Black Diggers Westlink telecast

Residents in regional Western Australia will have the opportunity to see a telecast of *Black Diggers*, one of the theatrical highlights from this year's Perth International Arts Festival.

Through a series of vignettes, the cast of male actors tell of the hundreds of dispossessed Aboriginal soldiers who heard the call to arms and stepped up to fight for Australia on the battlefields of Europe.

Drawing from interviews with the families of these soldiers, as well as conversations with veterans, historians and academics, the production tells a story of honour and sacrifice, with a lightness of touch and an Aussie-larrikin attitude.

By turns witty, moving and enlightening, it is an important part of the 2015 Anzac Centenary commemorations.

Black Diggers is a co-production between the Queensland Theatre company and the Sydney Festival, and was written by Tim Wright and Directed by Wesley Enoch.

Black Diggers will be telecast via Westlink on Friday 24 April and 7.30pm.

Sensational Food at the CRC

Food Sensations is a practical nutrition education initiative which has been developed for Foodbank WA's school and community networks. Running for the second time at the Lake Grace Community Resource Centre it is a fun programme operating over four weeks with each session running for 2 hours.

The sessions are interactive, utilising the video conferencing facilities between the centres taking part and Foodbank in Perth where dieticians and the Food Sensations coordinator are on hand to cover a range of nutrition principles. The programme focuses on providing skills to choose and prepare healthy foods through practical interactive workshops.

The four sessions cover the healthy eating pyramid, serving sizes, sugar in drinks, diabetes, homemade versus takeaway foods and how to read and understand food labels. Following each learning session the group then cooks a healthy meal from the recipes and books provided to share amongst themselves.

After having a group of ten take part in the workshop in 2014, the CRC elected to run the series again this year. Currently there are four taking part; this is the beauty of distance education via video conference in that the numbers needed to run the workshop aren't so stringent as if a trainer had to travel. Joining Lake Grace in the series were the Kellerberrin and Pingrup CRC's; all three of the CRC's and Foodbank in Perth were able to see each other on the screen.

All who take part enjoy the experience and although aware of the fat, sugar and salt content in fast food and soft drink are quite horrified when they realise exactly how much they're ingesting if they treat themselves to a Whopper and a Thick Shake.

The cooking is fun and it's wonderful to see what a wide range of tasty but nutritious recipes are available that don't bust the budget, use ingredients that are in your pantry and aren't time consuming to prepare. John Toohey - An Illustrious Life

Accolades followed John Toohey throughout his illustrious career in the field of law, but the resounding comments that have come forth since his passing on the 9th April at the age of 85 are what a decent person he was, seeming to have gained the respect of everyone he came into contact with.

Born on March 4th 1930 at Miss Harvey's in Bulwer Street Perth, John was the first child for Les and Sylvia Toohey (nee Featherstone). The Toohey family grew to include another son and two daughters.

Around 1935/36 the family moved to Meekatharra, from there they moved to Lake Grace taking up the lease of the Lake Grace Hotel in 1937.

John received his primary school education at the Lake Grace school but as there was no high school he was enrolled in St Louis, a Jesuit school in Claremont (now John XXIII College) where he became a boarder. In 1942 the Carter family returned to Lake Grace to take over the Hotel lease and the Toohey family then relocated to Perth.

He was beginning to think about a career in law with a particular interest in humanities. Following the receipt of good matriculation scores John enrolled in a law

course in 1947, graduating in 1950 with First Class Honours (he was the only one out of a class of 18 to be awarded this). He won the Frank Parsons prize for the most outstanding graduate and the HCF Keall prize for the best 4th year student. In those days the students were required to attend lectures in gowns.

Some students were supported by their parents, many worked part time at weekends. John supported himself by working in the holidays; employment included shovelling coal at the East Perth Power House and at Robbs Jetty Abattoir. The jobs were well paid and he enjoyed the physical work.

After completing his law degree, Toohey commenced his articles of clerkship at the Perth law firm Lavan & Walsh; and was admitted as a legal practitioner in 1952. Toohey soon rose to prominence in the WA legal profession, developing expertise in taxation and property law.

