

What makes the country lifestyle so special? Following a rendition of 'It's the Way It Is' from Gabby and Lucy Trevenen, Lake Grace High School students put on a display for parents and visitors at last weeks assembly.



SCIENCE AND STUFF

HOW SMART ARE YOU? (THE GIFTED CHILD:

Contrary to what many people believe, highly intelligent children are not necessarily destined for academic success. In fact, so-called gifted students may fail to do well because they are unusually smart. Ensuring that a gifted child reaches his or her



potential requires an understanding of what can go wrong and how to satisfy the unusual learning requirements of extremely bright young people.

One common problem gifted kids face is that they, and those around them, place too much importance on being smart. Such an emphasis can breed a belief that bright people do not have to work hard to do well. Although smart kids may not need to work in the lower grades, when the work is easy, they may struggle and perform poorly when the work gets harder because they do not make the effort to learn. In some cases, they may not know how to study, having never done it before. In others, they simply cannot accept the fact that some tasks require effort.

If the scholastic achievement of highly intelligent children remains below average for an extended period, many teachers will fail to recognise their potential. As a result, such students may not get the encouragement they need, further depressing their desire to learn. They may fall far behind in their schoolwork and even develop behaviour problems. Boys may turn aggressive or become class clowns. Girls often develop performance anxiety and psychosomatic symptoms such as stomach aches.

One way to avoid such difficulties is to recognise that IQ is just one ingredient among many in the recipe for success. These include motivation and persistence, social competence, and the support of family, educators and friends. Gifted children also need intellectual challenges (Scientific American Mind and Educator Christian Fischer, Psychologist and director of the International Centre for the Study of Giftedness at the University of Munster in Germany and the University of Nijmegen in the Netherlands).

MOUNTAINS UNDER THE ICE:

Working at temperatures of -40°C, researchers will begin a project to survey mountains buried 4 kilometres beneath Antarctic ice. Six countries –



the UK, the US, Germany, Australia, China and Japan – have joined forces to probe the Gamburtsev subglacial mountains, thought to be the birthplace of the vast East Antarctic ice sheet..(New Scientist p,7 10/10/2008).

ARCTIC HEAT:

Autumn air temperatures have risen to record levels in the Arctic. According to an annual report from the US National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration, average air temperatures this fall are 5°C above normal. The researchers put it down to the major loss of sea ice

in the region in recent years. This allows more solar heating of the ocean, which in turn warms the air.

BUBBLE MISSION:

A NASA spacecraft launched in October will map the size of the "bubble" surrounding our solar system, where the solar wind collides with interstellar gas. The Interstellar Boundary Explorer (IBEX) mission will observe this region from Earth's orbit by collecting particles flung from the border zone.

SEE-THROUGH IN MORE WAYS THAN ONE:

Peeling back ordinary sticky tape can generate bursts of x-rays intense enough to produce an image of the bones in your fingers. That's what Seth Putterman and his colleagues at the University of



California, Los Angeles, found when they used a motor to unwind a roll of sticky tape and recorded the electromagnetic emissions.

Ripping the tape from its roll at 3 centimetres per second generated x-ray bursts lasting one-billionth of a second, each containing over a million photons (Nature, DOI: 10.1038/nature07378). The researchers suspect the emissions arise when the two surfaces involved acquire electrical charges of opposite sign. In this case, the adhesive becomes positive and the polyethylene roll negative. The charge difference builds until electrons jump from the roll to the adhesive, apparently with enough energy to produce x-rays when they hit the tape. "My attitude is to marvel at the phenomenon. All we are doing is peeling tape, and nature sets up a process that gives you nanosecond x-ray bursts," says Putterman. The team is unsure why sticky tape produces such intense x-ray emissions, and plans to investigate whether factors such as the type of adhesive makes a difference. The work may one day lead to new x-ray photographic devices.

HOW WE GAVE COWS TB:

Analysis of 9000-year-old human skeletons from a submerged village off Israel's Mediterranean coast suggest that cows caught TB from us, not the other way round. This means that TB in humans pre dated its presumed spread to us in milk from infected cattle (Science Journal).

MOVING EVOLUTION:

An enormous seed bank proposed by US scientists to capture the world's plant diversity could spot evolution in action. Traditional seed banks are static because they are aimed at conservation, but the



proposed repository would regularly collect and study samples. This could document adaptations in plants – particularly the effects of climate change, such as early flowering (Bio Science, vol 58, p 870).

