It continues to amaze Ed Naisbitt the level of faith in community that people display as they step up to the plate to assist with Catholic parish cropping programme. The cropping programme is in its 6th year and without it, the struggle to finance the Catholic parish would be a constant test.

The change in farming over the decades has eroded the population of the community and therefore affected the number of parishioners. Reduced farmers has reflected in reduced grain donations, the parish was desperate for ways to bring in money to cover the costs.

When the parish finance council were throwing ideas around the Trevenen family mentioned that they had some acreage that could be utilised for cropping. It was a generous offer with the Trevenen's offering the land for no financial reward; however the generosity didn't stop there as Kim Slarke heard about the seeding programme and with a gate between his paddock and Trevenen's he decided he could shoot next door and manage the seeding and harvest.

Growing Up in Lake Grace Part IV

John Dyke

A former resident of Lake Grace, John Dyke was born in King Edward Memorial Hospital in Subiaco, on 24 April 1935, to Noel Frederick Dyke and May Dyke. Dad had gone ahead to Lake Grace as Secretary to the Road Board. They had come to West Australia from Wales, UK, in 1926, paid their own way, and were sent to the South West, south of Bridgetown, to one of the Group Settlements, No's 126 and 127. The whole thing was a complete con between the British and Australian Governments, promising the new settlers a house, good land to cultivate, and the promise that within a few short years, working hard, they would be wealthy enough to return to the UK and have a good holiday. John and his wife Cheryl currently live in Albany. The following is the fourth part in a series detailing some of John's earlier adventures.

One night in 1963 Alec Hillhouse and myself had just commenced duty at 7 pm in CIB headquarters Roe Street, the building with Courthouse etc., on the corner of Beaufort Street. As we were leaving the building two burly detectives came up the stairs with a small hare lipped man. At the end of our shift we found out the man was Eric Edgar Cooke, who over the next couple of days admitted to the murders and many other crimes.

How did we catch Cooke? A few weeks earlier an elderly gentleman was walking his dog in the Esplanade, Mt Pleasant, not far from the Raffles Hotel which was owned by Australia's Mr Big in crime from Sydney, Abe Safron. The dog stopped to relieve himself at a tree and whilst waiting this man noticed something sticking up from the centre of the tree. Upon his inspection he found it was a .22 single shot rifle. He immediately rang the police who quickly established it to be a gun recently reported as having been stolen. With the permission of the home owner above, directly overlooking the tree, CIB detectives set up a tent, suitably camouflage, in the front yard of the property, and for the next 2 to 3 weeks had 2 men on 8 hour shifts watching the tree. At the time the weather was freezing cold and wet. On the particular night I have mentioned, a vehicle pulled up alongside the tree a bit before 7pm and starting to get dark. A small man jumped out of the vehicle, went to the tree and removed the rifle. The waiting detectives were on him in seconds and had him back to CIB headquarters just as Alec and I passed him on the staircase.

When the police arrested Cooke as he was about to retrieve the gun from the fork of the tree, they frisked him and found in one of his pockets a piece of paper with an address on it. Cooke admitted later in an interview that he was going to that address to shoot the girl who was baby sitting. The address never became public, but, we needed the rifle with which Cooke had previously murdered his victims. We needed a ballistics match to prove beyond doubt Cooke did those murders.

After many hours of questioning Cooke admitted to detectives that some weeks earlier, after his last murder, he had stopped his vehicle in the middle of the

'Narrows' freeway traffic bridge on his way home, had taken the rifle from the back seat, walked to the east edge of the bridge and thrown the rifle as far as he could into the cold, murky waters of the Swan River. He took detectives there. With this information the Dive Squad was called to gather on the bridge the following day. So at 8am the next morning we commenced our attempts to recover the gun. After using grappling hooks and large magnets from the bridge - with no success - Detective Sgt Bill Neilson requested Sgt Bill Foster, OIC Dive Squad, to put a search plan together and have the divers go down in pairs to find the gun. Before doing so the decision was made to bring Cooke from Fremantle Prison and throw another similar gun into the river to give the divers a fairly accurate location of where the murder gun was lying.

