LGDHS Interschool Swimming Carnival



A Man of Vision

Suzanne Reeves

Does everyone see the name C Y O'Connor and understand the debt that Western Australia owes to this brilliant engineer. His surname denotes our Federal electorate, his name has branded the TAFE for our region, the lake held back by Mundaring Weir also bears his name as does the beach where he ended his life. Those who drive along the Great Eastern Highway have a constant reminder of the man as they motor parallel to the pipeline.

Charles Yelverton O'Connor was born 11th January 1843 in Gravelmount, Castletown, County Meath, Ireland. Following an apprenticeship as a railway engineer, he emigrated to New Zealand to take up the position of assistant engineer for Canterbury Province.

In 1873 he married Scottish-born Susan Laetitia Ness and they had eight children, four girls and four boys. Through advancements in his career he was appointed Marine Engineer for the colony (New Zealand).

By 1891 O'Connor had much experience in harbour and dock construction when he resigned his position in April that year to become Engineer-in-Chief of Western Australia. His wife and children relocated with him to

Australia. There he was responsible for the construction of Fremantle Harbour and the Goldfields Water Supply Scheme project, which supplied water to the Eastern Goldfields. He was the inaugural Engineer in Chief of the Public Works Department.

The construction of Fremantle Harbour^[1] was probably O'Connor's greatest personal triumph, as his proposal to build the harbour within the entrance to the Swan River was contrary to previous expert advice that this was impracticable and that the construction would require constant dredging. Work commenced in 1892 in removing a limestone bar and sand shoals at the mouth of the Swan River and was successfully completed in 1903. On 4 May 1897 the first ocean-going steamer, the *Sultan*, berthed at South Quay (renamed Victoria Quay on 26 July 1901 in honour of the late Queen Victoria). At age 54, O'Connor travelled to London to be inducted a Companion of the Order of St Michael and St George.

More than 100 years of continued use of Fremantle Harbour by heavy shipping has erased all doubt concerning O'Connor's technical judgement.

Gardening Tips

Media Release - Scotts Australia

Although it is Autumn, there's still time to plant out Winter and early Spring flowering annuals and vegetables while the soil remains warm.

There's an old saying that bulbs should be planted on St Patrick's Day - March 17 - but if you're a bit late, it won't matter! Try to have planting finished (except tulips) by mid April or a couple of weeks earlier in cold regions. Suggestions include:

The flower garden

Flowering bulbs from mid March to the end of April - daffodil, jonquil, freesia, ranunculus, anemone, crocus, hyacinth, muscari (grape hyacinth) and tulip*.

Pansy, viola, polyanthus, primula, primrose and cineraria.

Australian natives like native heath (correa), bottlebrush (callistemon), banksia, lillypilly, gum tree (eucalypt) and grevillea.

South African protea, leucadendron, leucospermum and serruria.

Evergreen trees and shrubs - camellia, azalea, rhododendron, magnolia, michelia, pieris.

* Tulip bulbs need 4-5 weeks in the vegetable crisper section of the refrigerator before they are planted out in early May.

The vegetable patch

Winter lettuce, onion, spinach, radish, broad bean, cabbage, cauliflower, broccoli, broccolini, pak choy.

Fighting for Hearts and Minds

Media Release - Heart Foundation. Stroke Foundation

The Stroke Foundation and Heart Foundation today brought together Members of Parliament from both sides to urge national action on one of Australia's biggest killers – cardiovascular disease.

Hearts and Minds – Effective measures to tackle heart disease and stroke were launched at a Parliamentary Friends of Heart and Stroke event in Parliament House.

Stroke Foundation Chief Executive Officer Sharon McGowan said Hearts and Minds was developed by the Stroke Foundation and National Heart Foundation in response to the Government's acknowledgement of ever increasing burden of chronic disease.

"With an aging population and more prevalent risk factors, chronic disease is Australia's biggest health challenge – internationally chronic disease is being described as a pandemic," Ms McGowan said.

"Within Australia around one-third of the population or seven million people have a chronic condition, and that number is set to grow, placing ever-increasing demands on our health system and burden on our communities.

"To successfully meet the chronic disease challenge, Australia must do more to tackle one our most costly diseases; heart, stroke and blood vessel disease." Heart Foundation Chief Executive Officer Adj Professor John Kelly AM said cardiovascular disease was largely preventable and treatable.

