## **Bushfire - A Summer Nightmare**



Fire-fighters combat a spot fire on the fence line of Laurence and Gwen Oliver's farm where fire swept through from the Duggan Reserve



Thirty five degree heat and gusting winds contributed to a nightmare bushfire on Thursday 2nd December.

At this stage it is still unclear as to how the fire started that swept through several farms, destroying approximately 500 kilometres of fencing, killing thousands of sheep and incinerating some farm buildings.

Sixteen hundred hectares of wheat was lost along with many thousands of hectares of pasture and native bushland.

It is a credit to community spirit that so many people pitched in to either be on the front line fighting the fire or providing nourishment for those that were.

Dumbleyung and surrounding shires contributed earth moving equipment to grade emergency firebreaks in an attempt to stop the fire in its tracks. Teams of fire-fighters from as far away as Pingelly and Brookton - and everywhere in between - were in attendance. The fire was eventually contained on the South Tarin Rock Road boundary of Ronald and Christine Willock's property.

#### Lotterywest Grant Encourages Lake Grace's Interpretation of Cultural Heritage

The Shire of Lake Grace is one of 57 organisations across Western Australia to share in almost \$350,000 in grants from Lotterywest's Interpretation of Cultural Heritage Grants round.

A diverse range of community groups including government authorities, community local museums and Aboriginal corporations are involved in caring for and supporting Western Australia's cultural heritage and this is strongly evident in the types of projects funded.

A grant of \$14,840 has been approved for the Shire of Lake Grace's Australian Inland Mission Hospital Museum. The grant will enable the Shire to engage a contractor to create a digital soundscape for the five rooms of the museum using excerpts of recorded oral and written interviews and other reference material from the museum archives.

Part of the grant will be used to recreate and draw attention to the former structure of the AIM hospital buildings, some now demolished. An old outhouse with 'dunny can' will be placed at the original location of the single toilet used by patients and staff and the layout of the former maternity wing marked out.

Other components of the project including adding an AIM Hospital Museum webpage to the Shire of Lake Grace website and completing the museum's exterior and interior signage.

Lotterywest's Chairman Clyde Bevan paid tribute to the diversity of projects receiving grants. "We have supported many projects from the development of conservation plans, to interpreting cultural histories of first settler groups, to urgent structural works, to curatorial projects," said Mr Bevan.

"Our Interpretation of Cultural Heritage Grants program supports and encourages a wide range of communities in WA - cultural heritage is a vital part of our community life and it is wonderful to see so many community groups committed to our heritage," he added.



## HEALTH SERVICE

Assistance to people in the community can be provided in the following instances:

#### **Home Care (HACC) Assistance**

People who apply for assistance in their home under the HACC program are required to have a needs assessment completed by the HACC coordinator. Clients must be identified as having a functional disability to qualify for assistance.

#### **Acute Care Assistance**

As a multi-purpose service (MPS) we are also able to provide assistance in the home for clients returning from surgery or with some other medical conditions. These services are provided on a short -term basis usually, with the amount of assistance being determined by the medical staff caring for the client.

Acute care services are not provided by the HACC program, they are funded by the Hospital MPS.

\* \* \* \* \* \* \* \* \* \* \* \*

People who require assistance, but do not fit into either of the above categories, are required to either pay full cost recovery to us (if we have sufficient resources to provide a service) or can source assistance privately.

## The Shire of Lake Grace receives funding for local physical activity project.

The Shire of Lake Grace has recently been awarded \$12,000 funding for a new project. It is one of 18 physical activity projects around the State that Premier Geoff Gallop announced under the Physical Activity Taskforce's Local Activity Grants Program. The Shire of Lake Grace will match the funding.

The State Government, through a Lotterywest grant, has provided \$150,965 statewide in the third round of funding for the projects, which are coordinated by Local Governments.



The Local Activity Grants Program is aimed at encouraging communities to become more physically active. For Lake Grace, the additional funding will extend the Aquatic & Recreation Coordinator's role, and provide more classes and activities.

Council is appreciative of the Local Activity Grant funding to

support the expansion of the role of its Aquatic and Recreation Officer project. Everyone needs to find 30 minutes a day to be active for health benefit - this project will help make it easier for our community to be active.



