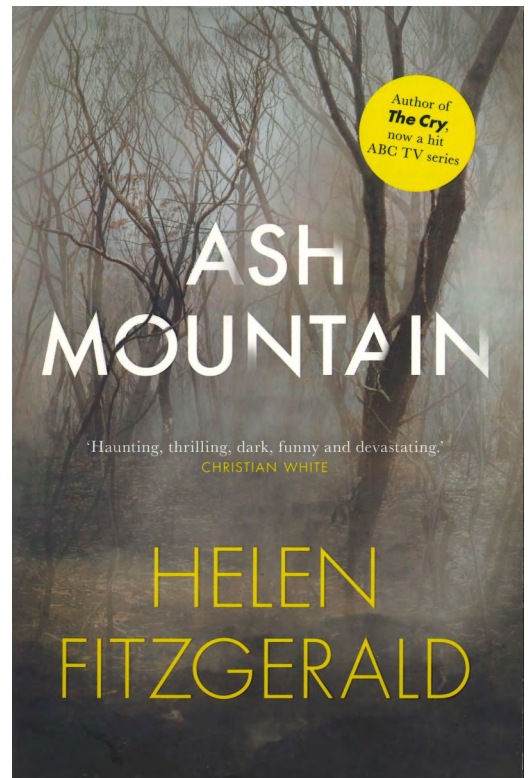
A little difficult to follow at first as it bounced between characters while going back and forth in time. However this book soon became addictive. It is wonderful to see so many Australian authors coming to the fore, the landscape and language is so familiar....this novel draws on Australia's ever present threat of bush fire while the shame of child sex abuse within the churches hovers in the background.

*Fran thought she'd never return to Ash Mountain but her dad has become ill, her relationship is over, and she hates her dead-end job in the city anyway. In a blistering summer, childhood memories prick at her fragile self-esteem as old friendships and rivalries are renewed, and new ones forged.*

*But the tumult of her home life is the least of her worries, because a bushfire is roaring towards Ash Mountain, and the town's long-held secrets will soon be exposed in the carnage.*

*Ash Mountain is uniquely Australian domestic noir - warm, blackly funny and a powder keg of accumulated tension. Vividly portraying small-town life, and a woman and a land in crisis, this is a disaster thriller you will never forget.*

## LOCAL NEWS

This week we popped into the Men's Shed for a surprise visit...nothing to do with the tea and cakes on offer, honestly. On attendance, we landed up on their training on their new Defibrillator. We happily joined in, as no one can be over trained in these valuable pieces of equipment.

At the end of the training, one of the members decided that he would like to try out the training he had received, by doing some CPR on the test dummy. I have to admit, I thought we were going to have to put the new defibrillator in to action by the time he was finished. But in all honesty, he did very well, and I think all members of the men shed who were in attendance found it very useful.

School canteen will be coming up soon. We will be at the school on Monday 29<sup>th</sup> November to help dish up some tasty treats to the kids. This will be Josh's first attempt at feeding the hungry kids. I'm not sure he knows what he's let himself in for.

## CRIME

Lake Grace made the news this week, unfortunately it wasn't all good news.

We have received a report of damage to a paddock just outside of Lake Grace. The unknown suspect used their vehicle to carry out the mindless act to destroy the crop. We would like to hear from anyone who knows the identity of the culprit.



This was likely a bit of fun for the thoughtless driver, but an expensive inconvenience for the victim in this matter.

Wilful damage such as this carries a penalty of up to 14 years in prison.

We have also received several reports of damage to boundary fences over the last fortnight. We ask that anyone who sees any suspicious vehicles or behaviour, calls police to report it while it is occurring. The last part is the most important, we have received reports about suspicious activity occurring, but all have been hours, or in a few cases, days later. We need to know at the time it is occurring. We have had a chat to our colleagues in Albany so that they let us know about any suspicious activity reports. Some jobs are vetted to ensure that it is absolutely necessary to call us out, but we definitely agree that most of the suspicious activity reported is necessary.