"Around 4.2 million Australians are living with cardiovascular disease, it is the underlying cause of 29 percent of deaths, yet is largely preventable," Adj Professor Kelly said.

Pre seeding 2017

Seeding is only just around the corner, especially after all the Summer rains, so its timely to review our electrical pre season check list.

Two-ways - check all your two ways (UHF + VHF) are in good working order, UHF should be able to transmit up to 20 kilometres with a good aerial, VHF further. If the sets are faulty, bring them into store so we can have them repaired before the rush. We also have GME electraphone, UNIDEN and ICOM two ways in stock. We can arrange VHF sets in most common brands.

Machinery upgrades - upgrading your tractor, car or air seeder and need to transfer monitors from old to new? Give us a call and book us in to carry out the transfer for you. We can fit isolation switches, to stop current drains discharging batteries, at the same time as the monitor swap.

General electrics - have your batteries got enough grunt to start your tractor or truck? Is the alternator keeping up with all the electrical load? How about the starter, is it sticking or making angry sounds every now and then. Last week my 8 year old son participated in his first school swimming carnival, and ended up winning his first ever medal for "champion boy" in his age.
Unfortunately I was away on a work trip, and of course when I spoke to the family that evening my son was the first on the end of the phone to tell me proudly of his achievement (he doubted himself and never expected to win). This recognition for effort has been amazing for his confidence and I have even noticed a positive change in his motivation towards other extra-curricular activities that had previously challenged his confidence.

A field known as "positive psychology" (focusing on one's strengths) has come up with findings that this aids in increasing wisdom, satisfaction and a sense of purpose. It's common sense really, how good do we feel when someone tells us we have done a good job?

There are three main areas where we can have a direct influence and use some "positive psychology" that is; in our family lives, in and around our working lives, in our community groups (sport clubs, rotary/men's shed, church groups).

To do this effectively we have to always maintain our own good mental health and wellbeing and a definition which encapsulates this is summarised by the World Health Organisation (2007) - "a state of wellbeing in which an individual realises his or her own abilities, can cope with the normal stresses of life, can work productively and is able to make a contribution to his or her community".

The interesting thing is that it's almost a social and personal expectation to continually commit ourselves to our family, working, and community lives, and rightly so. These are all important areas and putting time and effort in gives us satisfaction.





Flooding Event - February 2017

WML engineering consultants have now completed the secondary assessment of our road network, and projects have been costed for repair. This assessment has been delivered to Main Roads WA (MRWA) and the Shire is now waiting for confirmation from MRWA of funding for repair works.

Once the Shire has received confirmation of funding, a tender will be advertised for construction and repair works. Consideration will be given to the timeliness of works as well as quality of construction.

The Shire has engaged a number of grading contractors to undertake 'smoothing' works on our roads. This work does not involve any material importation, but is simply grading out ruts or damage in the road to remove washouts. We will start opening roads again as soon as possible, in light of vehicle capacity and water across roads. If a road is graded but still missing road base, it may not be possible to access these routes with restricted access vehicles.

For road closures please refer to the Shire's website www.lakegrace.wa.go.au or Facebook page for a list of current roads that are closed within the Shire.

BlazeAid have set up a base camp in Lake King to help those affected by the floods. Local Recovery Coordinating Committee Meeting

The Shire and other government agencies held a meeting on Friday 17 March 2017 and provided an update in relation to the recent flooding. A resolution was made for two sub-committees to be established of local farmers, community representatives etc. to assist in the progress for the recovery of the flooding. Firstly an Infrastructure committee, to assist assessing the

restoration of infrastructure and recommending priority road projects in the short, medium and long term and a community committee to provide advice and guidance to assist in the restoration and strengthening of the community's well-being.

Strategic Community Plan Review

Community forums were held on Monday in Varley and Newdegate and on Tuesday in Lake King and Lake Grace. Thanks to those who attended and contributed to the survey.

The elected members and I have the opportunity to attend the Integrated Strategic Planning training in Katanning on Thursday 30 March. This is a timely training session that uses existing legislation as its basis to explore the way in which Local Governments are required to plan for the future. On the 6 April Councillors and management will be workshopping the results of the community forums to develop the new Strategic Community Plan.

