## Profit Before Community

The lovely art deco building signifying the home of Westpac will become a part of history as the bank has decided to remove their branch from Lake Grace. It could be a cost cutting measure, but with Westpac declaring a full year cash profit of 7.82 billion dollars in November last year (a rise of 3 percent from the previous year) you would have to wonder how much money is enough.

With a golden return of 6.06%pa on investment, Westpac shares are providing a generous dividend for their shareholders, far more generous than the interest rate of 2.4% that they offer to anyone wanting to put a term deposit on for 6-7 months. It is little wonder that the share holder is king while the average joe with a couple of accounts and a credit card is of little

importance.

In his 'Dear John' letter sent to some account holders, Regional General Manager, Ken Luehman puts the reasoning squarely at the feet of the consumer; we have chosen to bank differently. He states that only 5% of customer transactions take place over-the-counter. So what. I'm sure the staff are busy doing other behind the scenes stuff. In this era of technology it wouldn't matter if Lake Grace staff were processing a bank loan for a customer in Perth; it works both ways.

Modern technology has given bank customers the ability to do a lot of transactions online; this technology has been embraced by banks who have then eagerly foisted it onto their customers.

## Preparing for the new Association law

Associations and clubs will see great change this year with the commencement of the *Associations Incorporation Act 2015* on 1 July 2016. The Department of Commerce is committed to raising awareness about the new law and has released some new resources to help associations and clubs understand their future obligations.

## Transition pack 1 is now available.

The first new law Transition Pack is now available online and includes information about:

- changes to make when the new law commences;
- what your association's financial reporting tier will be; and
- transitional requirements to update the rules.

We encourage all associations to circulate this information to all committee members – or maybe even your whole membership!

## Presentation video

A copy of our information session - **Making the Change: Introduction to the *Associations Incorporation Act 2015*** is now available to watch online. This 45 minute presentation provides information about:

- how the new laws will impact existing incorporated associations;
- key changes to committee responsibilities;
- the prescribed model rules; and
- the process for updating an association's rules during the 3 year transition period.

## Letter To The Editor

### THE NATIONALS STAND THEIR GROUND ON THE FREMANTLE PORT

I must applaud the WA National Party for their non supportive stance on the privatisation of the Port of Fremantle which includes the outer harbour encompassing Cockburn Sound and the CBH ship loading facility at Kwinana.

With the lack of information about the proposed port sale provided to the Nationals' by their partners in government, the Liberal Party and with the Brookfield rail shambles which has left all of the tier three rail lines closed in the Wheatbelt of WA fresh in everyone's mind, the Nationals cautious approach is timely.

Amendments to the Brookfield rail lease agreement were allowed by the Liberal Party in 2010 whereby changes made were no longer required to go to Cabinet thus eliminating the Nationals from scrutiny of the changes. This allowed Brookfield to close the lines to other users such as CBH until a usage fee was agreed upon and which is still in process. The result of this is the cost of thousands of dollars in freight charges for farmers who used the tier three rail network.

The premier Colin Barnett has already threatened to trim back the annual amount of Royalties for Regions (RfR) funding for regional Western Australia. Obviously

a payback to the Nationals who initiated Royalties for Regions for their refusal to support the government enabling legislation for the privatisation of Fremantle Port .

Royalties for Regions has delivered some 8 billion dollars to regional WA since its' inception in 2008. Projects such as rural housing, regional hospital and medical service upgrades, mobile phone stations, local Community Resource Centres, marinas at small coastal towns and many other small grants for regional sporting and cultural groups etc, which has alleviated the need for large fundraising efforts in small rural towns.

This leads to the question of the Nationals ability to preserve RfR in a climate of diminishing regional Lower House (Legislative Assembly) representation as has occurred recently with the amalgamation of the Wagin and Eyre Electorates into the new seat of Roe. Roe will now extend and include the shire of Williams all the way to Cape Arid National Park, some 150 kilometres East of Esperance. Some shires such as Jerramungup (to Albany) , Mount Barker (to Warren Blackwood), Kondinin (to Central Wheatbelt) and Pingelly-Brookton (to Central Wheatbelt) have moved out of the original Wagin/Eyre electorate areas.

The Nationals member for Wagin Tuck (Terry) Waldron is retiring at the next state election due in March 2017 and the current member for Eyre, Liberal Graham Jacobs will be contesting the new seat of Roe. The Nationals have endorsed Peter Rundle from Katanning as their candidate for Roe and he will be running against Liberal Graham Jacobs.

The contest for Roe will be very close after analysing previous election numbers and I consider that it is very important for all electors in Roe to bear in mind the safe preservation of RfR funding when they cast their votes next year.