However when the prison van arrived in the centre of the bridge police decided it was too dangerous to bring Cooke out of the prison van as there were by this time hundreds of people gathered, watching, on the bridge and river banks as word had quickly got around to what was going on. The thought was that the mood of the public was such that to bring Cooke out of the van may cause a riot and God knows what the result may have been. Instead a prison guard, twice the size of Cooke was handed the rifle to throw into the river. With half a dozen police divers waiting in the river the guard threw the rifle. It landed pretty much in the middle of the divers and, although they tried to follow it down, the water was so swiftly flowing, and so dirty with visibility nil, it was a half hour later that this rifle was found.

It was decided to search using two divers at a time operating our Hooker unit for breathing and, using a grid pattern, we would then cover the whole search area. Each diver would hold the hand of the other and we would proceed across the river bed digging into the soft mud of the bed which appeared to have no bottom to it. As soon as a diver touched the mud it flew up into millions of small particles so that visibility for divers was nil.

At 10am the first divers entered the water and by 2 pm we had found nothing. At that point in time not only were there hundreds of people on the bridge and river banks we also had a dozen press photographers sitting waiting, wanting to get a photo of the rifles recovery. Cec Lamb, Chief of the CIB, yelled out in a loud voice when the first divers went into the water "I'll give a bottle of Johnny Walker whisky to the man that finds the rifle".

Kevin Smith and myself were the last two divers to go into the water. I was holding Smithy's right hand with my left. It was about 40 feet deep, the water freezing cold and running very swiftly. As we touched bottom those millions of particles of mud came up and you couldn't see your own nose in your face mask. We moved very slowly across the top of the mud, I was digging as deep as I could with my right arm, about 3 feet. We had travelled about 20 feet, when suddenly without warning my right open hand went straight over

the top of the rear sight of a rifle - not any rifle but the murder weapon. I knew I had it immediately, it fitted my hand as if the Lord himself had placed it there. In the rush of blood to my brain, the unbelievable excitement of knowing Cooke was now going to the gallows. That no smart arsed lawyer would have him off on some legal technicality. I let go of Smithy's hand and rushed for the surface. As I hit the surface with the rifle held high, they say it was like Excalibur coming out of the lake. Photographers scrambling for their cameras, a huge roar from the crowd, and 2 seconds later I am dragged back down into the murky depths as the slack had been taken up between my hooker line and that of Smithy's. As he said after "You bloody near broke my jaw John! I wondered what the hell was happening." We met up about 20 feet under water and I came up again at the rear of the police boat where I handed the rifle to Sgt Cyril McNally, OIC Water Police.

I then went ashore and changed into my casual gear and left the Barrack Street jetty carrying the rifle for a press photo with Det Sgt Neilson. Sgt Bill Foster was waiting, he took the gun from me, raced off to the Ballistics section and within a half hour had a perfect match of the bullets that killed those who Cooke murdered. With the rifle now in police hands, and which I tendered at his trial as the gun that I had retrieved

from the Swan River.

I don't know who got that bottle of Johnny Walker but it wasn't me. I heard a whisper from a mate in the CIB that SO and So had said John won't mind us drinking his whisky; I heard him say only the other night in the Canteen he preferred beer to anything else. Anyway good luck to him as long as he doesn't ask Cec Lamb when is he going to get his whisky when they play squash next week.

Sgt Bill Foster gave me the nickname of 'the man with the Golden Arm'. Any time I went into Ballistics after that one of the guys would call out "Hey Sgt, here comes the man with the Golden Arm". Sounds like a James Bond movie, doesn't it?

Cooke was convicted and hanged in 1964. The last person to be hanged in Western Australia. I see in some States in America they have brought back hanging as they say it is the only way to keep America safe from murderers.

*CEO's Corner***Flooding Event – February 2017**

The Shire received notification from Main Roads WA (MRWA), that our Natural Disaster Relief and Recovery Arrangements cost estimate of \$10,607,882 for AGRN 743 has been approved. This is based on the use of contractors for the re-instatement works for the local roads.

We are now in the process of engaging a Project Manager with the tenders closing on Thursday 13 July 2017. This position was sourced from the WA Local Government Association (WALGA) preferred supplier panel. The tenders will now be assessed and presented to Council to determine the successful Project Manager. Once appointed, the Project Manager will call the required tenders on behalf of the Shire for supervision services, plant, equipment and materials as required.

These tendering processes are required to ensure we are compliant with the provisions of the Local Government Act 1995. It is estimated that the timeframe to undertake these processes will be a minimum of six weeks.

