This may be the third time that Lake Grace artist Kerrie Argent has exhibited at Cottesloe's Sculpture By the Sea but the passion hasn't lessened for her craft, nor the commentary on the consumerism and waste that we as a human race are inflicting on our planet.

Sculpture by the Sea, Cottesloe 2017 opens to the public on 3 March, 2017 and it's all systems go as they prepare for the 13th annual exhibition. Featuring artists from across Australia as well as countries as different and far apart as China, Germany, Japan, Finland, New Zealand and the Czech Republic, Cottesloe Beach will be transformed into a free sculpture park with over 70 sculptures.

Kerrie's work, titled 'Homeless', features hundreds and hundreds of jumpers. What happens to those

jumpers tucked away in the wardrobe that no longer fit, are unfashionable or were an impulse purchase that should have never left the boutique! Mountains of processed fabrics make their way into landfill each year; why can't these be processed into shelter for the homeless?!

When Kerrie put out the call for donated knitwear Lake Grace and many other communities rallied. The processed materials aren't recyclable in the traditional sense; no good for the mechanic's rag bag, not right for the cleaning cupboard. Some of the donations were beautiful garments, but never likely to be worn again. Kerrie said it was difficult to pick apart clothing that was still in good condition... but she persevered. Within the artwork you will see a time line of fashion.

Once picked apart the garments were rusted. Why

Wards and All That Stuff

Ward reviews and the discussion around them may not seem quite as riveting as MKR; however, with the right ingredients it could be equally as divisive. With council in the position of having to go through this process, Shire staff and councillors were on the road to host community consultation forums.

Forums were held in Newdegate, Varley, Lake King and Lake Grace Town Hall. Shire CEO Denise Gobbart has developed seven proposals; all designed to assist the community in considering proposals and ideas. The Shire is not promoting any particular option, being open to alternative proposals from the community.

Under a wards system each councillor needs to represent a similar number of electors, with the deviation being no greater than 10%. Currently the three Lake Grace Councillors represent 109 electors each; the five rural councillors represent 120 electors while the one Newdegate councillor represents 89 electors.

Although council had made a resolution in 2011 to review the wards again in four years, the discrepancy in the elector/councillor ratio has further necessitated this. The current Newdegate ward could be 'stretched' to

draw in more electors, however predicted population shifts have foreseen that in four years the imbalance may be rearing its head again.

Proposals put forward have touched on one, two and three wards with the option of reducing the number of councillors from nine to seven. Of the 42 local governments within the Wheatbelt Development Commission region, 33 are managing on a single ward system.

Copies of the discussion are available on the Shire's website; the Shire welcomes your feedback and asks that submissions be in by Monday 27th February.

G'day all,

As I write this we are just coming out of the end of the heavy rains that affected the Great Southern region and has impacted us all one way or another. Without going over all the incidents that occurred those three days, I was pleased to see the community pulling together and the offers of help during a time of crisis was the best of country people.

One of the issues arising from the weekend is the conflict of information that we had to hand and the information Main Roads were putting on their website. Main Roads are only as good as the information provided from the ground and they work out their assessments from there. I'm not going to delve into the politics of it all, but a review of the weekend's events may well raise some issues and hopefully when something occurs like this again a better system will be in place.

Our local arrangements worked very well and ourselves, the Shire and DFES had the situation covered well in the event we ended up like Wagin or Ravensthorpe. The Shire was outstanding and was instrumental in making things tick over on Saturday when the worst of the weather came through.

From our point of view it was disappointing to see and hear of people "giving it a run" just so they could get to social functions in Albany and Perth. As we speak Tara is assisting with a search in Ravensthorpe for a man who "gave it a run" and my colleagues in Esperance are dealing with the same scenario there. It seems perverse that a Brit (by birth) should be lecturing Australians about the dangerous conditions that we have here - but here I find myself. Flood waters change by the minute either by flow or direction and then we have the roads under them, which can be there or not there. Would we have been looking for ways past the system and rules if there had been bush fires? I don't think so. Some folks casual disregard for flooding has cost them their lives. I hope we don't have to talk about this again, but emergency situations can escalate to catastrophe when people stop using common sense.