CWA Flashback

The following article was printed in the "Countrywoman" State Magazine of CWA, in October 1954.

The opening of the new CWA Rest Room in Lake Grace on July 16th, will remain a memorable one. Nearly 300 residents, visitors and members attended the function and many past foundation members travelled long distances from various parts of the State to be present on this occasion, which coincided with the tenth anniversary of the branch.

They came from Perth, Albany, Harvey, Waroona, Narrogin and Margaret River. Many branches from other towns were also represented. At 3pm the branch President, Mrs Evans, expressed pleasure at seeing such a large and representative gathering and invited Mr Elliott, Chairman of the Road Board and Mr Colquhoun, Secretary, to extend a welcome to everyone.

The first President of Handicrafts in the Division, Mrs Stafford, addressing the gathering, recalled that the first handicraft meeting of the Division was held at Lake Grace. 

Bonus Payments from Centrelink

The Minister for Human Services, Senator Joe Ludwig, said Centrelink is working hard to deliver the bonus payments contained in the Rudd Government's Economic Security Package.

Night watch



Welcome to Night Watch for the fortnight from midnight Friday 21st November to midnight Friday 5th December. Astronomy is looking up.

Highlights this fortnight are the Conjunction of VENUS and JUPITER on 1st December and with the Moon on the 2nd in the west/south west (see details below).

Our Local star "**THE SUN**" in the constellation of Libra on Saturday rises in the east/south east. On Monday 24th the Sun rises in the constellation of Scorpius. Then on Sunday 30th the Sun rises in the constellation of Ophiuchus (the serpent carrier). The magnitude of the Sun is -26.72.

Morning twilight starts on Saturday at 4:22am and evening twilight ends at 9:28pm. On Friday 5th December morning twilight begins at 4:17am and evening twilight ends at 9:42pm.

The **NEW MOON** will occur at 12:46am on Friday 28th in Scorpius. On Sunday 30th in Sagittarius at 1:44am the 4% Moon will be at <u>Apogee</u> (furthest) from Earth at 406,480 km/s. The 13% Moon on Tuesday 2nd December will be 0.8° north of Venus and 1.3° south of Jupiter.

MERCURY on Wednesday 26th in Scorpius will be in superior conjunction at 2am (far side of Sun). On Friday 5th December in Ophiuchus Mercury at magnitude -0.4 sets at 8:31pm in the west.

VENUS in the constellation of Sagittarius in the west/south west at magnitude -4.1 sets at 11:05pm on Saturday. On Monday 1st December Venus in Sagittarius will be 2° south (thumb at arms length) of Jupiter at magnitude -2.0. Venus on Tuesday 2nd will be 0.8° (close) south of the Moon and making a triangle along with Jupiter. Venus on Friday 5th still sets at 11:12pm in the south/west.

MARS is too close to the Sun to view until the end of January 2009.

JUPITER the giant gas planet shining at magnitude -2.0 in Sagittarius on Saturday in the west/south west sets at 11:32pm in the south/west. On Monday 1st of December Jupiter will be in Conjunction with Venus at 2° north and sets at 11:03pm. Jupiter on Tuesday 2nd will be 1.3° north of the Moon and in a triangle with Venus in the west/south west. Jupiter on Friday 5th sets at 10:47pm.

SATURN: on Saturday at magnitude +1.0 in Leo rises at 2:43am in the east/north east, $6^{\circ}(3 \text{ fingers at arms length})$ north of the 32% Moon. On Friday 5^{th} Saturn rises at 1:54am.

URANUS the blue/green coloured planet at magnitude +5.8 in the north/north west in the constellation of Aquarius at 9:30pm on Saturday sets at 2:40am on Sunday. Uranus on Friday 5th will remain in the night sky until 1:49am Saturday morning.

NEPTUNE the grey/green coloured planet at magnitude +8.0 in the west/north west at 9:30pm in the constellation of Capricornus sets at 1:17am on Sunday in the south/west. On Thursday 4th December Neptune will be 1.4° south of the 29% Moon. Neptune on Friday 5th in the west/north west at 9:30pm sets on Saturday 6th in the west/south west

VENUS and JUPITER start to get close together from the 28th and

Venus will move east as Jupiter moves west. There will be another Conjunction at the end of December when MERCURY heading east and Jupiter are close together on the 26th Dec to 1st January 2009. On Saturday at 9:30pm high in the north will be the constellation of Cetus the Monster or Whale. The main attraction of Cetus is the giant red star Mira (the amazing one) or (o) Omricon Ceti. Mira is a star that moves between magnitudes +2.0 and +10.1 over 331.96 days and is 418.69 light years away.