Development Applications (Planning/Building Approvals)

A friendly reminder, if you are undertaking any development on your property (i.e. building something new or using your land for another purpose) please contact the Shire on 9890 2500 to ensure all the relevant approvals and permits are in place.

Insurance Responsibility

Any Community Groups, Organisations, Associations, Social Clubs, Sporting Groups, Senior Groups etc. that undertake any activity (e.g. fund raising, holding an event etc.) should have their own insurance coverage. The insurances to consider are Public Liability, Association & Officers Liability, Volunteer Workers and Community & Family Events. The type of coverage needed depends on the activities your group undertakes.

The Shire's insurance covers any property and contents owned by the Shire and liability to the public for areas within the Shire's responsibility. If you are a group that uses Shire owned facilities or grounds to store your equipment or goods, it is important that you have your own contents insurance to cover any loss that may occur.

The Shire policy will not cover the loss of property not owned by the Shire. I am happy to catch up with any group that is concerned about the need for insurance and the limitations of our policies.

In the year 2000, Australia's insurance industry faced a public liability crisis because of the prohibitive costs for community groups. From here the Local Community Insurance Services was established to manage the special needs of clubs, community groups and not-for-profit associations. Building & Maintenance Team

The Building Maintenance Team have been carrying out building/maintenance inspections on all Shire buildings collecting data towards the 10 year maintenance plan and carrying out work requests.

Progress on the Lake Grace Independent Living Units (ILU's) can be seen with the compliance works completed for Unit 1, roof lining and gable cladding works on Units 2 and 3, and the electrical pre-wire complete on Unit 2. Other works carried out on Unit 3 were the building wrap, installation of windows, footings for the carport and alfresco areas and ceiling battens.

The coming weeks will see completion of external cladding on Units 1 and 2 and installation of compliance ply bracing on Units 2 and 3. The units will then be to lockup stage which will enable internal fitout.

Road Works

Our Construction Team are working on Hatters Hill Road. They have completed 2 kilometres of formation and gravel sheeting. This project is being undertaken utilising Commodities Route funding.

The Newdegate grading contractor has been grading along Biddy Camm Road, Mission Road, Newman Road, Orr Road, Mt Sheridan Road and some of Old Ravensthorpe Road.

The Lake King grading contractor has been grading along Milsteed Road, Long Creek Road, Mallee Road, Magdhaba Track and Old Newdegate Road.

The Lake Grace Maintenance Grader is currently grading the roads in the south east area after the flood damage (Brookfield, Thornton, Bairstow and Fourteen Mile Road).

Simon Trevenen (Contractor) has been grading along Magenta Road and Ardler Road.

Road Maintenance Team

The Road Maintenance Team have been erecting white posts along Morton and Holt Rock South Road, and patching the road damage on Magenta Road. The team have assisted the mowing of the ovals in Lake Grace when required.

Gardeners

Our Town Maintenance crew have been out to Lake King mowing the park area behind the tavern and

spraying the cemetery and playground near the Lake King Hall.

The team have been out to the sale yards in Lake Grace for spraying and slashing of the yards, spraying and weeding of the Lake Grace cemetery and trimming the hedges in the main street islands, and the Lake Grace Administration Building.

The team will be commencing the trimming of the street trees in Lake Grace.

Ordinary Council Meeting – Wednesday 22 March 2017

Items of business considered at the meeting included:

- Council endorsed the specifications of plant purchases to be purchased within budgetary constraints set in the 2016/17 budget.
- Council endorsed the selection criteria for the Newdegate Parks and Gardens Contract.
- Council approved the development approval subject to conditions and advice notes for a proposed transportable addition to existing house on Lot 3024 (No 6223) Mallee Road, Dunn Rock.
- Council endorsed the waiver of fees associated with the hire of the Lake King Community Hall by the Lake King Primary School with conditions.
- Council agreed to consider the appointment of a heritage architect to inspect suspected structural defects at the AIM Hospital Museum during 2017/18 budget deliberations.
- Ward Review Council are to recommend to the Local Government Advisory Board to maintain the number of offices of councillor on the Council at nine (9) and an order be made to remove all wards.
- Council endorsed the Shire of Lake Grace Strategic Resource Plan 2016 – 2031.
- Council adopted the Statutory Compliance Return 1 January 2016 to 31 December 2016 for the Shire of Lake Grace.

