St John Ambulance Lake Grace... Grand Opening

On Saturday 25th February 2017 at 2.35pm, with over 215 people in attendance, the Honourable Terry Waldron MLA Member for Wagin and Community Donations Representative Gary Guelfi, unveiled the commemorative plaque and declared the new St John Ambulance WA Ltd - Lake Grace Sub Centre officially open.

Our little lady (new facility) was resplendent in her party dress, she had been polished from head to toe, and not a thing was out of place. The volunteers and their spouses had rubbed, scrubbed, set up, planned and put in place everything for the big day. And it looked magnificent.

Traffic management and parking went without incident, and our thanks to the Shire of Lake Grace for the traffic management signage and the additional mozzie management for the day. Our thanks to the Lake Grace Sportsman's club for the use of the carpark and the toilet facilities, thank you to the Lake Grace/Pingrup Football Club for the use of the cool-room, thank you to the Lake Grace Department of Fire and Emergency Services for the sand bags to hold the marquees down, our thanks to the Lake Grace District High School for the use of the sporting faction marquees, and our thanks for the use of (and offer) of many other shade shelters that were used on the day.

The day was always going to be a hot one, but it proved to be tolerable with a gentle breeze blowing. The opening ceremony was held in the 4 bay garage with 3 of the 4 doors up,allowing breeze access. There was seating for 209 in the garage, and most seats were full with the balance of people choosing to sit under the shade shelters at the rear of the garage. The new sound system projected the proceedings perfectly throughout the area.

With over 200 people looking through the building prior to the opening, movement was surprisingly un-restricted and there were fantastic comments being made about the design and finish of the building.

Opportunities for Lake Grace Youth

When one of Fyfe's stock trailers was showing signs of needing some quite major repairs, rather than send it out of town as he would normally do David popped next door to have a chat to Clint at Lake Grace Engineering as to whether the trailer overhaul would be something that they could take care of.

As chance would have it Lake Grace Engineering had taken on a new apprentice, 15 year old Cooper Earnshaw who preferred the idea of being 'on the job' to being at school. Clint saw this as an ideal project for Cooper to cut his teeth on, with the stock crate having standing room of less than one metre; other staff exhaled with relief!

Built in 2001 the crate needed the grating replaced in the lower deck; like any good fix-it project it soon became more involved with the cross members supporting the slats and the main beam running down the centre of the crate also looking worse for wear. With the crate being a tad older than Cooper, his first job became a major learning curve.

Sections of the main beam and cross members were cut out, with new sections welded in. The new grated floor involved the cutting and flattening of checker plate, which was then welded at equidistant gaps; all in a cramped area. Once the metalwork was completed, it

When's an Audit not an Audit?

When someone who doesn't have the right qualifications does it.

The changes in the Incorporation Act have stated that an audit must be conducted by an independent person who is:

• a member of Chartered Accountants Australia and New Zealand (CA or FCA) that holds a current Certificate of Public Practice;

• a member of CPA Australia (CPA or FCPA) or Institute of Public Accountants (MIPA or FIPA) that holds a Public Practice Certificate;

- a registered company auditor; or
- approved by the Commissioner.

All sounds very complicated and it is the reason that it is essential for ALL incorporated groups and organisations to have a look at their constitution. If you have written in your organisation's rules that you have an audit then you MUST find a suitably qualified person; if you don't, you are contravening the rules of incorporation and as an organisation you face the risk of penalties.

What many clubs and organisations have done in the past isn't technically an audit but what would be called

a review. However even getting a review conducted requires similar qualifications to an audit. The simple solution is updating your constitution.

Incorporated organisations within Lake Grace would largely fall under the Tier 1 associations, earning income of \$250,000 or less for the year. Tier 1 organisations are not required to complete an audit or review of their accounts unless:

• it is a requirement of the association's rules that one be completed;

• it is a requirement under the terms of the association's funding agreement or licence;

• the majority of members at a general meeting pass a resolution that an audit will be completed; or

• the association is directed to do so by the Commissioner.

Tier 2 organisations (\$250,000 – \$1,000,000) are required to undertake a review, while Tier 3 organisations (over \$1,000,000) have to undertake an audit.

However although the Act does not require all incorporated associations to audit or review their

No More Muddling Along

Volunteers for community groups enjoyed two very productive workshops with Caroline Robinson that focussed on Roles of the Committee. Held in Newdegate and Lake Grace, the workshops were well attended by volunteers new to committees and some who had years of experience under their belt.