# The 11 Levels of Irish Rain

The Irish have a large number of words for rain. And knowing exactly which word or phrase to apply at any time can be tricky – especially for newcomers.

With this in mind, we have prepared this scientific ordering, which we're calling the Fliuch Scale. (It works like the Richter – so "I heard today was a 6.7 on the Fliuch Scale" and so on).

We're hoping it will be adopted officially by Met Éireann in the near future. But until then: yes, the rain in Ireland goes up to 11.

## Level 1: Grand soft day (thank God)

**How to spot:** Grey out, just a thick mist, not too cold, might rain later. In other words, conditions are normal.

## Level 2: Spitting (or 'only spitting')

**How to spot:** Definitely raining, but sure it might clear up. It wouldn't stop you nipping to the shops/going for a walk/having a picnic on a freezing beach on a family holiday, anyway.

## Level 3: Wetting rain

**How to spot:** Looks deceptively innocuous – you'd think it was no more than a mist – but soaks through clothing and makes you screw up your face in an unattractive way while walking through it.

Is it worth taking an umbrella? Maybe, but you'll only have to carry it round.

## Level 4: Rotten

**How to spot:** All-over greyness. Possible windiness. Unrelenting rain that never turns into a good honest downpour, but is definitely umbrella material. The weather equivalent of a sulking teenager.

## Level 5: P\*ssing

**How to spot:** Heavy-ish rain. Would definitely make you think twice about going into town for a few things. Windscreen wipers up to the second setting in the car.

## Level 6: Raining stair rods

**How to spot:** Big, fat rain that really means it. Minor-league umbrellas (ie those €4 ones from Centra) may struggle. You have your good shoes ruined.

## Level 7: Bucketing

**How to spot:** Heavy rain with a surprise element: "It started bucketing down." Generally appears when you have planned some kind of outdoor activity.

You might sit in the car for a while to see will it ease off. It probably won't.

## Level 8: Hooring

**How to spot:** Windscreen wipers up to full. People scurrying between shop doorways. Someone probably

holding a newspaper over their head, which is completely pointless and will ruin your newspaper.

## Level 9: Pelting down

**How to spot:** Serious quantities of water falling from the sky. Enough of a conversation point that you will almost certainly compare damp patches with at least one work colleague. Lift dialogues will go like this: "Jaysus, the weather." "I know, Jaysus."

## Level 10: Lashing

**How to spot:** Rain actually bouncing off the ground. Even medium-quality umbrellas are no protection. Their corpses lie strewn around the city streets.

## Level 11: Hammering

**How to spot:** Even the Irish a bit taken aback by the force of it. People talk about it in hushed tones and you can see them struggling for a big enough word: "It's absolutely lashing... no, I mean REALLY lashing... HAMMERING down."



# Lake Grace Girl Receives Excellence Award

Since 1999 Alberta Canada has recognised the cream of their nurses with the CARNA (College & Association of Registered Nurses of Alberta) awards. On March 17th at Edmonton, Alberta, Canada a former student of Lake Grace District High School was the recipient of the 2016 CARNA award for excellence in administration.

Emma Folz (nee Marshall) received the award for her role as patient care manager of the paediatric and neonatal intensive care units at the Calgary children's hospital in Alberta, Canada.

Emma Folz (Marshall) BScN, MA, RN grew up on the family farm north of Lake Grace. Educated firstly at Lake Grace DHS and then at Methodist Ladies College in Perth she went on to study nursing at Curtin University.

***“Growing up in that environment gave me an appreciation for the cycle of and fragility of life and of how many different systems interplay to create health ... From a young age, what I wanted to do most was simply to help people and nursing was an obvious choice to do that.”***

Following her graduation Emma worked at Princess Margaret Hospital, specialising in paediatric child care. She then travelled to London and worked at various children's hospitals in the UK and Toronto, Canada where she married John-Paul Folz.

After years in clinical care and clinical education, Emma applied for an assistant manager position at the Alberta Children's Hospital paediatric intensive care unit (PICU) and developed an incredible passion for the role. Shortly thereafter, she became manager and later patient care manager for PICU, the neonatal intensive care unit and the neonatal follow-up clinic.

***“The moment that PICU staff reaches these patients and their families, we go from being complete strangers to becoming the most important people in their lives.”***

Emma developed a PICU website with evidence-based data to help guide practice and recently added information from Alberta Children's Hospital Nuclear Medicine and Oncology departments as well.

Members of the nursing profession and patient families cite Emma Folz as an advocate for common sense, clarity and compassion. Staff also get involved in management team retreats, holiday parties, BBQs and the PICU tea-time ritual Emma initiated when the new Alberta Children's Hospital site opened.