We've had an increase in our Misuse of Drugs Act searches in the last few weeks. As stated in the previous issue, we will not pass on the opportunity to detect or disrupt the supply and use of illicit drugs in the community. As a result, Narrogin Magistrates Court has a few more on their list.

## TRAFFIC

We have spent many long hours on the roads these past two weeks. We also surprised quite a few motorists who think police are solar powered, only working during the day. This is not the case, and we usually do our best work once the sun goes down.

Since our last Lakes Links issue, we have:

- Charged a drink driver who came tearing around a bend in front of us at night driving at 134kph. He was stopped and subsequently required to provide a sample of his breath. He gave a ridiculous reading of 0.126% (Well over twice the legal limit). He immediately lost his licence, and was lucky enough to be given a lift home, and a date at court with the magistrate.
- Impounded another driver's vehicle after he was caught rushing to meet his love interest. He was recorded at speeds up to 162kph. He was charged with Reckless Driving due to the speed being more than 45kph above the posted speed. After a very embarrassing phone call to the said love interest, they were gracious enough to collect the driver from the roadside.

- We charged two people with Drug Impaired Driving. We are also waiting for the results of analysis for samples taken from another two drivers.
- Issued 36 speeding infringements in one week alone. The highest speed was 41kph over the limit. Several drivers were found to be in excess of the 100kph limit when towing a trailer, a dangerous combination.

On Tuesday 10th November the State Government through the Minister for Local Government John Carrey released details of sweeping reforms to the Local Government Act.

The reforms are based on the findings and recommendations of a number of reports and consultation undertaken over the past five years, and represent the most significant package of reforms to local government in Western Australia since the Local Government Act 1995 was introduced more than 25 years ago. The package is based on six major themes:

- Earlier intervention, effective regulation and stronger penalties;
- Reducing red tape, increasing consistency and simplicity;
- Greater transparency and accountability;
- Stronger local democracy and community engagement;
- Clear roles and responsibilities; and
- Improved financial management and reporting.

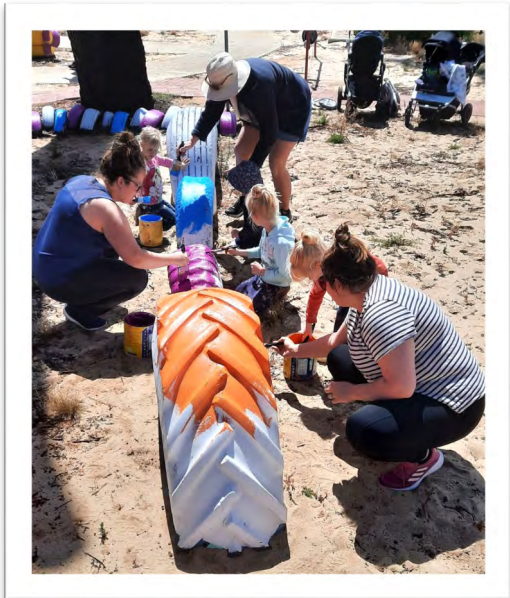

Thank you also to Karen in CCL, who allowed us to use her paint shaker. Certainly more effective than a stick!