All went away having learned something new; gaining tools to help ease the work burden and take the scare factor out of committee roles. Caroline Robinson, Executive Officer of the Wheatbelt Business Network and former Rural Woman of the Year is a dynamic presenter, with a clear and concise understanding of rural communities and the challenges they face.

Committee meetings should be organised and productive; they should never drag on for hours. Agendas are vital to running any meeting and if it is not on the agenda then don't talk about it. Everyone attending the meeting should have already read their minutes, there's no need to cover old ground.

The Chairperson or President is an important lynchpin to a committee's success; as they set the tone for the committee. An effective chair will see that a meeting runs to its agenda and that everyone gets to have their say.

It's really important that groups and organisations have a structure in place that when someone new steps into the role, they have a clear picture of what they need to be doing and when they need to have that task completed.

Caroline also talked about the Incorporation Act and what the changes mean for clubs and organisations. It is important that all incorporated groups have a good look at their constitution; this needs to be updated by June 2019.

Rural areas are faced with shrinking populations but its not the only reason there seems to be less people to take on roles to keep organisations going. Fear of not knowing what to do, busy lives and an inability to commit by members are also factors facing non profit groups. These same factors are also present in metropolitan organisations.

Country Alliance Coordinator Endorses One Nation.

Media Release

In 2005 the Labor Government drastically reduced the representation of country people in our State Parliament with its so-called "One Vote, One Value" electoral changes.

The number of Members of Parliament in the country was cut by six while eight more were added to the city.

The Country Alliance was formed to fight Labor's attack on country communities, with representation from the Regional Councils' Association, WAFF, PGA and the three main conservative political parties - Liberal, National and One Nation.

The Country Alliance defeated Labor's anti-country legislation in the High Court but eventually a defecting Liberal MP voted with Labor, giving it the numbers to pass the legislation into law.

Former Liberal & Independent MP Hon. Anthony Fels, said the Nationals and Liberals were very vocal against Labor's electoral rip off at the time but had done nothing since winning government to scrap Labor's anti -country laws.

"In 2005 Colin Barnett and Brendon Grylls spoke strongly in Parliament against Labor's electoral changes", Mr Fels said.

"But after they won government and had the numbers in Parliament to scrap Labor's anti-country electoral laws they did nothing to restore the voice of country people in Parliament.

"Country people should send Mr Barnett and Mr Grylls a message at the State election for failing to live up to their word and for failing to restore country representation in Parliament."

Mr Fels said the only major political party that had remained true to country people was One Nation.

"One Nation was represented on The Country Alliance and its members always have supported restoring country representation in Parliament.

"This is the strength of representation that country people really need in Parliament."

Mr Fels said if the polls are correct the Liberal-National government is facing the prospect of huge losses at the coming election, made worse due to the impact of Labor's electoral changes from 2005.

"Everyone knows the Liberals and Nationals won government in 2008 and again in 2013 because Labor was so much on the nose.

"Labor overcame this stigma and is set to gain hugely from the electoral changes it made more than a decade ago, simply because the Liberals and Nationals did not stand up for country people and scrap Labor's electoral laws."

accounts. An association may still require an audit to be carried out and this requisite would normally be specified in the rules. It is within the power of the members to pass a resolution that the accounts for a particular financial year be audited, especially if they had any reason to be concerned. Funding body agreements might also require the association's accounts to be audited to ensure that the funds provided are used according to the funding agreement and for the purpose stated in the agreement.

Reasons for auditing

Although it may seem like additional time, effort and expense to have an annual audit, there are a number of reasons why an association (or a funding body) would require records to be audited:

• an audit of the financial records of the association ensures greater accountability to the members (and for some associations, the public);

• the audit gives assurance that all funds received by the organisation have been correctly collected, documented and banked. It shows all monies spent by the organisation were for the purpose of the association, approved by the management committee, and documented. This also helps to protect management committee members against unfounded allegations of misconduct;

• the audit provides an account of the assets of the association and verifies that records and registers are properly maintained;

• the audit functions as a check and balance. It requires that the financial statements of the association be kept to a standard in order for the audit to occur and will indicate areas that may require improvement;

• audited financial statements are required if the association has charitable status; and

• funding bodies often require audited financial statements.

The role of the auditor

The purpose of an audit is to enable an auditor to express a professional and independent opinion on the financial statements of the association. It is the responsibility of the management committee to provide the financial statements.

It is not the task of the auditor to find all errors or fraud, therefore the management committee cannot rely on the auditor's work as a substitute for the performance of their own duties. Every member of the committee must pay close attention to the association's financial statements at all times.