***“It doesn't matter if you are the housekeeper or the senior leader of the hospital, you have a name, a story and a specific role that you should be respected for.”***

Emma has created a healthy workplace and a culture where all staff can be challenged in positive ways and participate in all aspects of the unit's daily functions. Her skills in processes of evaluation and adaptation have kept her team wanting to come to work and stay to work.

***“Doing what is right is not as easy as it sounds. So many forces can work against it. But I have learned from our patients, families and colleagues that the human spirit is stronger and more resilient than anything I have ever encountered.”***

In accepting the award Emma reflected on how fortunate she was to work at the Alberta Children's Hospital and that her team was an integral part in her success. “It is a place, like many other health care settings, that allows me the privilege to participate in some of life's greatest triumphs and tragedies”, said Emma.

Emma and JP have two sons and a daughter.

# New Ambulance Sub Centre Project Breaks Ground

Our hard working Ambo's and Firies are all volunteers and I can only imagine how upsetting it must be for these fantastic people to have to see the loss of life of people they've known for decades. Please take care.

If anyone you don't like the look of knocks on your door, keep the fly screen closed and ask for some ID. No ID no entry. Simple. No crimes have been reported in relation to this but it pays to be vigilant given the amount of traffic we get from the Esperance rat run. 

# BlazeAid Volunteers

***Not just helping rebuild fences, but helping rebuild lives.***

**BlazeAid** is a volunteer-based organization that works with families and individuals in rural Australia after natural disasters such as fires and floods. Working alongside the rural families, their volunteers help to rebuild fences and other structures that have been damaged or destroyed.

Equally important, volunteers also help to lift the spirits of people who are often facing their second or third flood event after years of drought, or devastating losses through bushfires. BlazeAid volunteers work in a disaster-affected area for many months, not only helping individuals and families, but also helping rebuild the local communities.

**The BlazeAid Story:** Out of the ashes of Black Saturday 2009 came an urgent need for fences to be rebuilt and communities restored.

Kilmore East farmers, Kevin and Rhonda Butler, were among those whose fences were burnt. Needing to quickly secure their 1,500 sheep, they sought assistance from family, friends and local volunteers to help rebuild their fences.

Within a week, the fences were completed – a task that would have taken them months to do on their own. Grateful for the assistance they received, Rhonda and Kevin decided to try to help a few others with their fencing.

Thus, BlazeAid was born.

## **A historical overview:**

**Since the devastation of the Black Saturday bushfires on 8th February 2009**, thousands of long- and short-term BlazeAid volunteers have come to help rebuild fences for bushfire survivors. Their volunteers have come from all parts of Australia, as well as New Zealand, Switzerland, England, Afghanistan, Canada, Germany, Austria, America and France.

Working tirelessly but cheerfully alongside the bushfire survivors, they have rebuilt over 400km of fences in areas including Kilmore East, Kinglake, Kinglake West, Pheasant Creek, St Andrews, Strathewen, Flowerdale, Wandong, Mt Disappointment, Glenburn, Murrumbidgee and Clonbinane. In addition, they've helped to remove hundreds of kilometres of damaged fencing, removed fallen trees from fence-lines, helped with gardening projects, and even built the odd chook shed or two.

By lending a hand in true Aussie style, BlazeAid volunteers have not only built fences, but helped to restore the spirits of fire survivors who lost family and

friends, pets, stock, homes and property to the inferno. The survivors who were assisted were extremely grateful for the work, support and friendship of BlazeAid's volunteers.

## **After the floods of 2011 and Cyclone Yasi ...**

BlazeAid completed flood and cyclone reconstruction work in Victoria, NSW, Qld and WA. Their volunteers came from far and wide and worked for many months to restore the fences and the properties of 577 rural families.

Volunteers worked in flood affected areas in Victoria at Bridgewater, (near Bendigo,) and at Charlton. In northern NSW BlazeAid volunteers were at Tenterfield and in southern Queensland at Toowoomba, Stanthorpe, Warwick, Chinchilla, Texas and Mt Tyson. Following the devastation of cyclone Yasi in northern Queensland their teams were at Tully, Murgon and Ficks Crossing. They also had teams working in the Carnarvon Junction area of WA.

Much was achieved after the disasters struck with 2,224 volunteers working from the basecamps. The teams of BlazeAid volunteers worked a total of 13,548 days, cleaning up 914km of damaged fencing and rebuilt 718km. In the Tully area much work was done clearing fallen timber and trees in paddocks. Many other smaller jobs were tackled which relied on the initiative and skills of the volunteers.

