

defence forces or on the home front during World War II. A number of civilians who contributed to the war effort overseas are also eligible to apply.



## Air Conditioning Review on Our School Buses

Roe MLA Dr Graham Jacobs has drawn an undertaking from the Carpenter Government to review their policy of air conditioning on school buses.

Dr Jacobs described the effects of climate stress on young children travelling for more than two hours per day in high ambient temperatures in a motion presented to State Parliament today.

"Planning and Infrastructure Minister Alannah MacTiernan agreed to review the situation over the next six months," Dr Jacobs said.

"To say that electorates in the south of the state are not affected because it does not get hot – as has been the government's air conditioning policy on school bus services – shows no understanding of regional conditions.

"It does get hot and many children in my electorate travel to school on gravel roads situated inland, hundreds of kilometers North West of Esperance."

Dr Jacobs said the South West, Great Southern and South East regions had been identified by the policy as producing climate stress no more than 22 days a year.

"Because of this, air conditioning on the school bus service in neither funded for installation or running costs of air conditioning units," he said.

"This is incongruous with modern standards where we all expect newly acquired private cars to have air conditioning no matter where we live in WA.

"I applaud the Minister for agreeing to a review and hope school children in my electorate can travel in air conditioned buses by next summer."

**SEA MONSTERS:** The last thing you might expect to encounter exploring the ocean floor is a chemical weapon. But it seems hundreds of thousands of tonnes of them have been dumped into the sea, and no one knows exactly where the weapons are. Now scientists are calling for weapons sites to be mapped for safety's sake. Between 1946 and 1972, the US and other




countries pitched 300,000 tonnes of chemical weapons over the sides of ships or scuttled them along with useless vessels, according to public reports by the Medea Committee, a group of scientists given access to intelligence data so they can advise the US government on environmental issues. But the military have lost track of most of the weapons because of haphazard record keeping combined with imprecise navigation. Even the exact chemicals were not always noted, though there are records of shells, rockets and barrels containing sulphur mustard and nerve agents such as sarin.

The Chemical Weapons Convention does not cover the destruction of the sea dumped weapons, which are considered abandoned. If the chemicals leak from their containers, they will break down slowly in the cold seawater. But it is unclear what will happen if the chemicals bind to sediment or sink into anoxic zones said Peter Brewer an ocean chemist A team led by Roy Wilkens at the University of Hawaii in Manoa is planning to look for munitions dumped off the island of Oahu. Records only note that the weapons were dumped about 5 Miles south of pearl Harbour and an area of 60 square kilometres will have to be searched (Environmental Science and Technology).

### CHILL OUT OR THE CHILDREN GET THE FEVER:

Stressed parents aren't just damaging their own health – they may also be making their children more vulnerable to illness. Stress is well known to affect a person's own physical health, but the effect on their children's health was unclear. To



investigate, Mary Caserta and her colleagues at the University of Rochester in New York asked the parents of 169 children aged between 5 and 10 to monitor their child's health over three years, recording symptoms of illnesses and taking their temperatures. Every six months, the parents took a test designed to assess their own psychiatric health, noting markers of stress such as anxiety or depression.

Caserta's team found that the total number of illnesses, both with and without fever, was significantly higher in the children of parents who reported high levels of emotional stress. The team also measured the levels of immune cells in the children, and found those with highly stressed parents were much more likely to have heightened immune activity — a sign that they were working hard to fend off infection (Brain, Behaviour and immunity, DOI: 10.1016/j.bbi.2008.01.007). David

Jessop at the University of Bristol in the UK calls the results fascinating, and thinks that future studies should aim to discover which stress factors have the biggest impact on children's immunity.