Hay Stack Fires

The Shire advise that there has been at least 3 fires across the region in hay stacks over the last week or so with the last one east of Narrogin destroying 4000 large rectangular bales of hay.

The cause is believed to spontaneous combustion due to the hay getting wet in recent rains.

People who have large amounts of hay stored in the open keep a close eye on the stack for any signs of heat build-up and take appropriate action before a fire occurs.

Blaze Aid in Lake King

Following the February flood in the south east of our shire (approximately 25% affected) we were contacted by Graham Jacobs on Friday 3rd March, informing us that BlazeAid was offering assistance to affected farmers in the Shire.

It was necessary to act fast so an SMS was sent and a register was set up at the Shire. By Tuesday, 14 requests for assistance were logged, the BlazeAid co-ordinators were informed and began their preparation to locate to Lake King as their base.

On the 14th March Ed and Judy, the BlazeAid coordinators stopped in Lake Grace to drop off forms and posters and phoned ahead that they were requiring a place for themselves and the volunteers to park their vans, shower, gather for their meals/prepare meals/brief teams on the days' work etc. It was essential that they had an area on their own, not with holiday makers, as they could be a bit disruptive.

The only suitable place was the pavilion as it ticked all the boxes, but we didn't have time to book and there were a couple of other activities that were earmarked to occur (cement work and court resurfacing), but it was decided that we could work around them. The BlazeAid team were happy to clean up after the summer recess and the dust etc that accumulates after months of non-use

We have had a mainly positive response to the BlazeAid volunteers assisting our local farmers, some even donating meat, money etc knowing it's going to a good cause.

A Man of Vision (cont.)

O'Connor is best known for his work on the Goldfields Water Supply Scheme, also known as the *Goldfields Pipeline*. This pipeline — perhaps the world's longest water main — carries water 330 miles (530 km) from Perth to Kalgoorlie. A succession of gold rushes in the Yilgarn region near Southern Cross in 1887, at Coolgardie in 1892, and at Kalgoorlie in 1893 caused a population explosion in the barren and dry desert centre of Western Australia, exemplified by towns like Cunderdin and Merredin.

On 16 July 1896, John Forrest introduced to Western Australian Parliament a bill to authorise the raising of a loan of £2.5 million to construct the scheme. The pipeline would pump 5 million imperial gallons (23,000 m³) of water per day to the Goldfields from a dam on the Helena River near Mundaring Weir in Perth, pumped in eight successive stages through 330 miles (530 km) of 30 inch (760 mm) diameter pipe to the Mount Charlotte Reservoir in Kalgoorlie. The water is then reticulated to various mining centres in the Goldfields. The lake created by Mundaring Weir is now known as *Lake O'Connor*, and still provides drinking water for the towns along the pipeline to Kalgoorlie.

O'Connor was subjected to prolonged criticism by members of the press and also many members of the Western Australian Parliament over the scheme. John Forrest, always a supporter, had left Western Australian politics to become federal defence minister; defamatory attacks by the press had wounded him.

If you think you've got a fair bit on your plate spare a thought for O'Connor who was also engineer-in-chief and acting general manager of railways in Western Australia. Upgrades of existing lines and plans for new lines were made. The search for water for the Northam-Southern Cross route was initiated by O'Connor.

O'Connor took his own life on 10 March 1902, less than a year before Forrest officially commissioned the Goldfields Water Supply Scheme, by shooting himself while riding his horse into the water at Robb Jetty, south of Fremantle.

Farmers Maintain Access to Popular Insecticide Dimethoate

Media Release

Australian farmers will continue to have access to a popular insecticide following a decision from the Australian Pesticides and Veterinary Medicines Authority (APVMA) that confirms dimethoate is safe and effective to use on a number of agricultural crops.

The APVMA decision follows a thirteen year reconsideration of the insecticide, which commenced in 2004 to confirm the safe use of dimethoate and that possible exposure to its residues in food is within safe limits.

APVMA Executive Director, Scientific Assessment and Chemical Review, Dr Jason Lutze, says that the findings on dimethoate are a result of extensive engagement with industry, over a number of years, which has provided the evidence required to allow a number of uses to be maintained.