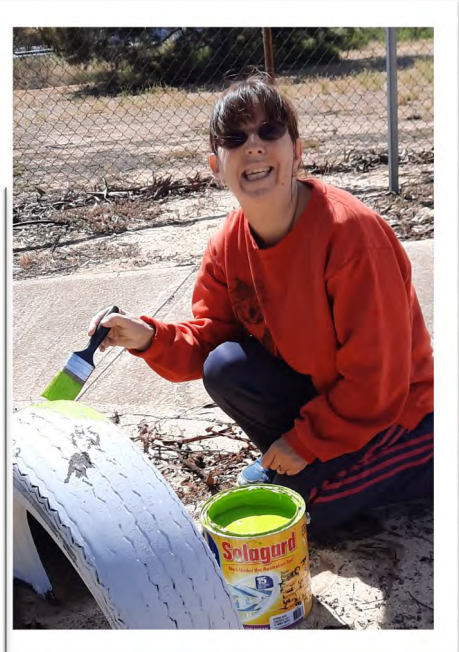

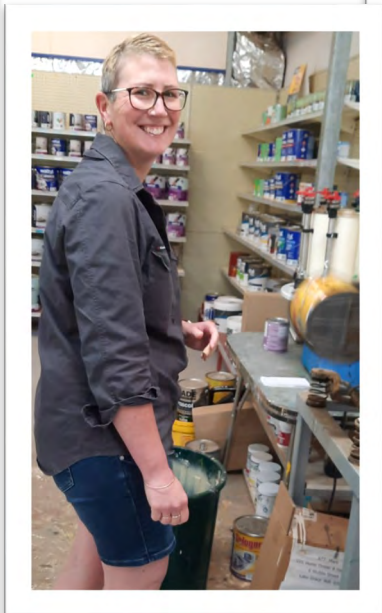

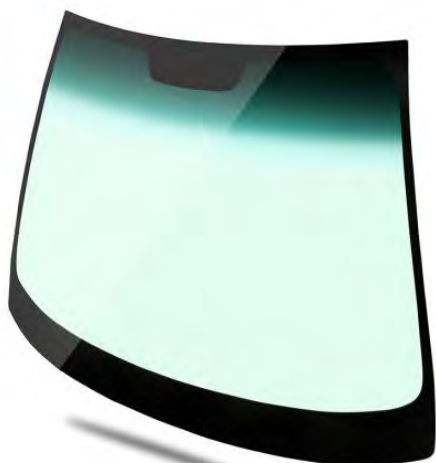

**Roasted pumpkin spinach and fetta slice****Ingredients**

- 750 grams butternut pumpkin, peeled, deseeded, cut into 3 cm pieces
- 2 zucchini, cut into chunks
- 1 large red onion, cut into thin wedges
- 2 tablespoon Bertolli olive oil
- 80 grams baby spinach
- 90 grams fetta cheese, crumbled
- 8 eggs
- 1/2 cup cream or milk  
salad, crusty bread to serve

**Method**

- Preheat oven to very hot, 220°C. Line a large baking dish with foil. Lightly grease an 18 x 28cm slab pan. Line base and sides with baking paper, allowing a 2cm overhang at both long ends.

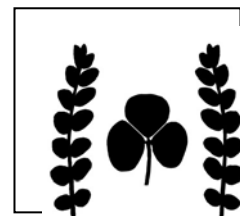

# Scams Awareness Week 2021

WA ScamNet is proudly supporting Scams Awareness Week 2021. This year's campaign is about breaking the stigma surrounding scams. It's hoped sharing knowledge and experience will prevent scammers from tricking people.

Having a conversation about scams with your workmates, friends and family is an essential part of stopping them and protecting people you care about. Conversations about scams can help people realise something is not right. Talking about them can also help us to recognise just how harmful scams are. And having a chat might even prevent someone from becoming a victim!

In addition to emotional suffering inflicted on victims, scams cost Australian consumers, businesses and the economy hundreds of millions of dollars each year.

Last year, WA ScamNet received 2,350 reports with reported losses of around \$9,390,080. The top three reported scam types included:

- investment scams (\$5,379,482)
- dating and romance scams (\$2,169,774)
- threats to life, arrest or other (\$1,022,552).

For 2021, WA ScamNet has already recorded 2,233 reports with reported losses of \$12,867,124.

We're not 100% sure about the exact number of scams experienced in Western Australia. Many victims are not reporting scams due to feelings of shame and embarrassment. But by talking about scams we can reduce the stigma and work together to stop them.

# Road Safety During Harvest

Harvest is well underway around the district. With more trucks and machinery on the roads it's a good reminder to slow down and be aware of your surroundings.

Tractors, Harvesters and Trucks are large and heavy, making it difficult for operators to accelerate, slow down and stop. Farm vehicles make wide turns and the large-scale equipment often crosses the center line, creating large blind spots and making it hard for operators to see approaching vehicles.

