Lake Grace CWA will work with the local community to run an opportunity shop from the former Methodist church in Bennett Street. The CWA believes the project will protect the heritage building, the first church in the shire, and provide a valuable service for the community.

The Uniting Church in Australia has given two town lots including the former Methodist Church building to the Shire of Lake Grace for community use. The idea of an opportunity shop came from community meetings to suggest ways to use the church building and site.

The CWA has leased the building from the Shire and will work with Activ Industries in Albany to operate the opportunity shop. Lake Grace CWA and a community committee will manage the business. We hope to open in January 2016, and at this stage, intend to operate two days per week staffed by volunteers.

There will be dinner available at a variety of stalls at late night shopping. Please stay and share a meal or picnic on the lawn of the RSL Hall.






Dad was born on the 28th June 1931, one of the babies born at the Lake Grace Inland Mission Hospital. He was the youngest child of Hugh and Maggie Carruthers and baby brother to Agnes and Hugh. He was brought up on King Edward farm in Lake Grace and being 5 1/2 years younger than his nearest sibling can always remember being peeved that he was not allowed to do what they were allowed to do. He attended Lake Grace Primary School and then boarded in Albany and attended Albany Senior High Scholl for his secondary education. Dad excelled both scholastically and athletically, particularly as a high jumper. He was always very proud of the fact that he could jump onto a 44 gallon drum fully clothed including work boots from a standing start though I remember a few skinned shins for his efforts when things didn't quite go to plan.

After completing his schooling at 14 he returned to Lake Grace to help on the farm as his father was unwell. Dad and his brother Hugh continued farming King Edward and Lake View Farms together very successfully until Hugh's retirement. Dad then continued with his nephew Greg until his retirement. Greg then leased the farm. An agreement which was done on a handshake requiring no paperwork. This arrangement worked very well for both parties and seeing the mutual respect that they shared for each other was testament to this. Dad saw many changes over his long farming life. He started out driving a team of Clydesdales to crop and was one of the last people in the district to still be doing so. Not because he had to, but because he loved to. He loved the horses, often taking extra lunch so that he could share it with them. He went through many eras of different machinery and farming techniques and in later years while riding around the paddock with Greg at seeding and harvesting time marvelled at the technology that allows tractors to drive themselves and the precision with which things are now calculated.

In 1951 at a local dance in Newdegate he met a beautiful girl form Lake Camm. Her name was Margaret McLean and the rest shall we say is history. Though that history was a long time in the making as Dad was always one to put a lot of thought into any decision he made and this was no exception. They were married 8 years later on the 30th March 1959 at St Columba's Catholic Church in South Perth. This also happened to be Easter Monday and every year Dad celebrated their wedding anniversary on Easter Monday regardless of the date. Bill and Margaret had 4 children; Cheryl, Martin, Leonie and Wayne, the youngest, who unfortunately died aged 17 months.

Bill had many loves; none greater than the love for his family and he adored his 4 grandchildren; Luke the Spook, Kal (he was lucky his name didn't rhyme with

anything, Kane the Pain and the apple of his eye Little, also known as Emma. Many a school holidays were spent teaching them to drive, making billycarts and just doing farm stuff.



There were also those 'apparently' orphaned or abandoned lambs that always seemed to turn up if he knew the boys were coming for holidays; much to Mum's dismay as she knew that for the 1 week of fun for the grandkids she would be the one feeding them first thing in the morning, last thing at night and many times in between until they were old enough to be returned to the paddock.

As I mentioned earlier he loved his animals. He bought Marty a pony named DoBouy when he was away at college and was always telling him how he used to grab a handful of mane and vault onto the back of the Clydesdales when he was young. One day he decided to give Marty a demonstration, grabbed a handful of mane, jumped, kicked poor DoBouy right in the midriff and promptly landed himself on his butt on the ground. DoBouy just turned his head, looked at him sitting on the ground and gave him a look of 'You Silly Old Foo'. Dad had forgotten the years had taken their toll and he wasn't as agile as he used to be. Then there was his dogs. As kids we had to sit on the back of the ute to go around the sheep while the dog took pride of place on the passenger's seat in the cabin.

