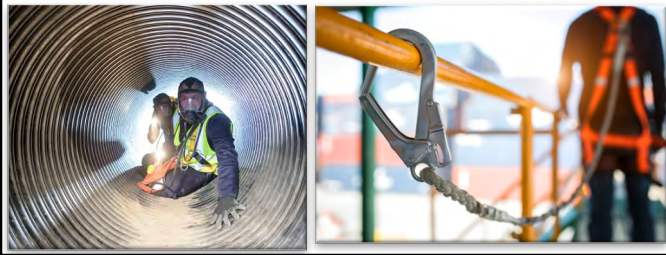

Farm Household Allowance

A payment for farming families in financial hardship. New Farm Household allowance 10-year period starts 1st July 2024

Farm Household Allowance (FHA) is a fortnightly payment for a farmer or partner of a farmer. It's paid for up to 4 years in a specific 10-year period. There are some eligibility rules you'll need to meet. To get this you must:

- be a farmer or partner of a farmer
- meet the income and assets test limits
- meet mutual obligation requirements
- not have exceeded the time limits for the 10-year period.

A farmer must contribute significant labour and capital to a farm.

Who can get it

You need to meet eligibility requirements to get Farm Household Allowance. To get Farm Household Allowance (FHA) you must meet all the following:

- be a farmer or partner of a farmer
- be 16 years or older
- contribute labour and capital to an Australian farm, or are the partner of a farmer who does
- have income and assets below certain amounts
- have had less than 4 years of FHA in the specific 10-year period.

Your farm must have significant commercial purpose.

We'll assess this based on all the following:

- the purpose of your farm
- the prospect for profit
- consistency of activity
- whether your farm runs as a business
- the size, scale and permanency of your farm activity.

If you've previously had this payment, you can apply again, but you can only get it for 4 years in a specific 10-year period.

Farmer Assistance Hotline

Our specialist staff can give you advice about:

- eligibility
- claiming
- progress of applications
- appeals
- change in circumstances
- reporting
- general enquiries.

How much you can get

The amount of Farm Household Allowance you can get depends on your circumstances.

This payment is the same as the maximum rate of JobSeeker Payment or Youth Allowance.

If you have a partner, we may pay the allowance to both of you. You may be able to submit a combined claim.

If you get Farm Household Allowance (FHA) you'll get all the following:

- a fortnightly payment for up to 4 years in each specific 10 year period
- activity supplements up to a lifetime limit of \$10,000 to pay for activities to help improve your financial position
- a Farm Household Case Officer to work with you to help you improve your financial circumstances.

FHA is a taxable Centrelink payment. We don't automatically deduct tax from most of our payments. But you can ask us to do this for you if you get a taxable payment. This can reduce the amount of tax you may have to pay at the end of the tax year.

Call the Farmer Assistance Hotline (132 316) and talk to us about assistance we give to farmers.

How to claim

Complete the following steps to claim Farm Household Allowance (FHA). Before you start, check if you can get it.

1. Get ready to claim

The easiest way to claim is online. To claim online, you need a Centrelink online account linked to myGov. If you don't have a myGov account or a Centrelink online account you'll need to create them. You may need to confirm your identity with us before you start your claim.

If you and your partner are both claiming FHA, you may be able to submit a combined claim online. To use the combined claim option, you both need all of these before starting your claim:

- your own myGov accounts linked to your own Centrelink online accounts
- to subscribe to electronic messaging
- to check we've linked you as a couple with us before starting your claim
- to record that your partner can deal with us on your behalf
- at least one bank account recorded in joint names.

If you or your partner have a nominee, they can't do your combined claim online. You'll need to get supporting documents ready to help answer some of the questions in the claim.

2. Make your claim

If you can claim online

If your Centrelink account is linked to myGov you can claim online.

[Sign in to myGov](#)

Make sure you submit the claim within 13 weeks from when you started it. If you don't, it'll expire and you'll need to start again.

Based on your answers, we may ask if you also want to claim Farm Household Allowance for your partner. If you choose a combined claim, your partner will get an SMS or email from us to let them know. We'll advise them to:

- sign in to myGov and select Centrelink
- select the task on their homepage
- answer questions

They'll have 3 days to do this before the task disappears. If this happens, they'll need to start again and submit their own claim.