### FAULT FOUND FOR THE MEDITERRANEAN "DAY

**OF HORROR:** The survivors of a tsunami that killed thousands living on the shores of the Mediterranean in AD 365 called it the "day of horror". Worryingly, history may be due to repeat itself, say geologists who have located the source of the wave. No one



had been able to find evidence pinpointing the earthquake that caused the tsunami, which washed into the Egyptian city of Alexandria and the Nile delta. The mainstream view was that a series of quakes had struck the region - cumulatively thrusting a section of western Crete upwards by 10 metres. Beth Shaw and colleagues at the University of Cambridge carbon dated a section of corals on the coast of Crete that were lifted clear of the water during the upheavals. The corals' distribution and identical age showed that one giant quake must have lifted all of them by 10 metres in one massive push - revealing the tsunami's source. The only thing that could have generated such a large uplift at that location is an earthquake in a steep fault in the Hellenic trench, near Crete, says Shaw. The team built a computer model which suggested such movement would have created a 2- metre wave in open water - the same height as that generated by the Sumatran earthquake in 2004 - which would have reached the African shore (Nature Geoscience, DOI: 10.1038/ngeo151). Shaw says a further slip in the part of the fault that caused the tsunami is only likely to happen once every 5000 years.

However, other segments of the fault may slip on a similar scale, she says, and this movement could happen every 800 years or so. "The big unknown is whether the fault that slipped is unique, or one of the many contiguous patches that might slip in the future," says Roger Bilham of the University of Colorado in Boulder. In another new study, Anga Scheffers at Southern Cross University in Lismore, New South Wales, and colleagues reveal geological evidence of five tsunamis that hit Greece over the past 2000 years. Most were small and local, but in 1303 a larger one hit Crete, Rhodes, Alexandria and Acre in Israel (Earth and Planetary Science Letters. DOI: 10.1016/ j.epsl.2008.02.021).

**BUG HAIR DAY:** A new species of bacteria has been discovered in hairspray. But further tests are needed to say whether <u>Microbacterium</u> <u>hatanonis</u> is any threat to human health, say researchers at the Japan Collection of Microorganisms in Saitama.



## Substantial Rainfall Recorded in Lake Grace

Saturday's 40mm of rain has Lake Grace landholders and rural supply companies rubbing their hands together. Although the promise of a good start does not mean the rest of agricultural

year will pan out, it is the most substantial day's rain to fall in April since 1964; and one of the better falls recorded across the Wheatbelt.

Although 40mm fell in Lake Grace town, surrounding areas weren't quite so damp, with north and east of town only recording 20mm. Tarin Rock had a similar rainfall to Lake Grace, while falls of 50mm were recorded south of Lake Grace. Newdegate Research Station recorded 17mm though Newdegate towns fall was minimal.

Runoff from Saturday's rain resulted in 11,000 cubic metres (11 million litres) being caught in Lake Grace's town supply.

Welcome to Night Watch for the fortnight, from midnight Friday 11<sup>th</sup> April to midnight Friday 25th April. Astronomy is looking up. Never view the Sun with the naked eye, or through binoculars and telescopes without proper Solar Filters as your eyes can easily be damaged beyond repair. Binoculars and telescopes can easily shatter as well. The Full Moon may also hurt your eyes without filters.

Our local star the Sun resides in the constellation of Pisces until Saturday 19<sup>th</sup> when it will rise in Aries. The Sun gives off light at magnitude of -26.72 which takes eight and one half minutes to cross the 150 million kilometres to Earth. Morning twilight begins at 5:04am on Saturday and at 5:12am on Friday 25<sup>th</sup>. Evening twilight ends at 7:10pm on Saturday and at 6:57pm on Friday 25<sup>th</sup>.

On Sunday 13<sup>th</sup> in Gemini the 1<sup>st</sup> quarter **MOON** will occur at 2:22am at magnitude -6.0. The Moon on Tuesday 15<sup>th</sup> will be very close to the bright blue star Regulas at 0.9° south at 10pm. On Sunday 20th full Moon will occur at 6:15pm in Virgo at magnitude -12.0. The Moon on Wednesday 23<sup>rd</sup> in Libra will be at Apogee (furthest) at 405,943 kilometres from Earth at 6pm, and also very close to the red supergiant star Antares is Scorpius at midnight.