He was passionate about sport which he loved to both watch and play. He played football for the Lake Grace Bombers and was very proud to represent at association level playing Centre Half back, which was quite an achievement because Dad was not the biggest bloke around. He was also a very keen watcher of football and followed South Fremantle in the WAFL and Carlton in the VFL. When the AFL came into being he became a one eyed Eagles supporter but also had a soft spot for the Dockers when they entered the competition. Many a Saturday afternoon was spent with the TV on one channel the radio on another both going full blast with dad not behind the door in telling the players how to play and umpires how to umpire and getting increasingly frustrated when neither of them were taking any of his suggestions on board. I also understand why Mum found gardening in the pouring rain and freezing cold so appealing on a Saturday afternoon.

Another one of his accomplishments was playing cricket for the Lake Grace Cricket Club where he was more of a Shane Warne than a Ricky Ponting; however,

surprisingly his one and only cricket trophy was won for batting. According to Dad he batted so far down the order that most of the team was out before he even went in and all those NOT OUT'S at the end of the innings went a long way to helping him secure the Best Batting Average Award.

He also played basketball in the Lake Grace Association for a team called the Geebungs.

His golfing career was very short and sweet which was shame as this was another sport that he was very good at; but as his children grew older and began to play sport of their own he put golf on hold to support us. Many years later on one of this trips to Geraldton to visit Glenn and I when we were living there, Glenn and a mate who both fancied themselves as golfers decided to ask the father in law if he wanted to go and have a hit with them. As this was a flying visit and Dad had no golfing gear with him and for that matter had not picked up a club for about 20 years, he borrowed a 5 iron and putter off one of them and played the whole round with just these two clubs. Not only did he beat the pants of the pair of them he also bagged himself a hole in one. Needless to say he was not invited play golf with them again.

The final feather in his cap for this sporting career was lawn bowls. A sport he thoroughly enjoyed and played for many years until his back got too bad for him to play anymore. Again he had a very successful career winning a League Pairs Final with his brother Hugh and 3 club pairs championships with his great friend Len Elliott along with other club trophies. Pennants and Open Days were his favourite and Leone remembers that eskys must have been a very popular trophy at one time as we had a rather large collection of various shapes and sizes which always came in handy.

His other great love in life was fishing. A passion unfortunately not shared by any other members of the family at that time. On our annual family holidays to Hopetoun and after much whinging about how we didn't want to go fishing Dad always promised that on the first day we could do what we liked. This only ever lasted until Mum and girls had unpacked the car and Dad and

Marty got the fishing gear ready, then it was 'Oh well since we have nothing else to do we may as well go and throw a line in'. On one such occasion after he had baited and thrown out a rod he looked around for someone to give it to. Marty and I were paying our usual attention, running up and down sand hills, so unfortunately for a very young Leonie, she happed to be closest so she got the honours with the instruction hold onto this tightly. Dad finished getting the next rod ready for casting and turned around just in time to see Leonie sliding down the beach screaming. All of you who knew Dad know, that even in you are only four years old, being dragged half way to Antarctica by some unknown monster from the deep, letting go of that rod was NOT an option. She did manage to land her first salmon though.

Dad had many happy fishing trips to both Bremer and Hopetoun with a group of good friends. We never did hear much about those ventures. A classic case of what happens on fishing trips stays on fishing trips I think. In later years he and his great mate David Evans spent a lot of time fishing together in Hopetoun, both claiming the biggest fish in the bag and having a lot of fun arguing about and finally agreeing to disagree, until next time and then the banter would start all over again.

Although Dad did not enjoy the best of health over the last few years he still remained very interested in what was going onand never lost his love for sport and his dislike for politicians.

To our family and friends. Your love and support over the last few weeks has been overwhelming and we are very grateful to have you in our lives.