If you can't claim online

If you can't claim online, you can print and complete the [Claim for Farm Household Allowance form](#). Submit your form and supporting documents within 14 days. You need to complete your claim in full before you can get a payment. We need all supporting documents before we can start to process your claim. You can

After a rather long journey of investigation, it was wonderful to finally take delivery of the new community bus last week. Upon delivery some of those who have driven the community bus over the last 12 months were invited to inspect and ask questions.

The 35-seater coach style bus offers plenty of underneath storage, comfortable seating with a faux leather finish making it much easier to clean. Each set of seats also has a USB charging station with individual reading lights.

Drivers will need to have a MR Licence and if they're driving for reward, they will need a PTD (Passenger Transport Driver) authorisation.

The bus was funded by the Community Bus and the Shire of Lake Grace and as previously will have the bookings managed by the CRC and the maintenance etc. managed by the Shire.

We will continue using the old bus over the next couple of weeks as the committee will convene to discuss charging costs, housing of the bus and the key arrangements.

Neurocare Support Available

Did you know that there was a dedicated team of community neurological nurses committed to assisting anyone with a neurological complaint free of charge? I didn't until Tania Hughes, a Neurocare Community Neurological Nurse dropped into the CRC last week. These nurses are tasked with providing high quality, patient-centred neurological nursing and health care navigation services to people of all ages living with any neurological condition or symptoms. Tania and her work colleague, Charlotte Leonardi, are based at Lotteries House in Centennial Park Albany.

Neurological conditions affect the brain, spinal cord and nervous system and are now the leading cause of disability and second leading cause of death worldwide, placing significant burden on health, disability and aged care systems.

These conditions include stroke, migraine, epilepsy, autism, dementia, Alzheimer's, Parkinson's, motor neurone disease, brain tumours, meningitis, functional neurological disorder and acquired brain injury, and over 600 other common, rare and genetic conditions as varied as Huntington's and muscular dystrophy.

Many brain diseases are preventable, and through education, advocacy and informed policy and service development, the health and economic impacts of neurological conditions on individuals and society can be

significantly reduced.

For over 30 years, the Neurological Council of WA has been a health peak and connecting body for the Western Australian neurological community. They are committed to, and passionate about, improving the health, wellbeing and lives of all people impacted by neurological symptoms or conditions across our diverse member and client base.

Lions District Governor Annual Visit

Lions District Governor for area 201w2, **Lion Peter Kenneday** visited the Lions Club of Lake Grace on the evening of 12th June '24 at a meeting held in the Hotel dining room.

President Chris Harvey welcomed the DG and incoming Zone Chairman Clifton Cook along with Lions present including Lions ladies Laure-Anne and Glenda. In addition, special thanks went to Lion's club Treasurer John Ayer-Dillon for making the trip from Katanning to attend the meeting.

The club reported to the governor it's main activities which includes establishing the Historic machinery display; *School scholarships*; tree planting; fund raising with the containers for change program and mint sales.

Treasurer John reported on the satisfactory state of the club finances. John made the point that the long drawn out switch from one bank to another bank is largely complete with just one hurdle remaining to enable a term deposit reinvestment to go ahead.

Lion John also put forward the list of organisations that normally receive annual Lions Club donations.

In his reply Lion Peter complimented the Lions Club for the community work it is doing. He encouraged Lions to continue their effort and offered advice where he thought it would assist.

Information from the DG's introduction sheet showed how qualified and experienced he is in the area of community service. His dedication to serve others evidently started with him being an Apexian for 15 years in his early life. During that time he moved to many locations around WA and to the NT as a bank employee. DG Lion Peter has been a Lion's member since 2014.

DG Peter confirmed the Lions districts W1 and W2 will amalgamate as from 1st July this year to become **District 201WA**.

The main reason for this move is the number of clubs north of the Swan River (W1) have diminished with around 500 members all told. Area W2 (south) has 1263 currently.

Some history:-

Until 30 years ago Lions in this state had only 1 district.

Then came the mining boon with the springing up of new mining towns which created demand to establish more clubs in the north.