Just a reminder to all that in the event of an emergency (road crash, domestic situation, immediate threat to your safety or others etc) please call 000. Some of you have the station number and some have my mobile as well, but we can be away on patrol or training or simply on a day off. Anything needing as urgent a response as possible needs to be 000. I know it can be frustrating talking to a person in Perth, but they are in the best place to work out what help you need and where it is coming from. Nine times out of ten it'll be me they call.

The time that could be wasted trying to call me or Albany might result in something worse. If you need an appointment to see someone here or need us for something that doesn't seem urgent (lost wallet, firearms license renewal, stolen bin etc) then by all means call the station number 9890 2000. If you get it wrong I don't mind, I just want you to get what you need from us the best way possible.

The new officer Cameron Hobson and family arrive on Thursday this week, so be sure to introduce yourselves and make the Hobson family feel at home in Lake Grace. We are delighted to have them here and they are also looking forward to being part of the Lake Grace community.

Study Shows Long-Term Implications of Amphetamine Use

Media Release

Research carried out by scientists from The University of Western Australia has shown the detrimental effects of long-term amphetamine use on the vascular system.

Many studies have confirmed the toxic effects of amphetamine use on the cardiovascular system, however the UWA study found that the drug also results in the hardening of arteries which increases more dramatically as a person gets older.

The researchers examined 55 amphetamine users, 107 tobacco users, 68 methadone users and 483 non-smokers over a five year period.

People with known cardiovascular disease or therapy or acute exposure to alcohol, cannabis or heroin were not included in the research.

Associate Professor Stuart Reece from UWA's School of Psychiatry and Clinical Neurosciences said the results of the study suggested people who use amphetamines age much faster than non-addicts who are occasional users. It also found that long-term amphetamine users aged at an exponential rate.

"These findings show an increase in the risk of strokes, heart attacks, and many other arterial diseases from abuse of the substance," he said.

When the results were adjusted to account for known

causes of the hardening of arteries, the effects remained regardless.

"This shows the effects of amphetamines in addition to known risk factors for arterial stiffness," Professor Reece said.

"The results validate results from another similar study we conducted recently on the effects of cannabis and opioids on the vascular system."

February 4th 2017 at 2.30pm heralded a new era in the service of St John Ambulance to the Lake Grace and districts community.

After seventy years and eight months at the Bennett street site we closed the doors for the last time and moved the ambulances to the new facility.

With a flash of the beacons and a whoop of the siren the final stage of the move was completed and we had officially moved. It has been more than 7 years from the conception of the project until this day.

Our new facility is now resplendent with 24 solar bollards that shine brightly at night forming a virtual fence (rather than having a formal fence). Talking about light, Stubby's Electrical business owner Reid Stubberfield answered the call to install the power to the new pylon sign at the front of the block and it looks great at night.


Lake Grace Transport delivered the 369 plants from Benara Nurseries in great condition (loaded and unloaded individually our apologies to the truck drivers...we thought they would be on pallets). In less than 24 hours all of the plants were in the ground, mulched and on their drippers. Sharon and Steve Clunie came to our rescue in digging all of the holes for the new plants. The project manager had seriously underestimated the job. The Clunie bobcat was

fantastic, and Sharon and Steve had a great system going to get all the holes in to depth. Who knew that kebab skewers were so versatile. The loosening of the 300mm holes soil at least 600mm down for each plant gives the new garden a great start.

Over the "stinking hot" Friday, Grant Medlen, Keith Higgs and Amanda Milton got the plant layout mapped out while the bobcat got the holes dug. Once the plant lines were marked out, Keith kept working on the irrigation while Grant, Amanda and Ross laid out the plants, then Sharon, Grant and Amanda got on with planting.

Bright and early Saturday morning the rest of the ambulance team (and other volunteers) arrived to get on with planting, and by 10.30am we were finished

Federal Minister Focuses on Regional Roads

Media Release

After visiting the Wheatbelt and Great Southern, Federal Minister for Infrastructure and Transport the Hon Darren Chester is now aware of the challenging transport needs WA is facing and the funding needed to upgrade local roads and key transport corridors in the region.

Member for the Central Wheatbelt Hon Mia Davies and Member for Agricultural Region Hon Martin Aldridge were pleased to see a Federal Minister interested in developing and investing in regional WA.