To our amazing Mum. Although the last couple of years have been extremely difficult you were able to keep dad at home and avoided him going into care; something he dreaded. Your strength and love is an inspiration to us all.

To our darling Husband, Dad and Grandad. Rest in Peace. We love and miss you. You did it your way

Harvest Insurance Tips

With harvest now well underway, there is increased activity on our roads, especially for trucks and towed machinery. There is always people on the road who are not familiar with country conditions, so here are some things to remember – and which will help to make sure your insurance policy will cover you in case of an accident.

It is important to give large vehicles the space they need to stop or turn. Remember that large vehicles may legally cut corners, or cross over a continuous line leading up to the intersection. Be patient and follow the directions of any drivers of pilot vehicles – they are authorised traffic wardens and you must obey their lawful directions.

Each year, Tom gets the job of chief pilot driver for the movement of his farm machinery and each year he takes a few minutes to check the Department of Transport's website for any updates concerning the

movement of oversize vehicles. This year, he was thankful that he took the time to make sure he was up to date and fully compliant. While moving the header

and comb from one farm to another Tom could see a small car coming toward his vehicles at speed. The car failed to slow, despite Tom's flashing lights and his pilot vehicle being positioned toward the centre of the road. When the oncoming driver finally realised that he was going to have to pull over, he overcorrected on the gravel shoulder, lost control of his vehicle, side swiped the comb trailer and then hit a tree. When the police arrived and charged young Harry with dangerous driving he certainly wished he'd spent a few minutes thinking about driving on country roads. As Tom had done all the right things, his insurance claim was a straight forward process. Harry, unfortunately, will be in discussion with his insurer for some time to come.

Outcomes from the last meeting:

 Plans to re install the old playground will be submitted to the Shire for approval as soon as possible. Once this is approved we will be calling a busy bee asking user groups for help to reassemble the old playground (with plans to add new equipment as funding becomes available) between the tennis shed and pavilion. This will include sand play area and a shade structure.



How many times have we heard the phrase "getting the balance right"? What does this mean to you? If we look up the word "balance" in the dictionary (yes I still have the book version) we will find 18 definitions, depending of course on the context in which the word is to be used.

The context of a work/life balance also depends on individual circumstances and attitude; whether we are single or married, studying, self-employed, contracting, FIFO, caring for someone or raising a family.

Ask yourself "do I have my work/life in balance?" To assess this firstly identify the prominence of work in your situation. Does it challenge/drive you, is it enjoyment, a sense of satisfaction and/or purpose or is it just a means to an end (that is if we don't work we don't get paid, if we don't get paid we can't live the life we want or do the things we enjoy)? Is it a mix of both?

The "life" side of things for most of us is enjoying some form of interaction with other people. This can happen through our hobbies, sport, children, family, religious congregation, social/community groups, or by volunteering (ironically work can also be one of these).

The definition which (I think) is the best fit when considering "work/life balance" is to have these two areas "well-proportioned and harmonious".

Our work/life balance can be disrupted when we are under pressure, feeling distressed or even embarrassed by an event and as blokes we may then disengage from others and try to solve problems and deal with stressors alone. Unfortunately by doing this we remove ourselves from valuable support systems, which in turn creates and exacerbates feelings of loneliness and isolation.

Remember to maintain and re-engage with social opportunities as this is a significant part of positive mental health, coping and overall wellbeing.

Something as simple as taking timeout, communicating (remember its part of the problem solving process), having a laugh with others (this may expose us to different ways of thinking of doing things) and even in busy times scheduling time to have that game of bowls, timeout with the kids or partner, is essential.

Having a busy life may lead us to feel that there is more to do than what seems reasonable in any given day. We all get equal measures of time, there are 24 hours in a day for everyone. Why then is it that for some of us 24 hours never seems enough, while others seem to have plenty of time? Perhaps we need to ask ourselves "is time the problem, or is it our ability to manage our time"? How much we have on our plate varies throughout the year, so we need to be aware to continually monitor our time to ensure that for the majority of the year we have a well-proportioned and harmonious work/life balance.