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Shire of Lake Grace Road Update

Media Release - Shire of Lake Grace

The Lake Grace Shire administration continues to work on progressing flood affected damages throughout the Shire. The first step in this process was having all of the roads inspected and photographed, to determine which roads could be opened to local traffic. This process has now been completed.

During this initial inspection, the event was declared a natural disaster, which has triggered WA Natural Disaster Relief and Recovery Arrangements (WANDRRA) funding assistance for repair to damaged sections of roads.

It should be noted that if the Shire undertakes any repair works to damaged sections of roads prior to the secondary assessment, the repair works will disqualify that section of road from funding.

The Shire has on Friday 24 February 2017, engaged WML Consultants as third party engineers to undertake a compliance inspection of the claim to be made by the Shire, an action that is required under the funding arrangements. The initial estimate of damage is in the vicinity of \$9-10,000,000.

On a positive note, the Shire is very much in front in this process, and we have been very fortunate to gain the services of WML Consultants. The compliance inspections will commence Wednesday 1 March 2017.

Fight the Bite at Home



Mosquitoes can breed around your home. They will lay their eggs in fresh or salty water, and often in containers that hold water. Common breeding sites include pot plant drip trays, gutters, ponds, pet water bowls, old tyres, rubbish, containers and pools that are not well maintained.

Stop mosquitoes breeding around your home by following these simple steps:

- empty out or discard containers and rubbish that may hold water
- clean out roof gutters to prevent water from pooling
- empty, clean and refill bird baths, stock troughs and pet water bowls at least once a week
- keep swimming pools properly maintained
- empty wading pools at the end of each day
- cover rainwater and septic tank openings, wells or other large water containers with mosquito-proof mesh keep edges of ponds clear of vegetation.

Where possible, avoid exposing your baby or child to mosquitoes.



Consider staying indoors, using pram netting or dressing them in loose long-sleeved clothing, socks and shoes.

Under 12 months – repellents containing DEET or picaridin are not recommended.

From 12 months – repellents containing up to 10% DEET or picaridin can be used.

Adults - repellents containing up to 20% DEET or picaridin.

- Always apply the repellent according to the instructions on the label.
- Do not allow children to apply repellents.
- Apply repellent first to the hands of the carer and then spread evenly to exposed skin of child.
- Avoid applying repellent to the child's hands, near the eyes or mouth.
- Avoid applying repellent under clothing

Safe Places in a Bushfire

It is important to identify places where you can go as a last resort if you are unable to leave or implement your bushfire survival plan. A 'safer place' is somewhere you can shelter during bushfire. These places may include a local open space, a dam or beach. Identify and plan where your family safer place will be.

There are things that you will need to consider if you do plan to use a safer place in your bushfire survival planning:

- They do not guarantee safety in all circumstances. You and your family's safety should be your first priority.
- There may be a risk with travelling to your safer place. Check to see if the route is safe and clear, have a contingency route or safer place in your back -up plan.
- Firefighters may not be there, they may be fighting the main fire front elsewhere.
- Your safer place caters for animals or pets. You will need to consider this in your bushfire survival plan.
- Your safer place may not cater for animals or pets. You will need to consider this in your bushfire survival plan.

Your safer place may not provide shelter from the

elements of a bushfire, particularly flying embers and hot weather. Keep woollen blankets in your car to give you shelter from flying embers and a supply of drinking water.

- place them into a marked and sealed plastic bag and keep them until winter when they can be safely burnt or
- take them to the Shire Depot, at Absolon Street Lake Grace, where there is a specially marked caltrop wheelie bin facility located just outside the main depot gate.



Telescope Records Massive Explosion 12 Billion Years Ago

Media Release - UWA

The University of Western Australia's Zadko Telescope has captured the explosive birth of a black hole 12 billion light years away that took place before the Earth and Sun existed.

The images reveal a blast so powerful it was equivalent to a billion suns shining together for one minute.

The explosion was recorded at 10.49pm on Thursday 2 February when a NASA satellite orbiting the Earth sent an alert to the Zadko Telescope.

Within seconds of NASA detecting the explosion, Zadko swung into action, taking very sensitive images of the sky.

UWA Zadko Science Director Associate Professor David Coward said what the images revealed was extraordinary.

"Over several minutes we saw a rapidly brightening star, where there was no star before," Professor Coward said.