Local Activity Grants form part of the Premier's Physical Activity Taskforce's target to increase the proportion of Western Australians who undertake sufficient physical activity to gain a health benefit by 5% (from 58% to 63%) by 2011. The Physical Activity Taskforce Local Activity Grants program is jointly administered by the Premier's Physical Activity Taskforce and the WA Local Government Association.

Developing and implementing physical activity strategies require a multi agency approach. Grants programs such as these, allow community groups and Local Government to work together with the assistance of the State Government in succeeding to encourage more people to be more active, develop new physical activity programs, and build on facilities and resources which already exist in local communities.

What Makes a Sand Dune Tall?: The world's tallest sand dunes, some half a kilometre high, survive in a windy desert because water

cements them together. That's the conclusion of studies in the dunes of Bardain Jaran desert in Northern China. The researchers were surprised to find moisture lurking just 20 centimetres beneath the surface. They suspect the water floods in through subterranean faults when snow melts on nearby mountains. Up to 500 million cubic metres of useful water could be extracted from the region each year, but this could leave the dunes prone to erosion. (Nature, vol 432, p 459)

The liver is the largest gland in the body, producing about half a litre of bile per day. It weighs some 1.8 kilograms in men and 1.3 kilograms in women. It holds about 13% of the total blood supply at any given moment. Each liver cell (hepatocyte) has an average lifespan of 150 days.

10 squared by 15, the estimated number of synapses linking the 100 billion or so neurons in your brain. There are about 200 million neurons more in the left side of the brain than the right.

Lizard Enjoys Colourful Nights: The nocturnal helmeted gecko has become the first vertebrate known to see colours in the dark. Most



creatures, including humans, have eyes that contain two types of light-sensitive cells. In daylight, animals rely mainly on colour-sensing cones that distinguish between light of different wavelengths. At night, when photons are scarce, they rely exclusively on more sensitive rod cells, which are colour-blind. The only exception to this rule, and the only animal known to see colours at night, was thought to be the elephant hawkmoth (Deilephila elpenor). It has adaptations, which include different facets of its compound eye, to increase the light captured by its cone in the dark. Studies have now shown that the helmeted gecko

(Tarentola chazaliae) also has nocturnal colour vision. The researchers presented one male and one female gecko with either a tasty cricket painted blue or a bad-tasting, salty one painted grey. The lizards soon learned to lunge for the blue crickets, even when the light was as dim as a moonlit night. The eyes of helmeted geckos do not have rod cells, but they do have highly enlarged, rod-shaped blue, green and ultraviolet cone receptors, which the researchers say are sensitive enough to discriminate colour even in very low light. The lizards also have multi-focal lenses, which may help focus small amounts of light on different receptors for sharper colour image perception. It may mean that all geckos descended from diurnal lizards, if one has colour vision, its definitely possible that other ones do.

Endurance Running is in the Genes of East Africans: The long-distance running prowess of Ethiopia's elite male athletes is partly dictated by their genes. Researchers have established that such athletes are more likely to have certain

variants of four Y chromosome genes compared with other Ethiopians. No one knows what the genes do, or how influential they are, but they are the first to be linked to east Africans' outstanding ability for endurance events. Ethiopian and Kenyan athletes have run 37 of the 40 fastest times have recorded over 10,000 metres. Alongside dedication and training, there is no doubt that social and geographic factors, such as having to run long distances to school at high altitudes, contribute to their success. To find out if genes also play a significant role, researchers, studied the Y chromosomes of elite athletes, city dwellers and other non-athletes from the Ethiopian region of Arsi, where many runners originate. Four gene variants were clearly more common among the athletes, and one was less common. No mutation was unique to the athletes, however, suggesting that it is the combination of certain gene types that makes the difference. The athletes do show differences from the population as a whole, but they are not so overwhelming to say that this is the reason for their success, and no single gene for endurance running emerged. ## **AWB Harvest Update**



The 2003/04 Australian harvest is approximately 80% complete. The pace of harvest has been speedy over the last fortnight with mostly favourable weather around the country.

QLD 100% NSW 85% VIC 60% SA 80% WA 75%

The major trend of the Australian harvest to date is that protein is higher than normal. A larger proportion of grain is being delivered to the hard wheat pay grades such APH and AH at very high protein levels.

Yields and quality have been very variable, even within regions.

Locally, yields and quality have reflected the difficult season that included frost and a dry

finish.