**The 2012 Floods...** Once again, BlazeAid volunteers worked with flood-affected families – this time at Bribbarree, Narrandera, Ungarie and Wagga Wagga in NSW and Dunkeld, QLD.

Over 866km of fencing was removed or cleared of debris, with a further 679km of fencing rebuilt. This was achieved by 811 volunteers across the five basecamps. Collectively, they completed 7,907 days of work on 176 rural properties. Many volunteers had previously been to a BlazeAid basecamp, while others were new volunteers.

**In 2013 bushfires and floods** devastated the eastern states of Australia. In Tasmania, Victoria and NSW, BlazeAid volunteers worked alongside bushfire-affected families from 6 basecamps (Hamilton and Sorrell, Tas, Maffra/Heyfield, Vic, Bookham, Coonabarabran and Nimmitabel, NSW). They had a further 8 basecamps in Queensland, where they worked with rural families who were affected by major flooding – Mundubbera, Monto, Murgon, Biggenden, Gin Gin, Dululu, Mulgowie/Laidley and Junction View.

A total of 3,500 volunteers helped 810 rural families in 2013, doing over 29,600 days of work. They cleared approx. 1,350km of damaged fencing and rebuilt 1,460km.

### Drainage Proposal – Lake Grace Town Site

Council considered a request from Mr Arthur Slarke in regard to a proposal to address increasing salinity of his property to the south of the Lake Grace Townsite and adjoining properties in the light industrial area. It was agreed that the contributing factors are complex, as identified in the Rural Towns – Liquid Assets Study of 2005 and subsequent GHD Studies undertaken as a result of the 2006 flooding event.

Council resolved to consider the upgrade of the Slarke Street culvert to accommodate a one in 25 year flood event and further authorised the Chief Executive Officer to meet with Mr Slarke and relevant government agencies to discuss how best to address the issue and determine what, if any, additional Shire involvement is appropriate.

### Others items on the Agenda for consideration by Council were:

- 2015/16 Roads to Recovery Program – Council resolved to add eight road reconstruction/re-sheeting projects to the Shire's 2015/16 Works Program in connection with additional funding from Commonwealth's Roads to Recovery Program.
- The introduction of Bulk Recycling Bins – Council endorsed bulk bin recycling for the townsite of Lake Grace and will determine an appropriate fee in its upcoming 2016/17 Budget deliberations. A similar service for the Newdegate townsite will also be considered at this time.
- 2015/16 Budget Review – Council adopted the Budget Review conducted for the eight months ended 29 February 2016, and notwithstanding overruns in regard to the Newdegate Independent Living Units, it is confident of meeting its budgetary obligations by the end of this financial year.
- Endorsement of a \$214,549 funding application to the Commonwealth's National Stronger Regions Funding Program to complete further works for the Lake Grace Sporting Precinct Redevelopment Project. The Shire's contribution of \$25,000 towards this project will be included in 2016/17 Budget deliberations.

- Lake Grace Saleyards – Council agreed to retain the existing saleyards on the corner of Gorge Rock and Biddy Camm Roads, Lake Grace.
- Wheatbelt Development Commission Board Nomination – Council agreed to nominate Cr Allan Marshall for a position on the Wheatbelt Development Commission Board.
- Committees of Council – As a result of Cr Walker stepping down from his committee obligations, Cr Lloyd was appointed to the Audit Committee, the Newdegate Town Centre Rejuvenation Committee, and the Integrated Planning Asset Management Committee. In addition Cr Stanton was also appointed as a member of the Audit Committee.
- Local Laws – In regards to the Cemeteries

Amendment Local Law 2015, Council resolved to prepare a draft amendment to rectify errors identified by the Joint Standing Committee on Delegated Legislation. Council also resolved to approve the statewide public notice of the Shire of Lake Grace Health Local Law 2016 and the Shire of Lake Grace Animals, Environment and Nuisance Local Law 2016 in order to seek public comment.

Facebook is accessible all over the world so it was quite exciting to receive a message from Jean Holmes in Towcester, Northamptonshire, England who had a link through family to Lake Grace. Jean's grandmother, Edith Allen was a niece of Edith Slarke; Edith along with her husband Charles was one of the first families to settle in Lake Grace.

As was the way the families corresponded with Edith Slarke sending many letters to her niece, enclosing photos of her ever-growing family. Jean has fond memories of her grandmother posting the local paper to her Aunt Edie and of them receiving a large tub of Lake Grace honey following the second world war. Jean's grandmother measured the honey out on the scales to make sure that everyone in the family had the same amount. The honey would have been an absolute treat in post war England which explains why Jean can remember it so well.