"It's fantastic to have Minister Chester in the region to see the condition of our roads and the funding we need to improve extensive stretches of the State's major highways and local government roads," Ms Davies said.

The Minister travelled from Albany to Kalgoorlie, stopping via Jerramungup, Ravensthorpe, Lake Grace, Kulin, Kondinin, Narembeen, Merredin and Southern Cross to meet with farmers, transport operators, local government and businesses.

Increased funding to improve road safety and carry out continual maintenance on commodity corridors and

National highways was raised with the Minister as well as the prospect of creating special tourist routes.

"Our meetings were productive and I believe Minister Chester has a firm understanding of what Wheatbelt communities need and how the Federal Government can support road safety outcomes and delivering an efficient road and rail transport network," Mr Aldridge said

The Minister also travelled from Merredin to Southern Cross with local transport company Great Eastern Freightlines to inspect first-hand the condition of the Great Eastern Highway, a Federal transport route.

"We often see Federal Ministers fly in and fly out of our vast State. Minister Chester proved he is committed to his portfolio and regional WA, as he made sure he spent time travelling our roads and understanding local issues," Ms Davies said.

The Nationals WA recently announced \$48 million as part of the \$350 million Seizing the Opportunity in Agriculture initiative to improve Local Government roads burdened by heavy transport as well as \$15 million for strategic agricultural lime routes in the Wheatbelt.

"With the rising demand for WA produce the upgrades announced will ensure our roads can support the increased traffic and are safer for heavy freight and locals to travel on.

With the donated garments offering a kaleidoscope of colour, the rusting neutralises the pieces without taking away all the colour. Apprentice to Subbie – Insurance Matters

Directions WA

Becoming a subcontractor or a self-employed tradesman can be very rewarding but you need to make sure you do your homework first and get the essentials in place to ensure things run smoothly. When you are an employee, apprentice or tradesman, most of your insurance requirements are taken care of by your employer. Once you become a subcontractor however, you are responsible for all of it.

Insurance is one of those risk management tools that you hope you will never need but will be very grateful for if you ever do. It is important to ensure you have the right types of insurance and sufficient coverage for your particular circumstances. There are two main types of insurance that all subbies should consider.

Public Liability Insurance

Almost all tradies, subbie or not, will require **public liability insurance** which covers you for any property damage or personal injury that you cause through your work. Most contractors and projects will not allow you on site without it. Some work contracts will also specify a minimum amount of coverage required, so make sure your read the fine print and know what you are up for.

Income Protection Insurance

Another form of insurance cover you should consider is **income protection insurance**. This type of cover is often optional but some worksites do require you to have it. As an employee you are entitled to sick leave and workers compensation in almost all cases but as a subcontractor, if you cannot work your income and cash flow may stop. You are on your own. If you have suppliers or others to pay you could find yourself in financial hot water, especially if an injury or illness keeps you off the tools and out of work for an extended period of time.

Income protection benefits generally pay you around 75% of your normal income if you are unable to work through sickness or injury. How much it will cost will depend on the amount of the monthly benefit to be paid and how long a period that benefit is paid for. Your premium will also depend on your age, whether you are




a smoker or not, and the level of risk in the work you do. In almost all cases for subbies and tradespeople income protection insurance is tax deductible but any benefit received does need to be reported as taxable income. To get proper tax advice you should talk to your accountant about it.

Seek Professional Advice

There are other types of insurance but these two are key considerations. Talking to other subbies in your industry to find out about their experiences can be helpful. You can also talk with an insurance broker to work out which types of insurance you will need and how much. Part of their job is also to 'shop around' for you and evaluate different insurance products for suitability to your situation and level of risk. Alternatively, you can talk directly to your current insurance provider regarding their trade insurance options.

Given the information we are required to obtain, we cannot just repair any road damage, to do this would likely exclude that road from any external funding. Again, your assistance and patience in this recovery process is appreciated.

You can assist by spraying and/or removing any caltrop on your property or verge, please do not put into your rubbish bin as this will contaminate our waste facility and the neighbouring farm lands.

Disposing of Caltrop Plants

To dispose of any removed caltrop plants please:

- place them into a marked and sealed plastic bag and keep them until winter when they can be safely burnt or
- take them to the Shire Depot, at Absolon Street Lake Grace, where there is a specially marked caltrop wheelie bin facility located just outside the main depot gate.