High screenings have been an issue in the area north of Lake Grace, with segregations to receive screenings up to 20% being opened to cater for the season.

#### **Market Notes**

- The US winter wheat crop is in excellent condition as it goes into dormancy this month
- Harvest has just commenced in Argentina and the quality is very good so far.
- The EU is thought to be considering introducing export subsidies early in 2005 (which would be negative for prices).
- The gap in receiving of premium hard wheats over soft wheats has narrowed over the last fortnight.

Also next year there is a few comets around, so until then have a merry Christmas and a happy bright New Year and remember, Astronomy is looking up.







## Baking With Pame

To all those cooks out there who are busy getting ready for Christmas, here are a few last minute recipes and hints. Both the salads can be made the day before and are yummy. The Pesto Torte can be made several days in advance and I have even frozen it. It is well worth the effort and a great party addition.

Have a wonderful time preparing for your families and enjoy the season. This is an excellent opportunity to teach your children the difference between enjoying a feast and gluttony. I hope you all have a feast to celebrate the birth of a "Special Baby".

This is a recipe given to me by a friend in Melbourne, Kay. It has become a firm favourite and is always one of the first salads to be eaten at every BBQ we take it along to (probably because the dressing is so morish!)

#### KAY'S NOODLE SALAD

1 wombok (Chinese cabbage) or sugar-leaf cabbage 100g slivered almonds, lightly roasted 6 spring onions (only use the green part) 1 x 100g packet of fried noodles

#### Dressina

1/4 cup white vinegar 1/2 cup castor sugar 1 tablespoon soy sauce 1/4 cup olive oil

Combine all the dressing ingredients in a jar with screw-on lid, shake the jar until the sugar is dissolved. Finely shred the cabbage and chop the Combine the cabbage, spring spring onions. onions and almonds in the serving bowl. Add the dressing and mix well (easiest done with clean hands!). Recipe can be made 24 hours ahead up to this point. Just before serving add the noodles to the salad.

#### **MARGIE'S PESTO TORTE**

1 quantity of basil pesto (see below) 375g cream cheese, room temperature 3/4 cup ricotta cheese, room temperature 180g butter, room temperature 2 tablespoons pine nuts, toasted

#### <u>Pesto</u>

100g pinenuts 175g olive oil 2 cloves garlic 1 packed cup of basil leaves 50g freshly grated parmesan cheese 50g freshly grated pecorino salt & freshly ground pepper

Make pesto: dry roast nuts, tossing frequently in pan. Blend all ingredients in food processor. Blend cream cheese, ricotta and butter in food processor until smooth. Sprinkle pine nuts into base of greased pot. Alternate layers of cheese

mixture with pesto, starting and finishing with cheese. Refrigerate overnight before tipping out onto serving platter. Serve with vegetable sticks or cracker biscuits.

#### LAYERED GARDEN SALAD

½ lettuce, shredded coarsely 250g mushrooms, finely sliced 125g tasty cheese, grated

2 cups frozen peas

2 hard boiled eggs

1 cup mayonnaise

2 teaspoons French mustard

2 tablespoons sour cream

1 tablespoon lemon juice

6 spring onions, finely sliced

1 tomato, cut into wedges

2 tablespoons chopped parsley

Place lettuce in a bowl. Sprinkle uncooked peas over lettuce. Push eggs through a sieve, combine with mushrooms and spread over peas. Top with grated cheese.

Combine mayonnaise, sour cream, mustard, lemon juice and spring onions, pour over cheese. Cover and refrigerate for several hours or overnight. Top with tomato wedges and parsley just before serving.

#### **BRANDY SAUCE**

2 tablespoons butter 2 tablespoons flour 300ml milk 300ml cream 2 tablespoons brandy

2 tablespoons sugar

1 teaspoon vanilla

Melt butter, add flour and mix to a smooth paste. Mix a small amount of the milk in at a time, keeping a smooth consistency.

Bring to boil. Add cream and sugar, Add more milk if too thick.

Remove from heat before adding brandy and vanilla.

If making the day before add brandy and vanilla after reheating, just before serving.









## CHILD SAFETY ON FARM WORKSHOPS FOR WESTERN AUSTRALIA in 2005

A series of workshops to help farmers create interactive and safe play areas, aiming to minimise the high rate of injuries and deaths of children on farms

Funded by the Health Department of Western Australia, the workshops will focus on developing exciting, diverse and sustainable play spaces that are environmentally appealing and structurally achievable.