He was a Senior Lecturer in Law at UWA from 1957 to 1958, as well as a Visiting Lecturer from 1953 to 1965. In December 1966 Toohey became the 10th member of the WA Bar Association. In 1974 Toohey helped to establish the Port Hedland office of the Aboriginal Legal Service of WA. He served as President of the Western

A Time to Reflect - A Century of ANZAC Tradition

This Saturday, 25th April, it will be time to take a moment and reflect on the century that has passed since Australian men landed on the shores of Gallipoli. Australia's involvement with the war was greeted with enthusiasm, seen as an opportunity for our young men to see the world and show the enemy a thing or two. The reality was a horror that is difficult to comprehend; trench warfare, hand to hand combat and weapons that inflicted such cruel injuries that death would become a blessing.

If Gallipoli wasn't bad enough, the Western Front and the Middle East were to follow. Not only dying on the front, service men and women were succumbing to illness brought on by weather conditions and close living conditions.

For Australia, as for many nations, the First World War remains the most costly conflict in terms of deaths and casualties. From a population of fewer than five million, 416,809 men enlisted, of which over 60,000 were killed and 156,000 wounded, gassed, or taken prisoner.

Many of those healthy, strapping young men who survived, returned as shells of their former selves; scarred physically and mentally.

Lake Grace has 28 WWI veterans on their honour roll, four of these made the ultimate sacrifice.

Early Commemorations

The 25th of April was officially named Anzac Day in 1916. It was marked by a wide variety of ceremonies and services in Australia, a march through London, and a sports day in the Australian camp in Egypt. In London over 2,000 Australian and New Zealand

troops marched through the streets. Marches were held all over Australia; in the Sydney march, convoys of cars carried wounded soldiers from Gallipoli attended by nurses.

During the 1920's Anzac Day became established as a national day of commemoration for the 60,000 Australians who had died during the war. In 1927, for the first time every state observed some form of public holiday on Anzac Day. By the mid-1930's, all the rituals we now associate with the day - dawn vigils, marches, memorial services, reunions, two-up games were firmly established as part of Anzac Day culture.

Anzac Day was first commemorated at the Australian War Memorial in 1942. There were government orders prohibiting large public gatherings in case of a Japanese air attack, so it was a small occasion, with neither a march nor a memorial service. Since then, Anzac Day has been commemorated at the Memorial every year.

A Distinguished War Worker

Mrs Emily Thompson, who, prior to 1896 was a resident of Albany, and is now spending a holiday at the southern port, is one of the very few members in Australia of the 'Order of the British Empire'.

On leaving Albany she went with her husband and sons to Coolgardie. The three sons served in the war, and Mrs Thompson was in London when war broke out. She at once devoted herself to war work, was one of the founders of the Anzac Buffet in 1915, and in 1917 was appointed official Red Cross visitor and distributor of comforts among Australian troops in England. For these services she was honoured.

The insignia of the Order is a Maltese Cross in gold, with purple ribbon, and the inscription reads: "For God and Empire". Mrs Thompson resides at Lake Grace with her eldest son.

Significance of Poppies

The Flanders poppy has long been a part of Remembrance Day, the ritual that marks the Armistice of 11 November 1918, and is also increasingly being used as part of Anzac Day observances.

During the First World War, red poppies were among the first plants to spring up in the devastated battlefields of northern France and Belgium. In soldiers' folklore, the vivid red of the poppy came from the blood of their comrades soaking the ground.

The sight of poppies on the battlefield at Ypres in 1915 moved Lieutenant Colonel John McCrae to write the poem *In Flanders fields*.

In English literature of the nineteenth century, poppies had symbolised sleep or a state of oblivion; in the literature of the First World War a new, more powerful symbolism was attached to the poppy – the sacrifice of shed blood.

How Private is Your Facebook Account?

While we might think our Facebook is perfectly safe and private, Facebook has a tendency to update their privacy settings every few months so it is always a good idea to check that you are not unwittingly sharing things online with a wider audience than your friends and family. Here's a refresher course in making sure your Facebook is on the privacy setting you want.

Who can see your Facebook posts and updates?

1. After you have logged in to Facebook, click the padlocked icon on the upper-right corner of your page. A drop down menu will appear.
2. Click on "Who can see my stuff?"
3. There will be an option for "Who can see my future posts?"
4. There will be two main options – Public (a world symbol) which means all your posts will be seen by anyone on or off Facebook and Friends (two person silhouette) which means only your friends on Facebook can see your post.