For current road closures please refer to the Shire's website www.lakegrace.wa.gov.au or Facebook page for a list of roads that are closed within the Shire.

AGRN 743 Category C Recovery Grants

Primary producers who have suffered direct damage as a result of the flooding in the Shire's of Lake Grace and Ravensthorpe, are eligible for a grant of up to \$10,000. This grant is to cover costs incurred for the clean-up and immediate restoration as a result of the damage. The grants will not cover loss of income.

The above assistance is managed by the Department of Agriculture and Food (DAFWA) and all claims for Category C Recovery Grants must be lodged with DAFWA before 4 December 2017. Claims which are incomplete or are lodged after this date will not be accepted.

CEO Support Program

The CEO Support Program is a joint initiative of Local Government Professionals Australia WA (LGPA) and the Department of Local Government (DLG) to provide

mentoring and general support to anyone appointed to the position of CEO in a local government for the first time. The program may extend over a period of 6 months from the time of appointment of a new CEO, and aims to provide participants with the opportunity to discuss a wide range of governance and management matters with the LGPA mentor and DLG officer.

I was fortunate enough to be invited to participate in the program last week. The program was held in Lake Grace and attended by Stuart Fraser, Principal Advisory Officer DLG and mentor Kenn Donohoe, CEO Shire of Serpentine-Jarrahdale, with President De Landgraft attending for the first session.

The program covered a vast array of discussion topics including;

- Role of the CEO;
- Governance;
- Strategic and Long Term Planning;
- Legislative Framework;
- Town Planning;
- Working Relationships and Local Politics;
- Risk Management;
- Resource Management;
- Managing the Business of the local government;
- Family impacts and considerations; and,
- Media interaction.

It was an invaluable experience, and I am grateful to have been given the opportunity to participate in the program.

2017 Local Government Elections

2017 is an election year for local government throughout Western Australia. Election Day is Saturday 21 October. While October may seem a long time away, key decisions need to be made by local government in August and the electoral rolls close on Friday 1 September. The Shire will be using the WA Electoral Commission to conduct a postal ballot.

All residents in a local government district who are enrolled on the State Electoral Roll are automatically enrolled on the corresponding local government roll. People, who own or occupy property within the shire, can apply to be included on the roll as an owner/occupier, as long as they are eligible electors. A body corporate may apply to have up to two eligible electors to be included on the owner/occupier roll.

Shire of Lake Grace Community News *Cont.*

In the coming Local Government Election the shire will have five (5) vacancies. The current term for Councillors Armstrong, Chappell, De Landgraft, Stanton and Walker expires this year. As the Shire has now gone away from wards and is now a single district for election purposes, it means the five (5) candidates with the highest number of votes are duly elected. If there were only five (5) nominations all nominees would be elected unopposed.

For any community members interested in standing for Council, we will conduct some candidate briefing sessions prior to close of nominations.

Building and Maintenance Team

This fortnight the Shire's Building and Maintenance Team reports that works are continuing on the Lake Grace Independent Living units as follows:

- Fencing is 90% complete;
- Tiling is completed for all units;
- Skirtings, architraves and door frames are 80% complete;
- Paving is complete on Unit 1 and has commenced on Unit 2; and,
- Internal doors and door fixture works will commence shortly.

The Building Maintenance Team has carried out works for:

- 14 Blackbutt Way, Lake Grace;
- 5 Banksia Place, Lake Grace;
- Lake Grace Medical Centre; and,
- Lake Grace Airstrip.

Wayne Trawinski, the Building Supervisor, attended a meeting with the Lake Grace Recreation Committee in regards to the refurbishment of the Lake Grace Pavilion.

Road Works

During the past fortnight, Doug Whiting, the Shire's Infrastructure Supervisor, advised that the Construction Crew has been located on Hatters Hill Road and has commenced installing the required culverts.

The Maintenance Grader has been working on West Kuender Road, White Dam Road and is currently working on Jarring South Road.

The Newdegate grading contractor has been working along Dragon Rocks Road for the entire length and will then move on to Granville Road. The second grader has commenced on Breed Road and Magenta Road. On the weekend of 15-16 July, the contractor removed the tree in front of the Newdegate Post Office and trimmed the Bottle Brush.

The Lake King grading contractor has been working on Norseman Road, Stennetts Lake Road, Hogan Road and Ace Road. The contractor will be continuing on Norseman Road for the next week.