"Farmers can still use dimethoate on avocado, cereal, citrus, cotton, mango, peanut and pulse crops, and the amended labels outline new instructions that will protect the health of workers," Dr Lutze said.

"A number of these uses would not have been possible had we made a final decision in 2011."

The APVMA took interim regulatory action to suspend the use of dimethoate on many food crops and in the home garden in 2011 following advice that residue levels could exceed the recommended public health standard.

"Since the suspension, we've undertaken significant engagement with industry that included numerous calls for data," Dr Lutze said.

"People have had time to generate that data, to consider the possibility that particular uses would be removed indefinitely and the opportunity to adjust their agricultural practice."

The final regulatory decision restricts the use of dimethoate in oilseed and fodder crops, and removes approval to use dimethoate in the home garden, on some tropical fruit crops and some vegetables where there is insufficient data to confirm these uses are safe.



Farmers Maintain Access to Popular Insecticide Dimethoate (Cont.)

The full details of the regulatory decision, including a list of crop uses that are being retained, removed or amended are available from www.apvma.gov.au/dimethoate.

A number of alternative registered chemicals are available for many of the uses that have been removed.

The new labels approved by the APVMA include only those uses that have been confirmed as safe and also include amended safety directions and re-entry instructions to protect workers.

Retailers can continue to sell existing agricultural products with the old labels for a period of 24 months and farmers are encouraged to use up existing stock during the phase out period.

From 6 March 2019 all agricultural products containing dimethoate that are sold in Australia must have the new

approved labels.

Bush Tucker Plant - Wongup / Quandong

Wheatbeltnrm.org.au

The Wongup is also known as Quandong and is a unique native fruiting tree that grows up to 7m.

It is a hemiparasitic plant; attaching to the roots of another plant and using it as a water and nutrient source. One plant can attach to a number of host plants for survival.

Wongup trees can also tolerate high soil salinity and can frequently be seen on the fringes of salt lakes. Trees typically grow 2 to 3 metres in height, with a dense crown of leathery leaves perhaps 2 metres wide.

Wongup grow in a wide variety of soils including white, grey, yellow-brown or red sand, clay loams, and landforms including coastal dunes, gravelly plains, granitic outcrops and creek beds and lake margins.

The small flowers are green-white to red-brown, and occur during January to April, or July to September, or November to December.

The round fruit range in colour from yellow, pink to deep shiny red and have a distinctive tart flavour which can be sweetened with sugar or honey. The flesh is high in vitamin C, and low in sugar.

Noongar uses

- Traditionally Noongar people would eat the succulent bright red fruits raw or dry it out to store for later use.
- The roots have edible suckers that are juicy and succulent with a bitter or sweet taste.
- Wongup flowers were also soaked in water to make a sweet drink.
- Wood was used by Noongar for shields, after which families would return to eat the raw, sweet gum that oozed from the wounded tree.
- Removing the outer peel uncovers a kernel which can be cracked open to reveal the nut, which is then roasted and eaten.
- The seeds contain oil which can be used for skin moisturising and treating skin sores. Just grind the seeds into a paste and add water.
- The fruit makes a tasty snack and can be made into pies, jams and jellies jams and preserves.

Cultivation

Propagation and cultivation has been considered difficult. Seed has a dormancy that is strongest in fresh seeds

Gardening Gurus in Lake Grace

Anyone who gets a water account has been receiving advice from the Water Corporation about how to reduce his or her water use. With over 40% of household water used in the garden, our outdoor lifestyle has come under the microscope with plenty of advice on reticulation, plant types and garden planning that could help reduce water usage and therefore our water accounts.

The Beyond Gardens team will be in Lake Grace this Saturday 1st April, speaking from 3:30pm to 5:30pm at the Lake Grace Community Resource Centre. The team have a wide variety of expertise ranging from planting types, planning, and reticulation through to plant health.

In 2011 the Beyond Gardens crew came and planted the garden in front of the Lake Grace Library and CRC; 55 varieties were planted some of which were considered 'out there' for this area. Of the 55 varieties, 19 have decided for one reason or another that Lake Grace wasn't the place for them. The others have flourished and a couple of new varieties have been brought in. The garden is a fantastic example of what flourishes in Lake Grace on a garden bed of building sand (with a base of clay) while receiving full exposure

to the sun, wind and frost; with watering kept to the recommended amount.