The additional number of Lions Clubs and wide

spread locations made it too difficult to govern. Hence, 2 districts (W1 & W2) were created.

Now however, the practice of mining companies moving to Fly in Fly out (FIFO) for their workers and the disbanding of many dedicated mining towns, there is no longer the demand for the number of Lions Clubs in the north there once was.

So now 30 years on, the state Lions 201 district will revert to just one body covering the whole state; notwithstanding the logistical problems that it will no doubt create once again.

Other: Lion Nick asked Lion Darren, the President of the WA Shearing Industry Association for his take on the proposed live sheep export ban. Darren obliged with a summary of the situation at the moment and the foreseeable effect the ban will likely have (and is having) on farmer's confidence, rural employment and country communities.

Meeting conclusion: President Chris presented a LG Lions bannerette to the DG. In exchange Lion Peter presented a personalised badge struck for his year of service as District Governor 201w2, 23-24 to all in attendance. This was followed by a cracking joke told by Nick.

The following day, before departing Lake Grace, Lion Peter was shown around the Historic Machinery display at Lions Park. Being keen to take a closer look at the Lake, he was then taken 8 km west of town, where a stroll beside the lake and through the challenging environment of the reserve in delightfully foggy, crisp wintery morning conditions.

Sanctuary is a leap away from his other novels which have focused around a police officer, the lead character in Sanctuary is from the other side of the spectrum.

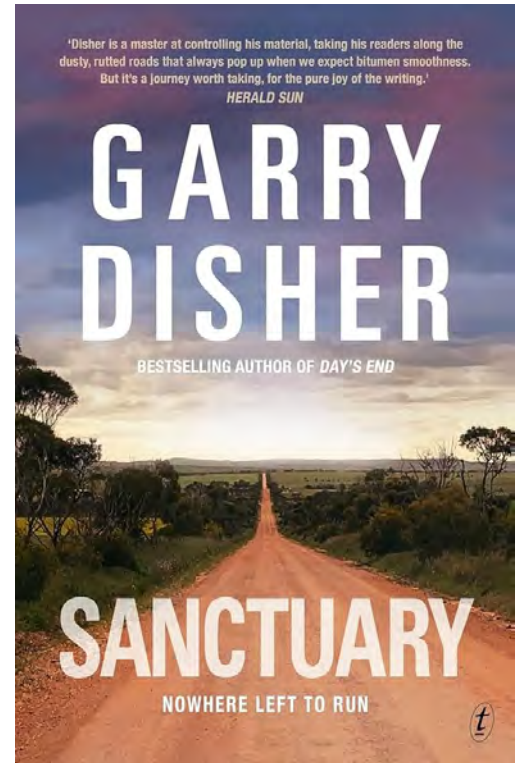

There are no shortcuts to the top

ladder safety explained

On average, more than 30 Australians die each year, and over 6,000 are hospitalised with injuries, from ladder falls.

The injuries can be serious and life altering with people suffering fractured limbs, spinal cord damage and severe brain injuries. Sadly, the majority of people killed or injured were men aged over 45 years.

Consumer Protection's Product Safety team are urging people to make safety a top priority while using ladders around the home. Whether it's cleaning the gutters, changing light bulbs, hanging decorations or just taking care of projects around the home - safe use means proper use.

It's often the split-second decision or risky shortcut that results in a fall. Taking a few extra minutes to assess and set up the job safely could save you a trip to hospital or even your life.

Make sure the ladder is the right height and design for the job and check it is in good condition. Also check the ladder's weight capacity so you know it can hold you, this can be found on the ladder itself or in the manufacturer's advice.

Take off the Ugg boots or thongs and put on sturdy, slip resistant shoes. Take time to set up your ladder on a

firm, flat surface and lock the spreaders. Ask someone to hold the ladder and keep your body centred between the siderails as you climb. Always maintain three points of contact, this means two hands and one foot, or two feet and one hand. Only carry items up and down that allow you to maintain the three points of contact and don't over reach as this can lead to losing balance.

Don't stand above the second step from the top on a step ladder or the third rung on an extension ladder. If the job you're doing is outside, don't work in wet or windy conditions.