The Moon will be in Gemini at 38% on  $12^{th}$  and 49% on  $13^{th}$ , in Cancer on  $14^{th}$  at 60% and  $15^{th}$  at 70%, Leo on  $16^{th}$  at 87%,  $17^{th}$  at 87%, Virgo on  $18^{th}$  at 93%,  $19^{th}$  at 97%,  $20^{th}$  at 99% and  $21^{st}$  at 100%, Libra on  $22^{nd}$  at 98% and  $23^{rd}$  at 95%, Scorpius on  $24^{th}$  at 91% and Ophiuchus on  $25^{th}$  at 85%.

**MERCURY** will be too close to the Sun to view this fortnight as it moves into the evening twilight.

**VENUS** the very bright planet at magnitude -3.8 in the constellation of Cetus (the Whale or monster) rises at 5:14am on Saturday. Venus rises at 5:19am on Tuesday 15<sup>th</sup>, rising in Pisces. On Friday 25<sup>th</sup> Venus rises at 5:37am at close to 1 hour before the Sun.

**MARS** the red planet in the constellation of Gemini on Saturday sets at 10:51pm and is just south of the Moon at 1.2° and at magnitude +0.9.On Friday 25<sup>th</sup> Mars sets at 10:32pm.

**JUPITER** the giant gas planet in the constellation of Sagittarius rises at 11:13pm shining at magnitude -2.4 on Saturday. On Friday 25<sup>th</sup>, Jupiter will rise at 10:26pm and will soon be good evening viewing.

**SATURN** the ringed gas planet in the constellation of Leo shining at magnitude +0.4 will be in the night sky until 2:35 on Sunday morning. On Wednesday 16<sup>th</sup>, Saturn will be 3° north of the Moon and in the north at 8:45pm. Saturn on Friday 25<sup>th</sup> will be in the night sky to 1:43am on Saturday 25<sup>th</sup>.

**URANUS** in the constellation of Aquarius rises at 3:57am on Saturday morning at magnitude +5.8. On Friday 25<sup>th</sup> Uranus rises at 3:09am. Binoculars are needed to find Uranus which is blue/green in colour.

**NEPTUNE** in the Constellation of Capricornus rises at 1:52am at magnitude +7.9 on Saturday and at 1:02am on Friday 25<sup>th</sup>. Neptune is grey/green in colour and binoculars or telescope is needed.

Now is a good time to study the Moon with your telescopes and binoculars. The South Pole is the part of the Moon with all the craters close together.

Some double and triple stars are still good to view in the southern sky. A good double is the furthest pointer star Alpha Centauri which contains two observable yellow stars the same as the Sun. One is larger than the Sun and the other is smaller, they are 4.5 light years away and are the closest stars to Earth except for the Sun.

There is a third star in the group, which is a red dwarf but will be hard to find as it shines at magnitude +11.05. A good triple star system is the bright blue star at the head of the Southern Cross called Acrux. It contains two stars very close and one just further away. They shine from a distance of 320.7 light years away and magnitudes of +0.77, 1.6 and 5.1.

A good pair of binoculars is the best way to learn the night sky with a star map which shows the main stars and the Constellations.

# Fitzgerald Campdraft and Gymkhana Weekend

Campdrafting is proudly one of this country's very own national sports. First pioneered by our early stockmen as a way of drafting cattle in large unfenced tracts of land it has been refined to the keenly competitive horse sport we know today.

To best briefly describe a campdraft would be to say that horse and rider combine to separate one beast from six beasts in a camp (20 X 40 metre yard). When the rider gets the beast to the front of the camp they show the judge how well they can control the beast

before calling for the gates to be opened and proceeding to take the beast in a clover leaf pattern around 3 pegs in a football oval sized arena in 40 seconds. Riders are scored on their ability in the camp and outside.