Debt-recovery Backlash Leads to Centrelink Staff Strikes

The public backlash over the flawed debt-recovery program has lead to the launch of strike action by Centrelink staff and will cause delays for customers.

The Community and Public Sector Union (CPSU) advised the Department of Human Services on Friday that its members would be commencing two weeks of rolling industrial action, to begin on 13 February.

The debt-recovery program, which was launched last year, has seen 170,000 customers issued with notices of potential overpayments, identified by cross-referencing data from the Australian Tax Office and Centrelink. Customers have been asked to provide further information, including pay slips, sometimes dating back six years, within a limited timeframe. If they are not able to provide this information, a debt-recovery notice is issued. However, it has been found that some of the data matching has been flawed. In January this year, the system was amended to enable customers to request an internal review before debt recovery processes were commenced.

In a statement, Department of Human Services spokesman, Hank Jongen said, "We are asking customers to use the self-services options available through MyGov and the Centrelink, Medicare and Child Support mobile apps," he said.

"Of course, anyone who needs to speak to us can phone or visit, they just need to know that this may take longer due to the industrial action.

Assuring that customer payments would not be delayed, Mr Jongen also said, that the industrial action would not have an impact customer payments.

"We appreciate our customer's patience during this time and want to reassure them that we are working hard to minimise disruption to the services they need."

While the action is in direct response to the backlash its members have faced in dealing with the debt-recovery program, the CPSU has been at loggerheads with the department for two years over pay and conditions.

Similar strike action was taken in December, with no customer payments affected. This time around, it is

expected that delays will be experienced at Centrelink offices and via call centres, although it's understood that staff dealing with robo-debt calls will not be striking.

CPSU national secretary Nadine Flood said the budget cuts and resulting 5000 job losses made it difficult for staff across Centrelink, Medicare and Child Support agencies to provide the necessary service to customers.

"Our members are doing this because they care about the quality of the services they provide, which is why workers dealing with sensitive clients such as those being dragged through the robo-debt crisis will not be taking industrial action," she said.

"There are 34,000 hardworking Medicare, Centrelink and Child Support staff who've gone more than three years without a pay rise as they've fought for a new enterprise agreement."

Furthermore, CPSU assistant secretary Michael Tull said last month that it was "perfect storm" which had led to public servants struggling to deal with the public backlash.

The strikes will take place on 13, 15, 17, 20, 22 and 24 February.

Beware of 'Catch the Scammer' Scams

Media Statement

If you get a call from someone saying they are an officer at the Randwick Police Station and they want your help to catch a scammer, hang up – it's a scam!

Numerous reports have been received recently by Consumer Protection where scammers pretend to be police and tell their targets that their bank accounts or credit cards have been compromised. The pretend police officer then asks the target for help in catching the criminals by withdrawing and sending money to the offenders who will be arrested when they collect the money.

In the past 12 months, 18 victims in WA have reported losing a total of more than \$300,000 to this new type of scam. In one case, an 81 year old Woodvale man put \$50,000 in cash in two shoeboxes and sent them to an address in the United Kingdom. When the man's family found out, they contacted the real Police who managed to have the delivery of the parcel stopped and the money returned to sender.

Acting Commissioner of Consumer Protection David Hillyard said there have been a few variations of this latest tactic being used by scammers. "Apart from claiming to be police, the scammers also pretend to be from an internet provider, but on each occasion they tell their targets that their computer has been hacked and their bank accounts may be at risk," Mr Hillyard said.

"They then create this elaborate fake sting operation where the target has to send money, usually by wire transfer, in order to help catch the crooks. Of course, it's totally fake and the targets of this scam will only lose their money. "If you get any calls of this nature, hang up and don't comply with their instructions and certainly don't send any money."

Last year an 81 year old Gosnells woman lost \$22,000 when scammers pretending to be from Telstra said her computer had been hacked and they wanted her help in catching the hackers. They asked her to make multiple payments to India with the promise that the money would be reimbursed and she would receive a new mobile phone for free in return for her assistance.

She was about to send a further \$4,500 when her bank queried the withdrawals and made her aware that she may be a victim of a scam.