Many farmers are aware of the risks regarding raising children on farms. These workshops will work on ways to implement long-term strategies to avoid common dangers.

A farm is not only the home of a family, but a dangerous workplace, and solid boundaries for young children are needed to ensure that they are safe at all times.

The workshops are being co-ordinated by Farmsafe WA Alliance. Key presenters will be international playspace designer, Ric McConaghy and leader of Farmsafe Australia's Child Safety on Farms Strategy, Laurie Stiller.

A professional artist, Ric McConaghy has designed a number of well-known playgrounds throughout Australia.

Mr McConaghy said spaces could be achieved through the incorporation of art and design elements that promote interaction, engagement and wonder.

"These spaces can help children to better meet their social, emotional, spiritual and physical needs and aspirations", he said.

Laurie Stiller has degrees in engineering and arts (psychology/sociology) and is a published children's author.

The workshops will entail short half-day sessions. Some will be based in towns, and others will take place on farms.

## Lake Grace Development Association

The December meeting of the Lake Grace Development Association was extremely pleasant as it was held in conjunction with an evening meal at the Hotel. Items discussed were:

- Ian Menzies notified us of the lack of information in the events calendar for our region and urged us to have an input. The trade show for tourism will be in Western Australia next June and this is a great opportunity to show overseas operators our area.
- On the Sheep's Back. Landmark has agreed to auction a sheep at the Wagin Woolarama next year. There was also discussion on raffling one of the sheep. If you intend on ordering your own sheep, and haven't, could you please do so ASAP.
- Stationmasters House Action Group. As the work is not yet completed an extension of the grant acquittal has been applied for. It is hoped that the ceiling in the kitchen will be installed early in the New Year. Unfortunately it is the busiest time of the year and they have been unable to meet to formalise an agreement between them and the Tourism Promotions Group on the running of the visitors centre.
- At the Wheatbelt South Tourism meeting held in Darkan recently changes in the fees was discussed, Shire fees are on a per head of population. Membership to Wheatbelt South (formally Central South) also covers membership to "Australia's Golden Outback' and W.A. Tourism.
- Townscape. There was discussion of the plants in the median strip and the number of sprinklers that have had to be replaced because they have been run over. The celebration for the completion of main street was debated, whether it should be before or after seeding.
- Youth Advisory Council. National Youth Week is in the first week of the school holidays next year from the 9<sup>th</sup> to

- the 17<sup>th</sup> of April. Everyone was bought up to date with the Art 2 Wear project.
- Recycling Group. The depot has not been relocated yet, however it will be able to take a larger range of recyclable material including cardboard and paper.
- Local nominees of Australia Day awards will be able to celebrate with family and friends at the Australia Day Breakfast at the pool on the 26<sup>th</sup> of January.
- 2005 will be the 60<sup>th</sup> anniversary of VE day and 90<sup>th</sup> anniversary of Gallipoli, funding is available to help communities celebrate this.
- The Shire has been successful recently in receiving about \$40,000 in grants. There will also be a number of signs ordered by the Shire for the town and as entry statements to the Shire. Due to lack of resources the Shire is unable to proceed with the Walk Trails and have asked for a submission be made to be placed in next year's budget.

The next meeting will be on the 14<sup>th</sup> of February at 7.30 in the Shire Chambers.

## Department for Planning and Infrastructure

COUNTRY PATHWAYS PROJECT Lake Grace Townsite

June 2004 saw completion of Council's 2003/04 Country Pathways Project in the Lake Grace townsite, which attracted funding of 50% through the State Government Department for Planning and Infrastructure's Country Pathways Grant Scheme.

The project funded extension of the existing Bennett St shared-use-pathway from the Town Hall eastwards, across South Rd and through the public open space up to Morrison Avenue, then continuing through to the Gum Tree Drive Playground.

The project also included funding for a footbridge for use by pedestrians/cyclists to safely cross over the drain that runs adjacent to South Road, a gazebo/rest area in the public open space on Griffin St, as well as directional and safety signage for pedestrians and cyclists.