Lastly, don't become a statistic Consumer Protection talks about next year. Know your limits and work to your ability. Sometimes you may need to accept the job is safer left to a professional.

A number of ladders have been recalled over the years due to faults that can contribute to an accident. Even if it's an older purchase, take a moment to check productsafety.gov.au to see if your ladder has been recalled.

If you spot an issue with a ladder, report it to our Product Safety team via the form at consumerprotection.wa.gov.au, or call 1300 30 40 54. Your reports can assist us in identifying safety issues with products and this helps keep consumers safe.

Backyard Buddies

Larvae in firewood

During the winter period where firewood is often collected and split, our service receives a common enquiry: *"I've chopped some wood and found these grubs! Are these borers? Is this the European house borer? Is my house at risk???"* The first question we ask to split European house borer (EHB) from many other wood borers is: *"What wood are you cutting? Is it pine?"*. If the answer is no, it's not going to be EHB.

EHB larvae will only reproduce in seasoned (dry) coniferous timber and wood, including pine, fir and spruce. Of these, pine trees (*Pinus* species) and pine timbers are abundant in WA.

What if the answer was yes? - If you notice larvae or borer emergence holes in dead pine branches, logs, or untreated pine pallets or timbers, please report this. EHB has the potential to cause major structural damage to buildings constructed with untreated pine timber. Infested wood stored in or around the home is worth investigating.

Who's on the chopping block?

Most firewood burnt in WA is from native hardwood species and pictured in this article are the larvae of native longicorn beetles (*Phoracantha* species) in jarrah. These beetles attack live or recently dead/felled Eucalypt trees and do not pose a risk to the timbers in

your home.

If you have been chopping firewood for years but are only starting to see these borers, it's likely the trees the firewood has come from, were stressed or recently felled. Trees stressed by drought or disease are particularly susceptible to borer attack.

Reporting

We can't all be insect identification specialists, but that doesn't matter. If something isn't familiar to you, it's best to report it rather than ignore it. When reporting, please include as much information as possible about what's occurring. Collect and hold onto any insect samples, and if taking photos, include things like a ruler or a pen so the dimensions of insects, holes or other symptoms can be gauged.

If borers are coming out of furniture, timber, or wooden products like bowls, chopping boards or ornaments – report it as soon as possible and we will provide guidance from there.

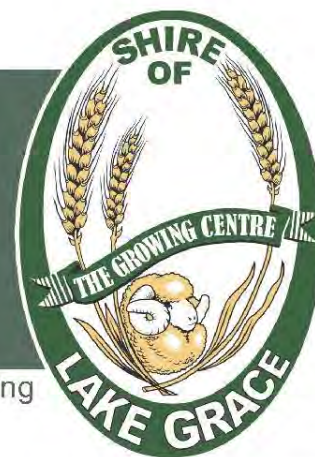

Bush Fire Service Awards

State Wage Case Decision

State Wage Case decision – State minimum wage and WA award pay rates to increase from 1 July 2024

The Western Australian Industrial Relations Commission has increased the state minimum wage and pay rates in all WA awards effective from the first full pay period on or after 1 July 2024.

The state minimum wage for employees 21 and over will increase to \$917.80 per week. Minimum rates for younger workers and award free trainees and apprentices will also increase.

Rates of pay in WA awards will increase by 4%, with rates of pay for some WA award adult employees 21 years and older increasing by more than 4% to align with the new state minimum wage of \$917.80.

This year's increase in the state minimum wage reflects the WA Industrial Relations Commission's decision to re-align the state minimum wage to the level of the C13 classification in the State Metal Trades (General) Award.

The new minimum rates and updated Wageline WA award summaries will be available on the Wageline website by 1 July 2024.

Wageline News subscribers and social media followers will be notified when the new pay rates are available on the Wageline website.

This pay rate increase only applies to employers and

employees in the state industrial relations system. It covers businesses and organisations which operate as:

- sole traders
- unincorporated partnerships
- unincorporated trust arrangements

incorporated associations that are not trading or financial corporations and other not-for-profit organisations that are not trading or financial corporations

If your business or organisation is in the national industrial relations system, visit the Fair Work Ombudsman website for information on pay rate increases.