"We commend the bank for querying any unusual withdrawals by their customers which, in this case, prevented a senior member of our community from losing even more money," the acting Commissioner said

Building Starts on Narrogin Health Service

The construction tender for the \$50 million redevelopment of the Narrogin Health Service has been awarded to Cockram Construction, Health Minister John Day announced.

Mr Day said the refurbishment would strengthen local health care delivery, allowing more people to get the care they needed closer to home without the need to travel out of the district.

"Narrogin Health Service will receive a new outpatient building, two new birthing rooms with ensuites, a new inpatient ward, theatre, procedure room and sterilising department, as well as new dental and chemotherapy services," he said.

Acting Regional Development Minister Brendon Grylls said Royalties for Regions was investing in significant new infrastructure to improve local services and health outcomes. "This redevelopment will support patients and staff, enhancing the delivery of efficient patient diagnosis and care, while also supporting considerable local employment during construction," Mr Grylls said.

"Significantly expanding Narrogin's health facilities will benefit the district's existing population and sustainability, and also help attract more families to the town in future." The redevelopment of the Narrogin Health Service is being undertaken as part of the Southern Inland Health Initiative's \$300 million capital works program.

Architects Silver Thomas Hanley designed the new outpatient centre with a striking chequerboard facade, representing the stacked hay bales common in the region.

The project will support up to 500 jobs and is due for completion in early 2019.



What's the Story with Summer Rain?

Media Release

If someone asked you if it's normal to get summer rain in the Wheatbelt, how would you respond?

According to Bureau of Meteorology records, sporadic summer rainfall generated by tropical cyclone activity in the north has always been part of life in south-west Australia.

However, with similar flood conditions occurring in the region in early January 2016, and rainfall records showing a very general increase in the number of years with above average summer rainfall for south-western WA; some people are wondering if this a symptom of a changing climate.

The message from the Bureau of Meteorology is that rainfall in south-west WA will continue be characterised by high inter-annual variability against a background of generalised climate change trends. These are broadly speaking projected to be decreasing winter rainfall and increasing extreme weather events.

In fact, the long-term projections for summer rainfall presented on Wheatbelt NRM's Climate Change Portal suggest a steady or decreasing trend in summer rainfall across the Avon River Basin to 2070. This doesn't mean we aren't in for summer floods in the

near to mid-term future.

It is helpful to understand that La Nina conditions are associated with a higher frequency of tropical cyclone activity that can lead to summer rain for us. Keep your eyes on the Bureau's ENSO Wrap-Up to give yourself some idea of whether summer rain might be on the

This can give you time to plan how to best capitalise on the moisture by planting summer-active or perennial pastures. Don't forget it is important to protect your soil and the local waterways from erosion and pollution by revegetating degraded areas and riparian zones as well as maximising your nutrient-use efficiency.



ABC Killed the Shortwave Radio Star

Media Release - Nick Xenophon

There will be moves to have an urgent Senate inquiry into legislation introduced into the Senate this week requiring the ABC to restore its shortwave transmission services.

The Australian Broadcasting Corporation Amendment (Restoring Shortwave Radio) Bill 2017 was introduced by Senator Xenophon this week and requires the ABC to maintain both its domestic and international shortwave transmission services so that people living in rural and remote Australia, as well as remote parts of the Pacific, have access to reliable emergency broadcasting and news. The broadcasting ceased on 31 January 2017.

"This legislation was introduced in direct response to the daft decision by ABC's management in Sydney to kill off shortwave radio which will create a further digital divide in remote Australia," said Nick.

"The ABC's transmission service is the only option for many people who live, work and travel through rural and remote areas. It's an absolutely vital service that provides timely notice in the event of natural disasters. The alternatives proposed by the ABC such as satellite telephones will not provide up-to-date real time broadcasts so this legislation is imperative.

"The response to the shortwave cut-off demonstrates

the woeful inadequacy of the ABC's consultation process. Not only have we heard from many rural Australians concerned about the decision, our near neighbours such as Vanuatu and Papua New Guinea have also voiced serious concerns.

"I'm looking forward to the support of the major parties on this legislation considering that members from both the Coalition and Labor have publicly voiced their concerns."