Road Maintenance Team

The Road Maintenance Team has been inspecting drains in the Newdegate townsite area and has

commenced road patching on North Lake Grace Karlgarin Road.

Parks and Gardens

This week the Town Maintenance Crew has been spraying laneways in the Lake Grace townsite. The team has attended the Lake Grace airstrip and has carried out slashing around the lights, buildings and carried out routine inspections to lights etc. Works have also been carried out at the playgrounds on Gumtree Drive and McMahon Street. Spraying of weeds has been carried out at the Lake Grace saleyards.

Last Friday the crew went out to Lake King to carry out works at the cemetery, public toilets and the playground area.

National Firearm Amnesty

The aim of the National Firearms Amnesty 2017 is to reduce the number of unregistered firearms in Australia and to improve public safety. The amnesty runs from 1 July to 30 September 2017, and covers all states and territories.

During the three-month amnesty, anyone can hand in unregistered firearms or firearm-related items for registration or surrender at an approved drop-off point without penalty and without fear of prosecution. There is no limit to the number of items you can hand in.

Amnesty participants do not need to provide personal details if they surrender a firearm or firearm-related article for destruction – there is a “no questions asked” policy. There is also no cost involved with handing in firearms or related items for destruction.

Owning and using unregistered firearms carries risks for you and your family. If you are found in possession of an unregistered firearm outside the amnesty, you may face a criminal conviction, fines and even imprisonment.

This amnesty is as much about giving families a chance to get rid of an old heirloom as it is about getting guns off our streets.

Bulk Oil Disposal – Rural Locations

The Shire of Lake Grace has the capacity at our licence waste facilities, to collect small scale domestic oil from residents. Users are able to pour a container weighing no more than 10 kilograms into the containment unit, in accordance with the Shire's Fees and Charges schedule.

Conditions set in the Licence of the Waste Facility, require any oil container, to have the capacity to hold that oil in spill containment should that container leak or rupture. This is why the Shire can only take oil that users pour into the containment.

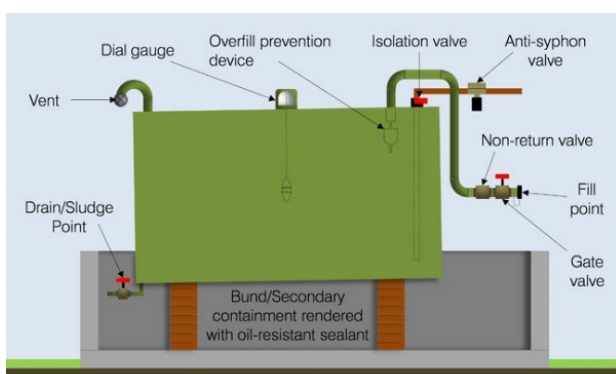
If the Shire was to accept any other oil in containers, we need to have an equal amount of containment to hold the volume of any containers. Any spillage is an environmental breach, which is a significant cost to clean up, and may result in fines to the Shire of up to \$50,000 and \$5,000 per day of any non-compliance. This would impact on our ability to deliver projects to our ratepayers.



The problem that the Shire has been facing, is the inappropriate delivery of oil in large containers to our waste sites. This then requires the Shire to dispose of the oil which is a cost to our ratepayers.

Part of the problem would appear to be that rural landholders do not believe that they have the capacity to dispose of waste oil, other than through the Shire waste facilities.

The Shire has been in contact with Wren Oil, who have indicated that they will come out to properties and pick up the waste oil.



If you have a large amount of waste oil, please contact Wren Oil by email quotes@wrenoil.com.au or by phone 08 9725 4002. Your yard will need to be accessible for a b-double vehicle, with drums and/or IBC's located in one section of your yard. A mud map would be appreciated.

Wren Oil will require:

- Credit card details
- Site address
- Contact number
- Number of drums or containers to be pumped out.

(A 205 litre drum is the smallest that their spears will fit into.)

Half Price July

Dog registration renewals are forwarded to registered dog owners in October each year.

Dog registrations expire on 31 October for 1 year and 3 year registrations regardless of the month your dog is registered.

Register your dog from 1 June to 31 October and the fee payable will be **half price** as the registration will expire on 31 October of that same year.



Walking your Dog

A reminder that dog owners have a legal responsibility to keep their dogs under control, either within a fenced area on their property or on a leash when in public.