Click on Friends so all your posts and update will only

be seen by your Facebook friends.

- 1 To double-check this on your home Facebook page click to update your status. On the bottom right-hand side (next to the post button) you should see "Friends". This means your status update will only be going out to your Facebook friends.

2 Who can contact you?

1. After you have logged in to Facebook, click the padlocked icon on the upper-right corner of your page. A drop down menu will appear.
2. Click on "Who can contact me?"
3. There is an option to change what messages appear in your private inbox on Facebook and "Who can send me a friend request?"
4. You can choose strict filtering system so only Facebook friends can send you private messages.

You can also change your friend request setting from the default "Everyone" (world symbol) to only "Friends of Friends" can send you friend request on Facebook. This will prevent strangers on internet from befriending you.

- 1 However, just remember Facebook is a social networking site and there may be people from your past (for example, old school friends) who are trying to look you up and get in touch. That is one of the wonderful benefits of social media so it is something to consider when changing your options to very private. You could miss out on reconnecting with your best friend from primary school!

2 Updating your status on your smartphone and tablet

- 3 When posting on your Facebook on a device it is now easy to double-check if you are posting to only your Facebook friends.

1. Click on "Status" or "Photo" and at the top you will see box with "To:" (similar to what you will see in an email).

You should see "Friends" with the two person silhouette symbol. If you do not simply click on the arrow on the right-hand side and the option will come up to post to Friends (or the Public if you are so inclined).

Cyber Criminals Attacking WA Computers

Consumer Protection is warning Western Australians about cyber criminals who are infecting computers with ransomware.

The scammers trick computer users into installing malicious software, or malware for short, by encouraging them to open up an attachment in an email or directing the person to a website where the ransomware is unknowingly downloaded.

After the ransomware is installed, victims receive a pop-up message saying they are locked out of their computer and that their files have been encrypted. The scammers ask for payment to unlock the computer and set a deadline for the ransom to be paid.

Consumer Protection has received more than 30 reports of ransomware attacks over the past year.

Recently Consumer Protection was contacted by the owners of a removalist company that was attacked by ransomware after a staff member opened an attachment sent by email. The small business lost several thousand dollars and information about clients before the problem could be rectified.

Commissioner for Consumer Protection Anne Driscoll believes the cases are just the tip of the iceberg as many attacks go unreported.

"Ransomware can be devastating not only to home computer users but small business owners who don't have the time, expertise or resources to deal with the problem," said Ms Driscoll.

"I urge Western Australians not to pay money to cyber criminals if their computers are infected by ransomware as the scammers are likely to come back for more money. Instead, use a different device to search online for a solution or seek help from a local computer technician."

Take measures to prevent ransomware:

- Do not open attachments that could be infected, especially from unknown senders.
- If in doubt about an attachment do not open it, even if it is from someone you know. Their computer or email account could have been hacked.
- Make sure you have up-to-date anti-virus, anti-spyware and firewall software and scan your computer regularly.
- Keep a backup copy of your data in a safe place, disconnected from your computer and the internet.
- Only visit reputable websites and online services.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION FOR DOG OWNERS

From the 1 November 2015 ALL dogs over the age of three months must be microchipped.

Amendments introduced on 1 November 2013 require that all dogs registered for the first time, or dogs that are transferred to a new owner, need to be microchipped. All existing dogs need to be microchipped by 1 November 2015.

Microchips are available through your veterinarian.

You are required by law to register your dog!

Registrations are due on the 1 November each year and can be renewed for one or three years. Lifetime is also now available. Upon paying your dogs registration renewal you must supply a copy of your dogs microchip details. Registrations will not be renewed if your dog is not microchipped.

It is an offence to keep an unregistered dog over the age of three months. The maximum fine is \$5,000. Higher penalties apply if your dog is a dangerous dog.

If your dog is unregistered and impounded, local governments may exercise the right to keep your dog in their pound until both the registration fee and pound fee are paid.