A big thank you to Annie Slarke and Elsie Bishop who have helped Chloe Robertson update the CRC/Library garden map. This map, with a full list of the plantings, will be available on Saturday for anyone wanting to access a list of native plants suitable for growing in Lake Grace.

What We Do At The Community Resource Centre

Centrelink: The CRC is an access point for Centrelink, which means we can photocopy and verify your original documents; fax 'stuff' for you or help you access forms whether it be from the supply we have on hand or through the internet. We also have a phone that customers can use to call the Call Centre and will be getting a computer solely for Centrelink use.

ATO: We are also an access point for the Australian Taxation Office. We have a supply of their forms on hand (or can download them), can help you apply for an ABN over the internet or can give you free access to a computer so that you can complete your tax return online.

Government Computer: As part of its contract the CRC has a computer available, free of charge, for anyone needing to access state (WA) government websites.

Computer Training: We have in house training for Beginners, Excel, Word (Beginners & Intermediate), Publisher, Outlook, Internet, Social Media and Digital Photos. If the interest is there we can also source trainers to provide other IT training. We also provide one on one training at the CRC.

Other Training: The CRC also sources training workshops for Skippers Tickets, Chemcert, Forklift, Chainsaw & MC Assessment. These courses are reliant on the needs and wishes of the local community.

Photo Printing: Glossy photos of 4" x 6" (standard) and 6" x 8" are able to be printed on the photo booth.

Scanning: The CRC has an excellent scanner that can scan negatives, slides, photographs and documents. These can then be burned to a CD or DVD and/or printed. We also have a scanner that can convert a scanned document into word text, or we can scan a multipage document into a single pdf document.

Photocopying: We can photocopy anything up to A3 (twice the size of this page) in both black and white and colour. Items can be increased in size or decreased (very handy for the crafty people).

Printing: The CRC has a wide format printer than can print up to A0 (841mm x 1189mm) as well as banners on a variety of mediums. Can also print on canvas.

Passport & ID Photos: The CRC is able to take and process your passport or ID photos.

Dubbing & Converting: We can convert your videos to DVD.

Digital Photos: If you need some photos taken (within Lake Grace boundary) we can take them and either burn to CD/DVD, print or email. If you are a keen photographer but don't have your own computer we can download the images for you and put them onto a DVD for you. We also have mounts for using when

framing your photographs (have a good selection of colours).

Card / Paper etc: We have a selection of coloured paper and card (of varying thicknesses) in both A4 and A3 available, plus a variety of labels (we can also print your labels for you).

Desktop Publishing: CRC staff can create pretty much anything you want in the way of posters, leaflets, booklets and banners. Whether it's a birthday invite or a birth announcement to a thank you card or calendar we are able to create it for you.

Secretarial Services: Want a letter or some minutes typed up? The CRC can do that, they will even attend meetings and take minutes if needed.

Equipment Hire: We have an amplifier, digital projector, screen and whiteboard available for hire.

Venue Hire: The fully ac/heated seminar room, with interactive whiteboard, widescreen TV, DVD & video players and wireless internet is available for hire.

Computer Use: The CRC has five computers available for public use; they are all installed with Windows 10 and Office 2016. Computers can be hired individually or the computer area can be hired in it's entirety for an hour or a day by any organisation.

Faxing: Are able to fax any documents, locally and internationally.

Email: Need an email sent but don't have a computer or email account, we can do that for you.

Memberships: Are a very economical way to have unlimited access to the internet. Members also receive reduced rates for photocopying, printing, desktop publishing, hire of equipment plus more.

Community Newspaper: Most importantly the CRC edits, prints and collates the Lakes Link News; a vital source of information for the community of Lake Grace.

Licensing: The CRC conducts the theory testing for drivers licenses.

Videoconferencing: The CRC has videoconferencing available.

TAFE: A variety of TAFE brochures are available at the CRC for a wide variety of studies that are available; from nursing and office studies through to horticulture and agriculture.

Lake Grace Calendars: Toward the end of each year the CRC creates calendars using local photographs. Ideal as Christmas gifts. We also put together personalised calendars.

Roadwise and LCDC (Land Conservation District Committee): The CRC has partnerships with both of these organisations.