Completion of the shared use pathway extension provides pedestrians and cyclists with a safe access between the residential development at the eastern end of town and school, shopping and community facilities in the town centre and the Hospital/Medical Centre located at the western end of the town. The new pathway has also improved safety for those school students who ride their bikes to school and live at the eastern end of town.

Total cost of the project was \$85,443.00 and included 50% funding of \$42,721.50 (GST excl) received through the State Government's Department of Infrastructure Country Pathway's Grant Scheme and 50% ratepayer funding through Council's 2003/04 budget.

Council and the community gratefully acknowledge the assistance given by the Department of Planning and Infrastructure's Country Pathways Grant Scheme to developing shared use pathway networks in regional WA.

1Cor.1:26 - 2:5

<sup>"26</sup>For consider your calling, brothers: not many of you were wise according to worldly standards, not many were powerful, not many were of noble birth. 27 But God chose what is foolish in the world to shame the wise: God chose what is weak in the world to shame the strong; <sup>28</sup>God chose what is low and despised in the world, even things that are not, to bring to nothing things that are, 29 so that no human being might boast in the presence of God. 30 He is the source of your life in Christ Jesus, whom God made our wisdom and our righteousness and sanctification and redemption. <sup>31</sup>Therefore, as it is written, "Let the one who boasts, boast in the Lord." 2<sup>1</sup>And I, when I came to you, brothers, did not come proclaiming to you the testimony of God with lofty speech or wisdom. <sup>2</sup>For I decided to know nothing among you except Jesus Christ and him crucified. 3And I was with you in weakness and in fear and much trembling, <sup>4</sup>and my speech and my message were not in plausible words of wisdom, but in demonstration of the Spirit and of power, 5that your faith might not rest in the wisdom of men but in the power of God." (1Cor. 1:26 - 2:5)

What a wonderful way to spend a night before Christmas, and what a joy it is to see so many children here tonight.

Now some of you may be wondering why I chose the reading from Paul's first letter to the Corinthians as the text for my message this evening?

Some of you may not, and for the rest, perhaps it hadn't occurred to you that that particular reading had been chosen for a purpose. It is not a reading usually associated with the celebration of the birthday of Jesus Christ, in fact His name is mentioned only twice. So why did I choose it?

I chose it because I am weak and I cannot survive without the crutch of faith and hope in Jesus Christ. I chose it because everyone here who confesses Jesus Christ as Lord and Saviour is weak and cannot survive without the crutch of faith and hope in Jesus Christ.

And I chose it because of everyone here who does not confess Jesus Christ as Lord Saviour; for everyone who says that Christians are weak and cannot handle life without a crutch; you are 110% right.

According to the apostle Paul, Christians are weak, powerless and foolish. We are insignificant and of no account; and as one commentator on this passage has written;

"God has not chosen only those whom the world counts foolish and weak; He has chosen those who really are foolish and weak in the world."

But, the good news is that He does not leave us that way. He takes the despised and makes them more desirable than gold, even pure gold. He takes the foolish and makes them wiser than professors and philosophers, the ugly and makes them more beautiful than even all the stars in the heavens above, the poor and makes them richer than any man has ever

dreamed, He sets the oppressed free, makes the lame to walk, the blind to see, the deaf to hear and the dumb to speak.

Why? Because He has a purpose. First, because He loves us and He wants us to enjoy Him forever. Second, because He is the sovereign God everything knee must bow to Him. Therefore, everything that seeks to exalt itself before Him will be put to shame, and everything that seeks to boast of self-sufficiency will be brought to nought.

And it is here that we find the connection with the Christmas story.

I saw a bumper sticker once that said, "Kid born in shed saves world."

Now at first glance this is a foolish thing to say. For, how can a baby save the 6,000 children who die in Africa alone every day? How can a baby put an end to the terrorism that even the armies of the world's most powerful nations cannot put a stop to? How can a baby rescue anyone or change anything?

It sounds stupid doesn't it, and from the world's perspective it is stupid and yet there is something strangely appealing about it. Something that says that maybe, just maybe, in this picture of peace, perfection, purity and innocence, perhaps there is hope.

Perhaps, there is hope that God really does exist and that one day everything will be pure, perfect, and peaceful; that one day

and as foolish as it may sound, and as weak as it may seem, perhaps the only real hope for mankind really did begin with a kid born in a shed?

Heaven knows, this world does not need any more wise men, or more powerful armies, or more political kings, or another holy war. 