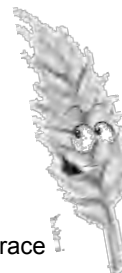

Australian Bar Association (1969-1972) and President of the Law Society of WA (1972-1973).

During the course of his legal career, John was a Justice of the Federal Court, Justice of the Supreme Court of the Northern Territory, Presidential Member of the AAT, inaugural Aboriginal Land Commissioner, Member of the Constitutional Commission, Justice of the High Court of Australia, a judge in the justice system of Kiribati and a Justice of the Supreme Court of Fiji.

Following his retirement from the High Court of Australia he was also one of three independent members of the Bloody Sunday Inquiry.

His peers posted the following:

John was one of Australia's foremost jurists with a sharp legal mind and tremendous wisdom. A man of integrity and compassion, skill and wit, he served as an inspiration to the establishment of John Toohey Chambers, whose members strive to conduct their practices as barristers commensurate with the high standards he set for the practice of law in Western Australia. His contribution to the law and its practice

both in Western Australia and nationally will serve as his professional legacy.

John is survived by his wife Loma, seven children, nine grandchildren and four great grandchildren.

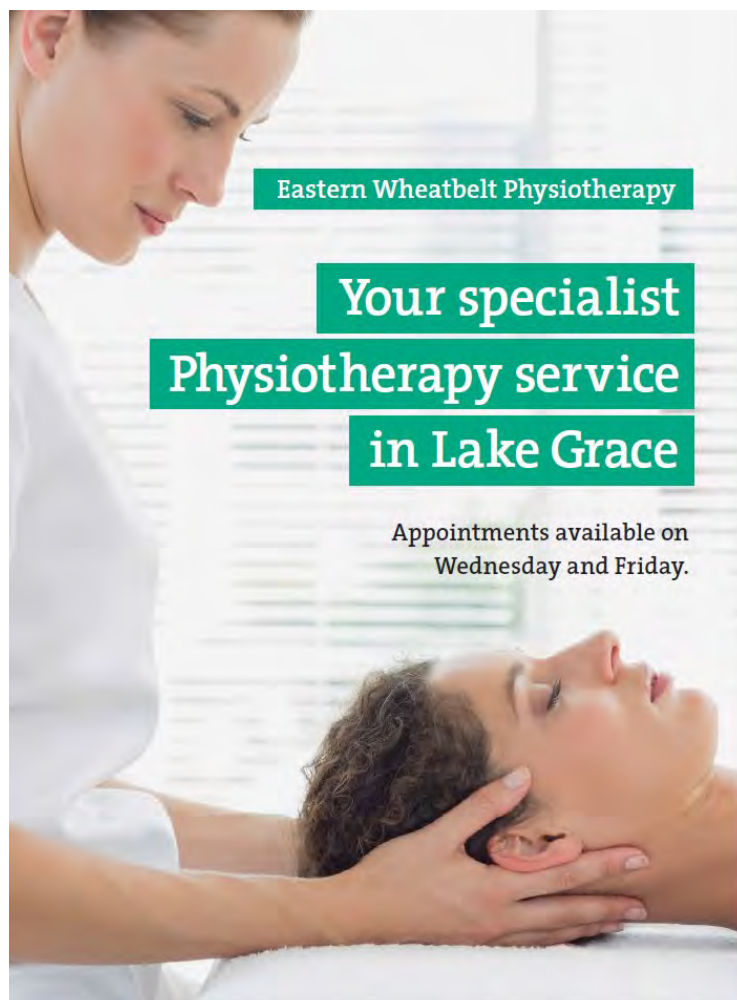

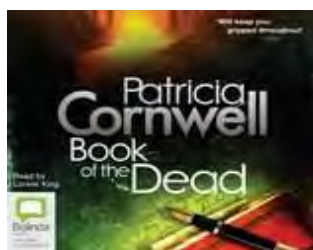
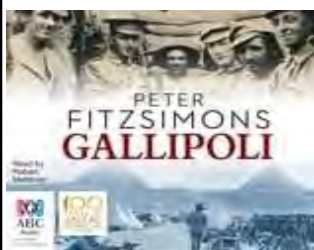

What Do We Do at the Community Resource Centre?