When walking your dog pick up your dog waste:

- Keep your bags/pouches/pooper scooper products with your leash, as a reminder to take them with you.
- If you forget your bag look for bag dispensers and bins provided.
- If using the plastic bag method for cleaning up, simply put your hand inside the bag, pick up the dog poo, turn the bag inside out, then seal.

People like dogs not dog waste, please be considerate of others.

- Most suicides occur with little or no warning.
- Most suicides are the result of one single traumatic event.
- Don't talk about "it" with someone you think may be at risk.
- Youth suicide is an impulsive act.
- A person who talks about suicide will not attempt.
- A suicidal person wants to die.
- Some people attempt suicide to get attention.
- People who commit suicide are poor.
- Suicide is an individual choice. It's none of my business.
- Suicide is complex. They need more help than I can provide.

When to be concerned

Be observant about any change in a person's situation.

Situations

- Relationship breakdown
- Trouble with the law
- Family disruption
- Work related problems
- Financial crisis

- Recent tragedy or suicide in area or publicity about a suicide.

Physical and Behavioural Changes

- Loss of interest and enthusiasm
- Increase in minor illnesses
- Emotional outbursts
- Excessive drug or alcohol consumption
- Withdrawal from interactive activities
- Reckless or careless behaviour
- Putting affairs in order
- Unusually argumentative or quiet

Anything that is out of the ordinary for this person.

Possible Personal Feelings You May Experience

If you have to discuss a difficult situation with someone it is normal to experience an emotional reaction. If someone is contemplating suicide this reaction will be more extreme but you can manage.

PANIC!

- I feel helpless and unskilled in this situation
- I am not a trained crisis worker
- This is not in my job description

- What if I try to help and it happens anyway?

RESENTMENT

- I'm being conned again

- What else am I expected to do for this person?
- How dare you do this to me!

HOPELESS

- This situation is impossible
- If I was in this situation I would be suicidal too

DISTRESSED

- My personal beliefs make it difficult for me to help in this situation

FRUSTRATION

- I don't need this right now
- Surely this can wait
- I have important things to do right now

Indicators of Risk

As a first aid person we are not able to assess if someone is suffering from clinical depression, we can however determine if a person is experiencing distress or despair in their life.

Stress

Our perception of real or imagined occurrences or events (can be physical or mental).

Everyone lives with stress it is a normal part of life. It is only when it goes to the next level (distress) that people start to malfunction, and the longer it persists the more difficult it becomes.

Distress

If stress becomes excessive it creates personal distress (you become dysfunctional).

Despair

- Excessive stress
- Feeling "defeated"

- Feeling "trapped"
- Lack of "escape" possibilities
- Sense of being alone (no one cares)

EVALUATING THE RISK

Evaluate the situation

Seeing their behaviours

Hearing their thoughts and feelings

Sensing their feelings through what they share

ESTIMATING THE RISK

Thoughts of suicide

Ask directly to ascertain if a person has thoughts of suicide.

Three "estimators" of risk of self harm

- Current suicide **plan** (method, preparations and time)
- Prior **history** of suicidal behaviour or exposure (ask for details)
- Personal **support** resources (the person most at risk feels totally alone and unsupported).

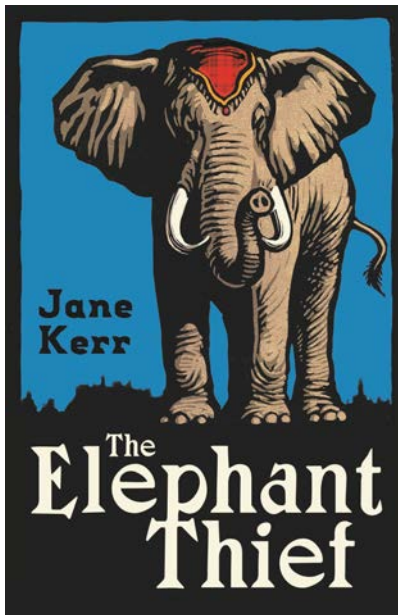

Gone Baby Gone - DVD

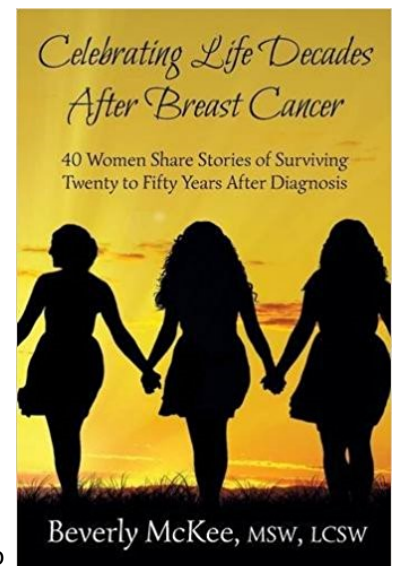

Drones... Tools or Toys?