High in the south sky at 9:30pm you will find the bright blue/white star Achernar at 143.81 light years away and being a Main Sequence Dwarf and about the same size as the Sun. Achernar is the main star in the Constellation Eridanus (the river) which winds its way to Orion (the hunter)(saucepan).

In the north/north east is the open star cluster **THE PLEIADES** or seven sisters. There are actually 440 stars in the cluster and is thought to be 100 million years old. This star cluster is the oldest eye test known and if you have good eye sight you may see 7, or 9 stars if very good. In photos the stars are surrounded by faint blue and green coloured nebulae. The bright seven are called Celaeno, Electra, Taygete, Maia, Merope, Pleine and Atlas. The story behind the cluster is that it was one beautiful star and was always looking in a mirror and saying, oh I am so beautiful until the queen got sick of it and split it into seven, so now they say, you were beautiful.

The Pleiades is the tail of Taurus the bull and the head is the V shaped 790 million year old **HYADES** star cluster while the orange/ red star Aldebaran is the eye and shines from 65.11 light years distant Also in Taurus is the Supernova remnant which lit up the night sky in 1054 and was just like daytime.

For telescopes the Great Red Spot on Jupiter will be in view for an hour on Saturday at 11:14pm, Tuesday 25th at 8:54pm and Thursday 22nd at 10:26pm. Of Jupiter's moons Callisto moves from behind the disc at 9:06pm on Saturday, Europa moves behind the disc at 10:53pm on Monday 24th. On Wednesday 26th at 9:58pm, Europa starts across the disc, followed by the shadow at 9:54pm.

In the east/north east is the constellation of Orion (the hunter and saucepan asterism). The handle of the saucepan is the hunter's sword and the bottom of the pan is his belt. The middle star in the handle is the Great Nebula M42 and M43 and is great through a telescope. On the bottom of the saucepan is the Horsehead nebula and the flame nebula.

Remember use the darkest sight available and do not use white lights as you lose your night vision which takes about 10 minutes for your eyes to adapt.

Viewing of the Sun, planets, Moon, stars, galaxies and nebulae along with pointing out the constellations is free at my house and it can be arranged for viewing at your place if out of town for the cost of fuel. Inquiries welcome day or night.

Keeping Calm In Difficult Times View from the Shed

Have you ever noticed that whenever we are stressed or under pressure how difficult it is to stay calm. This applies to physical as well as mental stress and often adds to the problem because it affects our ability to deal with problems rationally.

Right now I hear a lot of talk about the challenges we are having this season and what happened last year. While there are similarities, there are also significant differences.

We are not only stressed over frost and other unusual climatic conditions, we are facing challenges with grain marketing, rising input costs etc and in the turmoil of the world financial issues it tends to destabilise our ability to cope.

We can find ourselves feeling distressed and finding it difficult to stay calm which is really a normal reaction to our circumstances. Primarily because of our expectations and experiences are not being realised and it throws us off balance and moved us out of our comfort expectations.

As humans we tend to base our expectations on our learned experiences of last season that can lead us to a pessimistic outlook that upsets our equilibrium.

While I appreciate the stress people are feeling it is important to take some simple steps to protect us from over reacting. I would suggest the following tips,

- Stop and evaluate where we are and some of the elements that get over emphasised.
- Compare the seasonal predictions from last year with the current expectations for your area.
- Have a look at how many unusual seasons there have been in your area over the last twenty years and how they were managed.
- Evaluate the most effective strategies for profitable outcomes.
- Plan to manage the things you can manage, in spite of the external pressures.

- Discuss the outlook with the ones that matter so that you can support each other.
- Keep the things we cant control in perspective, none of us can control global issues or the weather yet we do worry about it because of its overwhelming influence on our livelihood.

Finally we have all heard the saying "Life wasn't meant to be easy." Being a farmer certainly isn't easy but we need to remember this is only half the actual quote. For me the second half adds the balance we all need, which is "But take heart my friend, for in it there is much to enjoy".