Centrelink: The CRC is an access point for Centrelink, which means we can photocopy and verify your original documents; fax 'stuff' for you or help you access forms whether it be from the supply we have on hand or through the internet. We also have a phone that customers can use to call the Call Centre and will be getting a computer solely for Centrelink use.

ATO: We are also an access point for the Australian Taxation Office. We have a supply of their forms on hand (or can download them), can help you apply for an ABN over the internet or can give you free access to a computer so that you can complete your tax return online.

Seniors Computers: The CRC has two Seniors computers which are available for use FREE OF CHARGE to anyone over 50. FREE assistance is provided for anyone using.

Government Computer: As part of its contract the CRC has a computer available, free of charge, for anyone needing to access state (WA) government websites.

Computer Training: We have in house training for Beginners, Excel, Word (Beginners & Intermediate), Publisher, Outlook, Internet, Social Media and Digital Photos. If the interest is there we can also source trainers to provide other IT training. We also provide one on one training at the CRC.

Other Training: The CRC also sources training workshops for Skippers Tickets, Chemcert, Forklift, Chainsaw & MC Assessment. These courses are reliant on the needs and wishes of the local community.

Photo Printing: Glossy photos of 4" x 6" (standard) and 6" x 8" are able to be printed on the photo booth. The photo booth also prints calendars, images with borders and collages. Other items such as photobooks and giftware are also available but is delivered at a later date.

Scanning: The CRC has an excellent scanner that can scan negatives, slides, photographs and documents. These can then be burned to a CD or DVD and/or printed. We also have a scanner that can convert a scanned document into word text, or we can scan a multipage document into a single pdf document.

Photocopying: We can photocopy anything up to A3 (twice the size of this page) in both black and white and colour. Items can be increased in size or decreased (very handy for the crafty people).

Printing: The CRC has a wide format printer than can print up to A0 (841mm x 1189mm) as well as banners on a variety of mediums. Can also print on canvas.

Passport & ID Photos: The CRC is able to take and process your passport or ID photos.

Dubbing & Converting: We can convert your videos to DVD.

Digital Photos: If you need some photos taken (within Lake Grace boundary) we can take them and either burn to CD/DVD, print or email. If you are a keen

photographer but don't have your own computer we can download the images for you and put them onto a DVD for you. We also have mounts for using when framing your photographs (have a good selection of colours).

Card / Paper etc: We have a selection of coloured paper and card (of varying thicknesses) in both A4 and A3 available, plus a variety of labels (we can also print your labels for you).

Desktop Publishing: CRC staff can create pretty much anything you want in the way of posters, leaflets, booklets and banners. Whether it's a birthday invite or a birth announcement to a thank you card or calendar we are able to create it for you.

Secretarial Services: Want a letter or some minutes typed up? The CRC can do that, they will even attend meetings and take minutes if needed.

Equipment Hire: We have a digital projector, screen and whiteboard available for hire.

Venue Hire: The fully ac/heated seminar room, with interactive whiteboard, widescreen TV, DVD & video players and wireless internet is available for hire.

Computer Use: The CRC has five computers available for public use; they are all installed with Windows 7 and Office 2010. Computers can be hired individually or the computer area can be hired in it's entirety for an hour or a day by any organisation.

Faxing: Are able to fax any documents, locally and internationally.

Email: Need an email sent but don't have a computer or email account, we can do that for you.

Memberships: Are a very economical way to have unlimited access to the internet. Members also receive reduced rates for photocopying, printing, desktop publishing, hire of equipment plus more.

Community Newspaper: Most importantly the CRC edits, prints and collates the Lakes Link News; a vital source of information for the community of Lake Grace.

Rubber Stamps: Need a rubber stamp? The CRC can organise for you, a variety of sizes and colours, self inking or those to be used with a stamp pad.

Licensing: The CRC conducts the theory testing for drivers licenses.

Videoconferencing: The CRC has videoconferencing available.

TAFE: A variety of TAFE brochures are available at the CRC for a wide variety of studies that are available; from nursing and office studies through to horticulture and agriculture.

Lake Grace Calendars: Toward the end of each year the CRC creates calendars using local photographs. Ideal as Christmas gifts. We also put together personalised calendars.

Roadwise and LCDC (Land Conservation District Committee): The CRC has partnerships with both of these organisations.