Lake Grace Swimming Pool

We anticipate the Pool opening by the weekend. Commercial Aquatics Australia is scheduled to replace the chlorination system around Wednesday of this week – all being well i.e. the equipment arriving from the Eastern States on time. The delay in opening the pool is regretted however the safety of pool patrons is paramount. Fortunately, the weather has been reasonably mild to date.

Wheatbelt General Practice Business Support Service Shire Governance Committee

I attended a meeting of the above committee with the Shire President, Cr Walker, in Corrigin on 25th November. At the meeting it was resolved that the Shire of Lake Grace be reimbursed \$25,000 for recruitment costs incurred through engaging First Health to recruit a permanent General Practitioner. The committee also resolved that some funds be made available to help offset additional locum costs for a six month period.

Newdegate Independent Living Units

As Neville mentioned in the last issue of the Lakes Link News the Shire's building team has now taken over completion of the four units in Newdegate. The intention is to have two of the units completed by the end of February with the remaining two being completed well prior to June 30th. Both targets are dependent on the availability of contractors when required.

Central Country Zone of the WA Local Government Association

Cr De Landgrafft and I attended a Meeting of the Central Country Zone in Brookton on 27th November. The Shire of Lake Grace had submitted an agenda item relating to the Recruitment of Doctors into the Wheatbelt. The Shire raised the idea of Medicare Provider Numbers being allocated to an area and not to individual doctors. It was recommended that the Zone's Wheatbelt Health Advocacy Group pursue the matter to determine whether the idea may assist to secure the services of doctors in Wheatbelt towns.

Part of the background relating to the item mentioned that the State and Commonwealth Governments have spent significant funds on aged housing and hospital upgrades in regional areas and this much needed infrastructure enhancement is dependant in some way on having a medical practitioner available to provide the necessary supporting health service.

A person other than a technical operator may undertake the required daily manual water chemistry testing of an aquatic facility water body, providing that the technical operator, Environmental

Health Officer of the local government of the district, or other equivalently competent person has instructed and shown them how to undertake prescribed manual water chemistry tests.

Department of Fire & Emergency Services - Total Fire Bans

Total fire bans are declared by the Minister for Emergency Services. They are declared on days when fires will be difficult to control, are most likely to threaten lives and property, or when widespread fires are impacting the availability of resources.

Total fire ban means a person must not; light, maintain or use a fire in the open air, carry out an activity in the open air that causes or is likely to cause a fire.

The ban includes: hot works (welding, grinding, soldering, gas cutting) all open solid fuel fires for the purpose of cooking or camping, use of incinerators and other activities.

The decision to put a ban in place is based on the weather forecast.

DFES consults with the Bureau of Meteorology to determine when dangerous fire weather conditions are likely. DFES also consults with local governments that will be affected. The need for the ban to remain is assessed and may be revoked in the morning if weather

conditions ease. The status of a ban should be checked after 6pm each day.

How Long is a Total Fire Ban in Place for?

The ban will be in place from 12.01am to 11.59pm on the day declared.

How is a Total Fire Ban Declared?

They are declared by the Minister for Emergency Services, or his authorised delegate, using the whole local government boundary.

Requirements for Tax Invoices

When you make a taxable sale of more than \$82.50 (including GST), your GST- registered customers need a tax invoice from you.

Tax invoices must include at least seven pieces of information:

- 1. The words Tax Invoice has to be present to identify the document as a tax invoice.
- 2. Identity Person or business name

- 4. Issue Date
- 5. Item Description, qty, price
- GST indication
- GST amount

In addition, tax invoices for sales of \$1,000 or more need to show: the buyer's identity or ABN

If you are not registered for GST then you cannot claim.

Water Supply during Bushfires

During a bushfire do not rely on Scheme water supplies during a bushfire.

Residents living in or near bushland are reminded not to rely on public scheme water supplies if they plan to stay and defend their homes during a bushfire.