The name Edith continues to pop up with Jean welcoming a new granddaughter called Edie! Jean felt that the photographs belonged in Lake Grace and has sent them to the CRC. Along with the photos were two letters; the last one that Edith Slarke sent to her niece where she talks about Queen Elizabeth visiting Australia and coming to Albany. The second letter was from Bluebell Farrell (Edith's daughter) to Edith Allen to break the news that her mother had died. The significance of these two letters explains why they were kept. Along with the letters was a Show Ball programme from 1948, significant because two of Edith's granddaughters, June Slarke and Marie Lay were debutantes.

Per capita Wheatbelt south has the worst ranking in Australia for road safety.

As a group all we can do is continue to educate, pinpoint problems with our roads and take preventative actions such as the Driver Reviver van. A continued point of frustration is that when attending accidents police are finding the victims in a high percentage of cases were not wearing seatbelts.

Seatbelts became part of vehicle manufacture in the 1960's but it wasn't compulsory to wear them until the early 1970's. Although the law has been accepted by the bulk of the population, alcohol and/or drugs influences drivers to make poor decisions.

Road Safety Officer Rodney Thornton ran a snap 5 question quiz at our meeting and the results weren't glowing! We want as many people as possible to take part in the quiz's, the

We're not picking on anyone, just wanting to highlight that your behaviour could be making life difficult or dangerous for someone else. ## BlazeAid Volunteers (cont.)

**Bushfires in 2014** saw basecamps established in Victoria at Laharum, Wandong and Clarkefield and at Palmer/Angaston and Wirrabara, South Australia. Over 830km of fencing was cleared and approx 540km of fencing was rebuilt.

For the first year, they also provided Drought Relief Assistance. Volunteers in the Richmond and Julia Creek areas of Qld worked on a variety of jobs including helping to clean and paint homes and shearers quarters, fixing machinery, looking after children and helping with home-schooling, fencing, clearing yards, etc.

In 2014, almost 1,400 volunteers helped 513 rural families, contributing 14,670 days of work to the local communities.

**In 2016....** BlazeAid currently have six volunteer camps. Hamley Bridge and Roseworthy (Pinnery Fire SA), Grass Patch (Esperance Fires WA), Waroona (Waroona Fire WA), Winton and Julia Creek (Drought Qld).

**Grasspatch Camp:** BlazeAid currently have a camp at Grasspatch, 123 km south of Norseman and 78 km north of Esperance on the Coolgardie-Esperance

Highway, which is winding up in early April. It is set up at the oval with most volunteers set up in their own caravans or motor homes whilst utilizing the hall and its conveniences. Only meals, power and personal protective gear are provided.

# Newdegate Community Crop Donates \$50K to Lake Grace Ambulance Building

The Newdegate Community Crop has donated a very generous \$50,000 towards the St John Ambulance WA Ltd New Lake Grace Sub Centre Project

The Newdegate Community Crop is part of the Newdegate Machinery Field Days incorporated body. It was important that all the correct, due process, was followed to allow the donation to flow to this new building project. ## Profit Before Community (cont.)

Internet banking is fabulous and it certainly has its place, but my computer doesn't give me cash. So many transactions need to be done face-to-face for the consumer to have their needs met.

Lake Grace Westpac covers an enormous area and they have provided a banking service for not just Lake Grace but well beyond. The nearest branches are Narrogin or Katanning; an hour and 20 minutes for those of us in Lake Grace but another hour again for anyone living in Lake King.

Losing the branch means a loss of employment for current staff and a loss of convenience for the community. How do we bank our cash and cheques? Just go to the Post Office says Mr Luehman. Banking is not the Post Office's core business and it is quite limited in what it can do for Westpac customers.

If we elect to keep our Westpac accounts and drive to Narrogin or Katanning, what else do we do while we're there? Do we get new tyres on the car, pop into Target for a few things and grab some groceries from Coles. This all impacts on our community and local businesses who provide us with employment and sponsorship for our sporting groups. What about those who don't have the facility to drive.

So what do we do? Do we fight? We certainly need to complain. As customers the only power we have is to change banks. Is Westpac relying on us being too complacent and not bothering? I'd say they are.

The finality of Westpac's decision is disheartening, there has been no effort at compromise with the offer of reduced opening hours or days. Eight years ago Westpac extended their hours in Lake Grace to what they are now. This followed a public backlash after they had previously reduced their hours. Perhaps the executioners block was our reward.

Bankwest will be the only cash transaction bank in the district. If Westpac continue on their plan of retreating from the region then it will be important to support our one remaining bank.

Friday June 10th is the last day of business for Westpac Lake Grace.