Media Release

Drones are the next big thing in agriculture, we all want one, but how do you go about choosing one for farming?

Kulin Community Resource Centre and Kulin Community Bank will be hosting an inaugural young farmer's conference GenAg2017 on Tuesday July 25 with the aim of answering this question.

One of the presentations on the day is from Mr Ben White of the Kondinin Group. Mr White, along with his colleague agricultural engineer Josh Giumelli, have recently tested the various drones available on the market.

According to Mr White and Mr Giumelli the always-improving battery technology combined with advancements made with sensors expands the potential for drones to improve our agronomic understanding.

"While drones are unlikely to replace any machinery for field applications or operations, they can be used to scan and pinpoint applications for inputs including expensive chemistry." Mr White said

"The expanding range of multispectral cameras could see crop inspections done quickly and more regularly, backed up by ground truthing in areas of concern."

Other topics from the day include succession planning, time management in the farming business, industry outlooks, herbicide resistance, grain marketing, wealth creation, flock management, noodle wheat opportunities, educational opportunities in agriculture and more.

A key feature of the conference is the breakout sessions with a networking corner. Attendees are encouraged to make connections, whether it's with other young farmers, new business or potential opportunities.

Tom Murphy from the Kulin Community Bank said the motivation behind the initiative is to bring key agribusiness speakers to the Wheatbelt and host a one day conference on the doorstep of farmers in this region, making it simpler for farmers to attend.

"Holding the conference in Kulin at the Freebairn Rec Centre, a world class indoor recreation facility, was an obvious solution to bring information to time poor farmers in modern facilities.

"Driving to Perth, finding accommodation and then getting around the city is off putting for most time poor farmers where every day off the farm is loss in productivity.

"There's no reason why people can't come to Kulin for something like this. There's plenty of parking, no traffic lights, accommodation, coffee and all your meals are catered for with our renowned country hospitality at its finest".

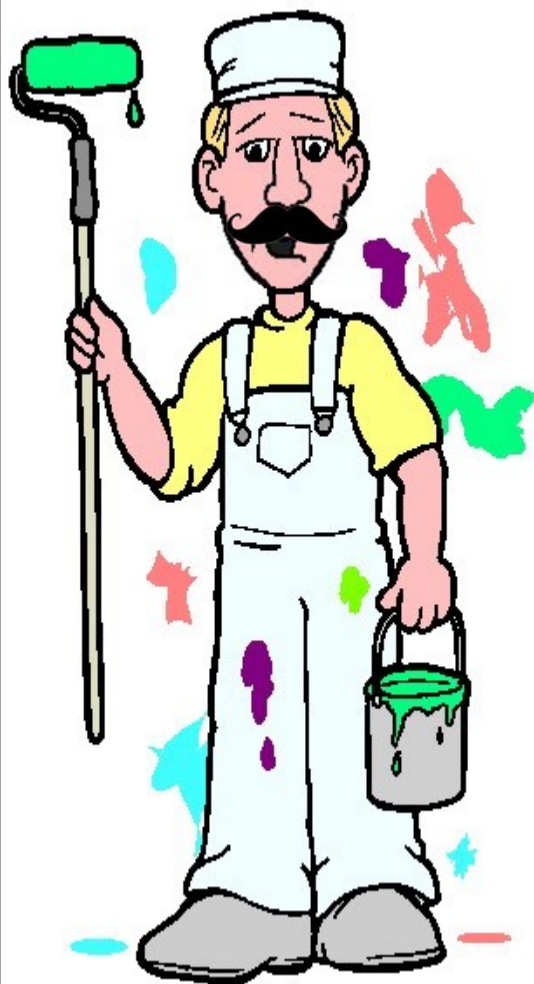
Round 10 – JERRAMUNGUP (3) v's LGP (1)