If you plan to defend your home scheme water may not be available due to damaged infrastructure, extreme demand depleted supply and pressure, or a cut to power which is used to pump water.

Residents need to have an independent water supply, such as a concrete or steel tank with a minimum 20,000 litre capacity.

You will also need to have a generator available with pipes and fittings at the correct length and type of hoses to protect your home.

Review of WA's Electoral Boundaries

Media Release

The Electoral Distribution Commissioners have announced the electoral boundaries that will apply for the next State election in 2017.

The Electoral Distribution Commissioners are Neville Owen, former Supreme Court judge, David Kerslake, WA's Electoral Commissioner and Tom Joseph, WA's Government Statistician.

The Electoral Distribution Commissioners have confirmed that there will be an additional metropolitan district, with the corresponding loss of a country district. The 59 Legislative Assembly districts will be made up of 43 districts in the metropolitan regions and 16 districts in the country regions.

The district of Baldivis will be created south of Perth and Eyre in the country is abolished.

Some changes to the original proposals have been made in the country, including reuniting both Esperance and Busselton within their respective districts. A number of agricultural shires have been returned to their previous districts, resulting in Central Wheatbelt and Roe acquiring large district allowances for the first time.

Changes to the original proposals have also been

made in the metropolitan area retaining the districts of Girrawheen and Mount Lawley in North Metropolitan and East Metropolitan Regions respectively, and returning Melaleuca and the whole of Bullsbrook to Swan Hills.

The proposal to rename districts after prominent persons will not proceed except for the renaming of Wagin to Roe.

Overall, Western Australia's electoral landscape has changed significantly with only nine of the 59 districts (seven in the country and two in the metropolitan area) unchanged.

The new boundaries are final but will not apply until the next State election, expected in March 2017.

Does Your Organisation need an ABN?

Taken from the ATO website

How will an ABN help your organisation?

The Australian business number (ABN) is a single identifier used to deal with the ATO and other government departments and agencies.

To access various concessions and comply with your organisation's tax obligations, your organisation may need to register for an ABN.

A not-for-profit (NFP) organisation can use its ABN to:

- · register for GST and claim GST credits
- register for pay as you go (PAYG) withholding
- · deal with investment bodies
- apply for registration as a charity with the Australian Charities and Not-for-profits Commission (ACNC)
- apply to us for endorsement as a deductible gift recipient or tax concession charity
- get an AUSkey to transact online with government agencies
- register a business name with the Australian Securities & Investments Commission (ASIC)

- interact with other government departments, agencies and authorities
- interact with us on other taxes, such as fringe benefits tax (FBT).

Your organisation's ABN registration details become part of the Australian Business Register (ABR). The publicly available information on this register allows people to find out whether the entities they are dealing with:

- have an ABN
- · are registered for GST
- are endorsed charities and/or are endorsed as deductible gift recipients.

Who is entitled to an ABN?

To be entitled to an ABN, your organisation must be one or more of the following:

- a company registered under the Corporations Act 2001
- an entity carrying on an enterprise in Australia

Does Your Organisation need an ABN? (cont.)

- an entity that, in the course or furtherance of carrying on an enterprise, makes supplies that are connected with Australia
- a government entity
- a non-profit sub-entity for GST purposes
- a superannuation fund.

Entities can include charities, NFP clubs, societies and associations.

An enterprise includes an activity or series of activities performed by either:

- · a charity
- · a gift deductible entity.

Does your organisation need an ABN for endorsement?

Your organisation must have an ABN if it is seeking endorsement as one or both of the following:

- · a tax concession charity
- a deductible gift recipient.

Does your organisation need an ABN for each of its enterprises?

For the purposes of ABN registration, an entity includes a corporation, unincorporated association or a trust.

If your organisation is a single entity, it should register for one ABN, regardless of the number of enterprises that it carries on.

With the exception of a partnership arrangement, if your club or charity is a collection of separate entities carrying on one or more enterprises, each entity in your organisation should register for a separate ABN.