"The light from the explosion had travelled for 12 billion years before hitting the telescope." Professor Coward said the discovery was important because Zadko had provided one of the most detailed recordings of a massive star exploding. The event, named GRB170205

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was monitored by Zadko for more than 24 hours. The Zadko images will be used to test the "fireball model", which so far is the only feasible description in the world of how these explosions occur. The discovery will help understand the extreme physics at play when a massive star explodes.

The Zadko Telescope, operated by the UWA School of Physics and Astrophysics, was made possible by a philanthropic donation to UWA by James Zadko.



At 2:10pm, the master of ceremonies Volunteer Ambulance Officer, Ross Chappell called everyone together to commence the ceremony. Ross welcomed everyone and gave a brief history of the sub centre. It was fantastic that our most senior sub centre member Mr Phillip Franks and his wife Ann were able to join us at the ceremony. Thank you to Coralie Palmer for assisting Mr & Mrs Franks.

Chief Executive Officer of St John Ambulance Mr Tony Ahern was next to address the audience. Tony reflected on the project construction and the role of infrastructure to the St John Ambulance volunteer model. After the ceremony Mr Ahern was very complimentary to the community and the project.

Mr Gary Guelfi representing the vast amount of community donations, was then called to the lectern. Gary highlighted and acknowledged that this project is over 70% funded through community funds. As Gary said, "it takes a community to raise a child, but it has taken 12 communities to build an ambulance sub centre". Gary did a great job, especially considering he was a reluctant public speaker.

Next our MC Ross Chappell introduced Terry (Tuck) Waldron to address the audience. Terry spoke about the importance of government and corporate organisations in funding this type of project, and how by working together we can achieve great things. Artist Kerrie Argent was next to address the proceedings, and Kerrie described how the donor recognition tree sculpture came to be, and why the eucalypt "Silver Princess" was chosen as the sculpture inspiration. Silver Princess's are now very rare in the landscape, they grow in dry and desolate locations, they struggle to establish, but when they do, they have the most spectacular display of flowers.

Kerrie related the tree to the struggle that this project has had, to come to fruition, and the beautiful creation it is today. Kerrie also recognised Sculptor Ben Argent as the engineer who interpreted the drawings and created the sculpture. Kerrie also acknowledged Sculptor/ Engineer Lawrie Dickins for the ground sculpture of the St John Logo, that looks spectacular nestled into the synthetic grass.

Next we had local and ex local St John Ambulance volunteers, Fr Joseph Sousa, Ollie Farrelly, Fr Gayan Thamel, Mrs Lois Dickins (representing past and longer serving volunteers), Mrs Christine Fyfe (representing current volunteers) and Miss Lauren Bushby (representing new and future volunteers) conduct the blessing of the building ceremony. This blessing was punctuated with the sprinkling of holy water on the plaque as a representation of the building. In December 2015 a similar small ceremony was undertaken to bless the block, so this was a perfect bookend to that event.

The only thing left was to cut the ribbon. Every single person in attendance was invited to go out the front of the building where they were given a pair of commemorative scissors. The local volunteers then stretched out 50m of bright red ribbon and everyone was invited to find a space so we would cut the ribbon together. MC Ross Chappell gave the count of 3 and the community ribbon cutting was completed. It was fantastic to see the ribbon was shared amongst those in attendance to take home as a memento of the occasion.

Then it was time to relax, have another look around the facility, fill in the signing book, and enjoy a good old fashioned country afternoon tea, provided by Mrs G Catering and her staff.

Highlight of the event was the content of the ceremony (with the blessing being a significant component), while the ribbon ceremony was seen by most to be the pinnacle of the event.

We want to thank everyone from near and far who travelled to celebrate with us. We had visitors from Perth, Wongan Hills, Wundowie, Toodyay, Gingin, Margaret River, Albany, Pingrup, Pingaring, Kulin, Narrogin, Dumbleyung and Newdegate. Thank you for your support, the immense presence of community was not lost on the dignitaries of the day.

As this will be my last project update to the community, I am taking the opportunity to say what a privilege it has been, to manage this project on your behalf. It was with a great sense of responsibility that the community and corporate funds were spent carefully and wisely.

My sincere thanks to AK Homes our builders, our Architect, Urban and Rural Perspectives, Dan Turner our Structural Engineer, Darryl Baxter our Building Surveyor and to every trade for the care they have taken in producing this magnificent new facility. Lastly to my husband Graham. Thank you for allowing me to spend the last15 months almost full time on this project, and for the last 7 years of support to get this building to its conclusion.