To ensure safety, motorists should always slow down and use caution when approaching farm equipment. And, farmers need to move cautiously across roadways, always ensuring to check and double check blind spots. Farm machinery may unexpectedly turn onto a road from a nearby field or driveway. It's important to watch out for machinery in order to act swiftly.

Even if you can see the operator, the operator may not be able to see you. Keeping a safe distance away from farm machinery will allow more visibility for you and the operator. It will also allow the operator more space to make turns.

Also, ensure that there is no oncoming traffic approaching before you attempt to pass. Be patient as unsafe passing is one of the primary factors of

motor vehicle accidents.

Being vigilant when driving on rural roads will help protect everyone. So, here's to a safe and successful harvest.

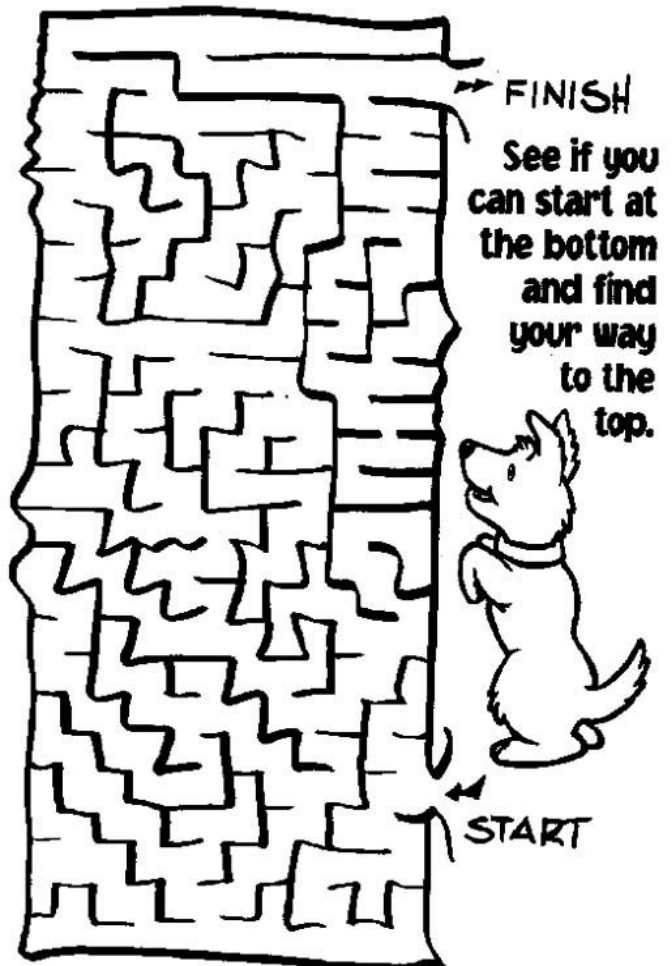

# New Optional Plate

- District number plates can be converted to optional plates from December 6
- Conversion will allow plate holders ability to display, trade and replace if lost or stolen
- 131 District number plate prefixes in WA stretching from Wyndham to Albany
- District plates have been issued for more than 50 years

Western Australians who currently hold a District series number plate can now choose to convert their plate combination to an optional plate to access a range of benefits.

There are 131 District number plate prefixes in WA, from Wyndham (WY) in the north to Albany (A) in the State's south.

A number of metropolitan areas, including Kwinana (KWN), Mandurah (MH) and Rockingham (RO), also have their own prefix.

Each prefix indicates the area or Shire where the plate originated and these have been issued to local residents in numeric order for more than 50 years.

This long history means many people with District plates have a strong affinity with their plate combination, with some having been in families for generations.

Over the years there has been strong interest from the community to preserve plate combinations for future generations.

From December 6, the Department of Transport will be offering people who currently have eligible District series number plates the choice to convert to an optional plate with the right to display and trade, for a fee of \$175.00. This would mean the plate holder owns the combination and can sell it. It would also mean the plate can be replaced if lost or stolen.

People who choose to convert their plate can do this quickly and easily by calling 13 11 56 or visiting their local Department of Transport Services Centre or licensing agent.
